- General District Rate. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the seal of the Council was affixed to a General District Rate of 1/8 in the £, to be levied over the Parishes of Chipping Barnet, South Mims Urban, Hadley and Arkley, for the half-ycar ending 30th day of September, 1914: and also to a General District Rate of 9d. in the £, to be levied over the Parish of Totteridge for the year ending 31st March, 1915, to be collected in two equal half-yearly instalments, each of  $4\frac{1}{2}d$ . in the £, the first instalment being due on the 2nd April, 1914, and the second instalment being due on the 1st October, 1914.
- Seal. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by the Chairman, it was resolved—" That an additional lock be purchased for the Council's Common Seal, in order that one key may remain in the custody of the Clerk and the other in the possession of the Chairman of the Council for the time being."

Electric Lighting. The Council considered Mr. Poole's report consequent upon his visit to the Board of Trade in connection with this matter as instructed on the 20th ulto. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. - Chairman. A letter was read from Cr. Malins regretting his inability to be present owing to illness. On the motion of Cr. Mainland, seconded by Cr. Pearson, Cr. Hackforth-Jones was unanimously voted to the Chair.
- Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Minutes of the Meetings of the 17th and 20th March and the 2nd April, were taken as read and signed.
- Road Repairing and Lighting. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Eames, the Report of this Committee dated the 17th March, was taken as read and adopted.
- General Purposes. Housing of the Working Classes. Cr. Mainland moved— "That the Report of the General Purposes Committee dated the 2nd April, be taken as read and adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Jennings, Cr. Eames moved the following amendment-" That the Report of the Committee be taken as read and adopted, subject to the deletion of the seventh paragraph at p. 2 of the minutes headed 'Housing of the Working Classes.'" The amendment was seconded by Cr. Aldridge, and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge, Eames, Mainland and Tinsley; *Against*: Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman, Hackforth-Jones, Jennings, Lamb, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams and Wills. The motion for the adoption of the Report was then put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman, Jennings, Lamb, Pearson, Sheppard, Williams and Wills; Against: Cr. Eames.
- Wood Street Paving. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Jennings, the Seal of the Council was affixed to a mortgage with the London County and Westminster Bank, Ltd., for the advance of £1,650 repayable within 5 years with interest at  $3\frac{7}{8}$  % in respect of the repaving of Wood Street.
- Barnet Gas Co. The Reports and Statements of Account of this Company for the year ended 31st December, 1913, were submitted and laid on the table.

Motor Fire Engine. A letter dated the 23rd March was read from Messrs. Dennis Bros., stating that they would notify the Council when the body of the Fire Engine could be inspected before being painted.

A letter dated the 26th ulto. was read from the Local Government Board sanctioning the borrowing of a sum of £945 for the purchase of a motor fire engine and appliances, the amount to be repaid, with interest, within a period not exceeding 10 years from the date of borrowing.

- Totteridge. Compensation to Officers. A letter dated the 24th ulto. was read from the County Council stating that any compensation due to Mr. Bennett would be payable by this Urban Authority.
- Legal Charges. Mr. Poole submitted particulars of his account of legal charges and expenses, to March 31st, 1914, and it was resolved—"That the account be sent for taxation in the usual course."
- Farm Sales. A letter dated the 31st ulto. was read from Messrs. Baker, Cooke and Standen applying for permission to conduct the Farm Sales for the ensuing 12 months. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—"That the Farm Sales be entrusted to the firm named for the period mentioned."
- Housing of the Working Classes. Mr. H. P. Eames notified the Council in a letter dated the 1st April that he had prepared a suggested scheme for the development of the Housing Estate as instructed by the Council on the 17th ulto. On the motion of Cr. Mainland, duly seconded, the letter was referred to the Housing of the Working Classes Committee for consideration and report.
- Town Planning. A letter dated the 3rd inst. was read from the Local Government Board stating that before deciding upon the Council's application for leave to prepare a Town Planning Scheme, the Board would hold a Local Inquiry on the subject, and they requested to be furnished with the names of the persons or bodies who received notices under Articles II. and III. The Clerk explained that these particulars would be supplied in due course.

A letter on this subject from the Institution of Municipal & County Engineers was submitted and the consideration thereof deferred until the Annual Meeting.

Meetings. Offices. Cr. Wills moved in accordance with notice given: "That urgency be granted to reconsider the Council's resolution of the 16th December, 1913 (pp. 310 and 311), with regard to meetings of the Council subsequent to March 31st, 1914." The motion was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie and carried, *nem. con*.

Cr. Wills then moved further in accordance with notice given, namely: "That the Annual Meeting of the Council on Tuesday, April 21st, 1914, be held at the Council's Offices instead of at the Church House, Wood Street." The motion was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Jennings, Lamb, Mainland, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas and Wills; Against: Cr. Williams.

- Kerbing. Housing of the Working Classes. On the the motion of Cr. Mainland, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—" That the Surveyor be instructed to obtain a sufficient quantity of the old kerbing from Wood Street for use at the pathway opposite the Council's Cottages in Totteridge Lane, subject to the leave of the County Council."
- Wood Street Paving. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie it was resolved, *nem. con.*—"That permission be accorded to Mr. Adams to continue the work of repaving Wood Street, on Good Friday."
- **Chairman.** On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, a unanimous vote of sympathy was accorded to Cr. Malins in his illness, coupled with an expression of the Council's appreciation of the very valuable services rendered by him as Chairman during his past two and a half years of office.
- **Councillors.** On the like motion an expression of regret was passed with regard to the loss of the services, through their retirement from the Council, of Crs. Lamb and Mainland.

- Surveyor. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. - Electric Lighting. The Clerk read his letter to the County Council following the Meeting of the 2nd inst., together with Sir Charles Longmore's reply thereto. Cr. Mainland, seconded by Cr. Pearson, then moved urgency to rescind the resolution relating to this matter passed on the 2nd inst. This having been agreed to, *nem. con.*, Cr. Mainland moved : "That a letter be written to Sir Charles Longmore stating that if an offer of £2,000 be made to this Authority for the purchase of the rights referred to, the Council would be prepared to consider such offer, subject to their statutory powers in the matter." The motion was seconded by Cr. Jennings, and carried, all the Councillors present voting in favour with the exception of Cr. Thomas who voted against, and the Chairman who abstained from voting.
- Wood Street Paving. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was unanimously resolved—" That instructions be given to the Surveyor to have all the kerbs at crossings in the new paving in Wood Street constructed in a more rounded form in order to facilitate the passage of traffic into the main road."

A letter dated the 13th inst. was read from Second Officer Webb resigning his position as a member of the Fire Brigade as from the 30th inst., owing to removal from the district, and asking for a reference in respect of his past services. Enderby and Stoney Stanton Granite @ 11/6 per ton, subject to the maximum weekly delivery being 300 tons."

- Isolation Hospital. Smallpox. The Clerk reported with reference to this matter as referred to him by the General Purposes Committee, that it appeared to the County Council that the Hospital Committee should provide accommodation for smallpox cases. On the motion of Cr. Jennings, seconded by Cr. Chapman, the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated the 11th instant, was taken as read and adopted, subject to the insertion therein of the acceptance of Mr. Pedder's tender at 9d. per ton for cartage in connection with the making up of the roadway in Wood Street.

- Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Minutes of the Meeting of the 16th June, were taken as read and signed.
- Hoardings. The Clerk reported at length in reply to a question by Cr. Aldridge upon the position of this matter up to the present date.

Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Jennings, the Report of this Committee dated the 25th June, 1914, was taken as read and adopted.

General Purposes. The Chairman moved—" That the Report of this Committee dated the 25th instant, be taken as read and adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Pearson, Cr. Williams moved the following amendment— "That the Report be adopted subject to the dates of the next meetings being altered to read

> Farm, General Purposes and Finance Committees July 16th. Council Meeting ... ... July 21st."

This was seconded by Cr. Boulton but not carried, after which the motion was put and carried, *nem. con*.

Finance.—On the motion of Cr. Malins seconded by Cr. Jennings the Report of this Committee dated the 25th instant, was taken as read and adopted.

Town Planning. Arterial Roads. Cr. Eames moved—"That the Report of this Committee of even date, adopting the Reports of the Arterial Roads Sub-Committee of the 18th, 29th, and 30th insts., be taken as read and adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Jennings, Cr. Williams moved the following amendment—"That the last two lines of suggestion No. 2, of the Report of the Sub-Committee dated the 29th inst., be altered so as to read, "the opinion that the latter would involve less expense

than the former." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, and carried.

The Chairman drew the attention of the Council to p. 62 of the Minutes of the Council at a Meeting held on the 16th inst., at which a motion " that a deputation consisting of 3 members of the Council and the Surveyor be appointed to interview Col. Hellard on the subject of Arterial Roads" was not carried, and deprecated the action of the Sub-Committee in sending a deputation to Col. Hellard without the express authority of the Council.

It having been explained in reply that the attitude of the delegates was entirely non-committal, on the motion of Cr. Eames, duly seconded, the Report was thereupon adopted as amended.

- Motor Speed Limit. The Clerk presented his Report upon this Inquiry held by the Local Government Board's Inspector, R. C. Maxwell, Esq., on the 23rd instant.
- Roadman Day. As desired by the General Purposes Committee the Clerk reported upon the alleged refusal to admit this workman into the Barnet Victoria Cottage Hospital, as follows:—

"I have seen the Matron of the Victoria Cottage Hospital on this matter who states that Dr. Hughes rang up on the telephone on the day of the accident and said he had a case in the Police Station of a man with a broken ankle and enquired if accommodation were available. The Matron replied that there was only one vacant bed and that bed had been reserved by Dr. Stewart for a case of appendicitis for the following morning. Dr. Hughes thereupon sent the man to the Infirmary."

Meetings. Offices. Cr. Malins moved—" That the Clerk be instructed to endeavour to make arrangements for holding the Council Meetings at the Church House, for a further period of 6 months, as from the 29th September next." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Pearson, Cr. Wellsman moved the following amendment—" That the meetings of the Council be held at 40, High Street, after the date named." This was seconded by Cr. Eames and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Fern, Tinsley, Eames and Wellsman; *Against*: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Boulton, Chapman, Dunch, Jennings, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Thomas, Williams, Wills and the Chairman. The motion was then put and carried, *nem. con*.

- Fire Brigade. Cr. Pearson, by permission of the Council, stated that the Captain of the Fire Brigade proposed to take his usual annual holiday from the 17th to the 31st July, to which arrangement no objection was offered.
- Town Planning (Continental). Totteridge. A circular letter, dated the 20th instant, was read from the National Housing and Town Planning Council on this matter, but no action was taken thereon.

A letter dated the 22nd instant addressed to Cr. Mackay, was read from Mr. A. G. Scott with reference to the inclusion of the Totteridge Golf Links in the Council's Town Planning Scheme, and stating that the matter had been referred to Mr. S. T. Kelmo, of 6, Clements Inn, Strand.

Cr. Mackay having replied to the communication on the 23rd inst., no further action was taken in the matter.

- Children. Country Holidays. A circular letter dated the 25th June was submitted from the Local Government Board and referred to the Medical Officer of Health and Sanitary Inspector.
- Fire Station. Repairs. A letter dated the 19th June was read from Mr. W. Slough stating that he was prepared to carry out the repairs at the Fire Station at his price of £26 10s. 0d. according to the original specification, but subject to the Surveyor giving his certificate as soon as the work should be completed.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved —"That advertisements be again inserted inviting tenders for carrying out the work on the Surveyor's amended specification."

Meetings. Agenda. Cr. Williams moved in accordance with notice given-" That on all copies of Agenda for future ordinary Council Meetings there shall be

printed at the end thereof the words, 'And any other business not requiring previous notice.'" This was seconded for purposes of discussion by Cr. Aldridge, but was ultimately by leave of the Council withdrawn.

Workmen. Wages. Cr. Aldridge moved in accordance with notice given—"That the Wages Committee be re-appointed." The motion, however, was ruled out of order by the Chairman, in view of the resolution of the Council under "Workmen," at p. 62, and the recommendation now adopted of the General Purposes Committee under "Dustmen, Wages," at p. 72.

Cr. Aldridge then further moved in accordance with notice given—" That the Surveyor be instructed to obtain all the information possible from the surrounding Councils as to wages paid to dustmen, etc." The motion was seconded by Cr. Jennings and carried, *nem. con*.

### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

Barnet Common Estate. The Surveyor submitted a Report stating that he had inspected the houses now in course of erection in King's Road on the Barnet Common Estate, and considered the necessity of the laying of a foul sewer. He added that taking into consideration the fact that sewage is at present discharged into the ditch between King's Road and the Laundry adjoining Queen's Road, and that a nuisance already exists through such discharge, he was of opinion that no other connections should be made to the present sewer until it is linked up with the sewerage system, and that a new sewer is necessary, which should be laid through the land shewn on the plan between the points marked A to E.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Wellsman, it was resolved—"That following upon and in accordance with the terms of such Report, the Clerk be instructed to serve the necessary notices under section 16 of the Public Health Act, 1875."

Elm Road Passage. The Clerk submitted his Report on this matter (p. 67). On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was resolved, *nem con*. —" That no action be taken in the matter."

### Thursday, 13th August, 1914.

At a Special MEETING of the COUNCIL (in Committee) duly convened and held at 40, High Street, Barnet, on the above date at 8 p.m., there were present

There were also in attendance, by the invitation of the Chairman, The Rev. W. Manning (Rector of Chipping Barnet), The Rev. J. T. Wrenford (Vicar of Arkley), and The Rev. E. A. Smith (Vicar of Totteridge).

War. Distress. Letters addressed to the Chairman were read from the Lord Lieutenant of the County of Hertford and the Clerk of the Peace asking for the appointment of a Committee in the Urban District of Barnet to assist in the collection of funds for relieving distress among the Wives and Families of those who are called up on active service in connection with the present War and recommending that administration of relief should be made through the Soldiers' and Sailors' Families Association, the local Secretary for which is County Alderman J. L. Pank, D.L., J.P.

On the motion of Cr. Wellsman, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was unanimously resolved—"That this Council constitutes itself as a whole, a Com-mittee to associate itself with a representative body of Town and District people to constitute and organise a Working Committee to collect necessary Relief funds and distribute them.'

A letter dated August 12th was read from Mrs. Furnival Jones, offering to place the services of the Social Service Committee of the Barnet Adult Schools at the disposal of the Council in connection with the administration of the Prince of Wales's Relief Fund. The Clerk was requested to convey the thanks of the Council to the writer.

Special Constables. A letter dated August 10th was read from the Clerk of the Peace enclosing copy of a communication he had received from the Chief Staff Officer of the Special Constabulary, Metropolitan area, asking the Council to assist in obtaining suitable men for employment as Special Constables.

The Clerk reported that he had seen Inspector Grace of the "S" Division of Metropolitan Police who had informed him that the enrolment of Special Constables was already in progress within the District and the call was being satisfactorily responded to. There was therefore no urgent need for the Council to take action immediately.

Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the Minutes of the Meeting of the 28th July, 1914, were taken as read and signed.

- On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Minutes of the meeting of the 13th August were also taken as read and signed.
- **Councillors.** A letter was read from Cr. Lt.-Col. Oscar E. Boulton explaining his absence from Council and Committee Meetings owing to service with the City of London Yeomanry (Roughriders). On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Mackay, it was unanimously resolved—"That a letter be sent to Lt.-Col. Oscar E. Boulton congratulating him upon service for his country and expressing the honour experienced by this Authority in being so represented."
- Farm. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Wills, the Report of this Committee dated the 27th ulto., was taken as read and adopted.
- General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Wills, duly seconded, the Report of this Committee dated the 27th ulto., was taken as read and adopted (nem. con.), there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Mackay, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Tinsley and Williams.
- Finance. Rate Estimate. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated the 27th August, be taken as read and adopted, with the exception of the final paragraph headed 'Rate Estimate' at p. 112," there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Mackay, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams, and Wills. Cr Pearson moved—"That, in accordance with the recommendation of the Committee, a rate of 1/4 in the £ be made and levied throughout the District (with the exception of the Parish of Totteridge) for the half-year ending 31st March, 1915." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Eames, Cr. Williams moved the following amendment—"That a rate of 1/6 in the £ be made and levied over the

district and for the period named." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Tinsley, but not carried, there voting For: Crs. Fern, Malins, Tinsley, and Williams; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Wellsman, and Wills. Cr. Malins then moved as an amendment—" That such rate be 1/5 in the £." This was seconded by Cr. Tinsley, but not carried, there voting For: Crs. Fern, Malins, Thomas, Tinsley, and Williams; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman, Eames, Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Sheppard, Wellsman, and Wills. The motion was then put and carried, nem. con., there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Sheppard, Wellsman, and Wills.

Housing of the Working Classes. The Clerk reported that on the 26th ulto. Mr. Courtenay Clifton, an Inspector of the Local Government Board, held an Inquiry into the Council's application for sanction to borrow the sum of £8,000 for the erection of further dwellings on the Housing Estate.

A circular letter dated the 21st ulto. was read from the Local Government Board enclosing a copy of the Housing (No 2) Act of this Session, upon which the Board submitted explanatory notes.

- Byng Road. Wentworth Road. A letter dated the 21st ulto. was read from the Local Government Board enclosing their formal sanction to the borrowing of the sum of £1,033 for making up these roads under the Private Street Works Act, 1892. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the seal of the Council was affixed to the mortgage with the London County and Westminster Bank, Ltd., for securing the repayment of this sum with interest at  $3\frac{2}{5}$  % per annum.
- Fire Brigade. Reports were read from the Captain of the Fire Brigade in respect of Fires at Totteridge on the the 27th ulto. and at Galley Lane on the 1st instant. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, a cheque for £8 3s. 2d. was drawn in payment of the Brigade's expenses on the former date. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Thomas, a cheque for £3 1s. 6d. was drawn in respect of the Galley Lane Fire, and directions given for an account to be sent in for payment.

Fire Station. Coal. Tenders were received for supplying coal to the Fire Station

- for the ensuing year. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the tender of Messrs. Charrington, Sells, Dale & Co. be accepted for supplying Best Kitchener Cobbles at £1 0s. 9d. per ton and Best Anthracite Nuts at £1 6s. 8d. per ton."
- Classification of Roads. Census. A letter dated the 6th ulto. was read from the Road Board stating that in view of the present position it was considered desirable that this work should be postponed.
- Horticulture. A circular was read from the Board of Agriculture on this subject and was handed to the representative of the Press.
- Arterial Roads. A letter on this subject dated the 15th ulto. from Mr. T. Adams was read, together with the Clerk's reply.
- War Distress. A letter dated the 15th ulto. was read from the Clerk of the County Council stating that the local Distress Committee would generally have to take over the relief of the District, and establishment charges could be defrayed out of the moneys collected. The contents of this communication had been conveyed to the Secretary of the Local Committee, but the further consideration of the matter was adjourned, as it was understood that the establishment charges referred to could, if necessary, be paid out of local rates.
- Shop Assistants. A circular letter dated the 20th August was read from the Home Office stating that a conference of leading London retail traders had unanimously resolved that it was neither desirable nor necessary in existing circumstances to dismiss any assistants, but that if economies in the carrying on of business be necessary, they should be met by other means.

- Officers. A memorandum was read from the Local Government Board, stating they considered local Authorities might properly grant leave of absence to officers in their employ who are already in His Majesty's forces, or who join them with their permission, and might properly make such allowances in respect of salary as they think reasonable in the particular circumstances.
- Smallpox. A circular letter having been received from the Local Government Board, directing the attention of local Authorities to the importance of prompt and adequate arrangements for dealing with any cases of smallpox, the Chairman stated that, if necessary, after conferring with the Medical Officer of Health, he would call a special meeting to deal with the matter.
- Insurance. A letter of even date was read from the Law Accident Insurance Society stating that from the Wages Declaration Form of the Council, it appeared that an Excess Premium of £8 12s. 5d. was due in respect of this Authority's Employer's Liability Policy. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, duly seconded, a cheque was drawn for the amount named.

### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- **Depot.** The Surveyor stated that having regard to exisiting circumstances of labour, he had prepared a specification for painting at the Depôt (as recommended by the General Purposes Committee) and had invited tenders locally, six of which were submitted. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—"That the tender of Messrs J. Baughen & Son at £16, being the lowest, be accepted, subject to the local rate of wages being paid." On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Wellsman, it was resolved—"That should these terms not be accepted by that firm, the Clerk and Surveyor be instructed to accept the next lowest tender."
- Housing of the Working Classes. Cr. Pearson moved, and Cr. Malins seconded, "That the report of this Committee dated the 27th ulto. be taking as read and adopted."

The Clerk having reported the result of enquiries with reference to the tender of Mr. Thomas Carr, referred to in the Report, Cr. Williams moved the following amendment—" That the tender of Mr. G. Wilding of Mays Lane, amounting to £70 10s. 0d. be accepted." This was seconded by Cr. Wellsman, and on being put was not carried, Cr. Tinsley alone voting for the amendment. Cr. Eames then moved the following amendment—" That the tender of Messrs. Pearson & Son at £83 15s. 0d. be accepted." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Williams, and was carried (*nem. con.*), there voting For : Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Mackay, Malins, Sheppard, Wellsman and Williams. On the motion of Cr. Tinsley, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That no workmen engaged on this contract be allowed to work more than 10 hours per day, or 56 hours per week."

- Fire Brigade. Totteridge Hydrants. Cr. Pearson moved—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee dated the 31st ulto., under the heading of 'Totteridge, Hydrants,' be taken as read and adopted. The motion was seconded by Cr. Williams. A letter of the 31st ulto. having been read from the Barnet District Gas & Water Co. with reference to the size of the mains at Totteridge, Cr. Thomas moved as an amendment—" That the matter be adjourned for further information as to the diameter of the mains referred to." This was seconded by Cr. Fern, and carried (*nem. con.*), there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Dunch, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Wellsman, Williams and Wills.
- Motor Fire Engine. A telegram was read from Messrs. Dennis Bros. quoting their price for reinstating the Motor Fire Engine, as referred to in the Report of the Fire Brigade & Water Supply Committee dated the 31st ulto. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved, *ncm. con.*— "That the 4th paragraph of the Committee's Report under the heading 'Motor Fire Engine,' be taken as read and adopted, but that no further action be taken with regard to the telegram until the expert Engineer's report is to hand," there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Tinsley and Wills.

Minutes. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Minutes of the Meeting of the 1st September, were taken as read and signed.

Infectious Diseases. The Medical Officer of Health presented a Report in connection with a circular letter dated August 28th from the Local Government Board dealing with this subject.

On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That Chicken Pox be a notifiable disease within the District, and that Medical Practitioners be requested to notify the Medical Officer of Health immediately by telephone of all doubtful cases."

A letter dated September 14th was read from the Clerk of the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee enclosing copy of a communication addressed by that body to the County Council on the subject of provision for isolating cases of Small Pox.

Housing of the Working Classes. Cr. Pearson moved and Cr. Malins seconded that the Report of this Committee dated September 10th, be taken as read and adopted. Cr. Williams moved as an amendment-" That the paragraph in the Report headed ' Road ' be referred back to the Committee, with a view to the work being carried out by direct labour under the supervision of the Council's Surveyor."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Aldridge and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, and Williams; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Jennings, Mackay, Pearson, and Tinsley.



- Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated the 15th instant, was taken as read and adopted.
- On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, General Purposes. Workmen. the Report of the General Purposes Committee dated the 15th October, was taken as read and adopted, with the exception of the first recommendation under the heading of "Workmen" at p. 130.
- Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. letter of the 13th instant to the effect that having received no references as requested, the Council's provisional acceptance of his tender is cancelled."

The motion was seconded by Cr. Ball, and carried *nem. con.*, there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Fern, Jennings, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Thomas, Wills and the Chairman.

Fire Brigade. Motor Fire Engine. Fire Station. Repairs. Uniforms. Cr. Chapman moved—" That application be made to the owners for a renewal of the tenancy of 40, High Street, for a further period of 3 months from March 25th, 1915, and in the event of consent not being obtained, the premises be vacated at that date." The motion was seconded by Cr. Fern, and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Chapman, Fern and Wills; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Dunch, Jennings, Mackay, Malins and Williams.

On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Jennings, it was resolved—"That the tenancy of the premises be renewed for a period of 12 months from March 25th, 1915, in accordance with the terms of the existing agreement," there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Dunch, Jennings, Mackay, Malins, Thomas and Williams; *Against*: Crs. Chapman, Eames, Fern and Wills.

A letter addressed to the Chairman was read from Mr. E. H. Jukes asking for permission to use a portion of the premises at 40, High Street, as an orderly room and headquarters. It having been stated that such user would not be allowed to interfere with Meetings arranged by the Council, on the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Jennings, it was unanimously resolved—" That the permission asked for be granted."

Wood Street Paving. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Jennings, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—"That a cheque for £1,097 14s. 2d. be drawn in favour of the London County & Westminster Bank, Ltd., in part repayment of the above loan, such sum having been received from the Herts County Council as their contribution towards the cost of the works under an agreement dated 20th December, 1913, and representing two-thirds of the capital sum expended."

**Tuberculosis** Dispensary. A circular letter was read from the Corporation of London stating that a Dispensary had been established at St. Bartholomew's Hospital, West Smithfield, for treatment of cases of any form of Tuberculosis, the Dispensary being available for bonå fide workers in the City, no charge being made to patients and no contributions being asked for from Local Authorities.

On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Fern, it was resolved— "That the Editor of the 'Barnet Press' be asked to give publicity to the communication, and also that other steps be taken to advertise its contents."

- Motor Omnibus Traffic. A letter, dated December 4th, was read from the Hon. Secretary of the Guildhall Conference on this subject, enclosing a statement of the work done with a cheque for £1 11s. 3d. representing a proportion of the Council's original contribution towards the expenses.
- War. Literature. A letter, dated December 11th, was read from the Naval Store Officer at Portsmouth Dockyard, acknowledging with thanks the further contribution of a parcel of books for the Fleet.
- Arterial Roads. Classification. A letter, dated December 16th, from the County Surveyor asking for further statistics and particulars in this matter was left in the hands of the Surveyor to be dealt with.
- Councillors. Members of Local Authorities on Service. A circular letter, dated December 23rd, was read from the Local Government Board drawing attention to the provisions of the Local Authorities (Disqualification Relief) Act, 1914, which extends during the present War the Relief from disqualification for office granted by the Act of 1900 to all members of His Majesty's Forces employed on naval or military service.

### January 5th, 1915.

- **Troops. Billeting.** Cr. Williams then moved in accordance with notice given— "That the Council make application to the War Office for the billeting of another Battalion of troops in the town." The motion was seconded by Cr. Jennings, and carried unanimously.

Electricity Supply. Electric Lighting. Letters were read from the London County Council, the Hammersmith Borough Council, the Hertfordshire County Council and the Clerk of the Rickmansworth Urban District Council with regard to the London and District Electricity Supply Bill in Parliament during Session 1915.

The Clerk having submitted and read an exhaustive Report on the whole matter, Cr. Fern moved—" That Mr. Poole's Report be adopted and that the Bill be opposed by this Authority; if possible in conjunction with the Hertfordshire County Council." The motion was seconded by Cr. Wills and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Hackforth-Jones, Jennings, Mackay, Malins, Williams, and Wills. *Against*: Cr. Thomas. On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was further resolved—" That the Hammersmith Borough Council and the Rickmansworth Urban District Council be informed of the steps taken by this Authority."

Minutes. Quorum. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Minutes of the Meeting of the 5th January, 1915, were taken as read and signed. A Report was also submitted of a meeting convened for the 12th January, 1915, at which there was no quorum.

A letter was read from the Local Government Board stating that the Board had no jurisdiction to direct any reduction of the quorum prescribed by statute in respect of the meetings of this Authority.

- Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Jennings, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th January, 1915, was taken as read and adopted.
- General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved (*nem. con.*)—" That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated 28th January, 1915, be taken as read and adopted."
- Sanitary Inspector. The Chairman stated, with reference to the report of the General Purposes Committee under this head, that Mr. C. W. Hill had been gazetted as a 2nd Lieutenant in the 7th Battalion (Duke of Cambridge's Own) Middlesex Regiment as from the 3rd instant.
- Workmen. With regard to the paragraph under this heading at p. 185 of the General Purposes Committee Report, the Surveyor stated that J. Poulton was receiving 13/4 weekly through the Insurance Company and 5/- per week from his Slate Club. Cr. Williams moved "That during the continuance of this employee's disablement, the Council pay him a sum of 10/- weekly." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, Cr. - Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Chapman, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th ultimo, was taken as read and adopted, with the exception of the paragraph headed "Fireman," which was subsequently taken in Committee. There voted for the motion, Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Dunch, Jennings, Chapman, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams, and Wills; Against : Cr. Fern.
- Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Malins, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th ulto., was taken as read and adopted, *nem. con*.
- Electricity Supply. Electric Lighting. With reference to the Council's previous resolution to oppose the London and District Electricity Supply Bill in Parliament, if possible in conjunction with the Herts County Council, the Clerk reported that he attended before a Parliamentary Committee of the County Authority at the Holborn Borough Council Offices on the 15th ultimo, when the Boroughs and Urban and Rural Districts of the County were largely represented. The opposition to the Bill was unanimous, and each separate local Authority will be requested by the County Council to seal their own Petition embodying particularly facts relating to individual districts. The Petition for sealing not yet being to hand, on the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved---" That authority be given to the Chairman to affix the seal of the Council to the Petition in opposition to the Bill." There voted For the motion Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Jennings, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Williams, and Wills; Against: Cr. Thomas.
- New Offices. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was

- resolved—"That the seal of the Council be affixed to the Mortgage for £4,000 with the London County & Westminster Bank, Ltd., in respect of the loan for New Offices," there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Jennings, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Williams, and Wills; Against: Crs. Eames, Fern, and Thomas.
- Troops. Billeting. Letters were read from the War Office and the Assistant Quartermaster-General, 3rd Army Central Force, stating that the Council's request for another Battalion to be billeted in the town had been duly noted.
- Volunteer Training Corps. A letter was read from this Corps thanking the Council for according them accommodation at 40, High Street.
- Arterial Roads. A letter dated the 28th ultimo was read from the Local Government Board stating that the Northern Section Sub-Committee had appointed an Inspection Committee to investigate on the ground the principal proposed routes in connection with Arterial Roads in Greater London, and the Committee had fixed the afternoons of February 8th and 9th for their inspections. The Chairman and Cr. Wills had previously been appointed as the Council's representatives to meet and confer with the Inspection Committee and the Chairman moved—" That should he be unable to be present, Cr. - Infectious Diseases. A circular letter was read from the Buntingford Rural District Council, enclosing copy resolution passed by them and forwarded to the Education Authority of the Herts County Council, relative to outbreaks of Scarlet Fever in their area. The Rural Council now asked if this Authority

would support them in the matter. On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, the letter was referred to the Barnet Urban Local Education Sub-Committee for attention.

- **Contracts.** A letter was read from the Local Government Board, with regard to the contract of Mr. Briers for supply of oats, stating that if, in the exceptional circumstances, the Council make any payment to Mr. Briers in excess of the sum due under the contract, the grounds for such action should be explained to the Auditor at the Audit, when the payment is before him, in order that he may judge of its reasonableness. The Clerk will communicate with the Auditor on the matter and report to the General Purposes Committee.
- Byelaws. Hoardings. A letter dated the 1st instant was read from the Home Office stating that it might be convenient to call and discuss with the Home Office the question of the Byelaws under the Advertisements Regulation Act. It was left to Cr. Thomas as Chairman of this Committee with the Clerk and Surveyor, to attend such conference.
- Eleanor Palmer's Charity. The Hon. Clerk to this Charity, under date of 1st February, reported that the four years term of office of Mr. H. W. Milnes and Mr. E. H. Neal, two of the Council's representative Trustees, would expire this month and a fresh appointment would have to be made. Cr. Pearson moved—" That the gentlemen named be re-appointed." Mackay moved in accordance with notice given—"That steps be taken by the Council to obtain the consent of two-thirds in number and value of the ratepayers in the street now known as Totteridge Lane, and leading from Barnet to Totteridge, for the alteration of such name to Barnet Lane under the provisions of the Public Health Act Amendment Act, 1907."

New Court House. Building Line. The Surveyor read a statement setting out the position under s. 3 of the Public Health (Buildings in Streets) Act, 1888, which was confirmed by the Solicitor, and the matter was considered at length by the Council.

The County Surveyor admitted that the District Council had power to decide whether the Building line should be on the North or South side of the proposed new building, but pressed this Authority to declare that for the purposes of the Court House the Building line should be governed by the buildings on the North side.

On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was resolved— "That the South side of the building site in relation to the shops on the South side of Normandy Avenue be considered the building line for the purposes of the proposed Court House." There voted *For*: Crs. Pearson, Thomas, Fern and Chapman; *Against*: Crs. Aldridge, Malins and Wills.

On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved— "That this Authority are prepared to give careful consideration to any proposal or suggestion which may emanate from the County Council in connection with such modification or alteration of the plans in question as the County may think advisable." - Normandy Avenue. A communication was read from Mr. E. H. Moore of Normandy Avenue asking for this street to be made up as far as the premises in his occupation. The letter was handed to the Surveyor for reply.
- Barnet Common Inclosure Award. The Chairman reported the attendance of himself and Cr. Eames upon Mr. Byfield in connection with the proposal that the Council should acquire this Copy Award which had also been offered to the Guardians of Barnet Union. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was unanimously resolved—" That no further action be taken in the matter."

### 16th February, 1915.

Elm Road Passage. The Surveyor reported he had carefully inspected this passage and that whatever were done in the way of repair it would be necessary to place a drain and gulley at the south end to take away the storm water. He estimated the drain would cost £10, while material and labour would increase the amount to some £25. Of this total, a sum of £10 5s. 0d. would be chargeable to the Governors of Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School, £8 6s. 9d. to Mr. J. E. Wynne, £4 to Messrs. Levy and Frank of the Red Lion Hotel and £2 6s. 6d. to Mr. Booth of 17, Elm Road. If the work be carried out as proposed it is not anticipated that any further expense would be incurred for a considerable time.

Fern moved as an amendment—"That the paragraph in the Report headed 'Fires, Special Constabulary,' be referred back to the Committee with full power to act." The amendment was seconded by Cr.   - Cr. Hackforth-Jones then moved as a further amendment—"That the paragraph in question be considered in Committee at the close of the ordinary business." The amendment was seconded by Cr. - 8 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved, nem. con.—" That the Report of this Committee, dated May 27th, be taken as read and adopted."
- 9 New Offices. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved, nem. con. —"That the London County & Westminster Bank be asked to make this advance of £4,000 on the same terms as the sum recently advanced to the Guardians of Barnet Union, viz.: by placing the amounts needed for expenses to the credit of the Council as they are required."

Pearson, it was resolved—" That they be forwarded to the Home Office for approval prior to being advertised after insertion in Part II. of a paragraph numbered (5) to be worded as follows: 'The view looking southward from Arkley Hotel to Barnet Gate.'"

Valley U.D.C., stating that for reasons given, they could not see their way to assent to the proposal for increased representation of the Barnet Urban District Council on the Barnet Joint Isolation Hospital Committee.

A letter, dated 9th June, was read from a Joint Committee of the County Councils of Hertford and Middlesex, stating that after careful consideration they had come to the conclusion that a *primâ facie* case had been made out for the increase in the number of Guardians for the Parish of Finchley from 8 to 12 and for the Parish of South Mimms Urban from 1 to 2, and asking for the Council's observations on the matter. As a reply had been requested by the 25th June, the Clerk after consultation with the Chairman, had informed the Joint Committee that the Council were in favour of the proposed increased representation for the Parish of South Mimms Urban. The action of the Chairman was approved by the Council.
- 13 Arts and Crafts. The Chairman and Cr. Fern reported upon a conference attended by them on behalf of this Authority, at the Mansion House, under the auspices of the National Guild for the Revival of Arts, Handicrafts and

Village Industries, from which it appeared that there was nothing of special interest requiring the attention of this Council.

- 14 Urban District Councils Association. A letter inviting delegates to attend a conference of local Authorities, in connection with the Urban District Councils Association, on the 16th instant, was handed to Cr. Fern for attendance if possible, on behalf of this Council.
- 15 French Relief Fund. The Clerk submitted a letter received on the 5th July, bearing date June, 1915, from the Hon. Secretary of the French Relief Fund suggesting the participation of this District in organising a French Flag Day on the 14th July, the net proceeds from which would be handed over to the Fund. Various methods of procedure were suggested in the communication, and on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That this Council constitute itself a Committee for carrying into effect the proposals named, Crs. Wills and Eames to be Chairman and Vice-Chairman thereof respectively."

At the close of the ordinary business of the Council, time being a matter of urgency, the Council as such Committee considered the propositions submitted, when, having regard to the details to be settled, on the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Eames, it was decided to elect a small Committee with power to act, for organising the district on the day named. The Committee appointed consists of Crs. Abercrombie, Eames, Graddon, Malins, Pearson and Wills; Cr. Eames to act as convener. The Committee arranged to meet on the following evening (Wednesday, July 7th), at 7.30 p.m. at the Council Offices. In the meantime Cr. Malins, would endeavour to arrange with Miss Tudor for the services of the ladies connected with Hospital Saturday in connection with the proposed street collection. Cr. Wills undertook to communicate at once with the Secretary of the Fund and obtain a supply of his circular letter for the guidance of those concerned.

### 6th July, 1915.

- 16 Arkley Rifle Club. A letter was read from the Assistant Secretary of the Committee of this Club inviting assistance from the Council in maintaining the work of the Club. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the matter was referred to the General Purposes Committee for consideration and report.
- 17 Whelm Laundry. With reference to this matter, referred to in the adopted Report of the Highways Committee at p. 276, dated 1st July, Cr. Williams was elected Chairman of the Sub-Committee.
- 18 New Offices. Furnishing Sub-Committee. This Sub-Committee elected Cr. Pearson as their Chairman.

### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- 19 Town Planning. Cr. Abercrombie moved—" That the Clerk be instructed to make formal application to the Local Government Board for the Town Planning of the undeveloped portion of Barnet." The motion was seconded by Cr. Williams for the purposes of discussion. The Surveyor submitted a report of the procedure involved and the steps he had taken for dealing with this matter under the existing circumstances and in conjunction with his other duties. The motion was withdrawn by leave of the Council.

A letter was read from the War Refugees Committee appreciating the Council's action in connection with the employment of Belgian Refugees.

A circular letter of the 26th July was read from the Local Government Board setting out lengthy suggestions dealing with this matter. Particulars regarding five refugees were submitted and referred to the Committee for attention.

- 7 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated the 2nd September, 1915, was taken as read and adopted.
- 8 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the Report of this Committee, dated the 2nd September, 1915, was taken as read and adopted.
- 9 Finance. Economy in Expenditure. Estimates. Cr. Fern moved—" That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated the 2nd instant, be taken as read and adopted."

The motion having been seconded by Cr. Aldridge, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—" That the words 'reduction of rates' be inserted after the words 'necessity of' in the second line of the paragraph headed 'Economy in Expenditure' at p. 323 of the Report." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Pearson and carried, *nem. con.* 

Cr. Williams moved as a further amendment—"That the paragraph headed 'Estimates' at p. 323 of the Report be deleted." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Graddon, and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Thomas, and Williams; Against: Crs. Aldridge, Ball, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Malins, Pearson, and Sheppard. Cr. Williams then moved—"That the further consideration of the paragraph headed 'Estimates' be deferred for six months." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, but was negatived on the like voting. The Report, as amended, was then put and carried, *nem. con*.

- 10 Rates. Irrecoverables. With regard to the second paragraph under this heading in the Finance Committee's Report, the Clerk stated that he had ascertained that the Poor Rates on the premises therein referred to had been remitted by the Magistrates under a misapprehension, and upon the incorrect assumption that there was no beneficial occupation. Directions were given for the rate to be recovered in the usual course.
- 11 Game Licences. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—"That the seal of the Council be affixed to Game Licences to Mr. Frank Dodd and Mr. Alfred William Nicholls respectively."
- 12 Fire Brigade. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—" That the agreements between this Authority and the following honorary members of the Fire Brigade be signed by the Chairman: Messrs. W. R. Brown, S. H. V. Chaplin, J. H. Howard, J. W. Clark, W. J. Francis, C. E. Crane, R. H. Powell, C. White, B. Smith, E. W. Spring, L. Brown, and W. Wallis."
- 13 Elections. A circular letter, dated the 10th August, was read from the Local Government Board, announcing that the next statutory elections of District Councils would be postponed for a year, and the term of office of existing Councillors would accordingly be extended for that period, any casual vacancy to be filled by the nomination of the Council.
- 14 Maintenance of Live Stock. A circular letter, dated the 21st August, was read from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, enclosing copies of a handbill relating to the Maintenance of Live Stock Order, 1915, which the Clerk stated had been distributed as therein directed.
- 15 French Relief Fund. A letter was read from the Hon. Secretary of this Fund gratefully acknowledging the amount contributed to the Fund from this District as reported at the last meeting of the Council.
- 16 **Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee.** Letters, dated the 13th and 17th August, were read from the Local Government Board enclosing copy correspondence between the Board and the Hospital Committee relative to the representation of this Authority on the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee from which it appeared the Board considered that this District's representation should be increased from 4 to 5. The Board had therefore suggested to the Committee that application should be made to the County Council for the issue of an amending Order on these lines.

#### 7th September, 1915.

- 17 Barnet Union Workhouse. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Ball, a letter from Mrs. M. Knowles, dealing with matters concerning the Guardians of Barnet Union, was directed to be forwarded to that Authority.
- 18 New Offices. Surcharge. A letter, dated the 31st August, 1915, was read from the Local Government Board, relative to the amount of £100 surcharged at the Audit of the accounts of this Authority for the year ended 31st March, 1914, in connection with the preparation of plans, etc., by Mr. H. A. Cheers, regarding a scheme for the erection of new offices. After reciting the circumstances, the Board stated that they confirmed the surcharge as lawful, but had decided to remit it in exercise of their equitable jurisdiction, and enclosed a certificate accordingly.
- 19 Coal Supply. A letter was read from the Board of Trade with regard to the consumption of coal during the ensuing winter, also as to an arrangement instituted in the London area for the limitation of the charges by principal merchants. It was suggested by the Board that a similar arrangement might be practicable for this District, and on the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, the matter was referred to the General Purposes Committee for consideration and report.
- 20 Lighting. Suggestions from H.M. Office of Works for obtaining greater uniformity in the lighting conditions throughout the Metropolitan area had already received the attention of the Surveyor.
- 21 Insurance. Notices of motion concerning this matter, standing in the name of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, were deferred until the next meeting, Crs. Aldridge and Pearson giving their names in support of the motions in accordance with the Standing Orders.
- 22 Aircraft Insurance. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That steps be taken to insure all the property of the Council against loss or damage by aircraft at the rate of 2/- % per annum, in the Offices of the existing Fire Policies."
- 23 Offices. Dilapidations. A letter was read from the Governors of Barnet

Grammar School stating that they would be prepared to accept £130 in settlement of the schedule of dilapidations at 40, High Street. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved, *nem. con.*— "That this offer of £130 in settlement be accepted accordingly, payment to be made after the expiration of the lease."

- 24 Fireman. Cr. Thomas reported upon the application of Mr. W. R. Brown for engagement as a permanent Fireman, and undertook to make arrangements as to his appointment.

Tuesday, 5th October, 1915.

At a COUNCIL MEETING duly convened and held on the above date at 8 p.m., at the Church House, Wood Street, Barnet, there were present :--

- Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Minutes of the meeting of the 7th September, were taken as read and signed.
- Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated the 27th September, was taken as read and adopted.
- Highways. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Ball, the Report 3 of this Committee, dated the 27th September, was taken as read and adopted.
- 4 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Reports of this Committee, dated the 14th and 28th September respectively, were taken as read and adopted.
- 5 Housing of the Working Classes. Cr. Pearson moved-" That the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th September, be taken as read and adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Graddon, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved the following amendment-" That the recommendation of the Committee under the heading 'Rents' at p. 334 be not adopted." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Aldridge for purposes of discussion but was not carried, there voting For: Cr. Hackforth-Jones; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Fern, Graddon, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams and Wills. The motion for the adoption of the Report was then carried, nem. con.
- 6 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th September, 1915, was taken as read and adopted.
- On the like motion it was resolved-"That an agreement be signed 7 with Mr. H. J. Nickolds as to voluntary assistance in the Council's Fire Brigade in place of Fireman W. R. Brown, now a permanent member of the Brigade."

### 5th October, 1915.

- 8 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved, nem. con.--" That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated the 30th September, 1915, and the Rate Estimates of the various Committees as therein referred to, be taken as read and adopted, with the exception of the paragraph headed 'Accounts' at p. 340, which is referred back to the Finance Committee for further consideration."
- 9 Rate Estimate. General District Rate. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved, nem. con.—" That a Rate of 1/6 in the £ be made and levied for the half-year ending 31st March, 1916, upon the Parishes of Chipping Barnet, South Mimms Urban, Hadley and Arkley."
- 10 Meetings. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved —"That a Special Meeting of the Council be held at 40, High Street, Barnet, on the 19th inst. at 8 p.m., for the purpose of sealing the General District Rate for the half-year ending 31st March, 1916."
- 11 Charities. Valentine Poole Trust. On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—" That the two representatives of the Council on the Valentine Poole Charity now to go out of office be Cr. J. W. Pearson and Mr. F. E. Jennings, and that they be and are hereby re-elected for a period of 4 years from this date."
- 12 British Red Cross Society. With reference to the paragraph under this heading at p. 333 of the General Purposes Committee's Report of the 28th September, a letter of thanks was read from Lady Enfield to the Chairman for the Council's support in the matter. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was resolved—"That the Committee appointed to arrange for the French Flag Day collection be re-elected to deal with 'Our Day' celebration on the 21st instant, with power to add to their number."
- 13 Belgian Soldiers on leave. A letter, dated the 8th September, from the Secretary of a Committee at Folkestone as to offers of hospitality to Belgian soldiers on leave was handed to the Press.
- 14 Lighting. Circular letters, dated the 16th and 17th September, were read from the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis pointing out the undesirability of total extinguishment of street lights during enemy air-raids.
- 15 Elm Road Passage. A letter, dated the 29th September, was read from Mr. E. H. Neal relative to the condition of Elm Road Passage, but no action was taken thereon.
- 16 Belgian Refugees. A letter, dated the 28th September, from the War Refugees Committee, concerning the Belgian family Cuelemaere, was referred to the Clerk for attention.
- 17 Economy in the use of Gold Coin. A circular letter, dated the 29th ultimo, on this subject from the Treasury, was read.
- 18 Condolence. Cr. Williams moved in accordance with notice given—" That this Council expresses its sympathy with Mr. Councillor Amos J. Ford, J.P., in his illness, coupled with a hope for his speedy restoration to health." The motion was seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones and carried unanimously.
- 19 Housing of the Working Classes. Allotments. Cr. Pearson moved in accordance with notice given—" That such portion of the Housing Estate as is not already occupied or required for other purposes be let out in allotments." The motion was seconded by Cr. Aldridge and carried, nem. con.
- 20 Insurances. Premiums. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved, and Cr. Pearson seconded, in accordance with notice given---(a) "That urgency be granted to rescind the resolution of the Council dated 3rd August, 1915, under the heading of Insurances (p. 306) as follows: 'That all premiums on the Council's Insurance Policies in Mr. Dolton's agency be paid in future to the Company, less the usual commission.'" (b) "That such resolution be

rescinded accordingly, and that such premiums in future be received and retained by Mr. Dolton." The motions were put and carried, nem. con.

#### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- 21 Lighting. The Vice-Chairman reported his attendance at a Conference of Lighting Authorities at the Home Office on the 1st instant, in accordance with an invitation from that Department, when various questions dealing with the subject of subdued lighting were discussed by the Home Secretary. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, a vote of thanks was accorded to Cr. Eames for his attendance.
- 22 Emergency Isolation Hospital. The Surveyor reported the receipt of an offer of £100 for the fabric of the Emergency Isolation Hospital; the fixtures and fittings, together with the brickwork and concrete to be left for the use of the Council. The Chairman moved and Cr. Thomas seconded-" That a small Committee be appointed to view the premises with power to sell." Cr. Pearson moved the following amendment-" That any offer of not less than £100 he accepted for the fabric, etc., as above described." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Mackay and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Dunch, Fern, Graddon, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard and Williams; Against : Crs. Aldridge, Chapman, Hackforth-Jones, Thomas and Wills. Upon the resolution being put as a substantive motion Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment-" That the matter be referred to a small Committee with power to sell for not less than £100." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Wills and carried, nem. con., and was also carried as a substantive motion with the like voting. Crs. Chapman, Pearson and Thomas (with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman ex-officio), were then elected as the Committee and arranged to view the premises at 5 p.m. on the 6th instant.

received from Messrs. Dawkins of Edmonton, for the tenancy by them of the Emergency Isolation Hospital as a catgut factory; and submitted correspondence in connection therewith.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Sheppard, it was unanimously resolved—" That the Council consent to let the premises to Messrs. Dawkins for the purpose of a catgut factory on terms to be agreed, subject to a satisfactory report being received on the matter from the Medical Officer of Health."

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was further unanimously resolved—"That negotiations be entered into with Messrs. Dawkins to let the premises to them on a repairing lease for a term of seven years at an annual rental of £35, with an additional rental of £25 per annum for the first three years towards the cost of the first repairs to be executed by the Council."

A representative from Messrs. Dawkins attended before the Council when the above resolutions were conveyed to, and verbally accepted by him, subject to the report of the Medical Officer of Health as above and the usual form of lease in such cases.

with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), W. B. Chancellor (Engineer and Surveyor and Acting Sanitary Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Minutes. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Minutes of the meeting of the 5th October, 1915, were taken as read and signed. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Minutes of the meeting of the 19th October, 1915, were also taken as read and signed.
- 2 Recruiting. Permission was accorded to the local Recruiting Committee for the use of a room at the Council's Offices for meetings until the end of the present month.
- 3 Gipsies. Totteridge. On the motion of Cr. Mackay, seconded by Cr. Ball, the question of the removal of gipsies from certain parts of Totteridge was left in the hands of the Clerk and Surveyor.
- 4 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Malins, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th October, was taken as read and adopted.
- 5 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Ball, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th October, was taken as read and adopted.
- 6 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Malins, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th October, was taken as read and adopted.
- 7 Housing of the Working Classes. Rents. A letter was read from the Finchley and District Trades and Labour Council deprecating the increase of rents for the Council Cottages. Cr. Pearson moved—" That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated the 28th October, be taken as read and adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Chapman, Cr. Thomas moved as an amendment the notice of motion appearing in his name on the Agenda paper as follows—" That the recommendation passed by the Housing of the Working Classes Committee at their meeting on 28th September under the heading of 'Rents' (p. 334), and adopted by the Council at their meeting on October 5th, be and is hereby rescinded, and the question of rental be brought up again after the conclusion of the War." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Aldridge and was not

carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge and Thomas; Against: Crs, Ball, Chapman, Fern, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Williams and Wills. The motion for the adoption of the Report was then put and carried.

8 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th October, 1915, was taken as read and adopted.

A Report was submitted from the Chief Officer of the Fire Brigade of a call to a haystack fire in Totteridge Lane on the 30th October. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That a cheque for £5 11s. 1d. be drawn in payment of the Brigade's expenses, and that the thanks of the Council be accorded to Sir Samuel Boulton, Bart., for the services rendered by his steam fire engine at the fire in question."

Letters were read from Second Officer J. Robins and Fireman J. Brown stating they had joined His Majesty's Forces for the period of the War, and asking whether their positions in the Brigade could be kept open for them. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved— "That leave of absence be accorded to these two firemen until after the War, coupled with an expression of the Council's appreciation of their action in enlisting."

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was subsequently resolved—" That the Fire Brigade retaining fee be paid to the men during such absence," there voting *For*: Crs. Malins, Thomas, Sheppard and Williams; *Against*: Crs. Chapman and Fern.

- 9 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated the 28th October, was taken as read and adopted.
- 10 Lighting. Letters dated the 7th, 8th and 25th October were read from H.M. Office of Works containing further instructions with regard to the uniformity of street lighting. A letter dated the 8th ultimo was also read from the Home Office forwarding proceedings of a conference of Lighting Authorities recently held at that Office, and which Cr. Eames had attended as representing this Authority.
- 11 French Relief Fund. In reply to the Council's enquiry, a letter was read from the French Relief Fund stating that upon the handing over of the motor ambulances publicly subscribed for to the representative of the French

Government, the responsibility of the Committee of this Fund for their safe transit had ceased, all risks being borne by the French Government.

- 12 Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee. Correspondence was read from this Committee stating that they had made application to the Herts County Council for an Order for the representation of the Barnet Urban District Council to be increased to five, and now forwarded the necessary document which had been received from the County Council for sealing by this Authority. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Sheppard, the seal of the Council was affixed thereto.
- 13 Russia's Day. Relief in Belgium. A letter, dated 22nd October, was read from Lady Arthur Paget, asking for the co-operation of this Authority in the observance of "Russia's Day" on the 18th November, and the formation of a Committee to arrange collections, etc. A letter was also read from the National Committee for Relief in Belgium, asking if a special appeal towards this object could be made in this district on the 15th November. It was resolved—"That while expressing their entire sympathy with the suggestions put forward, the Council regret that the present moment is inauspicious for further action in this direction, having regard to the very recent appeals of a similar character, which have been liberally responded to in the District, but that the matter would be further considered in the coming year."
- 14 War Refugees. A letter from the War Refugees Committee relative to supply of clothing to the Belgian family Carpentier, was referred to Cr. Williams for attention.
- 15 County Councillors. Cr. Fern moved in accordance with notice given— "That this Council recommends the Hertfordshire County Council to appoint Mr. A. G. Malins of The Quinta, Arkley, to succeed Dr. W. O. Boyes, C.C.,

as from the 8th March, 1916, as one of the representatives of this District on that body, from which he has intimated his intention to resign." The motion was seconded by the Chairman and carried unanimously.

16 Assistant Overseer. Totteridge. Cr. Mackay moved in accordance with notice given and as amended by permission of the Council-" That the salary of Mr. Arthur Newman, Assistant Overseer of the Poor for the Parish of Totteridge, be increased by £4 10s. 0d. per annum so as to include travelling and incidental expenses, and that his duties be all such as appertain to and are incident to the office of an Assistant Overseer of the Poor with the exception of Parliamentary Registration." A letter on the subject was also read from Mr. Newman. The motion was seconded by Cr. Ball and carried, nem. con.

### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- New Offices. Assessment. A letter was read from from Mr. E. H. Neal, 17 one of the Overseers of the Poor for the Parish of Chipping Barnet, and who was also in attendance, stating it was proposed to assess the New Offices as a whole at £150 gross. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved—"That the gross assessment as stated be accepted." A vote of thanks was accorded to Mr. Neal for his attendance.
- 18 Fire Brigade. Challenge Cup. Three of the Council's Firemen attended before the Council with reference to the custody of a Challenge Cup, the matter having been previously considered by the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee. After hearing the statements of the men, on the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved, nem. con.-" That, subject to enquires in the directions indicated and to the legal position of the matter being satisfactory, the Solicitor be instructed to take the necessary steps for the recovery of the Challenge Cup in question."
- New Offices. Herts County Council. Tuberculosis. The Clerk submitted 19 a draft agreement received that morning from the County Council for the letting of rooms in the New Offices for use as a Tuberculosis Visiting Station. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Williams, the draft agreement was approved subject to the alterations agreed upon.
- 20 Old Isolation Hospital. The Clerk reported upon the result of the negotiations

with Messrs. Dawkins for the use of these premises as a Catgut Factory, and submitted the lease of the premises for sealing. Cr. Chapman moved---"That the seal of the Council be now affixed to the lease." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Pearson, Cr. Fern moved as an amendment-"That the lease be now read." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Graddon and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Fern and Graddon; Against: Crs. Chapman, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams and Wills. The motion was then put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Chapman, Eames, Malins, Pearson, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Fern and Graddon.

- 1 New Offices. This being the first meeting held in the New Offices, the Chairman offered congratulatory remarks upon the opening of the premises, and complimented Mr. W. B. - 6 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Malins, the Report of this Committee, dated the 30th December, 1915, was taken as read and adopted.
- 7 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Chapman, the Report of this Committee, dated the 30th December, 1915, was taken as read and adopted.

