22 SUCCESSFUL YEARS . . .

The Kaye family consists of Mr and Mrs Kaye and their son Martin, Mr Malcolm Bolton who is their General Manager and has been with them for the past nineteen years and the rest of the staff who help to run the shop and factory.

Upon entering the shop I immediately felt a warm atmosphere and was greeted very cordially by Mr Kaye who explained the various services that the business provides. A service which is in very strong demand is that of taking down and re-hanging of curtains.

NO EXTRA COST

This is a situation which most people do not enjoy and therefore the experts can provide this service at NO EXTRA COST to the customer. Normally curtains taken to the local dry cleaner would be invariably creased when transported home by car or over your arm. "This problem is overcome," explained Mr Kaye because when we re-hang curtains in homes, offices or restaurants if they are creased we will finish them off with a steamy (portable wrinkle remover)."

In charge of outside operations is their son Martin. He and his staff will visit your home and give you a free estimate for the cleaning of

your curtains as well as complete relines. Carpets and upholstery can be done on site and a protector service is also available. Indians, Persians and Orientals are usually taken away to be cleaned. "It is not unusual," Mrs Kaye explained, "for customers to ask for a complete service in a day, and this means our crew going early in the morning to customers homes taking down and returning curtains to the factory, while the rest of the crew start on the carpets and upholstery. Later in the day the curtains are returned hung and dressed on the windows." "A unique service", Mrs Kaye went on to say, "and one which we are very proud of." She herself deals with a lot of the enquiries that come over the counter and the factory as well as sorting out queries and checking that collection and delivery dates are strictly adhered to.

Special pleating

Mr Kaye who has been associated with fabrics all his life now puts his knowledge to good use into cleaning, repairing and alterations whether it be of garments or curtains. He explained to me that although their domestic side of the cleaning business is quite a large one they also cater for hotels, pubs, restaurants and offices as

well as cleaning for other dry cleaners in the area who do not possess curtain cleaning and pleating facilities such as theirs. When I queried him what he meant by pleating of curtains, he then showed me around the factory explaining all the various pieces of equipment and their functions. While a lot of the equipment is British they have travelled extensively attending various exhibitions all over the world to bring back the finishing products for garments and curtains. For instance, silk finishing equipment

from Germany, spotting equipment from America, Hoffman presses from Britain and finally with great pride he showed me the the Curtain Pleating Machine which was brought over from America. This is where the pinch pleat headed curtains are put back into their natural folds as well as curtains being checked for length measurements and shape.

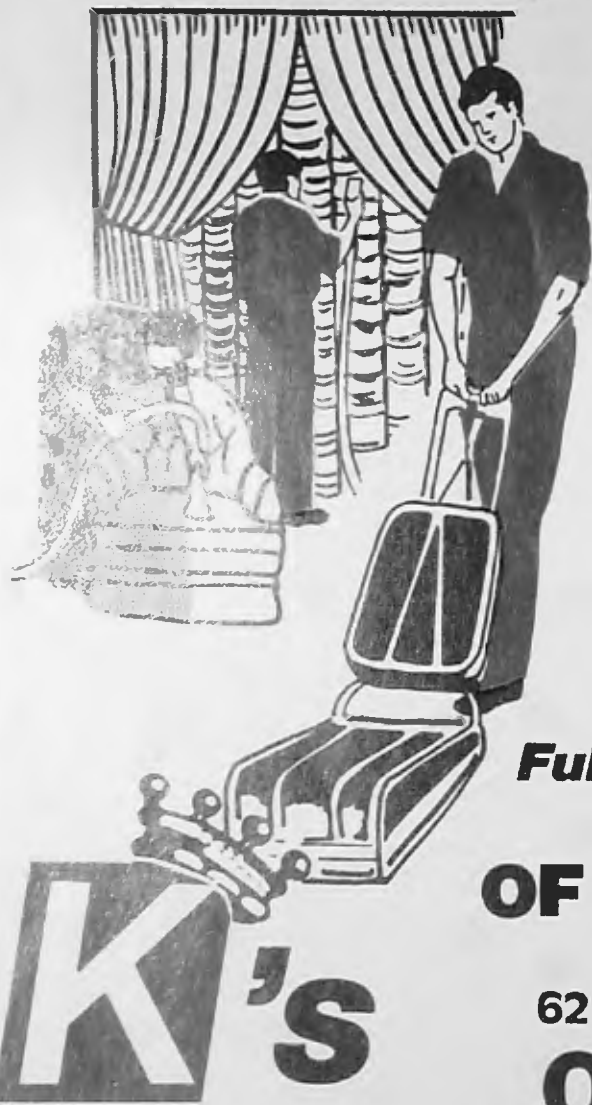

Garden centre for Mill Hill pool site

BARNET COUNCIL has accepted a tender from Country Gardens Ltd to turn the former swimming pool site in Daws Lane, Mill Hill, into a garden centre.