- Hoardings. A letter, dated the 7th December, from the Home Office relative 11 to the revised draft byelaws under the Advertisements Regulations Act, 1907, with regard to hoardings, was read and referred to the Committee dealing with the matter for consideration and report.
- 12 War Damage. With reference to the paragraph under this head at page 374 of the minutes of the last meeting of the Council, a letter was read from the Committee concerned asking if it were possible to obtain the corporate assent of this Authority to the resolution contained in their previous communication, but no further action was taken in the matter.
- 13 Guides. A letter dated 11th December, was read from Messrs. Burrow & Co. Ltd., with regard to the proposed Guides for this district, for which no obligation of any kind would fall upon the Council, and stating that a proof would be submitted to this Authority before publication.
- 14 Maintenance of Live Stock. A circular letter dated 22nd ultimo on this subject was read from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, and was referred to to the War Agriculture Sub-Committee for attention.
- 15 Air-Raid Insurance. A letter was read from the General Post Office enclosing explanatory notes and leaflets regarding the Government Air-Raid Insurance Scheme, and asking for the Council's co-operation in bringing this to the notice of the classes most concerned. Directions were given for a supply of the leaflets to be obtained and distributed with others shortly to be circulated on behalf of the Council.

Malins, it was unanimously resolved-"That the future rentals of the Council Cottages be 6/6 and 7/- per week respectively, and that those tenants who have paid additional rent from the 1st November, 1915, be credited therewith." - Minutes. On the motion of Cr. Malins, duly seconded, the Minutes of the Meeting of the 4th January, 1916, were taken as read and signed.
- 2 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Eames, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th January, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 3 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th January, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 4 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th January, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 5 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th January, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, the Report 6 of this Committee, dated 27th January, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Eames, the Report of 7 this Committee, dated 27th January, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- Demobilisation. A letter was read from the Social Welfare Association of 8 London, enclosing two copies of a statement for consideration by the Council relative to the civil employment of men of His Majesty's Forces on demobilisation. Instructions were given for a further supply to be obtained.
- National Motor Volunteers. A letter, dated 6th January, was read from 9 Sir Charles Allom, bringing to the notice of this Authority the formation of a mobile force by the Central Association Volunteer Training Corps as part of the scheme for National Defence.
- National Registration. A letter, dated 13th January, was read from the 10 Local Government Board, stating that the Council's expenses of £28 1s. 7d. incurred under the National Registration Act, 1915, were being refunded. The Registrar General also wrote under date of 22nd January, asking for the completed returns as regards this District to be expedited.
- On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, a 11 hearty vote of thanks was unanimously passed to Mr. Poole and his staff, for their able work in organizing and carrying out the work of National Registration, and the name of Mr. Dolton was specially coupled with this expression of thanks.
- Urban District Council Election. A circular letter, dated 26th ultimo, was 12read from the Hertfordshire County Council, stating that under "The

Elections and Registration Act, 1915," the statutory elections of District Councillors are postponed for a year, the term of office of the existing Councillors being extended by that period.

- 13 Russian Flag Day. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Sheppard, a letter from the Hon. Secretary of the Russian Flag Day Movement, with regard to the local observation of this day in the early Spring or Summer, was referred to the General Purposes Committee for consideration and report.
- 14 Fuel. Anthracite. With reference to the paragraph under this heading in the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee of 27th ultimo, the Clerk submitted an explanation from Messrs. Charrington & Co. with regard to the delayed delivery of the anthracite ordered from them. In view, however, of the circumstances attendant upon the necessity for purchasing this fuel elsewhere, on the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That application be made to Messrs. Charrington for the refund of the difference in cost of purchase, as recommended by the Committee." There voted For: Crs. Eames, Fern, Malins, Pearson, Thomas and Williams; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman, Graddon and Hackforth-Jones.
- 15 Economy. War Saving. In connection with a proposition by Cr. Fern for a conference of certain local bodies for the purpose of organizing a voluntary War Saving Association under Government approval, and the convening of a public meeting to urge the importance of thrift, on the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved (*nem. con*).—" That a Committee be formed to discuss and report upon the desirability of this procedure." It was subsequently resolved—" That such Committee consist of Crs. Fern, Hackforth-Jones, Malins, Pearson and Williams, with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman." The Chairman of the Council was elected as Chairman of the Committee.
- 16 **Public Conveniences.** On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Fern, it was left to the Surveyor to make the necessary arrangements for supplying indication tablets to the newly-opened Public Conveniences.
- 17 Workmen. Wages. The Surveyor read an application from the Council's workmen, received by him that evening, for the payment of a War Bonus.

Abercrombie, Fern, Graddon, Malins, Sheppard, Thoman, Eames, Hackforth-Jones and Pearson, and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Chapman, Eames, Hackforth-Jones and Pearson, Against : Crs. Abercrombie, Fern, Graddon, Malins, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams and wills. The original amendment was then put as a substantive motion and carried with the like voting as in the first instance.

- 11 Hoardings. Byelaws. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved-" That the Hoardings Committee be re-appointed and constituted as follows: Crs. Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Thomas and Wills."
- 12 Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee. On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was unanimously resolved-" That Cr. G. Ball be appointed as the additional representative of this Council on this Committee."
- 13 Meetings. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, it was resolved-"That the next ordinary Meetings of the Standing Committees be held on the 27th April, 1916."
- 14 Annual Meeting. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, it was resolved-" That the Annual Meeting of the Council be held on Tuesday, 18th April, at 8 p.m."
- 15 Overseers. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, Messrs. Samuel Huggins, George Daniel Malins, and Ernest Harry Neal, were re-appointed Overseers of the Poor for the Parish of Chipping Barnet, for the ensuing year.

On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Pearson, Messrs. Herbert Grieve and Thomas Smith were re-appointed Overseers of the Poor for the Parish of South Mimms Urban, for the ensuing year.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, Messrs. Thomas Charles and Arthur Nunneley were re-appointed Overseers of the Poor for the Parish of Hadley, for the ensuing year.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Malins, Messrs. Alfred Parmenter and Frank William Hackforth-Jones, J.P., were re-appointed Overseers of the Poor for the Parish of Arkley, for the ensuing year.

- On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, Messrs. George Ball, Charles Dunch, and Josiah Kipping Mackay, were re-appointed Overseers of the Poor for the Parish of Totteridge, for the ensuing year.
- 16 Serbian Relief Fund. The letter, dated 10th January, from the Secretary of this Fund, asking for the Council's co-operation with reference to a Flag Day was again submitted. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the further consideration of the subject was deferred until the Annual Meeting.
- 17 National Registration. A letter, dated 3rd February, was read from the Registrar-General, pointing out (inter alia) that the duty of compiling and maintaining the National Register is still imposed on Local Registration Authorities. The matter was referred to the National Registration Committee.
- 18 Byelaws. Pig-keeping. - 21 War Damage. Town Planning. Letters, on these subjects, were received from the Committee on War Damage and the National Housing and Town Planning Council respectively, and were laid on the table.
- 22 Fire Brigade. An application, from Mr. C. E. Crane of Salisbury Road, for membership of the regular Fire Brigade, was left to Cr. Thomas for report.

The Council then went into Committee.

- 23 Housing and Sanitary Inspector. Salary. Cr. Pearson asked leave of the Council to defer until after the Audit, the consideration of the three notices of motion on this subject standing in his name, and leave was given accordingly.
- 24 Public Convenience. A letter was read from the Metropolitan Electric Tramways, Ltd., asking what arrangements could be made for their women conductors in uniform to use the public conveniences without payment. The matter was left to the Surveyor to arrange and report.
- 25 Mary Payne's Place. A letter, dated the 11th instant, was read from Messrs. Boyes & Son adverting to their letter of the 1st instant and stating that, if the Council considered the concluding words of the draft resolution enclosed by them needed amplification, Messrs. Swain & Son were prepared to hold the Council harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings, actions or damages. After a short discussion, on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Thomas, the Council then adjourned.

Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Sheppard, Thomas, Williams and Wills.
- 5 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th April, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 6 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th April, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 7 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th April, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 8 War Service. Conscientious Objectors. In connection with the letter from the Urban District Councils' Association, referred to under this heading at p. 430 of the General Purposes Committee's Report, Cr. Williams moved— "That, in addition to replying in the negative to the two queries raised by the Association, they be informed that, in the opinion of this Council, the proper work for so-called conscientious objectors is life-saving, such as R.A.M.C. work, mine-sweeping, &c." The motion was seconded by Cr. Thomas, and carried, *nem. con*.

#### 2nd May, 1916.

- 9 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Malins, the Report of this Committee, dated 27th April, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 10 Offices. Aircraft Insurance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, a cheque for £3 13s. 6d. was drawn in payment of the Council's policy premium on Aircraft Insurance Risk in respect of the New Offices, as from the 13th April, the date upon which the Builders' liability ceased.
- 11 Barnet Grouped Schools. With reference to the re-election of Mr. E. H. Neal as this Authority's representative on the body of Foundation Managers of Barnet C. of E. School, the Clerk reported that Mr. Neal had already been similarly appointed by another Authority. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Chapman, Cr. Fern was appointed in his place, the representative for Arkley Infants School being Cr. A. G. Malins, C.C.
- 12 Petrol Licenses. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, the seal of the Council was affixed to Petrol Licenses to Messrs. Stevens & Co. and the British Petroleum Co. for the storage of Petrol as thereon respectively appears.
- 13 Urban District Councils' Association. A letter from this Association as to the election of representatives was read and laid on the table.
- 14 Arterial Roads in Greater London. A letter was read from the Local Government Board as to the appointment of representatives to the proposed Conference on this matter. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, Crs. Abercrombie and Malins, with the Surveyor, were appointed as delegates from this Authority.
- 15 Hadley Grouped Schools. A letter, dated the 19th ultimo, was read from the Herts County Council asking the Council to appoint a representative on the body of Foundation Managers of Hadley Infants School.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Chapman, Mr. T. Smith was re-appointed as such representative.

16 Christ Church Road. A letter from Mr. W. H. Wilkins as to this road was referred to the Surveyor for attention.

- 17 National War Savings Committee. A complete set of leaflets obtained by the Clerk from this Committee were submitted, and the matter was referred to the Committee of the Council dealing with the subject.
- 18 Finance (New Duties) Act, 1916. Entertainments Duty. A circular letter on this subject was received from the Local Government Board but consideration thereof was deferred pending the action about to be taken thereon by the County Authority at their meeting on the 5th instant.

#### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- 19 Audit. Salaries. Consequent upon the remarks of the Auditor relative to the payment of employees of the Council while on active service, the Solicitor submitted a Report on the matter having reference to pending legislation. A letter, dated 1st instant, was also read from Mr. Hill, expressing his point of view. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—"That, subject to the consent of the Local Government Board being obtained, the Council continue the present arrangement with Mr. Hill." The motion was seconded by Cr. Pearson, and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Dunch, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Pearson, Thomas and Williams. *Against*: Crs. Eames, Fern, Sheppard and Wills.
- 20 Land Values. Depot. Particulars were received from Messrs. Harland and Son as to the valuation of the Depôt. The Chairman undertook to make further enquiries of the firm and report.
- 21 Surveyor. The Surveyor reported that he had been asked to give his advice and help in connection with certain works now being carried out, particularly

in connection with the new roads being laid round the Infirmary at the Union and certain works at the Boys Grammar School. It was decided that the Surveyor be empowered to undertake such work.

- 22 Main Roads. St. Albans Road. The Surveyor reported that he had received verbal intimation from the County Surveyor that the Highways Committee of the County Council were prepared to agree to contribute the second repayment of the suggested loan from the Road Board to this Authority for the repair of the St. Albans Road, provided this Council would extend the maintenance period in respect of the road for 12 months from the present date of expiration, viz.: 31st March, 1918. By so doing, and continuing on the present financial basis, the County Authority would contribute an additional £43 towards the maintenance of the road for the year 1918-19 besides the usual yearly contribution of £220-£230. No written statement had as yet been received from the County Council that at the end of the extended period they would take over the road in its then existing condition. The Surveyor suggested the acceptance of the terms mentioned, and on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—" That the Chairman of the Council, the Chairman of the Highways Committee and the Surveyor enter into negotiations for the settlement of the matter, with power to act."
- 23 Notifiable Diseases. On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That the Medical Officer of Health bring to the attention of local medical practitioners, a list of such diseases as are notifiable within this District."

## Barnet Urban District Council.

### Council Meeting.

Tuesday, 6th June, 1916.

At a COUNCIL MEETING duly convened and held at the Council Offices, Wood Street, Barnet, on the above date at 8 p.m., there were present Crs. H. Eames, J.P. (Chairman), J. W. Pearson (Vice-Chairman), W. H. Abercrombie, G. J. Aldridge, G. Ball, J. T. Chapman, C. Dunch, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W Hackforth-Jones, J.P., A. G. Malins, C.C., J. L. H. Thomas, E. T. Williams, and A. J. Wills, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), W. B. Chancellor (Engineer and Surveyor and Acting Sanitary Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Secretary of State for War. The Chairman referred to the news received this day of the death of Lord Kitchener, Secretary of State for War, and the following motion was carried unanimously, upstanding and in silence—"That this Council hereby records its profound sense of the grave loss to this Country through the untimely death of Lord Kitchener while serving the Nation in the execution of his duty, nobly performed, and also respectfully tenders its most heartfelt sympathy with the relatives and associates of the late distinguished officer."
- 2 Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Minutes of the Meeting of the 2nd May, 1916, were taken as read and signed.
- 3 Farm. Farm Sales. Sewage Farm. Cr. Chapman moved—"That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated 1st June, 1916, be taken as read and adopted, subject to the sum realised for 'Farm Sales' being corrected to £97 15s. 0d." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Pearson, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved the following amendment—"That the Report as proposed to be corrected be adopted, with the exception of the paragraph headed 'Sewage Farm: Property Tax.'" The amendment was seconded by Cr. Ball and carried.
- 4 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 1st June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 5 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Chapman, the Report of this Committee, dated 1st June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 6 Hay. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That the Clerk communicate with Major Blake at St. Albans in order to facilitate the supply of hay, through the contractor, for the Council's horses."
- 7 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Graddon, the Report of this Committee, dated 1st June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 8 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Ball, the Report of this Committee, dated 1st June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 9 Finance. Advertising. Cr. Fern moved—" That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated 1st June, 1916, be taken as read and adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Pearson, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved the following amendment—" That the Report be adopted, subject to the

elimination of the paragraph headed 'Advertising' at p. 444." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Hackforth-Jones, Malins and Williams; Against: Crs. Fern, Graddon, Pearson and Thomas.

- 10 Russian Flag Day. The Chairman reported the result of the Russian Flag Day collection in this District, when a net amount of £157 1s. 3d. had been realised and paid into the London County & Westminster Bank. Cr. Eames testified to the assistance that had been rendered to him by numerous donors and helpers. The thanks of the Council were accorded to the Chairman for his energetic and successful labours in this direction.
- 11 Hoardings Byelaws. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Malins, the seal of the Council was affixed to the proposed byelaws under the Advertisements Regulation Act, 1907, the amended draft of which had been approved by the Home Office.
- 12 French Flag Day. National Party League. A circular letter referring to the observance of French Flag Day and the establishment of a branch of the National Party League in this District, was read from the Hon. General Secretary. No action was decided upon with reference thereto.
- 13 Housing and Town Planning. A letter was read from the Committee of the National Housing and Town Planning Council enclosing copies of resolutions of the recent National Congress dealing with questions of Housing which will arise after the War. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—" That while expressing sympathy with the suggestions enumerated, a reply be sent stating that the matter will be further considered by this Authority at their first meeting in October."
- 14 Alexandra Day. A letter was read from the Mayor of Hampstead offering to extend the organisation of that Borough to this District in connection with the observance of Alexandra Day. It having been reported that satisfactory arrangements had already been made, the Clerk was directed to reply accordingly.
- 15 Ravenscroft Charity. Notification was read from the Charity Commission of their intention to appoint Dr. C. F. Hardie as a Trustee of the James Ravenscroft Charity.
- 16 Serbian Relief Fund. A letter was read from the Chairman of this Fund soliciting the Council's assistance in the observance of a Serbian Flag Day in this District, and enclosing the necessary particulars. On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, duly seconded, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—"That a reply be sent stating that the necessary steps will be taken at a later date to render the assistance desired."
- 17 Urban District Council Association. Letters from this Association and various local authorities concerned, as to the Election of the Executive Council of the Association, were submitted and laid on the table.
- 18 Isolation Hospital. A letter, dated 31st May, was read from the County Council forwarding the original Order altering the Barnet Isolation Hospital Order, 1902, by increasing the number of representatives of this Authority upon the Hospital Committee.
- 19 Public Lighting. In reply to an enquiry from the North Metropolitan Electrical Power Co. as to whether this Council confirmed the acceptance of the Company's remission in relation to Public Lighting, the Clerk was directed to reply in the affirmative.
- 20 Barnet War Hospital Supply Depot. A letter was read from the Hon. Organiser of this Depôt, stating that it was intended to hold a Flag Day in aid of the Funds on the 1st July, to which it was hoped the Council would give their assistance. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That the Council accord their support in the matter, and also that the use of the Council Offices be placed at the disposal of the Hon. Organiser in connection therewith for the date named."

#### 6th June, 1916.

- 21 County Rate Basis. Particulars of the County Rate Basis were received and laid on the table.
- 22 National Registration. A circular letter, dated the 2nd instant, was read from the Local Government Board calling attention to recent Regulations for the production of certificates of registration. At the same time the procedure was set out for obtaining the information required under the Military Service Act, 1916, for the use of the local military authorities. In connection with the carrying out of this procedure, on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the National Registration Committee, as formerly constituted, be re-elected to undertake this work under the superintendance and for the assistance of the Clerk."
- 23 Fires. A Report was read from the Chief Officer of the Fire Brigade, relative to the Brigade's services at Mymms Hall fire, and on the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—"That a copy thereof be sent to Mr. Giddins."
- 24 Cinema Films. Cr. Fern moved—" That the following resolution be forwarded to the Home Office, namely: 'That this Authority is of opinion that all Cinema Films before exhibition in this country, should be censored by a Government Department, in the belief that such censorship will prevent the exhibition of any films likely to be detrimental to the morals of the audience." The motion was seconded by Cr. Thomas and carried, *nem. con.*

The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- 25 Land Values. Depot. The Chairman submitted his Report upon the Provisional Valuation of the Council's Depot. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was resolved—"That enquiry be made of the Valuation Department as to whether the remaining portion of ground comprised in the Council's property at the Depôt, has been valued."
- 26 Public Conveniences. The Surveyor submitted an estimate of £43 18s. 0d. from Messrs. Miskin & Son for the provision, in lieu of ironwork, of oak fencing and feather-edge boarding round the Public Conveniences. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That the work be put in hand on this basis."
- **Child Welfare.** The Medical Officer of Health reported upon the unsatisfactory 27 conditions at the Holy Infancy Hospital for Babies, Park Road, disclosed at his visit, with an Inspector of the Local Government Board on Friday last. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Fern, it was resolved (Cr. Hackforth-Jones not voting)—" That representations be made to the Barnet Board of Guardians, before their meeting on Thursday next, protesting against the admission to the Union Infirmary of children from the Hospital referred to, having regard to the fact that such children are chargeable to other Parishes, and cannot be considered as destitute; and further, that very strong representations be made to the Home Office, relative to the conditions of the childen under treatment at the Hospital, and urging the Department to take early action in the matter." It was further resolved-" That the Guardians be requested to receive the Chairman of the Council and the Medical Officer of Health at their meeting on Thursday, at 12.30 p.m., in order that the Council's views may be submitted."
- 28 Fire Brigade. Cr. Thomas reported the result of appearances before the Recruiting Tribunals for the exemption of certain of the members of the Fire Brigade, but in view of the results thereof it has been found necessary to supplement the remaining staff by voluntary assistance from the Councillors and officials. Crs. Abercrombie, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Thomas and Pearson, together with the Medical Officer of Health and Surveyor, offered their assistance as far as possible, and arrangements will be made on these lines.

Letters were read from Firemen Brown, Page and Phillips asking if their positions on the Brigade could be kept open for them on their return from military service; the two former also enquiring if the retaining fee could be paid to them in addition. On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved, *nem. con.* (Cr. Hackforth-Jones not voting)—" That the men be informed that their positions will be kept open for them, and that the question of retaining fee is under consideration."

- 3 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 29th June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 4 Highways. Wellhouse Lane. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—"That the

Report of the Highways Committee, dated 29th June, be taken as read and adopted, omitting the five words 'on behalf of the Guardians' in the ninth line of the paragraph headed 'Wellhouse Lane' at p. 451." The motion was seconded by Cr. Fern, and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern and Graddon; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Eames, Pearson and Thomas. Cr. Pearson then moved—"That the Report as presented be adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Eames, Cr. Fern moved as an amend-ment—"That the Report be adopted with the exception of the paragraph headed 'Wellhouse Lane.'" The amendment was seconded by Cr. Thomas and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Graddon and Thomas: Against: Crs. Eames and Pearson. The amendment was then put as a substantive motion and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Graddon and Thomas; Against: Cr. Eames.

- 5 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 29th June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted, and the thanks of the Council were accorded to the following members of the Council: Crs. Abercrombie, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Pearson and Thomas; and to the following officials. Dr. Hardie and Mr. Chancellor who had offered their services to the Fire Brigade: and to those townsmen who had undertaken to act as Voluntary Firemen.
- 6 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 29th June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 7 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 29th June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.

#### 4th July, 1916.

- 8 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Graddon, the Report of this Committee, dated 29th June, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 9 Accounts. Cheques. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That authority be given to the Chairman of the Council, the Vice-Chairman and the Chairman of the Finance Committee to sign any necessary cheques becoming due before the next meeting of the Council."
- 10 Infectious Diseases. Measles. The Clerk reported that, with the Chairman of the Council, Cr. Abercrombie and the Acting Sanitary Inspector, he had yesterday at his offices, met Dr. Manby, one of the Medical Inspectors of the Local Government Board, when the subject of endemic outbreaks of measles was discussed. It was suggested by Dr. Manby, after consultation with the Hertfordshire County Council, that an annual contribution of One Guinea per thousand population should be paid to ensure the efficient services of a reserve of special nurses. This sum would be payable to the Nursing Association, with an additional fee of 5/- for each case attended.

It was directed that Dr. Manby should be informed that the Council are inclined to agree to this proposition, provided it is submitted in concrete form by the County Council as suggested by the Clerk at the recent interview.

- 11 Petrol Licenses. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Graddon, the seal of the Council was affixed to a License to the Bowring Petroleum Co. for the storage of Petrol at the rear of the "Star" yard.
- 12 Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School. On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was unanimously resolved—" That the Rev. W. Manning and Mrs. Manning be and are hereby re-appointed as this Authority's representative Managers on the Body of Governors of Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School for a further period of three years."
- 13 Secretary of State for War. An acknowledgment was read from the War Office in reply to the Council's resolution of condolence in connection with the death of the late Lord Kitchener, Secretary of State for War.
- 14 Children's League of Pity. A letter was read from the Hon. Secretary of the
- Barnet Branch of the Children's League of Pity, asking permission to organize a collection in the District on behalf of the League on July 8th. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—"That permission be accorded as requested."
- 15 Entertainments Tax. A letter, dated 26th June, was read from the County Council referring to their previous communication of May 6th, as to whether the Barnet Urban area should be included in the Administrative County for the purposes of administration by the County Council of certain duties in respect of the Entertainments Tax imposed by the Finance (New Duties) Act, 1916. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—" That a letter be sent to the County Authority agreeing to the administration of these duties for the Barnet Urban District by the County Council." The motion was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Abercrombie, Chapman, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Pearson and Thomas; Against: Cr. Fern.
- 16 War Savings Committee. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Fern, the Report of this Committee of even date, was read and adopted.
- 17 Offices. Clerk. Cr. Eames moved in accordance with notice given—" That such portion of the resolution dated the 3rd August, 1915 (p. 308), as affecting the daily attendance of the Clerk, either personally or by the Assistant and Finance Clerk at the new Council Offices when open, between 9 and 10 a.m., be and is hereby rescinded." The motion was seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones and carried unanimously.
- 18 Storage of Furniture. With reference to this matter, Cr. Thomas reported that, as directed by the General Purposes Committee, he had considered this

question with Cr. Aldridge, and they were of the opinion there would be a difficulty in finding suitable accommodation, besides which the question of the Council's responsibility would have to be taken into account.

The subject was discussed, and section 19 of the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, read. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved— "That this Council approve of the principle of providing accommodation, where such may be necessary and after careful investigation of individual cases, for the storage of furniture of men called to the Colours, the cost of removal and insurance of such furniture however to be borne by the respective owners; further, that Crs. Aldridge and Thomas pursue their enquiries, and report to a special meeting of the Council to be convened later." The motion was seconded by Cr. Thomas and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Thomas and Williams; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Eames, Chapman and Pearson. In connection with the finding of accommodation, the Clerk was instructed to ascertain from the Military Authorities if any of the huts at Barnet Barracks could be utilised for the purpose.

19 Drainage. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, authority was given to the Surveyor to open up and examine the drains at No. 183, High Street, and also, if necessary to have an analytical examination made of the water supply thereat.

## Council Meeting.

Thursday, 20th July, 1916.

At a SPECIAL MEETING of the COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date, at 8 p.m., there were present Crs. H. Eames, J.P. (Chairman), J. W. Pearson (Vice-Chairman), G. J. Aldridge, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, A. G. Malins, C.C., J. L. H. Thomas, and E. T. Williams, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. B. Chancellor (Engineer and Surveyor and Acting Sanitary Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

1 Main Roads. St. Albans Road. Grant. The Clerk read a communication dated the previous day from the Clerk of the County Council enclosing copies of the two following resolutions passed by that Authority at their meeting held on the 17th instant :—

### Barnet Urban District : Re-surfacing St. Albans Road.

"That an offer be made to the Urban District Council of Barnet to enter into an Agreement with them for the payment by the County Council towards the cost of maintenance, repair, and reasonable improvement connected with the maintenance and repair of the main road leading from Barnet to St. Albans, a length of 1 furlong 120 yards, within that Urban District


repairable by the District Council under Section 11 (2) of "The Local Government Act, 1888," of the sum of £131 for the year ending the 31st March, 1919, and that in the event of the above-mentioned offer being accepted the seal of the County Council be affixed to the Agreement in question."

"That an offer be made to the Urban District Council of Barnet to enter into an Agreement with them for the payment by the County Council of the sum of £99 towards the cost of the maintenance, repair, and reasonable improvement connected with the maintenance and repair of the main road leading from Barnet to St. Albans, a length of 2 furlongs 138 yards, within the extended district, as scheduled in the Agreement between the County Council and the Urban District Council, dated the 5th May, 1911, for the year ending the 31st March, 1919, and that in the event of the above-mentioned offer being accepted the seal of the County Council be affixed to the Agreement in question."

The Surveyor submitted a detailed estimate of the work now being carried out, from which it appeared that the total cost would be  $\pounds 1,470$ . Of this sum the Road Board had given, through the County Council, a free grant of  $\pounds 693$ , while the County Council would contribute  $\pounds 690$  (in 3 yearly grants of  $\pounds 230$  each) and the Council would have to find the balance of  $\pounds 87$ .

It would be necessary for the Council to borrow a sum of  $\pm 547$  (*i.e.*  $\pm 460$  in anticipation of the County Council Grants for 1918 and 1919 and  $\pm 87$  Urban District Council Contribution) which the Road Board would be prepared to advance, repayable by two annual instalments of  $\pm 273$  and  $\pm 274$  respectively, the first instalment being repaid one year after the date of the first payment on account of the advance.

On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved-"That the Clerk reply to the County Council's letter above referred to stating that the Council are prepared to accept the terms contained in the resolution enclosed with their communication but would be glad to know that the County Authority would agree to the insertion of a clause to the effect that they would take over the road in question at the 31st March, 1919, in its then condition, subject only to fair wear and tear."

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved-"That the estimate of the cost of the work as submitted by the Surveyor be approved and accepted."

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved— "That the Seal of the Council be duly affixed to the Agreement with the Road Board for the loan of £547 above referred to."

2 Building Byelaws. The Surveyor reported a breach of the building byelaws in connection with additions to Dairy premises at Alston Road, Barnet.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved nem. con.—" That the Surveyor be instructed to call upon Mrs. Sharp to cover completely with corrugated iron the new erection in Alston Road within six months of the termination of the War."

3 Recruiting Appeal Tribunal. Expenses. Allowances. The Clerk reported the receipt of the sum of £13 in payment of the Tribunal's expenses up to June 30th, which he had paid over to the Treasurer.

On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved-"That following the similar resolution previously passed the balance of this amount and any subsequent amounts so to be received, be paid to the Clerk, after deduction of any out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the Council."

4 War Relics. Voluntary Training Corps. Use of Offices. The Chairman stated that he had been approached by Mr. I. H. A. Marchand for the use of a room at the Council's Offices for the purpose of placing on exhibition for one day the original appeal of the late Lord Kitchener for men to join H.M.'s Army, one half of the proceeds to be devoted to local V.A.D. Hospitals and the remainder to Red Cross Funds.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—" That the use of a room be granted free of cost accordingly."

The action of the Chairman in granting the use of a room at the Offices to the Voluntary Training Corps was approved.

5 Film Printing Works. A letter, dated July 20th, addressed to the Chairman was read from the Manager of The Williamson Film Printing Co. offering the members of the Council a cordial invitation to view their works, it being understood that the most suitable hours would be between 9 a.m. and 12 noon or between 2 p.m. and 5 p.m.

It was resolved—" That the thanks of the Council be conveyed to the Company for the invitation which was accepted."

- 1 Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Minutes of the Meetings of the 4th and 20th July, 1916, were taken as read and signed.
- 2 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated 31st August, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 3 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Ball, the Report of this Committee, dated 31st August, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 4 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 31st August, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 5 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the Report of this Committee, dated 31st August, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 6 General Purposes. Searchlight Station. Sanitary Conveniences. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated 31st August, 1916, was taken as read and adopted, subject to the recommendation under the heading of "Searchlight Station, Sanitary Conveniences," reading as follows—" That in giving the required permission, a stipulation be made to the effect that such connection must be discontinued so soon as the Government cease to use the erection for the purpose for which it is now built, and that a sum of £5 per annum be paid for the privilege of discharging into the Council's Sewer."
- 7 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated 31st August, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 8 Volunteer Firemen. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the seal of the Council was affixed to Agreements with J. Jackaman, H. Shepherd and C. J. Robinson as Volunteer Firemen.
- 9 War Savings Committee. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Report of this Committee, dated 4th July, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 10 Temporary Buildings. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, the seal of the Council was affixed to an Agreement with Mr. S. C. Howard for the temporary erection of an addition to his workshop adjoining Salisbury Road.

#### 5th September, 1916.

- 11 Game Licenses. On the motion of Cr. Graddon, seconded by Cr. Malins, the seal of the Council was affixed to Game Licenses for Mr. A. W. Nicholls and Mr. F. Dodd.
- 12 Petrol Licenses. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the seal of the Council was affixed to Petrol Licenses as recommended by the General Purposes Committee (p. 465).
- 13 Hydrants. Wellhouse Lane. Cr. Thomas reported with regard to this matter, and stated that it had been decided to leave the question over pending a practical test of the hydrants by the Fire Brigade.
- 14 Hoardings Bye-laws. A letter, dated 13th July, was read from the Home Office confirming the Bye-laws made by the Council under the Advertisements Regulation Act, 1907.
- 15 **Totteridge Charities.** Notification was read from Cr. Mackay that he had been appointed a Trustee of the Totteridge Charities in place of Mr. Thorowgood, resigned.
- 16 Military Service. Continuance of Custom. A circular memorandum was received from the Local Government Board enclosing a copy of a letter issued by the Board appealing for the continuance of public patronage to such establishments whose assistants have joined the King's Forces. Copies of the letter will be obtained for circulation.
- 17 Inland Revenue. A letter was read from the Surveyor of Taxes enclosing for the information of the Council and publicity, particulars of regulations for the forthcoming examinations for Established Clerks to Surveyors of Taxes.
- 18 Sailors' Day. A letter, dated 10th August, was read from Lady Beatty enquiring whether the Council would participate in the holding of a Sailors' Day on October 4th, or any subsequent convenient date. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—" That a reply be sent explaining that a collection on behalf of " Our Day," which covers the objects of Lady Beatty's Appeal, is being held in the district on the 19th October, and that the Council hope to take up the question of Sailors' Day at a later date."
- 19 "Our Day." A letter, dated 21st ultimo, was read from Lady Enfield asking whether the Council could see their way to organize a collection in aid of "Our Day" in Barnet, on 19th October, the proceeds to be given towards the help of the wounded. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—"That the Council organize the collection referred to." On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was subsequently resolved—"That the Chairman be asked to undertake the organization."
- 20 Serbian Relief Fund. An application on behalf of this Fund was received, and the consideration thereof postponed for the present.
- 21 Russian Flag Day. The Chairman reported that the previous sums received in the district on behalf of this Fund had totalled £155. A further £45 was necessary before a Bed could be endowed in a Russian Hospital in the name of this town, but a Fête had recently been held at which £69 had been realised, and the Bed would now be duly installed. The thanks of the Council were accorded to the Chairman and the numerous helpers to whom this satisfactory result was due.
- 22 War Relics. A letter was received from the Hon. Sir Charles Russell, Bart., as to the proposed exhibition of the original recruiting letter from the late Lord Kitchener, and a large portrait of the late Secretary of State for War. The matter was left to the Chairman to arrange, in conjunction with Mr. I. H. A. Marchand, J.P., C.C., the Council, however, undertaking no responsibility for any damage to the articles while on exhibition.
- 23 War Charities Act, 1916. A letter, dated 28th August, was read from the Charity Commission enclosing a copy of and documents in connection with

the War Charities Act, 1916, in respect of which the Council would be the Registration Authority. A letter on the same subject was also read from Mrs. Holland, of Bedford Avenue. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Sheppard, it was resolved—" That copies of the Act be obtained, and that the matter be referred to a small Committee, with power to act." On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, Crs. Fern, Thomas and Williams, were appointed as such Committee, with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman ex-officio.

- 24 Execution of Works after the War. A circular letter on this subject was read from the Local Government Board, and copies were directed to be obtained for the information of the Council. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That this matter be referred to the General Purposes Committee for consideration and report," there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Pearson, Shepherd, Thomas and Williams; Against: Crs. Ball, Graddon and Malins.
- 25 Memorial Holiday Home. A letter from the Hon. Secretary of this Fund was read, but no action was taken thereon.
- 26 Fire Brigade. A report was received from the Captain of the Fire Brigade of an Haystack fire in Barnet Lane on the 31st instant, within the Council's area. An account of £17 18s. 4d. was submitted for Brigade's services, together with an account of 16s. 6d. from the East Barnet Valley U.D.C. for help rendered by members of their Brigade. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Williams, cheques in payment thereof were drawn: it was decided to ask the Insurance Co. concerned for an *ex gratia* payment in view of the saving of an adjoining haystack; and the thanks of the Council were to be tendered to the East Barnet Valley U.D.C. for the services of their firemen. A cheque for £1 10s. 0d. was also drawn in payment of fees for a 'stand-by' call to the Brigade on the 2nd September in respect of an air-raid.
- 27 Meetings. Cr. Malins gave notice of his intention to move a resolution at the next meeting of the Council for the meetings of this Authority to commence at 7 p.m. during the winter months.
- 28 Highways (Main Roads) Sub-Committee. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Sub-Committee of even date was adopted.

The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- 29 Rag Flock Act. In connection with the Surveyor's report to the General Purposes Committee upon a sample of Rag Flock obtained locally and found on analysis to be unsatisfactory, the upholsterer was in attendance. Particulars concerning his acquisition of the flock were gone into, and his explanation of the affair given. After full discussion it was resolved, *nem. con.*, on the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie—" That having heard the whole of the circumstances, the accused be seriously admonished and notified that should any future cause of complaint arise prosecution would undoubtedly ensue.
- 30 Sanitary Inspector. Under date of the 29th August, a letter was read from the Local Government Board stating that the question of remuneration to Mr. C. W. Hill, while on military service, appeared to be covered by paragraph 4 of page 2 of their circular letter of the 26th May last, and that no further sanction of the Board would appear to be required to enable the existing arrangement with Mr. Hill to be continued.
- 31 Main Roads. St. Albans Road. Loan. In connection with the proposed loan from the Road Board, in respect of the repair of the St. Albans Road, and their letter, dated 26th July, it was resolved, on the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Wills—" That application be made to the Local Government Board for sanction to borrow from the Road Board free of interest the sum of £547 towards the cost of surfacing with slag, coated with tar, a portion of the St. Albans Road within the District, covering an area of 8,400 square yards, the sum in question to be repaid by two annual instal-

A letter, dated 24th October, was read from the Charity Commission acknowledging receipt of one duplicate Register Sheet (Mrs. Weber) and one duplicate Exemption List Sheet (Mrs. Holland) and stating they had

been duly entered in the Combined Register or the appropriate Combined Register as the case may be.

- 11 Military Service. Surveyor. A notice of decision was read from the Barnet Rural District Local Tribunal granting temporary exemption to the Surveyor for a period of six months to the 19th April, 1917, conditional upon his remaining in his present occupation on the ground that it is expedient in the National interests that he should, instead of being employed in Military Service, be engaged in other work in which he is habitually engaged.
- 12 Gas. A letter and notice, dated 4th November, 1916, was read from the Barnet District Gas & Water Company, to the effect that application had been made to the Board of Trade by the Company for an Order under the Gas (Standard of Calorific Power) Act, 1916, to authorise the substitution of 500 B.T.U. gross per cubic foot for the prescribed standard of illuminating power, and that any objections or representations with regard to the application should be made by letter addressed to the Board of Trade, within 14 days from the date of the notice, and that copies of such objections or representations should at the same time be sent to the Company. The Solicitor having reported on the matter, Cr. Pearson (by permission of the Council in the absence of Cr. Williams) moved in accordance with notice given-"That formal objection be lodged immediately with the Board of Trade and with the Barnet District Gas and Water Co., against the Company's proposal to alter the prescribed standard of the illuminating power of gas." The motion was seconded by Cr. Malins and carried nem. con.
- 13 Soldier Labour. Rates of Pay. A circular letter, dated 3rd November, was read from the Hertfordshire War Agricultural Committee on this subject and referred to the War Agricultural Sub-Committee.
- 14 Trenches. The Clerk submitted notices to the Barnet District Gas and Water Co., the North Metropolitan Electrical Power Distribution Co., Ltd., and the General Post Office determining the agreements now subsisting as to the repair of trenches. It was resolved—" That the Seal of the Council be affixed to the Notices in accordance with the recommendation of the Highways Committee's adopted Report."
- 15 Meetings. Cr. Thomas moved as by notice given—"That the resolution passed by the Council on 3rd October, 1916, at p. 480 under the heading of 'Meetings' be and is hereby rescinded." The motion was seconded by Cr. Graddon and carried *nem. con*.
- 16 Workmen. Referring to the paragraph under this heading on p. 485 Cr. Aldridge reported upon the result of enquiries made by Cr. - 17 Allotments. Cr. Aldridge having brought forward the question of approaching Miss Wyburn with regard to opening up more land in Moxon Street for the purpose of Allotments, Cr. Ball, Chapman, Eames, Graddon, Malins and Pearson; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Thomas and Aldridge.

Williams and A. J. Wills, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. B. Chancellor (Engineer and Surveyor and Acting Sanitary Inspector), Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Minutes of the Meeting of the 7th November, 1916, were taken as read and signed.
- 2 Petrol. Shell Marketing Co. The Clerk reported the names of the four Directors of the Shell Marketing Company, as shewn by the file at Somerset House.
- 3 War Agriculture Sub-Committee. The Report of this Sub-Committee dated 28th November, was read and received.
- 4 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated 30th November, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 5 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Ball, the Report of this Committee, dated 30th November, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 6 Main Roads Sub-Committee. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the Report of this Sub-Committee of even date was read and adopted (*nem. con.*), there voting *For*: Crs. Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Pearson and Wills.
- 7 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Graddon, the Report of this Committee, dated 30th November, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 8 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the Report of this Committee, dated 30th November, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 9 Allotments. Cr. Aldridge reported that from enquiries made it appeared there were some 20 applicants residing in Moxon Street, a number of whom were already allotment holders who desired to increase their holdings. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—" That Miss Wyburn be approached with a view to her opening up further suitable land as allotments land in the Moxon Street area." There voted For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Dunch, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Thomas and Williams; Against: Cr. Wills.
- 10 General Purposes. Meadow Works. Nursing of Measles. Cr. Pearson moved—"That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated 30th

November, be taken as read and adopted." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Graddon, Cr. Eames moved the following amendment— "That in lieu of the recommendations in the Report under the head of 'Meadow Works,' this matter be referred to a small Sub-Committee to inspect the premises, see Mr. Morris and go fully into the subject."—The amendment was seconded by Cr. Aldridge, and was not carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Eames, Fern, Graddon and Wills; Against: Crs. Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Thomas and Willliams. In connection with the proceedings proposed to be instituted against Mr. Morris, the Clerk asked for authority to engage Counsel at a cost not exceeding £5 5s. 0d. should he consider it necessary or advisable so to do. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, Permission was accorded, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Thomas and Williams; Against : Crs. Eames and Graddon.

With regard to the recommendation under the head of "Nursing of Measles," Cr. Fern moved as an amendment in lieu thereof—"That particulars of the proposals of the Hertfordshire County Nursing Association with reference to the supply of nurses for nursing cases of measles, be duplicated and circulated amongst the members of the Council, and that such proposals be submitted to the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee for an expression of their opinion thereon." This amendment was duly seconded but was not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge, Chapman, Fern and Pearson; *Against*: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Thomas, Williams and Wills. The Report of the General Purposes Committee was then adopted (*nem. con.*).

- 11 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, the Report of this Committee, dated 30th November, 1916, was taken as read and adopted.
- 12 Third Party Risks. Cr. Fern reported that the Law Accident Insurance Society would require a premium of £4 0s. 0d. to cover temporary Third Party Risk to February 7th. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Pearson, a cheque was drawn for this amount.
- 13 Petrol. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded Cr. Ball, the seal of the Council was affixed to a Petrol License to Sir Charles Allom for the storage

of 100 gallons of Petrol, as recommended by the General Purposes Committee.

- 14 Firemen. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—"That the completion of the agreement with Mr. W. Joy, as a Volunteer Fireman, be deferred."
- 15 National Registration. A letter was read from Cr. Fern regretting his inability to undertake the inspection of the National Registration cards in his specified area in view of the secretarial duties now being carried out by him in respect of the Barnet War Savings Association. A meeting of the Sub-Committee concerned will be called together in due course.
- 16 War Charities Act. A letter of the 3rd November from the Charity Commission regarding new Regulations issued by them, was referred to the Committee dealing with the matter.
- 17 Agenda and Reports. The Agenda and Reports of the Herts County Council were received.
- 18 Belgian Relief. Letters inviting support and co-operation in various methods for the relief of Belgians were read from the Belgian Artistes Committee and the National Committee for Relief in Belgium, but no action was taken thereon.
- 19 Roumanian Flag Day. A letter from the Central Committee for National Patriotic Organizations as to participation in a Roumanian Flag Day was read but no action was taken thereon.

#### 5th December, 1916.

- 20 Blinded Soldiers. Letters were submitted from the National Institute for the Blind asking the Council's co-operation in a proposed visit to this district in June next of "The Blind Musicians," who would give a concert in aid of the St. Dunstan's Hostel for Blinded Soldiers and Sailors. On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That a reply be sent stating that the Council will favourably consider the matter together with any further information regarding the proposals that may be supplied before the next meeting of the Council."
- 21 Offices. An application was received from Mr. Leggett, Collector of Taxes, for the use of a room at the Council Offices from 10 to 1 on Wednesdays in January, February and March. The matter was referred to the Surveyor for arrangement. A request from the 3rd Battalion Herts Volunteer Regiment for the occasional use of a room at the Council Offices was acceded to.
- 22 Clerk's Department, The Chairman reported the intention of C. W. Dale, one of Mr. Poole's clerks, to enlist in His Majesty's Forces upon his now attaining military age, and the Chairman was unanimously authorised to convey to the latter the Council's written appreciation of his action.

### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

23 Searchlight Station. A letter was read from the War Department Land Agent, London District, regarding the proposed connection of a drain with the Council's sewer in respect of the Three Elms Searchlight Station, and setting out the suggested method of procedure. The War Department stated they were unable to enter into any arrangement as to payment of rental, as the powers under the Defence of the Realm Act were applicable. The matter was left in the hands of the Surveyor for arrangement, particularly as regards the disconnection of the drain upon the vacation of the Searchlight Station by the War Department.

and that a Special Meeting of the Council be held on Thursday, March 29th, to seal the Rate for the ensuing year."

- 10 Women's Day. Regulations for Street Collections. Welsh Flag Day. Communications on these subjects were submitted and laid on the table.
- 11 Gas (Standard of Calorific Power) Act, 1916. A communication was read from the Board of Trade stating that the Barnet District Gas and Water Co. had suggested an amendment to Clause 4 (2) of the draft order under this Act, and enquiring whether the Council desired to offer any observations thereon.

The Clerk read the proposed amendment and on the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was resolved—"That a request be preferred to the Board of Trade for the inclusion of the name of the Barnet Urban District Council with that of the East Barnet Valley Urban District Council in the amendment referred to."

12 Nursing of Measles. A communication was read from Miss Burnside, of the Hertfordshire County Nursing Association, enclosing revised reprints of the agreement under this head and asking the Council to seal them in the amended form.

- 18 Fire Calls. A letter was read from residents adjoining 78, High Street, Barnet, conveying their thanks for the services of the Fire Brigade at a recent Fire on the premises referred to.

On the motion of Cr. Thomas, duly seconded, it was unanimously resolved—"That the contents of the communication together with the appreciation of the Council be duly conveyed to the Chief Officer and members of the Brigade."

19 Jesus Hospital Charity. Cr. Williams moved in accordance with notice given—"That the Council consider the question of Jesus Hospital Charity, and pass such resolution in connection therewith as may be deemed desirable." The motion was duly seconded and carried.

On the further motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That the Clerk be asked to obtain full information with regard to this Charity for consideration by the Council in due course."

Friday, 23rd February, 1917.

At a SPECIAL MEETING of the COUNCIL duly convened and held at the Council Offices, on the above date at 7.30 p.m., "to consider applications by the Medical Officer of Health and the Surveyor, respectively, for leave of absence on Military Service," there were present

> Cr. H. Eames, J.P. (Chairman), ,, J. W. Pearson (Vice-Chairman),

with Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Thomas, Williams and Wills, the Medical Officer of Health, the Engineer and Surveyor, the Clerk, and the Assistant and Finance Clerk.

Dr. Hardie stated that he had accepted a commission in the R.A.M.C. and would have to sign on for a year, the demand for doctors having been characterised by the Medical Board and Tribunal as acute; and, with the consent of the Council, he proposed to take up his duties on the 22nd March. Dr. Stewart and Dr. Whitmarsh (*locum tenens* for Dr. Harnett) would assist the Council generally, while the former was prepared to act as Medical Officer of Health during his (Dr. Hardie's) absence.

As regarded child welfare work, there would be a Maternity Centre Meeting once in each week at the Church House presided over by Dr. Swatman under the ægis of the Herts County Council.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was unanimously resolved—" That leave to join His Majesty's Forces be accorded to Dr. Hardie, and that the permission of the Local Government Board be asked for Dr. Stewart to take up his municipal duties at the same salary as that now prevailing with regard to Dr. Hardie."

Mr. Chancellor stated that he had been offered a commission in the Labour Contingent of the Durham Light Infantry, and announced that Mr. Catchpole, the Assistant Surveyor to the Finchley Urban District Council, who was over Military age, and whose advice would be voluntary, would probably attend the meetings of the Council at a fee of one guinea per occasion.

The amount of the Army allowance would be £150 per annum. Cr. Malins moved—"That leave be accorded Mr. Chancellor to join His Majesty's Forces and that he be paid by the Council during his absence on military duties the sum of £200 per annum, which with his Army allowance of £150 per annum will be equivalent to an increase in his salary as Surveyor during such period of £50 per annum."

The motion having been seconded by Cr. Williams, Cr. Pearson moved the following amendment—"That leave be accorded Mr. Chancellor to join His Majesty's Forces and that, subject to the approval of the Local Government Board, he be paid by the Council during his absence on military duties the sum of £230 per annum, which with his Army allowance of £150 per annum will be equivalent to an increase in his salary as Surveyor during such period of £80 per annum."

The amendment having been seconded by Cr. Graddon, the original motion was, by leave, withdrawn and the amendment having become the motion, Cr. Fern moved the following amendment—" That leave be accorded Mr. Chancellor to join His Majesty's Forces and that he be paid by the Council during his absence on military duties the sum of £150 per annum, thus making with his Army allowance the sum of £300 per annum, being equivalent to the salary he is now receiving." The amendment was seconded by the Chairman and on being put was not carried, there voting *For*: the mover and seconder; *Against*: Crs. Pearson, Wills, Williams, Malins, Graddon, Thomas, Mackay, Chapman, Abercrombie and Hackforth-Jones. Cr. Williams then moved the following amendment—" That leave be accorded Mr.



9 Workmen. Wages. A letter, dated 19th March, was read from the Local Government Board stating that in view of the definition of "Civil Remuneration" contained in Section 21 of the Local Government (Emergency

Provisions) Act, 1916, it appeared that a lawful increase in the scale of remuneration of a class of the Council's employees may be included in calculating the allowances payable under Section 1 (1) of the Act to those members of the class who are serving with the Forces. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That a War Bonus of 3/-per week be granted to each of the 19 workmen at present in the service of the Council." On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—" That the question of the extension of the War Bonus to the Council's workmen on Active Service be referred to the General Purposes Committee for consideration and report."

- 10 Venereal Diseases. Vaccination. The Report of the Medical Officer of Health under these headings was read, and on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, adopted subject to the addition in the proposed notices dealing with the first matter of the words "or to any one of 22 Hospitals, the names of which will be furnished on application."
- 11 Farm. Engineer. The Assistant Surveyor reported there had been no applicants for this post.
- 12 Overseers. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved—" That Mr. Samuel Huggins be re-appointed an Overseer of the Parish of Chipping Barnet for the ensuing year." On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved—" That Mr. Ernest Harry Neal be re-appointed an Overseer of the Parish of Chipping Barnet for the ensuing year." On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—" That Mr. William Henry Abercrombie be appointed an Overseer of the Parish of Chipping Barnet for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved —"That Mr. Herbert Grieve and Mr. Thomas Smith be re-appointed Overseers of the Parish of South Mims Urban for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved —"That Mr. Thomas Charles and Mr. Arthur Nunneley be re-appointed Overseers of the Parish of Hadley for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved— "That Mr. Alfred Parmenter and Mr. Frank William Hackforth-Jones be reappointed Overseers of the Parish of Arkley for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved— "That Mr. George Ball, Mr. Charles Dunch and Mr. Josiah Kipping Mackay be re-appointed Overseers of the Parish of Totteridge for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was unanimously resolved—" That the thanks of the Council be conveyed to Mr. G. D. Malins for his past services as one of the Overseers for the Parish of Chipping Barnet, together with an expression of regret at the circumstances necessitating his retirement."

- 13 Insanitary Dwellings. Calvert Road. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Williams, the seal of the Council was duly affixed to the Order determining the closing Order made in respect of Nos. 32-42, Calvert Road."
- 14 Councillors' Attendances. The Clerk submitted the Annual Statement of attendances of Councillors at meetings of the Committees and the Council.
- 15 Meetings. It was resolved—" That the Annual Meeting of the Council be held on Tuesday, April 17th, at 8 p.m., and that the next ordinary meetings of Standing Committees take place on Thursday, April 26th."
- 16 Charities. Jesus Hospital. The Clerk submitted his Report on this subject. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved— "(1) That the thanks of the Council be accorded to Mr. Poole for the trouble he had taken in obtaining the information given; (2) That the report be handed to the Press for publication; and (3) That the consideration of the matter be adjourned to a later date."

#### 20th March, 1917.

- 17 Water Supplies. Port of London (Various Powers) Bill. The Clerk reported that the petition of the County Council against certain sections of this Bill had been duly sealed on behalf of this Authority. A letter, dated March 19th, was read from the Clerk of the Peace stating that in face of the County Council's opposition and that of this Authority the Promoters of the Bill had withdrawn Sub-sections 1, 3 and 4 of Clause 36 which were likely to be prejudicial to the interests of this Authority.
- 18 Surveyor. Salary. Correspondence was read between the Clerk and the Local Government Board from which it appeared that in view of the circumstances of the case the Board sanctioned the payment of an allowance to Second Lieutenant W. B. Chancellor at the rate of £230 per annum, so far as it exceeds the rate of allowance fixed by the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, it being understood, however, that in the event of an increase in Mr. Chancellor's military pay the amount of the excess allowance must be correspondingly reduced.
- 19 Medical Officer of Health. A letter, dated 6th March, was read from the Local Government Board sanctioning the appointment of Dr. B. H. Stewart as Deputy Medical Officer of Health for the District with a salary at the rate of £60 per annum during the absence of Dr. C. F. Hardie on Military Service.
- 20 National Service. National Registration. A letter, dated February 27th, was read from the Local Government Board asking the Council to place the National Register at the disposal of the National Service Recruiting Committee. The Clerk stated this had already been done. A letter, dated February 28th, was read from Mr. W. C. Waymouth in this connection offering to undertake any professional work in which he could be of use. It was resolved—" That the thanks of the Council be conveyed to Mr. Waymouth and that his offer be referred to the National Service Committee."
- 21 Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee. Maintenance of Patients. A letter was read from the Clerk of the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee stating that in consequence of the increasing cost of provisions, etc., the charge to the Constituent Authorities in respect of the maintenance of patients will be raised from 1/6 to 2/- per day as from the 1st April next.
- 22 Food Consumption. A letter from the National War Savings Committee on this subject was read and handed to the Chairman and Cr. Fern for consideration.
- 23 General District Rate. V.A.D. Hospital. A letter, dated March 19th, was read from Mr. C. E. Berry asking for a remission of General District Rate in respect of "Oakfield," Totteridge Lane, which had been taken at a nominal rent for purposes of a V.A.D. Hospital. On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That Mr. Berry be asked to state the amount of rent paid for the premises and that he be informed the Council have no power to remit rates on property in respect of which rent is paid; but in the event of the premises being occupied for the purpose named rentfree the Council will be prepared to give his application their favourable consideration."
- 24 Small Pox Accommodation. On the motion of Cr. Wills, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the delegates to the conference on this matter consist of the Council's representatives on the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee together with the Chairman of the Council." It was further resolved— "That the conference be held in the Council's Offices on Tuesday the 27th instant."
- 25 England's Day. Y.W.C.A. Women's Day. Belgian Repatriation Fund. War Refugees. Metropolitan War Loan Campaign. Lee Conservancy Board (Elections). Medical Education and Registration. London "Safety First" Campaign. Various letters on these subjects were submitted but no action was taken thereon.

#### 20th March, 1917.

- 26 War Charities. A communication, dated February 27th, from the Charity Commission on this subject was read and referred to the War Charities Committee.
- 27 Pig-keeping. Soldier Labour. Letters from the Rural League and the Hertfordshire War Agricultural Committee respectively on these subjects were referred to the War Agriculture Committee for attention.
- 28 Allotments. A letter, dated March 13th, was read from Mr. P. Fergusson stating that Lord Enfield was willing to extend the West Barnet Allotments by adding a field or part of a field. The matter was referred to the Land Cultivation Committee for attention.
- 29 Hand Book. A letter, dated March 17th, was read from Messrs. Ed. J. Burrow & Co., Ltd., asking for assistance in connection with the hand book they proposed issuing for the District. Having regard to previous resolutions passed by the Council on the subject the matter was left in the hands of the Clerk.

The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, it was resolved— "That Mr. C. W. Hill be asked to transfer from Mr. Chancellor to Mr. Plumpton the allowance of £80 per annum made by him for carrying on his duties as Inspector during his absence."

On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That

pending Mr. Hill's reply, Mr. Chancellor be asked to transfer to Mr. Plumpton, as from March 1st, the allowance of £80 per annum received by him from Mr. Hill for carrying on the duties of Inspector."

32 Surveyor. Clerical Assistance. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—"That advertisements be inserted in "The Local Government Chronicle," and the "Barnet Press," for the services of a temporary Clerk in the Surveyor's department, a discharged soldier being preferred, salary required to be stated by the applicant; also that a communication be addressed to the Discharged Soldiers and Sailors Association inviting applications for the post."

It was further resolved—"That Mr. Plumpton be authorized to obtain temporary assistance, subject to a week's notice, at a cost of not exceeding 30/- per week."



Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Tinsley, Wellsman, Williams and Wills, be appointed as the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Malins, Cr. Thomas was re-elected Chairman of the Committee.