There were 23 offers for the site and the Council's Development and Estates Committee recommended the Country Gardens scheme, which was the highest offer.

Country Gardens owns two substantial garden centres at Chilton in Oxfordshire and at Cirencester. The company's scheme for the 1.7-acre site retains the existing building which will be imaginatively refurbished to a high standard.

There will be a glazed roof over the courtyard area and a conservatory adjacent to the old cafeteria building. The swimming pool will be converted to a sunken garden. The remainder of the site will be levelled, resurfaced and used as the exterior plant sales area. There will be access for wheelchairs.

The view from the park will be enhanced and softened by planting trees and shrubs on the park side.

The public car park will be resurfaced by Country Gardens.

The planning application will go to the Town Planning and Research Committee in the normal way with the support of the Development and Estates Committee.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

BARNET COUNCIL gave decisions on 530 planning applications during the three months, January to March, 1986. Of these 460, or 87 per cent, were granted.

Twenty-five were major developments, that is residential developments of 10 or more dwellings and other developments with a floor space of 1,000 sqm or a site of about 2½ acres (1 hectare).

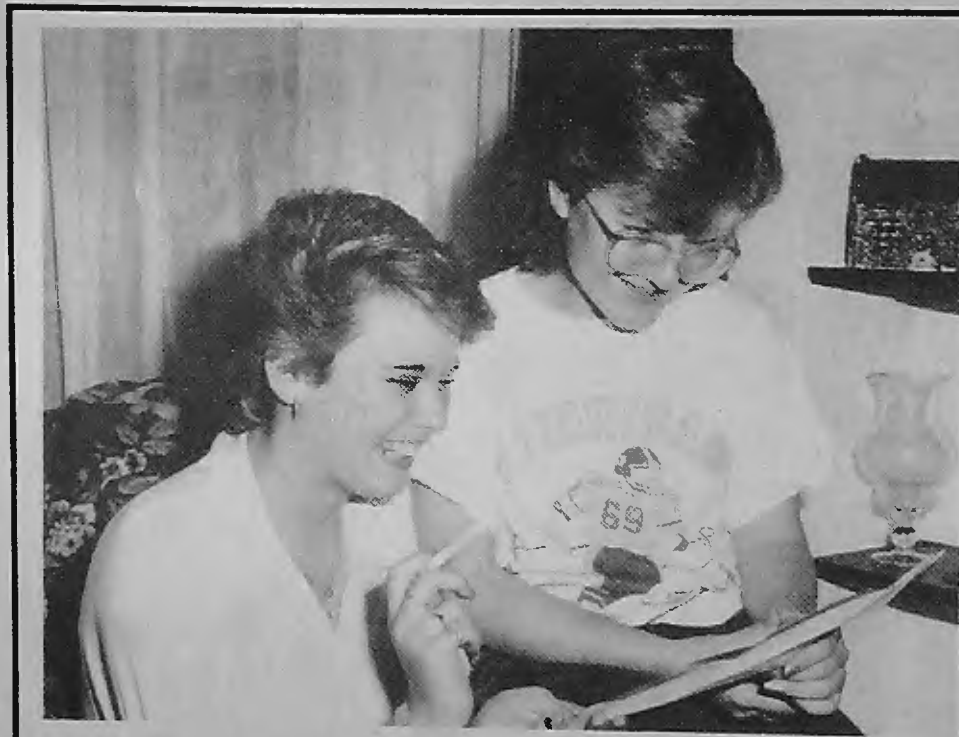
At the beginning of the quarter there were 502 applications and at the end of the quarter 570.

Nature Notes

SEPTEMBER

THE CONSERVATION movement has grown rapidly over the past decade and many of the achievements have been through the efforts of voluntary organisations. The future of conservation though is up to you! Apathy, and the attitude that someone else will do the work, means vital habitats being devalued for wildlife. I propose four levels of environmental involvement for **EVERYONE** in Barnet:

- Numbers help to influence developers and politicians, so anyone who enjoys a TV wildlife programme must register their support by signing a membership form.
- Learn more about natural history and join one of the many local field meetings.
- Obviously, nothing can be protected unless we know where it lives. Recording projects and surveys provide a vital baseline for assessing future wildlife population changes and initiating appropriate conservation measures. All wildlife sightings are required, especially plants, birds, mammals and butterflies.
- And finally, the most obvious way to help is to join a practical conservation task this autumn at Rowley Green, Darlands Lake or Oak Hill Woods.

Can you give a home to a child?

THE MOST precious gift of childhood is a secure and loving home. But in a society in which violence is increasing, family conflicts and breakdown, unemployment, drug and alcohol problems reach into every section of the community, it is often the children who suffer.

In recent months many more children have come into the care of Barnet Council. This is not just a local problem. It is certainly London-wide and probably nation-wide. Until this year it looked as if the number of children coming into care was decreasing. In Barnet it fell to 130 a year, but at the last check it was 150 and still rising.

This is in spite of Barnet's very active campaign to give support in the home to try and prevent family breakdown, or, where this does occur, to arrange for children to be placed in foster families.

Great demand

In line with the emphasis on family care, residential places have been reduced in recent years so that there is now a shortage of residential homes offering 'secure' or 'closed' accommodation in the locality.

Existing foster families are greatly in demand and this is why Barnet's Social Services' Director, Alan Gorst, and his Senior Fostering Officer, Carol Rogers, are making this Borough-wide appeal:

- Can you help?
- Can you take a child or group of children into your family?
- Can you become a foster parent?

It is not an easy job becoming a foster parent. Most children in Barnet's care are there because they have lived through almost impossible problems.

Some have been the victims of violence. Some have seen their family torn apart and have been moved between parents and relatives without ever finding security. Some have come from families where there are parents in conflict or who have problems with misuse of drugs or alcohol. Some have left home unable to get on with their parents, wanting to be independent but still too young to cope with life.

They need a family. They need an understanding and a structured environment where they will be given the freedom to develop their own personalities, where their problems will be sympathetically tackled, and where they will find security.

Many of these children are teenagers who have experienced difficulties in their own families and may take time to adapt to a foster family, who in turn will need patience and understanding to help the young person integrate into family.

AND YET . . . fostering is probably one of the most rewarding services that any family can give. When we use the word family, it can be a traditional family, a one-parent family or even a single man or woman with understanding of young people's problems.

It is most important that Barnet also finds families from the Asian and Afro/Caribbean community, because children need a family of their own ethnic culture or religious background to help them to fit into modern life from a firm family base.

RAMESH is torn between the traditions of his family and the values of Western life. He has rebelled against his own family but he needs an Asian foster family who can respect his natural family's values and help him to find a balanced solution and bridge the two cultures.

MARY is 15, a young Afro/Caribbean girl. She is a born leader who can be very obstinate and can get her values confused. She can also be very bolshie. She needs a family who can encourage her love of singing, music and athletics, enable her to develop, while also getting her to accept different values from her own.

STEPHEN is 12 and he needs a family where he can grow up and be adopted. He has always been the youngest of a large family of children; now he needs to take on a little responsibility, perhaps joining a family where there are younger children. He is a self-centred young man with a keen interest in swimming and BMX bike-riding, but he will need considerable encouragement and help to explore and express his feelings if he is to move easily into adolescence.

Togetherness

Another problem faced by Barnet when placing children with foster parents is the need to keep existing families of children together. Many foster parents are prepared to take one child into their family, and perhaps even two, but Barnet has several groups of 3, 4 and 5 children who need a home.

Alan Gorst said; 'We try desperately hard to keep these children together. They are so supportive of each other. That is why they are living in small residential homes. The staff provide good care and stimulation but it's not a home.'

'Sometimes these children have been through a terrible experience, and yet, perhaps through their affection for each other, they are able to survive. It is so very important that we find homes for these groups of children. We have some ability to help foster parents practically and financially, who would like to take a larger group of children but whose home is not

large enough to cope.'

One such group is five children — three older girls and two younger boys — with an age range of 4-14 years. Their mother has died and they need a home together. They also need to keep in touch with some of their relatives. Each child needs individual attention to help develop confidence and come to terms with the severe difficulties that they have lived through in their family.