- 12 Barnet Isolation Hospital. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—"That Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Fern and Malins be re-appointed the Council's representatives on the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee for the ensuing year."

The Report of the Acting Surveyor and Inspector was read and considered.

- 13 Temporary Clerk. Applications for this post were submitted and referred to a Committee consisting of the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, with Crs. Ball, Eames and Fern for consideration and with power to act.
- 14 Annual Report. Copies of the Annual Report of the Medical Officer of Health and Acting Inspector were presented and their consideration adjourned to the next Meeting of the Council.
- 15 Small Pox Accommodation. Cr. Fern reported that with the Clerk he had attended the conference with County Alderman J. L. Pank on this subject and stated that the Local Government Board were pressing for the provision of accommodation in anticipation of a possible outbreak of Small Pox, and with the Board's approval the County Council had power to insist upon such accommodation being provided. The representatives of the three Barnet Councils were not anxious to join with Cheshunt while the latter body were not desirous of having cases sent from Barnet into their District. Mr. Pank had, however, undertaken to approach the Committee of the St. Albans Isolation Hospital with a view to their accepting cases from Barnet and would communicate with the Authorities concerned as to the result of his interview.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—" That the report be received with thanks to the delegates for their services and that the Chairman of the Council be requested to convene a second meeting of the conference on receipt of Mr. Pank's expected communication."

16 Recreation Ground. Seats. Wounded Soldiers. Cr. Eames suggested there was room for the provision of 12 more seats in the Recreation Ground. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was resolved— "That an appeal be made through the 'Barnet Press' for the gift or loan of the seats in question for the duration of the War and that donors be permitted to have inscription plates affixed to them if so desired." An offer of the loan of 6 seats from Cr. Chapman was accepted with the thanks of the Council.

- 17 Maternity and Child Welfare Centre. The Clerk reported that during the absence of the Medical Officer of Health on Military Service, the Rector of Chipping Barnet was dealing with this matter and desired authority to have further details, which were then read, printed on the notice cards. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—"That the necessary expense of printing on the reverse of the cards in hand and on a further 1,000 copies be and is hereby authorised subject to the wording having the formal approval of the Acting Medical Officer of Health."
- 18 Jesus Hospital. On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That 50 copies of the Clerk's Report on this matter as published in the 'Barnet Press' be printed and a copy furnished to each member of the Council."
- 19 Assistant Surveyor and Inspector. The Clerk read a communication from Lt. W. B. Chancellor, stating that he had given the necessary instructions to his Bankers with regard to the transfer to Mr. Plumpton of the allowance in respect of Inspector's duties received from Lt. C. W. Hill.
- 20 Blind Musicians' Concert. The communication, dated 11th December, 1916, received from Lady Pearson with regard to a proposed concert by Blind Musicians in Barnet was again read and on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—"That Lady Pearson be informed that owing to the present demands on the time and service of the Councillors it has been found necessary to postpone the consideration of the matter for a further period of three months."

- 22 Barnet District Gas and Water Co. Copies of the Annual Statement of Account of this Company for the year 1916, were submitted and laid on the table.
- 23 Garden Cities. Town Planning. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That the paper received on this matter be referred to the Town Planning Committee for attention."
- 24 Fire Brigade. A letter, dated 29th March, addressed to the Chairman, was read from the Barnet Tradesmen's Association asking the Council to receive a deputation with regard to the attendance of the Fire Brigade at fires outside the District. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved, nem. con.—" That the Report be received."

11 Fire Brigade. Fires. A deputation from the Barnet Tradesmen's Association, consisting of Messrs. H. Coppin, J. Jackaman and H. W. Tilbury, attended before the Council with regard to the employment or otherwise of the Fire Brigade outside the Urban area and the possible provision of auxiliary fire appliances for use in connection therewith without cost to the District.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was unanimously resolved—"That the deputation be thanked for their attendance and that the further consideration of the matter be referred to the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee."

12 Contracts. Tar. Tarmacadam. Granite. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge,

- seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—"That the seal of the Council be affixed to the following Contracts: J. Smart & Son for (1) Tarmacadamising a portion of High Street; (2) Tar, and (3) Tarmacadam; (4) Enderby and Stoney Stanton Co. for Granite Ballast; (5) Groby Granite Co. for Granite Chippings; and further—That the Chairman and the Clerk be authorised to affix the seal of the Council to the Bond in connection with the first Contract upon its receipt from Messrs. Smart & Son's sureties."

Fern presented a report submitted by the Food Campaign Sub-Committee of the Barnet Local Central Committee for War Savings from which it appeared that a series of lectures on the preparation of and economy in foods, a free exhibition with practical demonstrations in the preparation of substitutes for foods now unobtainable, general publicity for such lectures and demonstrations and the institution of a Communal Food Kitchen in the town, were recommended.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—" That the recommendations contained in the Report be adopted, with the exception of that referring to a communal food kitchen,

which should be referred back to the Committee, and that the Committee be thanked for their services in the matter."

## Council Meeting.

Monday, 7th May, 1917.

At an adjourned MEETING of the COUNCIL held on the above date there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Hackforth-Jones, J.P., Mackay, Malins, C.C., and Williams, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), Dr. B. H. Stewart (Acting Medical Officer of Health), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Recreation Ground. Swans. Ducks. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—" That Mr. J. Boatwright's offer of 5<sub>i</sub>'- for each of the swans and 4/6 for each of the ducks in the Recreation Ground be accepted."
- 2 National Service. Substitution Volunteers. A circular letter, dated 25th April, was read from Lord Rhondda and Mr. Neville Chamberlain together

with a letter, dated 2nd May, from Mr. Arthur Collins, Secretary of the National Service Department, from which it appeared that the organisation of some of the trades and industries of the Country should be reviewed with the object both of increasing the yield of available men for National Service and of economising labour resources and for this purpose a National Service Committee should be set up to supplement the original scheme of National Service Volunteers and specially to promote the arrangements for enrolling and allocating Substitution Volunteers, to encourage the co-operation of local trades so as to economise labour employed in those trades and to organise schemes for the utilisation of part-time labour, the Substitution Volunteers to be called for from the less essential trades and occupations in order to fill the places of men of military age now doing work of National importance, who will shortly be called up to join the Army. In view of the likelihood that women's labour may be employed in substitution work, it was desirable that one or more women be placed upon the Committee.

It was also suggested that the Committee should prepare an outline of the scheme or schemes, which having regard to the unorganised and miscellaneous trades in the District, seem to be necessary to deal effectively with these trades, authority being given to cover the initiatory expenses until the Committee can formulate a programme of the work required to be undertaken so far as can be foreseen.

Cr. Ball moved—"That the work proposed be referred to the existing National Service Committee with power to add to their number." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Williams, Cr. Eames moved, as an amendment—"That this Council be the nucleus of the National Service Committee and that all Non-Council members of the former National Service Committee be and they are hereby co-opted members of the Committee."

The amendment was put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Hackforth-Jones, Malins and Thomas; Against: Cr. Williams. Upon the amendment being put as a substantive motion it was carried on a like voting.

3 Jesus Hospital Charity. Cr. Williams moved in accordance with notice given—"That the Clerk write to the Secretary of Jesus Hospital Charity enquiring whether the Governors and Visitors would be willing to entertain a proposal that the Barnet Urban District Council should co-operate with them in the promulgation of a New Scheme for the administration of the Charity." The motion was seconded by Cr. Thomas, and carried *nem. con.*, there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Thomas and Williams.

### 7th May, 1917.

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved and Cr. Ball seconded—" That the resolution be not conveyed to the Governors and Visitors of the Charity until after the result of the Vestry Meeting dealing with the subject called for 25th May be made known."

The motion was not carried, there voting For: Crs. Ball and Hackforth-Jones, Against: Crs. Aldridge, Chapman, Dunch, Fern, Mackay, Thomas and Williams."

4 Tram Service. Cr. Williams moved in accordance with notice given—" That the Tramway Company be urgently requested to resume a frequent through service of Trams between Barnet and London." The motion was seconded by Cr. Mackay and carried, *nem. con*.

It was further resolved—" That copies of the resolution be forwarded to the Hertfordshire and Middlesex County Councils."

- 5 Food Economy. Communal Kitchen. Cr. Fern submitted a further report on this matter from which it appeared the local Committee were applying for the use of Byng Road Cookery Centre for experimental purposes, with a view to ascertaining the need for the formation of a Communal Kitchen.
- 6 The King's Proclamation. Food Supplies. Forage. Horses. The Clerk read the Proclamation issued by H.M. The King, under date of 2nd May.

Cr. Williams moved and Cr. Malins seconded—"That application be made to the Food Controller for a license to feed the Council's eight horses with oats on the scale recently resolved upon by the Council."

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved-" That Standing Order No. 16 be suspended

to permit of an amendment by Cr. Eames—'That the supply of oats be crushed and that the allowance per horse be reduced to 5 lbs. per day,'" being submitted to the Council. Cr. Eames having seconded the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones it was put and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge, Eames, Fern and Hackforth-Jones; *Against*: Crs. Ball, Mackay, Malins, Thomas and Williams.

The original motion was then put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Mackay, Malins, Thomas and Williams; Against: Crs. Aldridge, Eames and Hackforth-Jones.

It was also resolved unanimously—" That the Council's workmen be instructed to report any waste food found in the course of dust collection and the houses from which such waste proceeds."

### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

7 Infectious Disease. Cerebro-Spinal Meningitis. The Acting Medical Officer of Health submitted a report of a case of this disease which occurred recently within the District, the infant patient having since died, while persons having had contact with the case had been isolated and no further cases had occurred.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—" That a copy of Dr. Stewart's Report be forwarded to the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee, and that the sum of £3 10s. 0d. be paid to the relatives who had sustained loss of employment to that amount by reason of voluntary isolation."

On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was also resolved—" That a request be submitted to the Local Government Board for the issue of an Order enforcing compulsory isolation of persons having been in contact with cases of a similar character."

8 Totteridge. A letter, dated 28th April, was read from the Barnet Rural District Council requesting early and satisfactory arrangements for the liquidation of the claim set forth by that Authority in respect of the transfer of the Parish of Totteridge.

Cr. Fern moved—"That Counsel's opinion be obtained as to the liability or otherwise of this Authority for payment of any portion of the claim made by the Barnet Rural District Council." 7th May, 1917.

The motion was seconded by Cr. Mackay and carried, there voting For : Crs. Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Fern, Mackay, Thomas and Williams; Against : Cr. Eames.

It was also resolved—"That Cr. Mackay be asked to peruse the draft case for Counsel and also that he be invited to attend any conferences arranged with Counsel in connection therewith."

- 9 Offices. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved, nem. con.—"That 20 Aluminium Stair Treads, 3 feet long, be purchased from Messrs. Braby, at a cost of 4/6 per tread, and that they be affixed to the stairs leading to the Council Chamber."
- 10 Interest on Balances. Cr. Fern reported that upon consulting the Treasurer he found the arrangement made with the Bank in February, 1914, for interest on balances was still standing, and it was resolved-" That no further action be taken in the matter."
- 11 Tarmacadam. High Street. Crossings. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved urgency to rescind that portion of the resolution passed by the Council at their Meeting on 17th April, whereby it was directed that the work of tarmacadamising the portion of High Street between Moxon Street and the Tram Terminus should be carried out by direct labour. The motion was duly seconded and carried unanimously.

Cr. Ball then moved—"That the words 'by direct labour' be deleted from the second paragraph under the heading of 'High Street' on page 520, and that Messrs. J. Smart and Son be asked to carry out the work therein referred to, the extra cost to be incurred amounting approximately to £93." The motion was seconded by Cr. Chapman and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was unanimously resolved—" That the crossings in the respective portions of High Street about to be made up, viz.: those at Union Street and Church Passage, be taken up."

Fern moved as an amendment—"That the second paragraph under the heading of 'Sewage, Sludge, Fertilizer,' on page 17 of the Report be amended to read as follows: 'That Horticulturists in the District be asked to accept delivery on their land, suitably situated, of the house refuse, fish offal and slaughterhouse refuse collected in the District, for a period to be arranged and defined." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Graddon and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Fern, Graddon and Thomas; Against: Crs. Aldridge, Ball, Eames, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Williams and Wills. Cr. Ball then moved as an amendment—" That the paragraph headed 'Engineer, War Service,' on page 17 of the Report be amended to read as follows: 'That efforts to obtain the services of a substitute be continued, but in the event of the Council not being successful before 24th June an appeal be made to the County Tribunal for an extension of time or for substitution in respect of W. Nickolls, the question of the amount of wages to be paid to a substitute being left in the hands of Cr. Chapman and the Acting Surveyor.'" The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried nem. con., there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Fern, Thomas, Williams and Wills; Cr. Hackforth-Jones abstaining from voting.

The original motion, with the deletion of the paragraph in the Report dealing with the matter of the Engineer, was then put and carried, there voting For: The Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Eames, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Williams and Wills; Against: Cr. Fern. On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That the Local Government Board be asked for a reply to the Council's letter of 24th May with regard to the Farm Engineer, W. Nickolls."

Mr. W. H. Cutbush was in attendance before the Council and explained at length his reasons for communicating with the Council on the question of collecting and placing for disposal material available for fertilization purposes.

Mr. Cutbush was made acquainted with the resolution passed in the Farm Committee's Report as to his being asked to accept deposits of refuse collected on to his land in New Road and stated his willingness to accept the proposal, but was of opinion that in view of his statements as to the value of such deposits the Council might now desire to give other cultivators in the District some consideration also of a similar nature.



5th June, 1917.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved-" That Mr. Cutbush be thanked for his attendance and that he be assured the subject of his communication and attendance will receive due consideration by the Council at an early date."

It was subsequently resolved-"That a Special Meeting of the Council be held on Monday, 11th June, at 8 p.m., to consider the question of dealing with material available for fertilization."

- 4 Farm. Committee. On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—"That the name of Cr. H. E. Fern be added to the Farm Committee."
- 5 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was resolved-"That the Report of the Highways Committee, dated 31st May, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 6 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved-"That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated 31st May, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 7 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved-"That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated 31st May, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 8 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved-" That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated 31st May, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."

- 9 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved-"That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated 31st May, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 10 Food Economy. Communal Kitchen. Mrs. Weber and Mrs. Charles, with other ladies, were in attendance and placed before the Council the proposals of the Committee dealing with the question of the provision of an experimental Communal Kitchen in the District at the Byng Road Cookery Centre.

Cr. Fern moved—"That in view of the representations made to the Council by the deputation from the Barnet Food Economy Campaign Committee respecting the inauguration of a Public Kitchen, it is agreed to advance up to £20 to such Committee by way of loan for financing the Kitchen under that Committee's management." The motion was seconded by Cr. Williams and carried nem. con.

The Chairman stated that upon making enquiries at the Local Government Board Offices he had been informed that the Board would make no objection to the loan and if the sum advanced should not be repaid their Auditor would take no exception to the payment.

- 11 Finance. Totteridge. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved (Cr. Eames voting contra)-" That a cheque for £5 10s. 0d. be drawn in payment of Counsel's fee for an Opinion with regard to the claim made by the Barnet Rural District Council in connection with the transfer of the Parish of Totteridge to the Urban area."
- 12 Blind Musicians. It was resolved-" That no further action be taken with regard to the proposed arrangements by Lady Pearson for a concert by Blind Musicians in the town."
- 13 Jesus Hospital Charity. Letters, dated 10th and 12th May, were read from the Clerk of this Charity suggesting that some members of the Council should endeavour to secure appointment as members of the deputation from the Chipping Barnet Vestry on this matter, and adding that the Chairman of the Visitors of the Charity desired the Council to advance any suggestions they may have to make as to a new scheme for the administration of the Charity.

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved-" That a small Committee, consisting of 3 members, should be appointed to get into communication with the deputation 5th June, 1917.

appointed by the Chipping Barnet Vestry and ascertain their views for the purpose of discussing the proposals to be placed before the Visitors of the Charity." The motion was seconded by Cr. Williams and carried.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Eames, it was resolved—"That such Committee consist of the Chairman, Cr. Fern and Cr. Williams."

- 14 Maternity and Child Welfare. "Baby Week." A letter was read from Cr. Fern stating that the Barnet Women's Welfare Council had decided to interest themselves in this matter and to undertake active propaganda in connection therewith. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—" That the use of the Council's offices, free of expense, be placed at the disposal of the Committee on a date to be arranged for the purpose of a lecture dealing with the subject." On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—" That the expenses of the lecture be borne by the Council."
- 15 Urban District Councils' Association. Royal Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Fund for Sick and Wounded Horses. Barnet Ambulance Fund. Letters on these subjects were read but no action was taken thereon.
- 16 Government Lands and Buildings. A letter, dated 31st May, was read from the Lands and Buildings Reconstruction Committee with regard to the disposal of Government Lands and Buildings upon the conclusion of Peace, and it was resolved—" That a reply be sent stating there were no such lands or buildings within the Council's District."
- 17 Small Pox Accommodation. A letter was read from the Clerk of the County Council enquiring what action had been taken by the Council in this matter. It was resolved—" That a reply be sent stating the question of the provision of Small Pox accommodation in the District had been referred to the representatives of the Council on the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee, who would report to the Council so soon as the Committee, who had the matter under consideration, were prepared to make recommendations on the subject, it being understood that the Committee would communicate with the County Authority direct with regard to their proposals."
- 18 Allotments. The Lands Cultivation Committee submitted a recommendation that the Council should accept an agreement on the terms of Lord Enfield's letter of the 11th May, 1917 (previously referred to them for consideration), with regard to the taking over of land for Allotments, the proposals being (1) That the land should be the portion of the Golf Links adjoining Hadley Green on the East side of the footpath from Barnet to Hadley; (2) That the nominal rent should be 5/- per annum; (3) That the Council should pay all outgoings—rates, taxes, etc.—and provide and erect a substantial fence to prevent the stock grazing on the Links from straying on the Allotments; (4) That the Council should indemnify the owner of such stock from any damage which may be done should such trespass occur by some unforeseen means or reason; (5) That the tenancy be for one year.

Cr. Eames, having stated that the cost of the proposed fence would be borne out of the funds of the Lands Cultivation Committee and that should the land referred to be required for a longer period than one year the Committee would have power to continue the tenancy, moved—" That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted." The motion was seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Ball, Chapman, Eames, Hackforth-Jones and Wills; *Against*: Crs. Abercrombie and Fern.

19 Cultivation of Land. The Lands Cultivation Committee further recommended—" That Private E. C. G. Bacon of 'Verulam,' Granville Road, Barnet, be transferred from the farm on which he is now working, to Barnet, to enable him to cultivate his own holding, he having expressed his willingness to break up the land in question for the cultivation of food as may be directed by the War Agricultural Committee."

On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Williams it was resolved— "That the recommendation be forwarded to the Hertfordshire War Agricultural Committee."

- 20 Rates on Government Property. A letter, dated 5th June, was read from the Overseers of the Parish of South Mims Urban expressing the opinion that strong representations should be made by the Council to the War Office with regard to the Government's refusal to make an equitable contribution in lieu of Rates in respect of the Barracks property now in the occupation of Territorial Forces. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Fern, it was resolved—"That a letter be written to the War Office accordingly."
- 21 Food Economy. A letter, dated 11th May, was read from The Master Bakers of High Barnet stating they would be pleased to help any Authority for the protection of National interests with regard to the feeding of the public, and enquiring the Council's opinion as to whether an appeal through the "Barnet Press" urging economy in the use of bread would be of service. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—"That the Association be informed the Council appreciate their attitude and offer of co-operation in the matter and thank them for their efforts in this direction."

It was further resolved---"That the letter from the Association be handed to the Press for publication."

- 22 Venereal Diseases. A letter, dated 23rd May, was read from the Honorary Secretaries of the London and Home Counties Branch of the National Council for Combating Venereal Diseases inviting the Chairman to serve as a member of the General Council of the Branch, the first meeting of which would be held at the Barnes Hall, 1, Wimpole Street, at 5 p.m. on Thursday, 14th June. The Chairman, having stated his inability to serve, it was resolved, on the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones— "That Cr. A. G. Malins, C.C., be appointed the Council's representative in this connection."
- 23 Surveyor. Military Service. Cr. Wills moved in accordance with notice given—" That this Council records its regret that at the last meeting of the Council a statement made by Cr. Eames should have given the impression that Mr. Chancellor, the Council's Surveyor, refrained from offering his services to the Military authorities until after the Compulsory Military Service Act had been passed, it being well known that on two separate occasions Mr. Chancellor sought to enter the Army but was medically rejected."

The motion having been seconded by the Chairman, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—" That Cr. Eames, having been under a misapprehension with regard to Mr. Chancellor's endeavours to obtain acceptance for service with His Majesty's Army, admits that the responsibility of Mr. Chancellor remaining in civil employment rested with the Council and therefore no further action be taken in the matter." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Fern and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Fern, Hackforth-Jones and Mackay; *Against*: The Chairman, Crs. Abercrombie, Graddon, Thomas, Williams and Wills.

The original motion was then put and carried *nem. con.*, there voting For : The Chairman, Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Graddon, Mackay, Thomas, Williams and Wills.

24 Congratulations. Parliamentary Representative. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—" That the Council offer their congratulations to Sir E. Hildred Carlile, Member of Parliament for the Mid or St. Albans Division of Hertfordshire, upon his elevation to a Baronetcy of the United Kingdom."

## Council Meeting.

### Monday, 11th June, 1917.

At a Special Meeting of the COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date to consider the question of collection and disposal of material available for fertilisation purposes, there were present Cr. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

Mr. W. H. Cutbush was also in attendance.

- House Refuse. The Acting Surveyor and Inspector reported that some 30 tons of House Refuse were collected weekly and the quantity now at the Farm was some 4,000 yards. Present collections were deposited either at the Farm, the Moxon Street shoot or Messrs. Cutbush & Son's land, as convenience of delivery permitted.
- Sludge. Mr. Plumpton, having stated that some 500 tons of Sludge was collected at the Sewage Farm each year, the question of its disposal was considered, and on the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Hackforth Jones, it was resolved—"That the offer of Mr. Cutbush to obtain from the Royal Horticultural Society, at an approximate cost of £1 1s. 0d., an analysis (from the point of view as a fertiliser) of mixed samples of Sludge taken from the septic tanks and the settling tanks be accepted, the necessary arrangements being left in the hands of Mr. Cutbush and the Acting Surveyor."
- Bones and Fat. It was resolved—" That no action be taken with regard to these items, the quantity available being insufficient to cover the cost of labour involved in their collection and disposal."

## Council Meeting.

#### Tuesday, 7th August, 1917.

At a MEETING of the COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. W. H. Abercrombie, G. J. Aldridge, G. Ball, J. T. Chapman, H. Eames, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., J. K. Mackay. A. G. Malins, C.C., Major W. H. Wellsman and E. T. Williams, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Minutes. The Minutes of the Meeting of the 3rd July were taken as read and signed.
- 2 Direction Plate. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That a direction plate be affixed in Alston Road at its junction with Wentworth Road indicating the route to St. Albans."
- 3 Broken Glass. Totteridge. Cr. Mackay having called attention to the quantity of broken glass deposited at Totteridge Green the Clerk undertook to communicate with the Lord of the Manor on the subject.
- 4 Farm. Sludge. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Eames, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated 2nd August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."

Cr. Chapman announced that he had arranged with Mr. Cutbush for the removal of the contents of the lagoons @ 1/- per yard and sludge from the heap @ 2/- per yard.

5 Highways. Public Lighting. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Highways Committee, dated 2nd August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."

It was also resolved—"That the correspondence relating to Street Lighting which was before the Highways Committee on 2nd August be handed to the 'Press' together with a note of Cr. Eames' report following his interview with the Home Office on the subject."

- 6 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated 2nd August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 7 Housing of the Working Classes. Repairs. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—"That the Report of the

Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated 2nd August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."

Tenders were submitted for repairs to Dollis Cottages, and it was resolved—"That the tender of Messrs. H. Wise & Sons at £80 be accepted."

8 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—" That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated 2nd August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."

### 7th August, 1917.

- 9 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Graddon, seconded by Cr. Eames, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated 2nd August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 10 Jesus Hospital Charity. The Chairman reported that the delegates appointed by the Council were courteously received by the Visitors of the Charity on Saturday, 4th August, when they were informed that the proposals submitted would be considered and further conferences arranged in due course.
- 11 Clerk's and Solicitor's Remuneration. Cr. Pearson moved—"That the Report of this Committee, dated 2nd August, be taken as read and adopted." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, Cr. Williams moved as an amendment in accordance with notice given: (a) "That the duties of Clerk and Solicitor to the Council be merged, as repeatedly requested by the Local Government Board Auditor;" (b) "That Mr. Poole be given an inclusive salary of £550 per annum for the combined duties, the matter to be again considered at the end of six months after the Declaration of Peace."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Thomas and not carried, there voting For : Crs. Thomas, Wellsman and Williams; Against : The Chairman, Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Eames, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones and Malins.

The motion was then put and carried, there voting For: The Chairman, Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay and Malins; Against: Crs. Aldridge, Eames, Graddon and Wellsman.

- 12 Assistant and Finance Clerk. Cr. Williams moved in accordance with notice given—"That the salary of the Finance Clerk be and is hereby raised to 25 guineas per annum." The motion was seconded by Cr. Thomas and carried, there voting For: The Chairman, Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Thomas and Williams; Against: Crs. Eames, Graddon and Wellsman.
- 13 Coal Supply. The Household Coal Distribution Order, No. 1, 1917. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—" That the Report of this Committee, dated 17th July, be taken as read and adopted."

Letters from the Board of Trade, the Metropolitan Borough of Bethnal Green and the Metropolitan Borough of Wandsworth on the subject were read and considered, but no action was taken thereon.

- 14 Representation of the People Bill. Boundary Commission. Mr. Poole submitted reports, dated respectively 12th and 24th July, upon his attendances before the Assistant Commissioners for the Counties of Middlesex and Hertford, when he supported proposals that the Enfield Division should consist of the Rural District of South Mims and the Urban District of Enfield, and that a fifth Division of the County of Hertford should be formed, to be called the Hemel Hempsted Division, which would secure the proper and adequate representation of the Agricultural interest. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—" That the thanks of the Council be accorded to Mr Poole for his services in the matter."
- 15 Food Control. Sugar. Prices of Food. With reference to the recommendation of the General Purposes Committee under this head at p. 44, Mr. Poole reported that he had carefully investigated the details of the case and the necessary proceedings would be instituted accordingly.
- 16 Tram Shelter. Letters were read from the Metropolitan Tramways Company and the Finchley Urban District Council from which it appeared that the question of the provision of a Shelter at Tally Ho Corner, Finchley, was
  - under consideration.
- 17 Blind Musicians. "Our Day." Patriotic Demonstrations. Herts County Regiment. Casual Vacancies. Various communications on these subjects were read but no action was taken thereon.
- 18 Herts Volunteer Regiment. A letter, dated 19th July, was read from Corporal W. S. Bates giving particulars as to strength, membership and work

done in connection with "B" Company (Barnet) of the 3rd Herts Volunteer Regiment.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved, nem. con.---" That a grant be made to the funds of the Company."

It was also resolved-" That Corporal Bates be asked to supply a recent financial statement and that the Clerk obtain information as to what is being done by other neighbouring Councils in a similar connection."

19 Councillors. Absence from Meetings. A letter, dated 20th July, was read from Cr. Sheppard explaining his continued absence from Meetings of the Council and its Committees on the ground of the necessity for his personal attention to his business owing to the whole of his employees having joined H.M. Army.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That Cr. Sheppard be asked whether he desires to retain his seat on the Council."

20 Employer's Liability Insurance. Injuries by Aircraft. A letter, dated 4th August, was read from the Law Accident Insurance Society in reply to the Clerk's enquiry referring the Council to the "Times" report of the 24th June, 1915, on the discussion in the House of Lords, from which it appeared that the Government were allowing compensation for personal injuries but it was generally understood by the Companies that the ordinary Workmen's Compensation Policy does not cover War Risks. Terms for the insurance of the Council's employees in respect of injury by Aircraft were quoted.

It was resolved—"That the matter be left in the hands of the Clerk for investigation and report."