Help at hand

Fostering is not easy — but you are not alone. On the financial side the basic fostering allowance of between £30 to £50 per week can be doubled, or even trebled, when families take on a child with difficult problems. For instance a family fostering a young child with Downs syndrome would receive between £80 and £100 per week.

When a teenager is fostered the initial allowance could be up to £140 per week for up to 6 months and once a child has settled it would be in the region of £110 per week. Payments do vary according to the circumstances of the child and family and will always take account of the task involved in caring for the child or young person.

Additional payments are made

for holidays, special tuition such as music lessons, and for school outings.

On the support side, a social worker specially trained in fostering, will work closely with you and your family to advise and guide you in fostering and to discuss any special problems.

The children themselves have their own social worker, so professional advice is always close at hand.

David Treleavon, a 'teen-care' foster-parent, is chairman of the active Foster Families' Association which provides a forum for foster parents and social workers to get together and discuss the tasks of fostering.

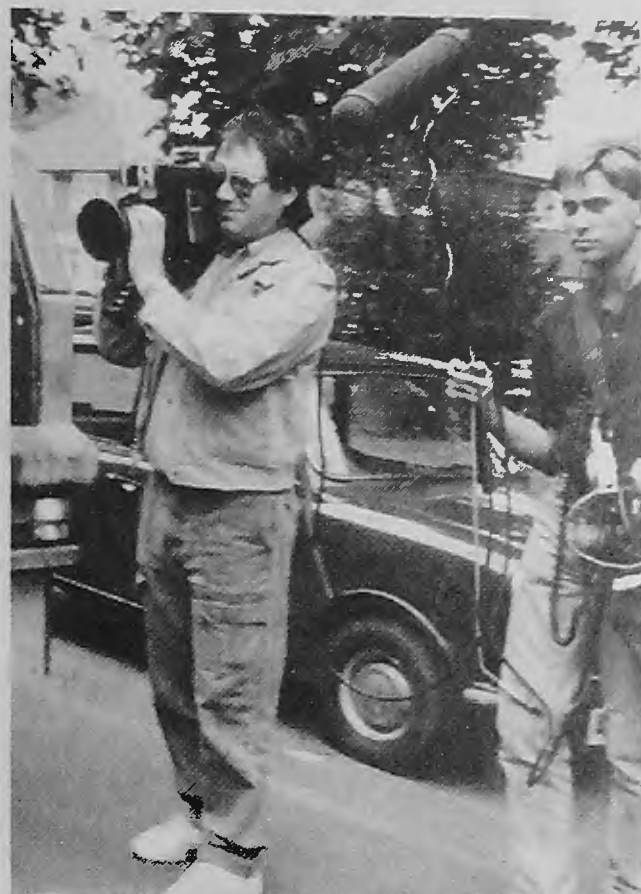

MADH Koya and Sudha Bakrania, the link-workers for Asian women having babies at Edgware and Victoria Maternity Hospitals, started work in April. Women are delighted to find someone who can help them through the various stages of ante-natal visits.

Hospital nurses and consultants have found the link-workers very useful in interpreting for people who have difficulty with English.

Madhu and Sudha can communicate with the great majority of Asian women from India, Pakistan and East Africa.

There are however, large numbers of Barnet people from other ethnic groups whose lack of English may prevent them from taking full advantage of the excellent maternity services. They may come from Cyprus (Greek or Turkish speaking) Hong Kong, Bangladesh, Vietnam or Japan.

It is intended to compile a register of women from these countries who live in the borough, have their own transport and would be interested in acting as an interpreter occasionally.

Fluency in English as well as mother tongue is needed. A fee is paid and it is intended to provide training. Anyone who would like to apply should contact Madhu or Sudha on 952 2381 ext 221.

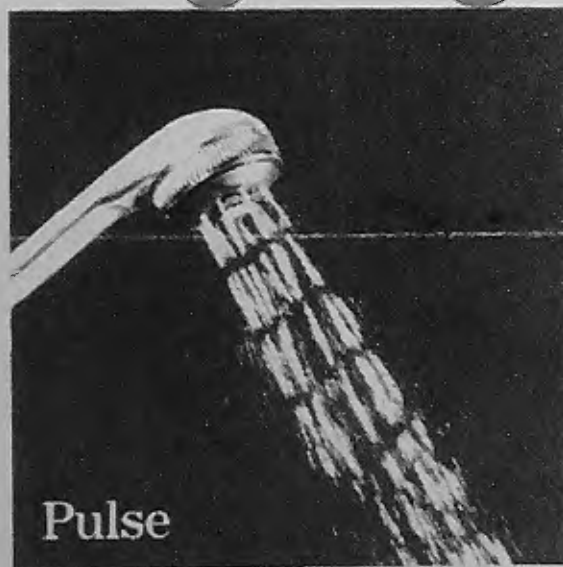

Learning the first skills of carpentry with junior hacksaws

The six year old was rather proud of the plant pot he had made — until he watered the plant in it and the pot disintegrated.

Instead of tears over a spoiled toy, this six-year-old worked out why his pot dissolved and which materials would be better and stand up to water. Plant pot number two was a success.

With the aid of scrap materials, paste and plasticine, he had had his first lesson in problem solving, watched over by a teacher who led him to make his own discoveries rather than showing him how it should be done.

He was taking part in a pilot scheme launched in Barnet primary and infant schools, on craft, design and technology for children from five years old upwards. It is all about learning by doing and getting to grips with the elements of technical design.

With a pump-priming grant of £750 from the Schools Curriculum Development Committee, and support from Barnet Council, five primary school teachers set up a series of craft, design and technology projects in local schools. This was a pilot scheme — not only for this borough but for schools

throughout the country.

Now teachers from other education authorities are finding out what the children in Barnet did, as reported in a booklet entitled: Primary School Craft, Design and Technology.

Craft design and technology brings together the manual skills of construction with principles of function and design and the application of science.

Through a series of projects the children make their own discoveries. Between the teacher and the child a partnership is built up where the teacher does not always have all the answers and investigation and discovery are key factors in development of skills.

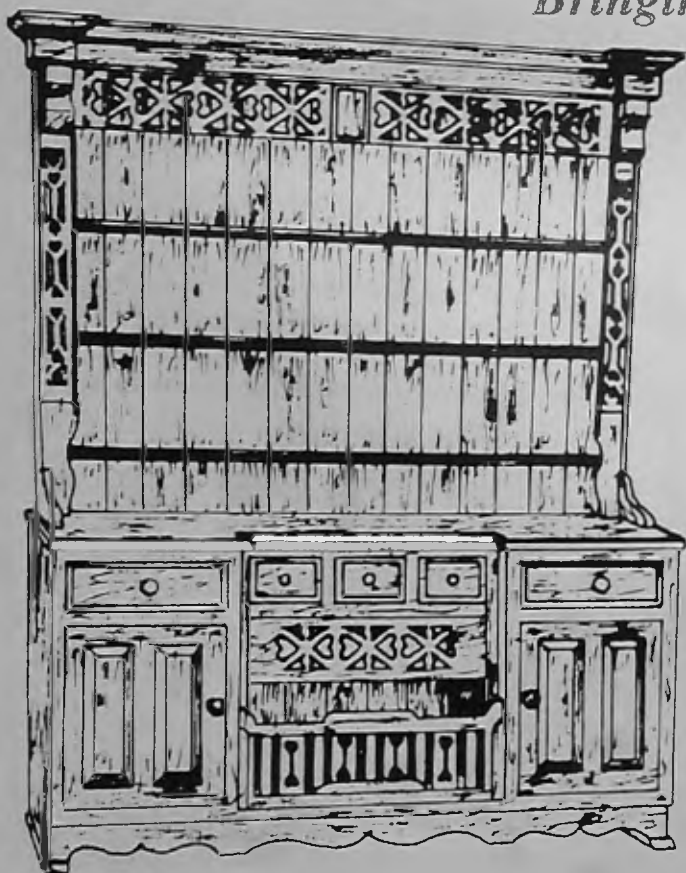
In fact, as Edward de Bono reported in his first book on lateral thinking, the younger the child the more unblinkered their thinking.

The projects involved children in making 'jack-in-the-box' toys without ever having seen one; powering boats made out of tin foil meat dishes; looking into the principles of flight, and making models.

As the children learned from experience and experiment, other benefits became apparent. Children having difficulty in reading and writing were able to join in on an

equal footing.

Gaining confidence, they improved their communication skills; learned to work with other children, pooling knowledge and ability. And they learned a wider use of language to express their ideas.

Without realising it they were using mathematics and principles of science and acquiring skills.