- 21 Volunteer Firemen. Insurance. It was resolved-"That a cheque for  $\pounds 1$  6s. 0d. be drawn in payment of the renewal premium in respect of insurance with the Law Accident Insurance Society of the Volunteer Firemen."
- 22 Charities. Garrett, Hill and Williams Charities. A letter, dated 4th August, was read from the Charity Commission enclosing copy of a notice of a proposed Order prepared by the Board appointing Mr. William Archibald Boyes a Trustee of this Charity to which the Council offered no objection.
- 23 Food Control. Sugar Distribution. A letter, dated 2nd August, was read from the Local Government Board covering a communication received by them from the Food Controller establishing local machinery for more systematic control of some of the foodstuffs in the Country.

Instructions as to the formation of a Committee and immediate steps to be taken by them were also enclosed together with a scheme for Sugar Distribution.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved, nem. con.-" That the Council form a Local Food Control Committee."

It was further resolved—" That such Committee consist of the following : Cr. G. J. Aldridge (representing Labour), Mrs. Weber, Crs. W. H. Aber-crombie, G. Ball, J. T. Chapman, H. Eames, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones and A. G. Malins, with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Council."

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, it was resolved-"That the free use of the Council's Offices be placed at the disposal of the Committee."

The scheme under which the Committee would work was discussed and on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved-"That representations be made to the Local Government Board pointing out that while the Council and its staff are anxious to assist the Government in every way possible, the sum proposed to be allowed for extra clerical assistance is totally inadequate for the work to be performed as it would only permit of an approximate expenditure in the case of this District of £2 2s. 0d. per week for the remainder of the year, for 2 full time and 3 or 4 temporary assistants."

At a MEETING of the COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. W. H. Abercrombie, G. J. Aldridge, G. Ball, H. Eames, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., J. K. Mackay, A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley, E. T. Williams and A. J. Wills, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, it was resolved— "That the Minutes of the Meetings of the 7th and 21st August, be taken as read and adopted."
- 2 Food Control. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Food Control Committee of 7th August, be taken as read and adopted." On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Food Control Committee of 21st August, be taken as read and adopted."

A report was read from the Acting Inspector asking instructions as to whom his reports as Inspector under the Local Authorities Food Control Crder (No. 1), 1917, should be submitted, as the Food Control Committee was formed under the Food Control Committees (Constitution) Order, 1917, as governed by the Local Authorities (Food Control) Order (No. 2), 1917, and the first Order named embodied all the Orders issued up to the present with the exception of that dealing with the distribution of Sugar, which was regulated by the two last named Orders. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Fern, a vote of urgency was passed for the purpose of dealing with the matter.

Cr. Aldridge then moved—"That the recommendation of the General Purposes Committee under the heading of "Food Control" at p. 33, as adopted by the Council at their Meeting of 3rd July at p. 36, par. 6, be and is hereby rescinded." The motion was seconded by Cr. Fern, and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins and the Chairman; Against: Cr. Williams.

Cr. Aldridge then moved in accordance with notice given-"That all matters and correspondence relating to Food Control be and are hereby referred to the Local Food Control Committee with full power to act." The motion was seconded by Cr. Fern and carried (*nem. con.*), there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Tinsley, the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman.

- 3 Public Slaughterhouses. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved-"That the Report of the Public Slaughterhouses Committee of 7th August, be taken as read and adopted."
- 4 Coal Supply. Coal Overseer. A letter, dated 27th August, was read from the Controller of Coal Mines, asking for particulars with regard to the appointment of a Coal Overseer for the District.

A further communication, dated 29th August, was also read from the Board of Trade in reply to the Clerk's enquiry to the Local Government Board, stating that where it was impossible for the Surveyor to undertake the duties the Controller would accept as Local Coal Overseer any other responsible person, who in the opinion of the Council would be able to carry out and discharge the duties.

It was subsequently resolved—" That the further consideration of the matter be dealt with in Committee at the close of the Meeting."

### 4th September, 1917.

- 5 Farm. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated 30th August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 6 Highways. Refuge. Tram Terminus. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Highways Committee, dated 30th August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."

The Acting Surveyor having reported that the electric lamp standard at the Tram Terminus had again been knocked down, submitted a suggestion that the refuge at that point should be reconstructed in oval form. On the motion of Cr. Tinsley, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—" That the proposed improvement be carried out in accordance with the Surveyor's proposals."

- 7 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated 30th August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 8 Air Raid Warnings. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded Cr. Wills, it was resolved—"That Air Raid Warnings be given by hooter from the Fire Station during authorised hours and notice be given to the public accordingly so soon as the apparatus is ready for use."
- 9 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated 30th August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 10 General Purposes. Food Control. Aircraft Risks. Insurance of Workmen and Firemen. A letter, dated 3rd September, was read from the Law Accident Insurance Society stating that in the event of an accident to any of the Council's employees caused by Aircraft, for which there is legal liability on the part of the Council to pay compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, they would agree to indemnify the Council.

The Clerk reported a later communication by telephone from the Society stating they were not prepared to insure any particularly specified employees against Aircraft Risks, but would cover the whole of the Council's employees at a premium of 7/6 per cent. on the total wages paid. A further letter from the Society, dated 3rd September, was also read stating that Aircraft Risk was not covered under the existing policy for members of the Fire Brigade, but that risk would be included giving similar benefits for an additional premium of 8/- per member.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—" That the question of insuring against Aircraft Risks the Acting Surveyor and the men required to deal with buildings damaged by Aircraft, together with that of insuring the Firemen against similar risks be left in the hands of the Chairman of the Finance Committee."

Cr. Hackforth-Jones then moved—"That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated 30th August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted subject to the deletion of the paragraph headed 'Food Control, Maximum Prices,' on page 56. The motion was seconded by Cr. Aldridge and carried, *nem. con.*, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Malins, Tinsley, the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman.

- 11 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated 30th August, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 12 Petrol Licenses. Slaughterhouse Licenses. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, the seal of the Council was affixed to Petrol Licenses and Slaughterhouse Licenses in accordance with the recommendation of the General Purposes Committee at page 56.

- 15 Private Street Works. Byng and Wentworth Roads Loan. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was resolved—"That a cheque for 14s. 10d. be drawn to the London County and Westminster Bank, Ltd., in payment of interest on the balance of the Byng and Wentworth Roads Loan to 1st September."
- 16 War Trophy. Letters, dated respectively 15th and 23rd August, were read from Lord Clarendon and the Right Hon. T. F. Halsey from which it appeared that the Council's request for a War Trophy would receive due consideration.
- 17 Barnet Grouped Schools. A letter was read from the Managers of these Schools calling attention to the continued absence of the Council's representative from their Meetings. Cr. Fern having stated that he did not desire to hold the appointment, on the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—"That Cr. - 11 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—"That the Report of this Committee, dated 1st November, 1917, be taken as read and adopted."
- 12 Burial Grounds. The Clerk reported in reply to an enquiry made by Cr. Williams, that under the Public Health (Internments) Act, 1879, there was no obligation upon the Council to provide Burial Grounds unless required so to do by the Local Government Board.
- 13 Food Control. A letter, dated 10th October, was read from Mrs. Currie of Bells Hill, Barnet, drawing the attention of the Council to the formation of a Local Food Vigilance Committee which demanded to be allowed to nominate three candidates upon the Local Food Control Committee. On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That a reply be sent stating the Food Control Committee was formed under instructions from the Ministry of Food and prior to the formation of the Local Food Vigilance Committee."

- Totteridge. Crs. Ball and Hackforth-Jones as the delegates appointed by the Council to confer with representatives from the Barnet Rural District Council in connection with the claim of the latter body in respect of the transfer of the Parish of Totteridge, presented their Report from which it appeared that the conference had taken place at Barnet Union Workhouse on 22nd November, there being present Crs. Ball and Hackforth-Jones on behalf of this Authority and the Rev. W. Clarke and Mr. G. H. Clayton on behalf of the Rural Council, when the following terms of settlement were agreed upon and confirmed by a duly signed preliminary agreement, viz.:—
  - "That the Barnet Urban District Council pay to the Barnet Rural District Council the sum of seventy-five pounds per annum for a period of ten years and fifty pounds in cash at once for legal expenses, in full satisfaction of the claim of the Barnet Rural District Council, as compensation to which they are entitled in respect of damage suffered in respect of the taking over of the Parish of Totteridge, the first payment of seventy-five pounds to be made on the 1st day of April, 1918, and the successive payments of a like sum to be made on the 1st day of April in each subsequent year for a period of nine years."

The Report was discussed at length and its further consideration adjourned until the ordinary meeting of the Council.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—" That a cheque for  $\pounds 50$  be drawn in favour of the Barnet Rural District Council in payment of the first instalment due under the aforesaid agreement."

- 13 Food Control. Food Vigilance Committee. Food Economy. Public Kitchen. The Clerk submitted copies of The Local Authorities (Food Control) Order (No. 3), 1917, issued by the Local Government Board under which the Local Authorities (Food Control) Order (No. 1), 1917, was as from the 31st December, 1917, rescinded, except so far as may be necessary in any case in relation to any proceedings commenced by the Local Authority before that date; and further, that where a Local Authority are, in pursuance of the Enforcement (England and Wales) Order, 1917, for the time being authorised by the Food Controller to prosecute a summary offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations occasioned by a breach of an Order of the Food Controller, the Local Authority and such of their officers as they may designate and appoint for the purpose shall have the power of enforcing such Order within their District in conformity with the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and the Board conferred such power accordingly.

- Air Raid Shelters. A circular letter, dated 30th November, was read from 18 the Commissioner of Police suggesting the provision of notices in standard street lanterns indicating the situation of Air Raid Shelters and enclosing specimen device. Instructions were given for a reply to be sent to the effect that such suggestion could not be carried out owing to the prohibition of street lighting.

### Council Meeting.

### Thursday, 20th December, 1917.

At a SPECIAL MEETING of the Council duly convened and held on the above date at 8 p.m., there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. W. H. Abercrombie, J. T. Chapman, H. M. Graddon and H. R. Tinsley, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor) and W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector).

1 Herts Volunteer Regiment. Captain Gooding, Lieutenant Lattimer, Sergeants Smart and Rabbidge with Corporal Saul were in attendance as delegates from the "B" Company of the 3rd Battalion of this Regiment and appealed for the assistance of the Council for the furtherance of recruiting; it having being announced that if the numbers were not satisfactorily increased by the 15th February, 1918, there would be amalgamation with the 1st Battalion. The minimum strength of a Company was 150 and the maximum 250, but Barnet had fallen to 50, partly owing to eighty men having recently joined the Army.

There would be a Recruiting Campaign during January, commencing on January 6th, the methods of which would be :--

- (1) Distribution of a circular letter on Recruiting.
- (2) An appeal in all Churches on the 20th January.
- (3) A Parade of the whole Battalion accompanied either by a week end in Camp or a Sunday Parade.
- (4) A Public Meeting at the Cinema Palace with approved speakers. The appeal is for 125 fit men, chiefly over military age.

The Chairman having thanked the deputation for the information which had been furnished and assured the Officers of all the assistance which might be within the power of the Council to render, it was unanimously resolved— "That an appeal for further Recruits be issued by the Council, the preparation to be arranged between Lieutenant Lattimer and the Clerk, and further, that the Council attend in a body the proposed meeting at the Cinema Palace on a date to be supplied."

- 2 Day of Prayer. A letter was read from the Rector of Chipping Barnet stating that, in obedience to the King's Command, Sunday, January 6th, would be observed as a Day of Prayer and Thanksgiving in connection with the War, and inviting the Council's attendance at a service to be held on that date at 11 a.m. It was unanimously resolved—" That the invitation be accepted, and that the whole of the Council's Staff, both in-door and out-door, including the Members of the Fire Brigade, be requested to attend the Service." The arrangements as to seating and notices were left in the hands of the Clerk.
- 3 Allotments. Acquisition of Land. The Cultivation of Lands Order, 1916-17. On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was unanimously resolved—"That Standing Order 6 be suspended for this evening."

Mr. Plumpton having presented his Report as to the urgent necessity for the acquisition of further lands for the purpose of allotment cultivation, on the motion of Cr. Graddon, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was resolved, *nem. con.*, —" That, numerous applications having been received from residents in Bedford Avenue for allotments and there being no available unoccupied land in the vicinity, this Council urge the Hertfordshire War Agricultural Committee to exercise its powers under the Cultivation of Lands Order, 1916-17,

by consenting to the acquisition by this Authority of the Shoulder of Mutton Field at the rear of Bedford Avenue as the same is now in the occupation of Mr. T. Sharp, being Plot 60 on the Ordnance Survey and containing about 3½ acres: And further, That many applications having been received for additional land for similar purposes adjoining the present allotments in Leecroft Road, a like application be addressed to the Hertfordshire War Agricultural Committee in respect of 3 acres of the field being Plot No. 100 on the Ordnance Survey."

4 Sick Pay. The Surveyor having reported that Nouch had been ill for 12 weeks, during which period he had received in accordance with custom half pay (13/-) for 3 months plus a War Bonus of 5/-, in all 18/-; on the motion of Cr. Tinsley, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was unanimously resolved—"That Nouch receive quarter pay (6/6 per week) plus 5/- War Bonus for a further period of 3 months as from the expiration of the first 3 months during which he has been receiving half pay."

- 2 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated 3rd January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 3 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, duly seconded, it was resolved— "That the Report of the Highways Committee, dated 3rd January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 4 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Mackay, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated 3rd January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 5 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee of 3rd January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 6 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Ball, duly seconded, it was resolved —"That the Report of the General Purposes Committee of 3rd January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 7 Finance. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—" That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated 3rd January, with the exception of the paragraph headed 'Child Welfare' on page 102, be taken as read and adopted." The motion was duly seconded and carried *nem. con*.

On the like motion it was resolved—" That the paragraph in question be considered in Committee."

8 County Rate Basis. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Mackay, it was resolved—"That a letter be written to the County Rate Basis Committee, enquiring on what grounds the County Rate Basis for the Parish of Totteridge has been again increased."

9 Smallpox Hospital Accommodation. The Clerk presented the following Report on this matter as under:---

That he attended this day at the Holborn Borough Council Offices the conference arranged between the Chairman of the Hertfordshire County Public Health and Housing Committee, and the representatives

of Barnet and East Barnet Valley Urban and Barnet Rural District Councils and the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee, when there were present :---

Mr. County Alderman Pank, D.L., J.P., C.C. (Chairman).

Sir Charles Longmore, K.C.B. (Clerk of the County Council). Councillor J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman of the Barnet U.D.C.)

Councillor Amos J. Ford, J.P. (Chairman of the East Barnet Valley U.D.C.) The Rev. W. Clarke, J.P. (Chairman of the Barnet R.D.C.)

Mr. T. A. Buckley (Clerk to the East Barnet Valley U.D.C.)

Mr. W. H. Trevellick (Clerk to the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee).

Dr. Hyslop Thomson (Acting County Medical Officer of Health).

The Chairman stated that the County Council had expressed to the L.G.B. the unwillingness of the County Authority to put the Barnets to any avoidable expense, with the result that the Board having already expressed itself satisfied with the provision of 10 beds as proposed by Cheshunt and having approved both the site, the buildings and the estimate (about £5,500), would be content that the Barnets should be affiliated with this scheme without any further outlay on their part, contributing to the cost proportionately upon their assessable value. It appears that there is amply sufficient land adjoining the proposed buildings to allow of temporary accommodation in the event of any epidemic.

The Chairman and the Medical Officer of Health emphasised the fact that the 10 beds would be constantly used for cases of tuberculosis should they not be required for smallpox cases, and that in such event the County Council would make payment for their use as against the charge for maintenance. There were now 30 cases of tuberculosis waiting reception.

All cases of smallpox would be sent for by motor ambulance. There was a meeting of the County Public Health and Housing Committee at 12.30, at which the Committee proposed to accept the tenders for the erection of the Cheshunt Hospital as the tenders would only remain open until the 15th instant.

This practically shews that the County Council intend to adopt their own suggestion even if not acceptable to each and all of the Barnets, and the Chairman admitted that such was the fact, the scheme having been placed before the various Authorities as an act of courtesy, the extended time allowed to them for making independent provision in this direction having already expired.

Cr. Williams moved—" That a letter of protest be written to the County Council against their action in proceeding with the erection of a Smallpox Hospital at Cheshunt." The motion was seconded by Cr. Fern and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Fern, Williams and Wills; Against : Crs. Ball, Dunch, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay and Malins.

On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was resolved, nemcon.-"" That the County Council be asked to furnish further information with regard to the estimated cost of upkeep of the proposed Smallpox Hospital at Cheshunt."

10 Food Control. Mr. Plumpton submitted a Report reviewing the work carried out by the Food Control Committee during the months of November and December, which was received and considered.

Cr. Abercrombie tendered his resignation as a member of this Committee

owing to other business engagements.

The resignation having been accepted, on the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved-" That the question of filling the vacancy be considered at the next meeting of the Council."

A deputation from the Barnet Food Vigilance Committee attended by appointment before the Council and suggested the election of a Consultative Committee representing the Working Classes and mainly composed of women for the purpose of assisting the Food Control Committee.

The deputation were informed that the matter should have due consideration, and it was understood that a further communication would be

addressed by them to the Clerk of the Council containing suggestions on the subject.

- 11 Coal Distribution. The Local Coal Overseer submitted a supplementary Report from which it appeared that the period for the purchase of coke irrespective of the allowances under requisitions, had been extended to January 31st, provided that—(1) A requisition form for coke had been sent in, and (2) That not more than 5 tons be supplied to the customer during the extended period outside his regular allowance which will continue as heretofore, and that no customer who has received more than 5 tons of coke up to the 7th January shall be supplied.
- 12 French War Emergency Fund. A circular letter, dated 28th November, was read from the Hon. Secretary of this Fund asking permission to hold a Flag Day in the Town in the Spring. It was resolved—" That no action be taken in the matter."
- 13 Fire Brigade. The Chief Officer submitted a report of a Fire which occurred at 60, High Street, Barnet, on 2nd January.
- 14 Herts Volunteer Regiment. The Clerk submitted a draft of the proposed circular letter to be issued by the Council on behalf of the Barnet Company, which he had received from Lieutenant W. Lattimer. On the motion of Cr. Ball, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman and the Clerk to settle and issue the appeal."
- 15 Lord Roberts' Memorial Fund. Belgian Repatriation Fund. Committee on War Damage. Comforts for Road Construction, etc., Companies in France. Circular letters on these subjects were read, but no action was taken thereon.
- 16 Ministry of Health. A circular letter on this matter was read from the County Borough of Wallasey and was referred to the General Purposes Committee for consideration and report.
- 17 Public Kitchens. A letter, dated December 13th, was read from the Ministry of Food stating the suggestion that the Food Control Committee or the Council should have power to take over and rent, for the purposes of a Public Kitchen, premises not in use, would receive careful consideration in the light of the views approved and endorsed by the Council.
- 18 Special Constabulary. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That a vote of appreciation and thanks be accorded to the Barnet Special Constabulary for the services rendered by them to the Town."
- 19 Y.M.C.A. Hut Fund. A letter, dated 29th December, was read from the Acting Hon. Treasurer of this Fund setting out the manner in which the contributions collected in the District had been disposed of.
- 20 Maintenance of Live Stock Act, 1915. An Order, dated 2nd January, 1918, was read from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries revoking the Order dated 18th August, 1915, made by them under this Act.
- 21 Food Control. A letter, dated January 5th, from the Barnet Food Vigilance Committee enclosing copy of certain resolutions passed by them, was read and referred to the Food Control Committee for consideration.

The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

22 Fire Brigade. Fire Engine. With reference to the recommendation under the heading of "Fire Engine" on page 99 of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee's Report of January 3rd, Cr. Mackay (in the absence of Cr. Thomas through a family bereavement), reported that the conditions consequent on the proposed temporary removal of Sir Samuel Boulton's Steam Fire Engine to the Fire Station prevented the suggested transfer of the machine, and moved—"That Captain Boulton be thanked for his kind offer and that the Engine continue to be stationed at Totteridge: also that

steps be taken to secure and train additional men from Totteridge in Fire Drill, the Chief Officer of the Council's Fire Brigade to be asked to render assistance in the matter."

The motion was duly seconded and carried.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, it was unanimously resolved—" That a vote of sympathy be accorded to Cr. Thomas for the reasons necessitating his absence from the meeting."

23 Child Welfare. Cr. Malins moved—"That the paragraph under this head at page 102 of the Report of the Finance Committee of 2nd January, be not adopted." The motion was seconded by Cr. Ball and carried, there voting For: Crs. Ball, Dunch, Eames, Graddon, Mackay, Malins and Williams; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Fern, Hackforth-Jones and Tinsley.

## Council Meeting.

#### Tuesday, 5th February, 1918.

At a MEETING OF THE COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date at 8 p.m., there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. W. H. Abercrombie, G. Ball, J. T. Chapman, H. Eames, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., J. K. Mackay, A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley, E. T. Williams, and A. J. Wills, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Minutes. The Minutes of the Meeting of 8th January, 1918, were read and signed.
- 2 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Eames, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated 31st January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 3 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Highways Committee, dated 31st January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 4 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. Totteridge. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Mackay, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, of 31st January, be taken as read and adopted."

Cr. Mackay stated that arrangements had now been made whereby supplemental assistance had been obtained from Totteridge for the manning of Sir Samuel Boulton's Fire Engine together with horse means of transport which would enable the engine to be used in case of need.

- 5 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee of 31st January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 6 General Purposes. Offices. Recreation Ground. Park Caretaker. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved —"That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated 31st January, be taken as read and adopted, subject to the charge for the use of the Council Chamber under the paragraph headed 'Offices' on page 110, being increased from £1 1s. 0d. to £1 11s. 6d."

The Acting Surveyor reported that H. McLeod had been appointed as Park Caretaker in place of J. Wren, @ 5s. 2d. per day for 6 days, 4s. 0d. per day for Sundays and 5s. 0d. per week War Bonus.

7 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated 31st January, be taken as read and adopted."

- 8 Coal Distribution. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Eames, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Coal Supply Committee, dated 31st January, be taken as read and adopted."
- 9 Cultivation of Lands. Allotments. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved—" That the Report of this Committee, dated January 14th, be taken as read and adopted."

#### 5th February, 1918.

On the like motion it was resolved—"That the Council enter into an agreement with the Earl of Strafford for the extension of the Allotments at the Old Fold Manor Golf Links, in accordance with the terms contained in Mr. P. Fergusson's letter of January 16th."

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—" That the remainder of the Report of the Lands Cultivation Committee of February 5th be adopted." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Graddon, Cr. Eames moved as an amendment —" That the Report be adopted subject to the Allotment holders not being allowed to erect sheds on their Allotments." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Chapman and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman, Eames, Mackay, Tinsley, Williams and Wills; *Against*: Crs. Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Malins and Thomas.

The amendment was then put as a substantive motion and carried on the like voting.

A petition, dated February 3rd, was subsequently read from 27 Allotment holders protesting against some of the regulations issued by the Council under The Cultivation of Lands Order, 1916–17.

Cr. Wills moved—"That the letter be referred to the Lands Cultivation Committee." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Tinsley, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—"That a reply be sent to the petitioners stating (1) That the Council were unable to see their way to amend Regulations No. 3 (Fencing) and No. 5 (Character of Crop); (2) That with regard to No. 10 (Sheds) reasonable facilities would be afforded to Allotment holders, and (3) That Regulation No. 12 (New Allotments) had already been amended by the Committee." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Thomas and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones and Thomas; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman, Eames, Tinsley, Williams and Wills. The original motion was then put and carried, nem. con.

- 10 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was resolved—"That a cheque for £138 14s. 6d. be drawn to the order of The Equitable Life Assurance Society in payment of instalment of Loan due on February 6th."
- 11 Insanitary Dwellings. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved—" That the seal of the Council be affixed to an order determining a Closing Order made by the Council in respect of Devon Cottage, Arkley."
- 12 Totteridge. On the motion Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That the seal of the Council be affixed to the agreement between the Council and Barnet Rural District Council with regard to the Parish of Totteridge, in accordance with the Minutes of the Council dated 4th December, 1917," there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Thomas and Williams; Against: Crs. Eames, Fern and Wills.
- 13 Food Control. The Chairman reported that at a recent Conference convened by the Food Controller, Lord Rhondda had authorised the respective Local Authorities to appoint 3 further representatives on the Food Control Committee, thereby increasing the number of members from 12 to 15.

A letter, dated January 11th, was read from the Barnet Food Vigilance Committee naming representatives for appointment on the Committee and a similar communication, dated January 15th, was also read from the Women's Public Welfare Council.

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—"That the Rev. W. Manning be elected a member of the Committee in place of Cr. Abercrombie resigned." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Malins, Cr. Wills moved as an amendment— "That Cr. Williams be elected a member of the Committee in place of Cr. Abercrombie resigned." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Chapman and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Mackay and Wills; *Against*: Cr. Hackforth-Jones. Cr. Chapman moved—"That Cr. Tinsley be elected an additional member of the Food Control Committee." The motion was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie and carried, *nem. con.*, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Mackay, Malins, Williams, and Wills.

Cr. Ball moved--" That the Rev. W. Manning be elected an additional member of the Committee." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Eames,

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—" That the remaining vacancy be filled by the election of a woman." The motion was seconded by Cr. Williams and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Fern, Hackforth-Jones, Malins, Thomas, Tinsley and Williams; *Against*: Crs. Eames and Mackay.

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—"That Mrs. Westoby be elected an additional member of the Committee." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Thomas, Cr. Fern moved as an amendment—"That Mrs. Tozzi be so elected." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Tinsley and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Fern, Graddon and Tinsley; *Against*: Crs. Ball, Chapman, Eames, Mackay, Malins and Wills.

The original motion was then put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Thomas, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Eames and Graddon.

#### Tuesday, 19th March, 1918.

At a MEETING OF THE COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date at 8 p.m., there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. G. J. Aldridge, W. H. Abercrombie, G. Ball, J. T. Chapman, C. Dunch, H. Eames, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., J. K. Mackay, J.P., A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley, E. T. Williams, and A. J. Wills, with Lieut. C. F. Hardie, M.B. (Medical Officer of Health), H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

1 Councillor. Medical Officer of Health. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, congratulations were accorded to Cr. Mackay upon his enrolment as a Justice of the Peace for the County of Hertford, and to Lieut. C. F. Hardie, M.B., M.O.H., upon his return on leave from service with His Majesty's Forces.

Upon a vote of Urgency being granted, Cr. Williams moved—" That in the opinion of this Council it is most urgent that every effort be made to retain Dr. Hardie, the Council's Medical Officer, in Barnet, after the conclusion of his year's Military Service, on the grounds: (1) that he is the Public Vaccinator with years of experience, and (2) that the Surveyor and the Sanitary Inspector are now in the Army and the remaining officials of the Council are fully occupied with other business of the Council and of Food Control." The motion was seconded by Cr. Ball and carried unanimously.

- 2 Minutes. The Minutes of the Meeting of 5th February, 1918, were read and signed.
- 3 Jesus Hospital Charity. The Clerk having reported, in reply to a question by the Chairman, that no answer had yet been received from the Visitors of this Charity to the Council's communication, it was resolved—"That a letter be written asking for a reply."
- 4 Air Raids. Syren. Light Signals. It was resolved—" That the Commissioner of Police be asked to sanction the use of the Syren for 'Take Cover' warnings immediately upon receipt of the appropriate call to the Fire Brigade."

The Acting Surveyor reported he had ascertained that the lamps still in use in the District were operated by separate switches, and he was in communication with the Police as to the use by them of such switches upon receipt of a "Take Cover" warning.

5 Farm. Cr. Chapman moved—" That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated 12th March, be taken as read and adopted." On the motion being seconded by Cr. Aldridge, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—" That the Report be adopted with the exception of that portion headed 'Estimate for Rate.'" The amendment was seconded by Cr. Graddon and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Eames, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Fern,

Malins and Tinsley.

The amendment was then put as a substantive motion and carried nem. con.

6 Highways. Cr. Eames moved—"That the Report of this Committee, dated 12th March, be taken as read and adopted." On the motion being seconded by Cr. Graddon, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—"That the Report be adopted with the exception of that portion headed 'Estimate for Rate.'" The amendment was seconded by Cr. Mackay and carried, there

voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Eames, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Fern and Tinsley.