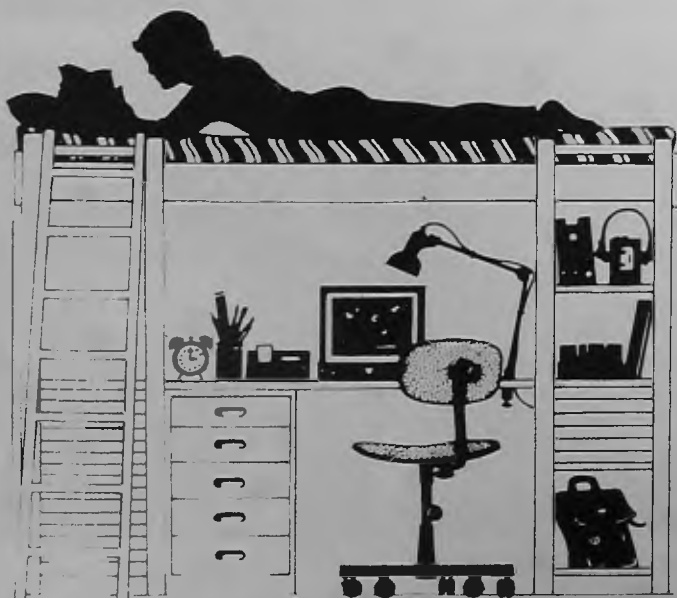

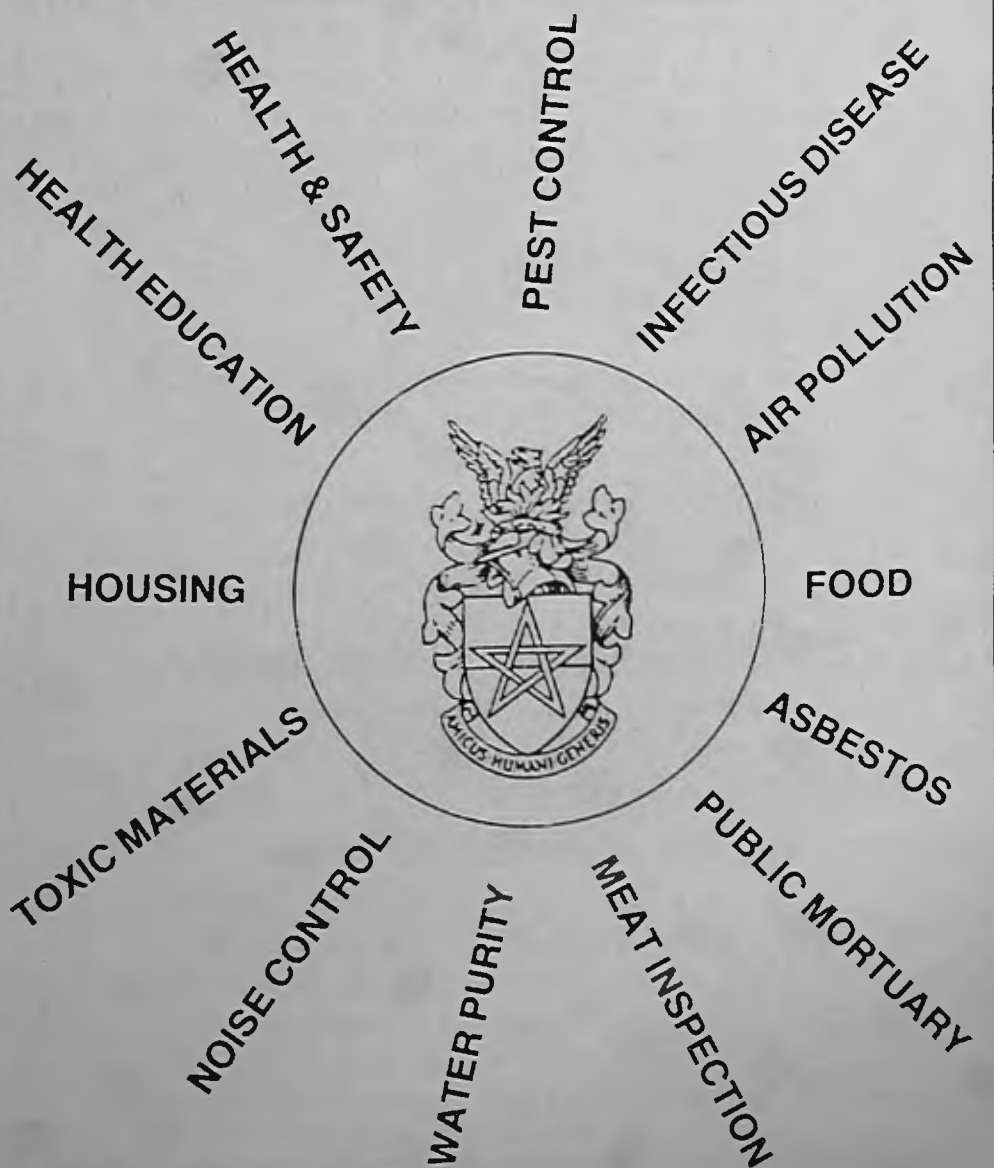
Perhaps you should consider a career as an Environmental Health Officer, which offers a wide range of professional experience. Whereas doctors, dentists and nurses care for your personal health, an Environmental Health Officer is responsible for many aspects of the environment which may affect your health as well. Among the areas that Environmental Health Officers will concern themselves with, the air you breathe, the water you drink or swim in, the safety of your workplace and your home — it can even include noise levels which you may find upsetting.