- 7 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. Cr. Thomas moved—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated 12th March, be taken as read and adopted." On the motion being duly seconded, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—" That the Report be adopted with the exception of that portion headed 'Estimate for Rate.'" The amendment was seconded by Cr. Mackay and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Eames, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Chapman and Tinsley.
- 8 General Purposes. Cr. Ball moved—"That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated March 12th, be taken as read and adopted." On the motion being seconded by Cr. Aldridge, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—"That the Report be adopted with the exception of that portion headed 'Estimate for Rate." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Mackay and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Eames, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Abercrombie and Tinsley.
- 9 Housing of the Working Classes. Cr. Pearson moved—" That the Report of this Committee, dated March 14th, be taken as read and adopted." The motion was seconded by Cr. Graddon and carried *nem. con.*
- 10 Finance. New Offices Loan. Cr. Fern moved—"That the Report of this Committee, dated 14th March, be taken as read and adopted with the exception of that portion headed 'Estimate for Rate.'" The motion was seconded by Cr. Williams and carried *nem. con*.

Cr. Fern reported that he had received a letter from the London County and Westminster Bank stating it was quite understood that payment in reduction of the Loan could be made at any time.

- 11 General District Rate. Cr. Fern moved—"(a) That a Rate of 9d, in the £ payable in two instalments of 4½d. each be made and levied for the year" ending March 31st, 1919, upon the Parish of Totteridge; (b) That a Rate of 3/2 in the £ payable in two instalments of 1/7 each be made and levied for the year ending March 31st, 1919, upon the Parishes of Chipping Barnet, South Mims Urban, Hadley and Arkley." The motion was seconded by Cr. Tinsley and carried nem. con.
- 12 Estimate for Rate. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—" That those portions of the Reports of the Farm, Highways, Fire Brigade and Water Supply and General Purposes Committees, dated March 12th, and of the Report of the Finance Committee dated March 14th, headed 'Estimate for Rate' be adopted." The motion was seconded by Cr. Tinsley and carried *nem. con.*
- 13 Overseers. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—"That the Overseers for the respective Parishes within the District be re-appointed for the ensuing year as under :—

14 Meetings. It was resolved—" (a) That the Special Meeting of the Council arranged for March 27th to seal the Rates be held at 6 p.m.; (b) that the Annual Meeting of the Council be held on Tuesday, April 16th, and (c) that

the next ordinary meetings of the Standing Committees be held on May 2nd, preceding the next ordinary meeting of the Council on May 7th."

15 Representation of the People Act. The Solicitor submitted a Memorial to the Local Government Board praying for the appointment of the Chairman of the Council as Deputy Returning Officer and the Clerk of the Council as Deputy Registration Officer for the District under this Act.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That the seal of the Council be affixed to the Memorial." On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved (*ncm. con.*)—"That the Council hereby approve the action of the Hertfordshire County Council in supporting proportional representation in the County of Hertford."

- 16 Licenses. It was resolved—"That the seal of the Council be affixed to Petrol Licenses and to Licenses under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order, 1885, as recommended by the General Purposes Committee under date of March 12th."
- 17 Small Pox Hospital Accommodation. A letter, dated February 5th, was read from the Clerk of the County Council enclosing copies of resolutions passed by the County Authority on this matter at their meeting of February 4th.

Councillor Williams moved in accordance with notice given—" That inasmuch as the buildings to be erected at Cheshunt by the Herts County Council are to be used primarily for the treatment of cases of phthisis, the County Council be requested to call the buildings ' The Herts Sanatorium at Cheshunt,' and that the County Council be requested, further, to endeavour to obtain a money grant from the Local Government Board out of the £1,500,000 made available for this purpose under the National Insurance Act, 1911, section 64, and the Finance Act, 1911, chapter 48, section 16 (1) (b) or other State moneys available for such purpose."

On the motion being seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, the leave of the Council was accorded to the mover and seconder to amend the motion which was then carried, *nem. con.*, in the following form—" That the County Council be requested to endeavour to obtain a money grant from the Local Government Board out of the  $\pounds 1,500,000$  made available under the National Insurance Act, 1911, section 64, and the Finance Act, 1911, chapter 48, section 16 (1) (b), or other State moneys available for the purpose of treatment of infectious disease."

18 Food Control. Letters, dated February 21st and March 18th, were read from the Divisional Food Commissioner with regard to the increase in the number of members of the Food Control Committee from 12 to 15.

Letters were also read from Mrs. Westoby and the Rev. W. Manning accepting appointment on the Committee.

- 19 Pig Keeping. A circular letter on this subject was read from The Rural League and referred to Cr. Graddon, who stated he would be taking part in a meeting on the subject at an early date.
- 20 Blind. Register of the Blind. A circular letter, dated March 11th, was read from the Local Government Board enclosing forms of inquiry for completion and return, with regard to blind persons not at present on the Register of any Institution or Society for the Blind. The Clerk undertook to deal with the matter.
- 21 Housing of Working Classes. Erection of Buildings after the War. A circular letter, dated March 18th, from the L.G.B. enclosing forms of return with four to foregrid excitance from public funds to Local Authorities.

with reference to financial assistance from public funds to Local Authorities for housing purposes, was read and referred to the Housing of the Working Classes Committee for consideration and report.

22 Royal Society of St. George. Food Production. Y.M.C.A. The Entente Peoples' Alliance. Palestinean Jews' Fund. The Italian Red Cross Day. London "Safety First" Council. National Salvage Council. Association of Poor Law Unions. Workmen's Wages (L.G.B.). Various communications on these subjects were read, but no action was considered necessary thereon.

It was resolved—" That Professor McLay's resignation be accepted with regret and that the question of appointing his successor be adjourned until the Annual Meeting of the Council."

- 2 Herts Day. The Chairman reported that the proposed collection in aid of "Herts Day" had been postponed, owing to the Regulations of the Police Authorities, until the month of July.
- 3 Venereal Diseases. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Mackay, it was resolved—"That the Reports of the Venereal Diseases Committee, dated respectively April 22nd and April 30th, be taken as read and adopted."

On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Pearson, it was resolved— "That the Report of the Venereal Diseases Committee, dated 6th May, be taken as read and adopted."

- 4 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated May 2nd, be taken as read and adopted."
- 5 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated May 2nd, be taken as read and adopted."

Cr. Hackforth-Jones then moved as an amendment-" That the Report be considered in Committee at the end of the meeting." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Malins and carried nem. con.

11 Lands Cultivation. The Report of The Cultivation of Lands Committee dated April 22nd was read.

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved-" That the request of the Committee for sanction to the provision of lockers be acceded to." The motion was seconded by Cr. Graddon and carried, there voting For : Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Thomas, Tinsley and Williams; Against : Cr. Eames.

Cr. Eames reported upon the recent Public Meeting held at the Barnet Cinema in connection with the question of Food Production, and moved-"That the thanks of the Council be accorded to the Management for the use of the Cinema free of charge, also to Messrs. Lowe, Mabbett and Staff for their services as stewards." The motion was duly seconded and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Thomas, it was unanimously resolved-"That the thanks of the Council be accorded to Cr. Eames for his successful organisation of the meeting."

Eames, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., J. K. Mackay, J.P., A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley, E. T. Williams, and A. J. Wills, with Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Minutes. The Minutes of the Meeting of May 7th, 1918, were read and signed.
- 2 Highways. Trees. Paving., Instructions were given to the Acting Surveyor for examination and report as to overhanging trees and disturbed paving.
- 3 Housing of Working Classes. Cr. Tinsley, in accordance with notice given, asked the Finance Clerk if the figures submitted by him on March 14th in connection with the Housing Estate were a correct record of the year's working. The reply was that the statement presented on the date referred to represented the financial position of the Housing Estate as at March 31st, and a supplementary statement was submitted shewing the Income and Expenditure for the year ended March 31st, 1918, which was received and considered.

Cr. Hackforth-Jones, in accordance with notice given, asked what amount had been paid in interest on moneys borrowed for purchase of land and the erection of cottages to which the Finance Clerk replied that  $\pm 644$  7s. 2d. had been paid on loans for purchase of land and  $\pm 2,057$  0s. 1d. on loans for erection of cottages up to March 31st, 1918.

- 4 **Tradesmen. Third Party Risk. Damages.** Cr. Williams asked if the Council had power to take any steps towards righting an apparent wrong in a case of excessive damages recently awarded by a jury against a local tradesman in connection with a collision between the tradesman's errand boy on a bicycle and a pedestrian; and further as to what steps, if any, could be taken by the Council to obtain an alteration of the law which allows heavy damages to be awarded in such a case. The Clerk replied that he was informed the damages were assessed by a jury, the action having been undefended; but that it was open to the defendant to appeal on the ground of such damages being excessive.

Thomas moved—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated May 30th, be taken as read and adopted, with the addition of the word '*minimum*' before the word '*charge*' in line 7 of the paragraph headed 'Motor Fire Engine, Fire Brigade Outside District,' on page 20 of the Report."

On the motion being seconded by Cr. Mackay, it was moved—"That the Report be adopted subject to the paragraph in question being referred back to the Committee for reconsideration." The amendment was duly seconded and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Eames, Fern, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Graddon, Mackay and Malins. Upon the amendment being put as a substantive motion Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as a further amendment—"That the Report be adopted with the substitution of the following words for those contained in the Committee's recommendation under the heading of 'Motor Fire Engine, Fire Brigade Outside District,' viz.:—That a detailed account of expenses of this Authority be similarly rendered on the basis of a minimum charge of £5 5s. 0d. for each attendance up to the present time, such charge to include all expenses, no charge to be made for standing by in the district."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Mackay and carried, there voting For: Crs. Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins and Thomas; Against: Crs. Chapman, Fern and Wills. The amendment was then put as a substantive motion and carried, there voting For: Crs. Ball, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins and Thomas; Against: Crs. Chapman, Fern, Tinsley and Wills.

- 10 Highways. On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Highways Committee, dated May 30th, be taken as read and adopted."
- 11 Housing of Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated May 30th, be taken as read and adopted."
- 12 Fire Brigade. Fire. The Chief Officer submitted his Report of a Fire which occurred on May 31st at North Mims, and it was resolved—" That a cheque be drawn for £1 16s. 0d. in payment of the Brigade's expenses : also that an account be rendered in the usual course to the owner of the premises concerned."

# Council Meeting.

Tuesday, July 2nd, 1918.

At a MEETING OF THE COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date at 8 p.m., there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. W. H. Abercrombie, G. J. Aldridge, J. T. Chapman, C. Dunch, H. Eames, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., J. K. Mackay, J.P., A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley, E. T. Williams, and A. J. Wills, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk) and E. H. Neal (Local Coal Overseer).

- 1 Military Service. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was unanimously resolved—"That the congratulations of the Council be accorded to Cr. H. Eames in respect of the honour recently conferred upon his son, Captain H. P. Eames, through the award of the Military Cross."

- 10 Housing of Working Classes. Allotments. Damage to Crops. The Acting Surveyor reported that he had seen Mr. Craze with reference to the damage caused to crops on the Housing Estate by horses from his Farm and if a written statement were made as to the damage done, the matter would be investigated and reported to the Government Department concerned. The Solicitor stated in reply to a question that the obligation was upon Mr. Craze to keep his cattle from trespassing and that he was therefore liable for the damage in question.
- 11 Highways. The Acting Surveyor submitted an application from the Middlesex Territorial Forces Association for permission to alter the position of the gates and crossing on the western boundary of the Barracks in Stapylton Road. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the application be acceded to."
- 12 Annual Reports. Medical Officer of Health. Sanitary Inspector. The Annual Reports of these officers were read and received.
- 13 Ministry of Health. On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was resolved —"That copies of the resolution adopted by the Council at p. 27 dealing with the establishment of a Ministry of Health be forwarded to the Prime Minister, the President of the Local Government Board, and to the Urban District Councils' Association in addition to the Members of Parliament for the Division in which the Urban Area is situate."

Paragraph (2) of the motion was seconded by Cr. Graddon, and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Graddon, Mackay, Malins, Williams and Wills; *Against*: Crs. Aldridge, Hackforth-Jones and Thomas.

- 15 U.D.C. Association. Railway Season Tickets. Small Pox Accommodation. National Kitchens. Communications from the U.D.C. Association, various Local Authorities, the Board of Trade, Col. Sir Hildred Carlile, Bart., M.P., Major Pretyman Newman, M.P., the Borough of Wimbledon, Dr. Hyslop Thomson and Barnet Food Vigilance Committee, respectively on these subjects were read but no action was considered necessary thereon.

At a meeting of the Special Committee of the Council appointed to consider and report upon the question of the development of the Council's Housing Estate, duly convened and held on the above date there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. W. H. Abercrombie, G. J. Aldridge, C. Dunch, H. Eames, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley and E. T. Williams, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

Housing Developments. A letter was read from Cr. Fern, regretting his inability to be present, and stating that he was strongly in favour of a progressive housing policy but the rents charged should be such a figure as to make the Estate self-supporting.

The circular letter, dated March 18th, 1918, issued by the Local Government Board, relative to the granting of substantial financial assistance from public funds to those local authorities who were prepared to carry through, without delay, at the conclusion of the War, a programme of Housing of the Working Classes, approved by the Board, was considered, together with a further communication, dated June 28th, stating that the Board had examined the plans submitted for further houses, which appeared to be capable of improvements in certain respects, and suggesting a conference between representatives of the Council and Officers of the Board.

A circular letter, dated July 4th, was also considered from the Housing and Town Planning Council inviting the Council to appoint a representative (or representatives) on the Advisory Committee, the inaugural meeting to be held in the Hall of the Royal Society of Arts, 18, John Street, Adelphi, London, on July 26th, at 11 a.m.



On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it is recommended (nem. con.)—" That the Local Government Board be informed that three representatives of the Council, with the Acting Surveyor, will be pleased to confer with them with a view to ascertaining their opinion with regard to

- (1) Their suggested improvements to the existing plans of proposed further buildings.

- (3) The purchase of other land for the erection of dwellings, and

Hackforth-Jones with Mr. Plumpton be deputed to attend as the Council's representatives before the Board, the proposed meeting to take place at 4.30 p.m. either on Thursday, July 18th or on Monday, July 22nd."

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Dunch, the Clerk was instructed to forward the agreed communication to the Board without delay.

The motion was then put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Chapman, Dunch, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, Malins, Thomas, Tinsley and Williams; Against: Crs. Eames and Graddon.

11 Coal Distribution. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—"That the Report of this Committee, dated July 25th, be taken as read and adopted."

The Clerk reported upon his interview that day with Mr. Gaunt of the Coal Controller's Department, who had explained the delay in issuing copies of the Household Fuel and Lighting Order, 1918, as due to printing difficulties, and had also stated that Committees will no longer exist in the London area and certain other places (a) because there would be much overlapping and confusion owing to the number of Authorities, and (b) because being comparatively near London, the Local Overseers and local requirements are practically under the Controlling Department's immediate observation.

While the Local Coal Overseer will in future work without his former Committee, his action is of course under the Controller, and the Council still retain the power of revoking the appointment.

- 12 Game Licenses. On the motion of Cr. Graddon, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That the seal of the Council be affixed to a Game License for issue to Mr. A. W. Nicholls of 77, High Street, Barnet."
- 13 Hertfordshire County Council. The Quarterly Reports and Agenda of the Hertfordshire County Council were submitted.
- 14 Maternity and Child Welfare. A circular letter, dated July 4th, was read from the Urban District Councils' Association calling attention to the Maternity and Child Welfare Bill which was read a second time in the House of Commons on June 24th, and asking that the local Member of Parliament should be asked to support certain amendments which would be moved when the Bill was taken in Committee with the object of extending the Bill to all local authorities, and that there should be no compulsory co-option of outsiders on the Committee.

No action was taken in the matter owing to the Committee stage of the Bill having been passed.

- 15 Ministry of Health. Acknowledgments of the Council's communications with regard to this matter were read from the Prime Minister, Colonel Sir Hildred Carlile, M.P., the Local Government Board and the Urban District Councils' Association.
- 16 Food Control. A letter, dated July 11th, was read from Mrs. Westoby explaining that she was in error in stating at the last meeting of the Council that a certain member of the Food Control Committee had only attended four times in the last four months.

A circular letter, dated July 15th, was also read from the Ministry of Food stating the Food Controller had now decided to extend to the 9th November next the term of office of those members of the Food Control Committees whose term would otherwise expire before that date, and to determine on that date the term of office of all other members, so that all members will go out of office at the same time. An Order giving effect to this decision will be forwarded in due course.

A letter, dated July 15th, from the Assistant Commissioner for Education and Propaganda, Ministry of Food, with regard to Demonstration on Potato Bread Making was read and referred to the Food Control Committee for consideration.

17 Lord Roberts' Memorial Fund. Blinded Soldiers and Sailors Fund. London "Safety First" Council. Communications were read with regard to these matters but no action was taken thereon. 18 Anniversary of Declaration of War. A letter, dated July 25th, was read from the Rev. W. Manning inviting the members of the Council to attend Chipping Barnet Parish Church on Sunday, August 4th, at 11 a.m., for united public worship, the day having been appointed to be observed for Prayer and Thanksgiving. It was requested that those attending should be at the Church not later than 10.40 and to enter by the High Street door.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was unanimously resolved—"That the Rector's invitation be accepted on behalf of the Council and their employees." Cr. Thomas undertook to arrange for the attendance of members of the Fire Brigade.

- 19 Fuel. A letter, dated July 27th, was read from Mrs. H. De Bock Porter suggesting the provision of peat and logs in bulk for winter fuel, to make up shortage of coal and of gas for heating. It was resolved—" That no action be taken in the matter."
- 20 National Registration. The Clerk reported a case of contravention of the National Registration Acts and of the Defence of the Realm Regulation No. 45 where a man and wife who had removed into the District had presented their Registration Cards for transfer bearing evidence of alteration of the surname in both cases. After considerable enquiry and investigation into the matter the offence had been reported to the Registrar who now stated in a letter, dated July 29th, that if a prosecution were desired for the offences alleged, application should be made to the Director General of National Service, who had informed the Registrar General that the necessary consent to such prosecution would be given on application.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Mackay, it was resolved (*nem. con.*)—" That it be left to Mr. Poole to take the requisite action if he so advise, the Council to defray the necessary expenses."

The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

21 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Dunch, it was resolved---"That the Report of the Special Committee, dated July 11th, be taken as read and adopted."

The following Report of the Acting Surveyor was read :--

#### HOUSING ESTATE.

ACTING SURVEYOR AND HOUSING INSPECTOR'S REPORT.

30th July, 1918.

To The Chairmen and Members of the Barnet Urban District Council.

GENTLEMEN,

The representatives appointed by the Special Committee of the Council, consisting of Crs. J. W. Pearson, J.P., F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., and C. Dunch, together with the Acting Surveyor, attended at the Local Government Board on Monday, July 22nd, to confer with the Housing Department as to:—

- (1) The Board's suggested improvements to the existing plans and proposed further buildings.
- (2) Their allowing the remainder of the present Housing Estate to remain undeveloped, except the Barnet Lane frontage.
- (3) The purchase of other land for the erection of dwellings.
- (4) The development of the Council's own freehold.

The conference was with Mr. Kitchen, who pointed out that since the plans were submitted a Housing Commission had been dealing with the planning of small house property, and that several improvements could be effected.

The Board's suggestions were :--

(1) That no bedroom should be less than 65-ft. superficial ground

- (1) That no bedroom should be less than of it dependent ar
- (2) That the staircases should be better placed.
- (3) That the parlours should be of a larger size.

- (4) That the elevations be more varied.
- (5) That the bathrooms should be more private.

The Acting Surveyor reported that the Housing Estate consisted of 14 acres 7 poles, and was originally intended for the erection of about 200 houses, or at the rate of 14 houses to the acre—this being subsequently amended by a resolution of the Council to limit the number of houses to 12 per acre or 170 houses to be erected on the Estate.

The present frontage on Barnet Lane would be sufficient for the erection of about 22 more houses, without road charges being incurred. The houses adjoining the Farm would have to be kept high to be sewered.

The Acting Surveyor also pointed out the essentiality, from a Town Planning point of view, of communication between Mays and Barnet Lanes being provided and suggested a through road be constructed.

Sufficient frontage for the erection of approximately 50 more houses would be available. If these suggestions were approved the number of houses on the Estate would then be 124 or at the rate of 8 per acre, the number suggested by the Board not to be exceeded in Rural areas.

The frontage of the Council's freehold land now being used for Farm purposes could provide sufficient accommodation for the erection of about 40 houses, without interfering with the treatment of the Town's sewage. Only  $1\frac{3}{4}$  acres of irrigation land which now deals with pumped effluent would be affected.

Ample depth would be available for excellent gardens to be given to each house and there would be no difficulty as regards sewerage. This land would be at the top of the Farm fronting Mays Lane and well above the line of irrigation.

The number of houses to be erected under the scheme, roughly set out, would be as follows :—

This number of houses should meet with the demand for small class property for some considerable time. Other land more suitable for letting at a higher rental, to meet the middle class demand, might be acquired under a separate scheme.

Mr. Kitchen suggested that the scheme set out should be placed before the Board for their approval. Personally, he could see no objection to houses being erected on land originally acquired for Farm purposes, and further pointed out that in some cases land had been so utilized, but before further details were prepared he requested a small scale plan, showing these preliminary suggestions, be submitted.

Tuesday, 3rd September, 1918.

At a MEETING OF THE COUNCIL duly convened and held on the above date there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. W. H. Abercrombie, H. Eames, H. M. Graddon, A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley and E. T. Williams, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Condolence. On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by the Vice-Chairman, it was unanimously resolved, upstanding and in silence—"That the condolence and sympathy of the Council be conveyed to Cr. F. W. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved-"That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated August 29th, be taken as read and adopted subject to the addition of the words 'Cr. Thomas was voted to the Chair' following line 3 on page 52 of the Report."
- 13 Fire Brigade. Aircraft Risks. On the motion of Cr. Graddon, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—" That a cheque for £5 12s. 6d. be drawn to Messrs. W. H. Dolphin & Co., in payment of renewal premium on insurance of the Acting Surveyor, Workmen and Firemen against Aircraft Risks."
- 14 Ministry of Health. A copy of a Report on this subject by the Medical Officer of Health for Tottenham, was referred to the Medical Officer of Health for consideration.
- 15 Food Control. A communication, dated July 30th, was read from the Divisional Food Commissioner enclosing copies of correspondence with regard to a published letter from the Barnet and Finchley Branch of the Independent Labour Party in connection with the constitution of the Food Control Committee.

A letter, dated August 2nd, was also read from the Ministry of Food with regard to the increase of the membership of the Committee from 12 to 15, stating that the Food Controller had decided to issue the necessary sanction to the increase referred to and requesting the Council to take the necessary steps to confirm the additional appointments which had been made.

16 Women's Day. Private Initiative in the Great War. National Sailors' Society. Communications on these subjects were read but no action was taken thereon.

- 17 Maternity and Child Welfare. A communication from the Local Government Board, dated August 9th, was read relative to the provisions of the Maternity and Child Welfare Act, 1918, but no action was taken thereon, as a Maternity and Child Welfare Centre was already in existence in the District and reported to be carrying on excellent work.
- 18 Queen Mary's Army Auxiliary Corps. The Clerk reported that Lt.-Col. Ingle had called upon him with reference to the formation of a local Committee for enrolment, a proposed Public Meeting and general propaganda in the interests of the Corps.

It was resolved-"That the Clerk arrange an appointment with Lt.-Col. Ingle at which the Chairman would be present for the purpose of further considering the matter."

- 19 James Ravenscroft Charity. A communication, dated August 17th, was read from the Charity Commission enclosing copy of a proposed Order to be made relative to the sale of a portion of the Trust property.
- 20 Coal Distribution Order, 1917. An application was read from Mr. E. H. Neal for payment of the sum of £50 for honorarium and expenses for services as Local Coal Overseer under the Order. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), Dr. C. F. Hardie, M.O.H., W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 "Our Day." The Chairman reported that the amount collected to date for this fund exceeded £600.
- 2 Military Service. Congratulations. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, it was unanimously resolved—"That the congratulations of the Council be conveyed to Dr. W. G. Harnett upon his release from captivity and safe return."
- 3 Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, it was resolved —"That the Minutes of the Meeting of October 1st, 1918, be taken as read and signed."
- 4 **Fuel Wood.** On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Fuel Wood Committee, dated October 14th, be taken as read and adopted."
- 5 Venereal Diseases. On the motion of Cr. Malins, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—"That the Report of the Venereal Diseases Committee, dated October 18th, be taken as read and adopted."
- 6 Food Control Selection. Cr. Pearson moved—" That the Report of the Food Control Selection Committee, dated October 31st, be taken as read and adopted." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Tinsley, Cr. Williams moved as an amendment—" That the Report be adopted subject (a) to the recommendation numbered (2) on page 68 of the Report being amended to read 'That in the meantime, in accordance with the directions from the Ministry of Food, the new Food Control Committee consist of 7 members of the Council and 5 non-members; '(b) That his name be removed from the list of members of the Council selected by ballot, and (c) That the Council proceed to the election of an additional member of the Committee, not being a member of the Council."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones and on being put was not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Thomas, and Williams; *Against*: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Dunch, Graddon, Mackay, Malins, and Tinsley.

The motion was then put and carried, nem con.

- 13 Street Lighting. Public Lighting. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved-"That a Committee consisting of Crs. Eames, Pearson, Thomas and Williams be appointed to communicate with the Police Authorities and Tradesmen with a view to improved street lighting in the District, and to report."
- 14 Public Conveniences. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved-" That the walls of the Men's Conveniences be cement-rendered and left rough, at an estimated cost of £5."
- 15 Public Health (Building in Streets) Act, 1888. Mr. Plumpton having reported that he had called the attention of a local firm of builders to an infringement of this Act in the reconstruction of a window at 48, High Street, without first obtaining the sanction of the Council; correspondence dealing with the matter having been read, on the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved-" That the Council's consent to the alterations of the building be accorded."
- 16 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. Letters, dated November 4th, were read from Mr. Jackaman on behalf of the members of the Fire Brigade relative to the death of Fireman A. Laidlaw and were referred to the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee for consideration and report.
- 17 Lands Cultivation. Allotments. The Report of the Cultivation of Lands Committee, dated October 21st, was read and received together with a report by the Honorary Secretary, dated November 5th, relative to the work carried out under this head in the District.

A letter, dated October 11th, from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries in connection with the Cultivation of Lands (Allotments) Order was submitted and referred to the Lands Cultivation Committee for attention.

A letter, dated October 22nd, was read from the Great Northern Central Hospital conveying thanks for surplus vegetables received from Allotment Holders in the District.

18 Military Service. Councillor. Officials on Active Service. A letter, dated October 7th, was read from Cr. Lieut.-Col. Ocar Boulton stating that he had now been released from Military Service and hoped shortly to be able to resume his attendances at the meetings of the Council.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved-" That a letter of welcome and congratulation be forwarded to Cr. Boulton on behalf of the Council."

A letter to the Clerk, dated September 8th, was read from Lieut. C. W. Hill reporting as to his welfare.

War Charities. A letter, dated October 11th, was read from the Charity 19 Commission stating that the Totteridge Choir School War Fund had been duly registered as a War Charity under the amended title given, which should be used in connection therewith.

- 20 War Pensions. A letter, dated October 17th, from the National Federation of Discharged and Demobilised Soldiers and Sailors as to representation on the Local War Pensions Committee was referred to that Committee for attention.
- 21 Venereal Diseases. A letter, dated November 1st, was read from the Women's Public Welfare Council, asking that the following resolution be adopted by the Council and forwarded to the Prime Minister and others :--

"That this Council desires the immediate withdrawal of Regulation 40D D.O.R.A., and the abandonment of the attempt to incorporate this measure in the C.L.A. Bill (clause 5, section 3) or any statute; and the Council further desires that no medical or surgical examination for venereal disease should be made in connection with any criminal charge whatsoever, and that the practice should be utterly abolished in our prisons."

Cr. Williams moved—"That the resolution be adopted and forwarded accordingly." The motion having been seconded by Cr. Thomas, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—"That the letter be referred to the Venereal Diseases Committee, now sitting, for consideration and report." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Ball and carried, there voting *For:* Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Mackay, and Malins; *Against:* Crs. Aldridge, Thomas and Williams.

- 22 Fuel Wood. A letter, dated October 31st, was read from the Local Government Board enclosing copies of the Local Authorities (Fuel Wood) Order, 1918, conferring and imposing upon Local Authorities and their Officers the powers and duties necessary for the due discharge of the Order.
- 23 Amalgamation of Areas. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved in accordance with notice given—"That the Council now resolve itself into Committee to consider a question of amalgamation of local areas."

The motion was seconded by Cr. Malins, and carried.