There are a variety of organisations with similar aims that specialise in various aspects of the work and the Environmental Health Officer will work with them all, in a spirit of coordination and cooperation. As a field worker the Environmental Health Officer is out of the office a great deal of the time, dealing with people and their problems. The

Environmental Health Officer will rely upon their scientific and technical background to decide on the best action to correct these problems. Most of an Environmental Health Officer's activities are supported by legislation but they prefer to persuade people to cooperate by using rational argument and common sense.

As you might imagine, such a responsible job requires extensive training. The student is sent to complete a BSc Honours Degree in Environment Health. This is one of the few degrees where you are required to work in the Environmental Health Department in order to gain practical experience outside of term time. Normal arrangements are made regarding salary, leave, etc. The minimum entry requirements are 5 GCE's (which must include English, mathematics, biology and one other science) and 2 A levels (including one natural science).

THE LOCAL Ombudsmen in England are independent people who investigate complaints against local authorities, and water authorities. There is no charge for the service and investigations are private.

The Ombudsman cannot question what an authority has done just because someone does not agree with it. There must be a complaint that something went wrong and

caused injustice to the complainant.

How to complain

If you feel you have been unjustly treated by something a council has done — or not done:

- First contact the council and

ask them to do something about it.

- If you are still not satisfied, ask a councillor to take up your complaint.
- If that does not settle the matter, put your complaint in writing and ask a councillor to send it to the Local Ombudsman.

He cannot normally consider a complaint unless it is sent through a councillor. But if a councillor does not send your complaint on in a reasonable time, you can send it direct.

Complaints can be made about most Council activities.

How to investigate

The investigation is thorough and the Ombudsman has power to examine files and interview anyone concerned. At the end a report is issued which will not usually mention people's names. If he finds that you have been unjustly treated the Authority have to tell the Local Ombudsman what they are going to do about it. In most cases the Authority remedy the grievance.

Helping the woodlands to flourish

IN A DARK wood no birds sing. Wild flowers cannot bloom, the pollinating insects find other pastures. In an open woodland the wild life returns, there is sunlight, the young trees can grow to maturity and future generations will enjoy a mature woodland.

In Cherry Tree Woods, East Finchley, 14 new wild flower species have established themselves following the first section of woodland management which has been carried out by Barnet Council.

Members of Barnet Council's Development and Estates Committee visited the woods on Tuesday, August 12, as part of their tour of local parks and amenities, with Max Caller, controller of engineering services, as their guide.

The planned woodland management scheme at Cherry Tree Woods caused strong local concern, but as Max Caller explained, the work is being carried out in small sections so that the overall character of the woods will not change drastically in one season.

'When we undertake woodland management we are working for future generations,' Max Caller, said.

'But we have to remember that people want to enjoy the woodlands today as well as in 50 years time. So we work on small sections with a five to eight year programme on each.'

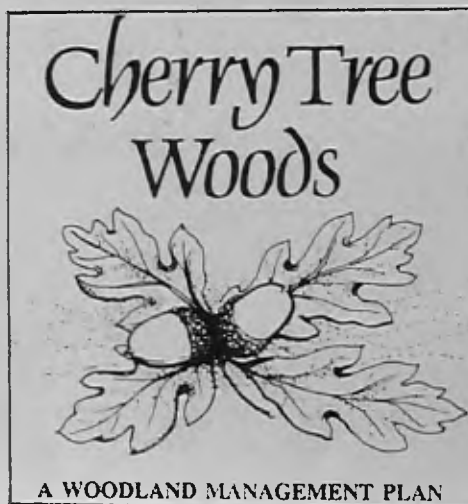
At Cherry Tree Woods the total woodland area has been divided into four so that altogether there is a 30-year woodland management programme underway.

So that the councillors could evaluate the work the first section was subdivided into two halves and it was the first of these that the councillors inspected.

All the hornbeams have been

coppiced and a small number of the weaker mature oaks felled, but already new coppiced growth is springing up from old tree trunks. This will be encouraged to bush out forming a natural protective en-

vironment for blackbirds and others who enjoy a shrubby habitat.

The trunks have been cut into logs and wired up. They will be allowed to rot down, again providing a habitat for small woodland mammals and insects. The larger trunks make pleasant picnic seats.

In the open areas the grass has grown, and round the old stumps of trees and in the heath, wild flowers have established themselves — wil-

low herb, nightshade, and vetches.

Before work began the mature oaks were retarding the growth of young trees and the numerous hornbeams were preventing young trees from establishing themselves.

Now new young trees are being planted among the remaining mature oaks and the long term effect will be a vital woodland which will serve the people of the borough for many generations to come.

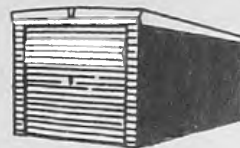

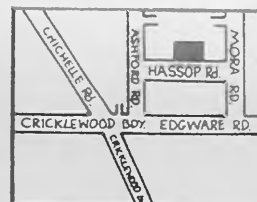

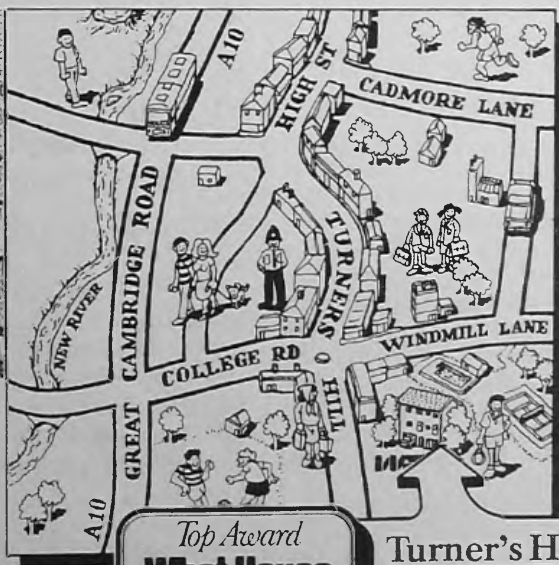

Striking right chord for understanding

OUR article about Raji Rasiah and her desire to set up multi-cultural links throughout the borough struck a chord with Mohana Lakshimipathy who plays classical Indian music.

Mohana, pictured right, who has lived in the borough since 1969, is as anxious as Raji to make contact with people of various cultural backgrounds in order to introduce them to the beauty of her music.

She plays the veena, a seven-stringed instrument which is one of the three main musical instruments in India, the others being the sitar and sarangi.

It can safely be regarded as the purest and most ancient of the three, apparently.

Early influence of music at home and the musical atmosphere in Mysore enabled Mohana, who lives at 4 Cumbrian Gardens, Cricklewood, to absorb the finer aspects of Indian classical music before moving on to college and then the concert platform all over the world.

She is particularly interested in playing and talking about Indian music to children and would like to hear from schools or old people's residences who may like to hear one of her lecture-demonstrations.



The artist has appeared at several music festivals and is connected with the UK University Circuit for Indian Classical Music who have arranged a tour by four eminent music scholars around the UK next month.

They are Prof R Visweswaran, veena and voice, Dr Prapancham Sitaram, flute, Prof Anoor S Ramakrishna, violin, and Mr Vidwan R A Rajagopal, mridangam and ghatam.

All are exponents of the Karnatic (South Indian) classical tradition and they will be giving a programme of concerts, lecture-recitals and

workshops in British education establishments and arts centres in October and November.

The UK University Circuit for Indian Classical Music is a voluntary body set up in 1982 to promote a deeper understanding and wider appreciation of the medium.