Williams, with H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

War. Cessation of Hostilities. Peace Celebrations. Memorial. The Chairman, in addressing the Council, stated the time had arrived when consideration should be given to the question of founding a memorial to those residents in the District who in the service of their Country during the War had sacrificed their lives, and invited discussion and suggestions on the subject.

Various opinions were expressed and suggestions made which included the erection of a permanent memorial and the endowment of a bed in a Hospital. It was finally decided that the further consideration of the matter stand adjourned and that Ratepayers be invited through the medium of the "Press" to state their views.

- Peace Celebrations. The Clerk having reported that Mr. C. W. Hartnett had offered on behalf of Hadley and Monken Hadley a supply of materials for a Bonfire, on the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved— "That Mr. Hartnett be thanked for his offer, of which the Council would be pleased to avail themselves, at what would in their opinion be a more suitable date, namely, after the Declaration of Peace."
- Thanksgiving. The Chairman stated that the Rector of Chipping Barnet had invited the attendance of the Council and their staff to a Public Thanksgiving Service at Barnet Parish Church on Sunday, November 17th, at 11 a.m. On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the invitation be accepted and that the Council, their staff and employees, with the members of the Fire Brigade, be invited to assemble at the Council's Offices at 10.30 a.m. for attendance at the Service as arranged."

Cr. Malins having stated that he could not attend the conference referred to under the heading of "Housing after the War," on page 84 of the Report, on the motion of Cr. Tinsley, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That the name of Cr. Ball be substituted for that of Cr. Malins."

- 10 Finance. Investments. War Loan Stock. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was resolved—" That a cheque for £26 9s. 8d. representing interest received on War Loan Stock be drawn in favour of the L.C.W. and Parr's Bank, Ltd., for investment in similar stock."
- 11 Mothers' Pensions. Communications were read from the Prime Minister, Col. Sir Hildred Carlile, M.P., the Ministry of Reconstruction, and the State Children's Association acknowledging the Council's resolution on this subject.
- 12 Food Control. A letter, dated November 4th, was read from the Divisional Food Commissioner acknowledging receipt of the list of members of the re-appointed Food Control Committee of 12 members, and stating that sanction to the increase in the number from 12 to 15 would only be given on very convincing reasons being adduced. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was resolved, *nem.* con.—"That the reply to the Divisional Commissioner's enquiries be left in the hands of the Clerk." Letters, dated November 16th and 22nd, were read from the Edmonton Co-operative Society asking (1) whether their nominee had been appointed a member of the Committee, (2) if a Co-operator had been so appointed, and (3) whether any seats had been allotted to Food Traders. It was resolved—"That a reply be sent in the negative."

- 13 Elections. A circular letter, dated November 20th, was read from the Local Government Board asking for facilities to be given for the services of staffs of local authorities and the use of public buildings in connection with the forthcoming General Election.
- 14 Allotments. Feeding Stuffs for Cattle. Communications from the Agricultural Organisation Society and the Ministry of Food on these matters were referred to the Lands Cultivation Committee for their consideration.
- 15 Street Decorations. Lights on Road Obstructions. A letter, dated November 28th, from the Commissioner of Police on the subject of Street Decorations was referred to the Acting Surveyor and Inspector for attention, while a letter, of the same date, with regard to Lights on Road Obstructions was referred to the Highways Committee for consideration and report.
- 16 Ravenscroft Charity. A communication, dated November 25th, was read from the Charity Commissioner enclosing copy of an order proposed to be made by them re-appointing Mr. Charles Goddard of "Eastwood," Arkley and Mr. John Foster Mainland of "The Orkneys," Manor Road, Barnet, Trustees of the Charity.

17 Recruiting Appeal Tribunal. A letter, dated November 28th, addressed to the Clerk was read from the Assistant Director of National Service expressing gratitude for services rendered in connection with Tribunal and Recruiting Work.

#### 3rd December, 1918.

On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Abercombie, it was resolved—"That the Council record their great appreciation of the work carried out by the Appeal Tribunal for the District."

18 Coal Distribution Order. A communication was read from the Board of Trade Coal Mines Department, enclosing Warrant for £89 3s. 1d., being repayment of expenses incurred by the Council under the Household Coal Distribution Order, 1917, up to June 30th, 1918.

The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

- 19 Highways. Main Roads. Contributory Roads. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was resolved—"That during the absence of the Engineer and Surveyor, the Acting Surveyor and Inspector proceed with the Report as to Grants in respect of Main Roads and Contributory Roads, in consultation with Lt. Chancellor."
- - 1919.—Crs. Boulton, Eames, Thomas, Tinsley, Sheppard and Williams (who would have retired in the ordinary course in 1916).
  - 1920.—Crs. Abercrombie, Dunch, Fern, Mackay, Malins, Pearson and Wellsman (who would have retired in the ordinary course in 1917).
  - 1921.—Crs. Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones and Wills (who would have retired in the ordinary course in 1918).

It was, however, possible that further legislature might vary this procedure.

- 21 Amalgamation of Areas. Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—"That Cr. Williams be elected an additional delegate (making 5 in all) for the purposes of conferences on this matter, and that the remaining 4 delegates, in conjunction with Cr. Williams, be empowered to continue the negotiations." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Thomas, Cr. Wills moved as an amendment— "That the name of Cr. Chapman be substituted for that of Cr. Williams." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Graddon, but Cr. Williams having withdrawn his name from election, the resolution as amended was put and carried unanimously.
- 22 Housing of the Working Classes. The Clerk reported that the original tender of Captain H. P. Eames in 1913, for preparing full working drawings, specification, etc., for the cottages and roads in connection with the Council's proposed development of the Housing Estate, giving necessary attendance at meetings of the Council and the supervision of the works in progress was 60 guineas, of which sum Captain Eames had been paid £40 on account in February, 1915. He had, however, at the time, applied for an increase in the fee originally agreed upon, having regard to the enlargement of the scheme as at first proposed, but the consideration of his application had been deferred until the receipt of tenders for the work. Having regard to the attitude taken by the Treasury concerning the advance of the requisite loan, and that no satisfactory tender for the work had been received, no further action was taken by the Council in connection with the erection of further dwellings, and nothing further had transpired in the matter up to the present time so far as Captain Eames services were affected.

On the motion of Cr. Thomas, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That Captain Eames be invited to state his views with regard to any further remuneration to which he might consider himself entitled."

On the motion of Cr. Wills, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved— "That the further consideration of the proposed development of the Housing Estate stand over until Lt. Chancellor returns from Hospital."

On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That copies of Sir Tudor Walters' Report on the erection of dwellings for the Working Classes be obtained and distributed amongst the members of the Council."

23 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. Fire Brigade Outside District. Cr. Thomas having reported that the Chief Officer had received instructions from 3rd December, 1918.

the Mobilising Officer for the attendance of the motor engine and men at a further drill under the Fire Brigades (Metropolitan Area) Order, on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Wills, it was resolved (Cr. Tinsley not voting)—" That the Chief Officer be instructed not to allow the Brigade to attend any further drills outside the District without the special sanction of the Council."

24 **Town Planning.** Cr. Abercrombie intimated that the question of further Town Planning in the District should receive the early consideration of the Council.

Highways. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, duly seconded, a vote of urgency was unanimously passed to consider the Report of the Highways Committee of this date.

Cr. Eames moved—" That the Report be adopted." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Ball, Cr. Williams moved-"That a special meeting of the Council be called to consider the Report."



8 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Dunch, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee of January 2nd, be taken as read and adopted."

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved—"That the Council record their appreciation of the work of Capt. H. P. Eames in connection with the preparation of plans for the development of the Housing Estate."

9 Food Control. A letter, dated December 11th, was read from the Scientific Instrument Makers Trade Society, deprecating the action of the Council in selecting Messrs. Jones and Manning, as accredited Labour representatives, while they had accredited representatives of the Barnet and District Trades and Labour Council before them.

A letter, dated December 18th, was also read from the Divisional Food Commissioner asking the reason why the Rev. W. Manning was considered to be a representative of Labour.

Resolved—" That a reply be sent to the latter communication, stating that the work of the Rev. W. Manning, as Rector of Chipping Barnet, was amongst the Working Classes."

10 Lee Conservancy. A letter, dated December 18th, was read from the Lee Conservancy Board enclosing forms for the Election of a conservator on the 7th March, 1919.

A letter, dated January 6th, was also read from Mr. E. B. Barnard asking for the support of the Council in favour of his re-election.

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved—" That the Council's vote be recorded accordingly."

- 11 War Charities Act, 1916. It was resolved—" That a communication, dated December, 1918, from the Charity Commissioners, with regard to demobilisation of War Charities be referred to the War Charities Committee."
- 12 War Memorial. A letter, dated December 23rd, 1918, was read from Cr. J. W. Pearson stating that a public meeting would be held at the Congregational Church Lecture Hall, Union Street, Barnet, on Tuesday, January 14th, at 8 p.m. to consider the question of a War Memorial for the District to commemorate the conclusion of the Great War and to perpetuate the memory of those who have made the supreme sacrifice.

On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That all members of the Council be invited to attend the meeting."

- 13 Band Stand. A letter, dated December 23rd, from Mr. E. Johnson advocating the erection of a Band Stand was read and referred to the General Purposes Committee for consideration and report.
- 14 Midwives Act, 1918. A letter on this matter, dated December, 1918, from the Local Government Board was referred to the Medical Officer of Health for attention.
- 15 Fever Nurses Association. A letter, dated December 1918, was read from the Fever Nurses Association, with regard to a uniform scale of salaries for Nurses in Fever Hospitals and was referred to the Barnet Isolation Hospital Committee.
- 16 Main Roads. An acknowledgment, dated December 30th, was read from the County Council with regard to the Council's notice to determine the existing agreement as to Main Roads.

17 Military Service. Demobilisation. A letter, dated January 2nd, was read from the Local Government Board, stating that if Lt. Chancellor's stay in Hospital exceeded 28 days he would probably be demobilised, without any action on the Board's part, so soon as he were fit: if, however, his stay were likely to be less than 28 days the Board should be informed of the address at which he is to report when leaving hospital.

It was resolved-" That a copy of the letter be sent to Lt. Chancellor."

- 18 Superannuation of Local Government Employees. Maternity and Child Welfare. Circular letters from the Urban District Councils Association on these subjects were read and referred to the Finance Committee and the Medical Officer of Health respectively.
- 19 Elections. Retirement of Councillors. A letter, dated 3rd January, was read from the Local Government Board stating that this question was under consideration with reference to the introduction of a Bill early next Session to make provision for the retirement of members of Urban District Councils at the time of the next ordinary election of Councillors in April, 1919.
- 20 Venereal Diseases. France's Day. Electricity Undertakings. Letters were read from Miss Norrys, Mr. Percy Collins, and St. Pancras Borough Council on these respective matters, but no action was taken thereon.
- 21 Public Lighting. A letter, dated January 3rd, from the Barnet and District Trades and Labour Council on this matter was referred to the Electric Lighting Committee for consideration and report.
- 22 Gas. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved— "That a letter be written to the Barnet District Gas and Water Company strongly protesting against the continual increase of price charged for Gas."
- 23 Town Planning. Cr. Abercrombie then moved in accordance with notice given—" That at the earliest convenient opportunity, when our Surveyor is able to prepare the preliminary plan, and also to serve notices on Owners and Occupiers, that application be made to the Local Government Board for sanction to apply Town Planning Powers to Barnet and District as recommended by the L.G.B. Inspector on the occasion of the enquiry held at the Church House, when Town Planning Powers for Totteridge and Arkley were obtained."

The motion was seconded by Cr. Malins and carried, it being understood that before expense of any appreciable amount were incurred, the matter would again come before the Council.

#### The Council then resolved itself into Committee.

24 Public Lighting. Electric Lighting. Cr. Fern gave a verbal Report of the meeting of the Electric Lighting Committee held the same evening, which was duly considered, and on the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Williams, the matter was referred back to the Committee for further consideration and report, as the terms offered by the North Metropolitan, &c., Co. were not satisfactory to the Council.

Chapman, H. Eames, H. M. Graddon, A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley and E. T. Williams, with W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), E. H. Neal (Fuel Overseer), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

Coal. A letter was read from Mr. Neal enclosing a communication from Messrs. Warren offering to purchase some of the coal in store at 33/- per ton in order that their trolley might be kept going. Mr. Neal asked that the Council should come to some decision with regard to the price as the position was becoming somewhat severe and it was impossible to say when he might have suddenly to draw upon the coal under the authority of Clause 4 (3) of the 1917 Order and Clause 27 of the 1918 Order.

The Acting Surveyor reported there were now approximately 35 tons in store and the average cost had been about 33/6 per ton.

On the motion of Cr. Tinsley, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved— "That the Council allow the coal to be removed solely for trolley sale purposes and only at a price of 35/- per ton as it now lies."

Aldridge, G. Ball, J. T. Chapman, C. Dunch, H. Eames, H. E. Fern, H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley, W. H. Wellsman, E. T. Williams and A. J. Wills, with Dr. C. F. Hardie (M.O.H.), H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. Plumpton (Acting Surveyor and Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

- 1 Minutes. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, it was resolved— "That the Minutes of the Meetings of January 7th, and 16th be taken as read and signed."
- 2 Questions. Roads. Snow. In accordance with notice given, Cr. Hackforth-Jones asked the Acting Surveyor if the snow plough could be used on the Arkley Roads and Cr. Ball preferred a similar question with regard to the Totteridge Roads. Mr. Plumpton replied that inasmuch as the roads in question were kept in repair by the County Council this Authority's snow plough could not be used on them without the consent of that Authority.
- 3 General Purposes. Cr. Williams moved—" That the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated January 30th, be taken as read and adopted." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Chapman, Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved as an amendment—" That the question of hours of employment for the Council's workmen be decided at this meeting." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Aldridge and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge and Hackforth-Jones; *Against*: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Fern, Graddon, Malins, Wellsman, Williams and Wills.

Cr. Fern moved as an amendment—" That the Council appoint three of their number to meet the employees either with or without a representative of their Union to discuss the proposal to establish a 48-hour labour week at the current rate of wage (exclusive of overtime) for the Council's employees as and from April 1st next and in particular to ascertain whether they favour such a proposal which will necessitate the abolition of all overtime." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Wellsman and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Hackforth-Jones, Thomas and Wellsman; *Against*: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Graddon, Malins, Tinsley, Williams and Wills.

Cr. Fern then moved as an amendment—" That the resolution suggested in the communication, dated January 14th, from The London & District One Man Business Association be adopted by the Council."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Wills and not carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Fern, Graddon, Wellsman and Wills; *Against*: Crs. Aldridge, Ball, Chapman, Hackforth-Jones and Malins.

The motion was then put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Malins, Tinsley and Williams; Against: Crs.

Graddon and Wills.

4 Finance. Fuel Distribution. A letter, dated January 4th, was read from the Fuel Overseer stating that if the accounts put forward by him had been passed he recommended payment be held over until after a meeting of Fuel Overseers to be held on February 6th.

On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved nem. con.—" That the Report of the Finance Committee, dated January 30th,

be taken as read and adopted, omitting the recommendation contained in the paragraph headed, ' Fuel Distribution,' on page 107 of the Report."

- 5 Farm. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—" That the Report of the Farm Committee, dated January 30th, be taken as read and adopted."
- 6 Highways. Plans. Bedford Avenue. Wood Street Frontage. Barnet Common Inclosure Act. Cr. Eames moved—"That the Report of the Highways Committee, dated January 30th, be taken as read and adopted."

On the motion being seconded by Cr. Chapman, Cr. Fern moved as an amendment—" That the matter of Mr. T. Cude's plans be referred back to the Committee for further consideration and, in the meantime, the suggestions of the Acting Surveyor contained in his Report to the Committee, dated January 30th, be acted upon."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Tinsley and carried, there voting *For*: Crs. Abercrombie, Dunch, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Thomas, Tinsley, Wellsman and Williams; *Against*: Crs. Ball and Wills.

The amendment was then put as a substantive motion and carried on the like voting.

Cr. Fern then moved as a further amendment-(1) "That in view of the opinion expressed by the Council's legal adviser that in so far as the Barnet Common Inclosure Act is concerned, the 'Council can neither give nor withhold their consent' to the alterations proposed in connection with the frontage of the Barnet Congregational Church; (2) That already there exist in Wood Street several building frontage lines; (3) That after the alterations are made there will still be a space of 45 feet to the public footway, and (4) Because the alterations are in the public interest, this Council passes the plans and agrees to give its written consent to the alterations under the Public Health (Buildings in Streets) Act, 1888." The amendment was seconded by Cr. Wills and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Malins, Thomas, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Tinsley and Wellsman.

On the amendment being put as a substantive motion, Cr. Ball moved as an amendment—" That before a final decision is reached with reference to the plans of the Congregational Church, the whole of the facts be laid before the Surveyor to the Hertfordshire County Council and his opinion be obtained in writing as to whether in the interests of the public it is advisable for this Council to approve the plans."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie and not carried, there voting For: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames and Wellsman; Against: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Malins, Williams and Wills.

The substantive motion was then put and carried, there voting For: Crs. Aldridge, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Malins, Thomas, Williams and Wills; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Ball, Chapman, Dunch, Eames, Tinsley and Wellsman.

On the motion of Cr. Eames, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved, nem. con.—" That the remainder of the Report of the Highways Committee, dated January 30th, be taken as read and adopted."

- 7 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was resolved, *nem. con.*—" That the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated January 30th, be taken as read and adopted."
- 8 Housing of the Working Classes. Cr. Pearson moved—"That the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated January 30th, be taken as read and adopted." On the motion being seconded by Cr. Tinsley, Cr. Fern moved as an amendment—"That the following resolution be added

to those recommended by the Committee for adoption under the paragraph headed 'Housing' on pages 110 and 111 of the Report :--

"Further that this Authority is of the opinion in view of the heavy capital outlay involved by building houses under existing abnormal conditions, that to make possible an economic rent the Treasury should make a definite contribution in reduction of the capital outlay, thus enabling the Authority responsible for the Housing Scheme to charge from the outset, an economic rent within the

means of the people for whom such houses are intended: such grant should represent at least one-fifth of the capital outlay on the building cost, but, in addition, the Treasury should be responsible throughout the whole loan period and on the whole of the housing schemes undertaken by an authority, for any deficiency exceeding the proceeds of a one penny rate."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Abercrombie and carried, nem. con., and upon being put as a substantive motion was carried on the like voting. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Tinsley, it was resolved, nem. con .--- " That the remainder of the Report be taken as read and adopted."

- Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was resolved-" That 9 a cheque for £137 8s. 5d. be drawn in favour of the Equitable Assurance Co. in payment of an instalment of loan due on February 6th."
- Fire Brigade. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, duly seconded, it was resolved -10 "That a cheque for £1 4s. 0d. be drawn in favour of the Chief Officer of the Fire Brigade in payment of services rendered by members of the Brigade in salting hydrants.'
- 11 Meetings. Estimate for Rate. It was resolved-" That special meetings of the Standing Committees be held on Thursday, March 13th, and a special meeting of the Council on March 18th for the purpose of dealing with the Estimate for Rate for the ensuing year."
- 12 Housing. Dwellings. On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved-" That application be made to the War Office for the utilization of the married quarters at the Barracks for dwellings."

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved-" That Messrs. H. W. Milnes and E. H. Neal be re-elected for a further period of four years as from February 2nd, 1919."

A letter, dated January 13th, was read from the Divisional 15 Food Control. Food Commissioner enclosing copy of a communication received from the Barnet and District Trade and Labour Council, with reference to the appointment of representatives on the Committee.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved-" That a reply be sent stating the Council have been supplied with ample credentials that Mr. Edwin Jones is a representative of Labour in the District, while Mr. W. Manning, as Rector of the Parish of Chipping Barnet, is also, in their opinion, qualified as a representative of Labour."

16 War Trophy. A letter, dated January 23rd, was read from the War Office, stating that on the recommendation of H.M. Lord Lieutenant for the County of Hertford, 1 German Machine Gun (damaged), 1 German Machine Gun Ammunition Box, and 1 German Machine Gun Ammunition Belt, captured from the enemy were offered to the Council.

On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, it was resolved—"That permission be granted accordingly."

- 1 Congratulations. On the motion of the Chairman, duly seconded, the congratulations of the Council were unanimously accorded to Cr. H. E. Fern upon his election as a County Councillor for the South Mimms Electoral Division of Hertfordshire.
- 2 Farm. Estimate for Rate. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Fern, it was resolved-" That the Estimate for Rate, submitted by the Farm Committee for the ensuing year, be adopted."
- 3 Highways. Estimate for Rate. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved-"That the Estimate for Rate, submitted by the Highways Committee for the ensuing year, be adopted."
- 4 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. Estimate for Rate. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—"That the Estimate for Rate, submitted by the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee for the ensuing year, be adopted."
- 5 Housing of Working Classes. Estimate for Rate. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, seconded by Cr. Dunch, it was resolved—"That the Estimate for Rate, submitted by the Housing of the Working Classes Committee for the ensuing year, be adopted."
- 6 General Purposes. Estimate for Rate. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved-" That the Estimate for Rate, submitted by the General Purposes Committee for the ensuing year, be adopted."
- 7 Finance. Estimate for Rates. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—" That the Estimate and recommendations for Rates submitted by the Finance Committee for the ensuing year, be adopted."
- 8 Ministry of Ways and Communications. Cr. Eames reported upon his attendance as Chairman of the Highways Committee at a conference of Local Authorities with Members of Parliament at Westminster Hall on March 13th in connection with the Bill now before Parliament for the establishment of a Ministry of Ways and Communications, etc.

A letter, dated March 13th, was read from the Borough of Hornsey, containing the following resolution passed at the Conference :----

"That this meeting of Members of Borough Councils, Municipal Authorities and Urban and Rural Authorities, viewing with great alarm the proposals of the Transport Bill so far as they have had an opportunity of considering them, presses on Members of Parliament the necessity of delaying the passage of the Bill in order to ensure proper consideration, and for this purpose further recommends that the County

Councils' Association, the Association of Municipal Corporations, the Urban District Councils' Association, and the Rural District Councils' Association be requested to consult various Local Authorities in the country whom they represent."

It was resolved—"That copies of the Bill be obtained and circulated amongst the Members of the Council."

Overseers. On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—" That Cr. William Henry Abercrombie, Mr. Samuel Huggins and Mr. Ernest Harry Neal, be re-elected Overseers of the Parish of Chipping Barnet for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—" That Mr. Herbert Grieve and Mr. Thomas Smith, be re-elected Overseers of the Parish of South Mimms Urban for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved---"That Mr. Thomas Charles and Mr. Arthur Nunneley, be re-elected Overseers of the Parish of Hadley for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Abercrombie, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—"That Cr. Frank William Hackforth-Jones, J.P., and Mr. Alfred Parmenter be re-elected Overseers of the Parish of Arkley for the ensuing year."

On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Abercrombie, it was resolved—" That Cr. George Ball, Cr. Charles Dunch and Cr. Josiah Kipping Mackay, J.P., be re-elected Overseers of the Parish of Totteridge for the ensuing year."

10 Barnet C. of E. School. Arkley C. of E. School. Hadley Infants School. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Chapman, it was resolved—"That Cr. Major W. H. Wellsman be elected Representative Manager on the body of Managers of the Barnet C. of E. School and that Cr. A. G. Malins, C.C., be elected Representative Manager on the body of Managers of the Arkley Infants School, both appointments to be for a period of 3 years."

On the motion of Cr. Aldridge, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved—"That Mr. Thomas Smith be re-elected a Representative Manager on the body of Managers of Hadley Infants School for a further period of 3 years."

11 Meadow Works. Drainage. Mr. Poole presented the following Report with regard to this matter :---

I have to report that this case was heard by his Honour Judge Scully at the Barnet County Court on March 11th, when the Defendant appeared in person.

Evidence in support of the Council's claim for a declaration of first charge on the Defendant's property in respect of the amount due to the Council for drainage expenses, and for liberty to enforce such charge by a sale of the property, if necessary, was given by myself and Mr. Plumpton.

The Judge made a declaration that the amount due, together with interest and costs was a charge on the property, but held over liberty to enforce the same in the hope that Defendant would come to an arrangement to pay the amount. Failing a satisfactory arrangement being made by the Defendant for payment, his Honour gave liberty to apply for the enforcement of the charge.

12 Barnet District Gas & Water Co. Gas. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Aldridge, it was resolved—"That 'urgency' be accorded to consider the statement of accounts submitted by the Barnet District Gas

and Water Co."

On the motion of Cr. Hackforth-Jones, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—" That a deputation consisting of Crs. Eames, Fern, Malins and Pearson be appointed to attend the Company for the purpose of submitting to them a protest against the increase of 4d. per 1,000 cubic feet, in the price of gas consumed as from the reading of the meters at Christmas last, such increase being totally unjustified. In support of this assertion, it was pointed out that the net profit earned by the Company for the six months ended December 31st last was £18,048, of which only £10,384 will be absorbed by the dividends declared on the various classes of stocks, so that a substantial margin for contingencies is assured : also that it was obvious the anticipated increased cost due to increased wages and the higher prices of materials, is being passed on to the consumer before being actually incurred by the Company."

- 13 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That no meeting of the Finance Committee be held on March 27th and that no accounts be submitted to other Committees meeting on that date."
- 14 Farm. Horses. On the motion of Cr. Chapman, seconded by Cr. Hackforth-Jones, it was resolved—" That the portion of the Report of the Farm Committee, dated March 13th, not already dealt with, be taken as read and adopted, subject to the number of horses referred to in the paragraph headed, 'Horses,' on page 137 of the Report, being altered from 2 to 3."

It was resolved—"That the Chairman of the Farm Committee be authorised to dispose of the black mare at the Farm for slaughtering."

15 Highways. Wood Street. Cr. Aldridge moved—"That the portion of the Report of the Highways Committee, dated March 13th, not already dealt with, be taken as read and adopted." On the motion being seconded by Cr. Tinsley, Cr. Eames moved as an amendment—"That a sum of £120 be allowed for repairs to Wood Street by Messrs. Smart & Son, under their contract, for the period ending December 31st, 1919."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Chapman, and not carried, their voting For: Crs. Chapman, Eames, Tinsley and Wellsman; Against: Crs. Abercrombie, Aldridge, Ball, Dunch, Hackforth-Jones and Malins.

Cr. Thomas then moved as a further amendment—"That the Surveyor be instructed to re-examine Wood Street, and report again thereon to the Highways Committee at their next meeting."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Aldridge, and carried nem. con.

The remainder of the Report was then put and carried nem. con.

- 16 Fire Brigade and Water Supply. On the motion of Cr. Thomas, seconded by Cr. Malins, it was resolved—" That the portion of the Report of the Fire Brigade and Water Supply Committee, dated March 13th, not already dealt with, be taken as read and adopted."
- 17 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Pearson, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the portion of the Report of the Housing of the Working Classes Committee, dated March 13th, not already dealt with, be taken as read and adopted."
- 18 General Purposes. On the motion of Cr. Williams, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—" That the portion of the Report of the General Purposes Committee, dated March 13th, not already with, be taken as read and adopted."

#### The Council then went into Committee.

- 19 Finance. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Dunch, it was resolved— "That the portion of the Report of the Finance Committee, dated March 13th, not already dealt with, be taken as read and adopted."
- 20 Fire Brigade. A letter, dated March 15th, addressed to the Chairman, was read from the Hon. Secretary of the Fire Brigade, asking the Council to refund the Brigade the sum of  $\pounds 2$  15s. 6d. incurred by them in connection with the attendance of other Fire Brigades under the Metropolitan Fire

Brigades Order during the period of the War.

On the motion of Cr. Williams, duly seconded, it was resolved—" That the sum named be paid."

21 Housing of the Working Classes. On the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Major Wellsman, it was resolved—" That a deputation consisting of Crs. Malins, Hackforth-Jones, Williams and the Chairman be appointed to attend

before the Local Government Board with a view to proceeding with negotiations for the purchase of certain lands now for sale, for purposes of Housing developments and also to approach the vendor's agents in order to obtain an option on the purchase of the property."

The Clerk was instructed to arrange an appointment with the Board for the attendance of the deputation on Thursday, March 20th, at 4 p.m., and the Surveyor was instructed to inspect the property and report to the Council.

The Assistant Surveyor and Inspector reported upon further negotiations undertaken with regard to other land and buildings in the Town for purposes of Housing accommodation and upon which he would report fully at a later date when the matter would be more advanced.

It was resolved—" That the Report be considered at the next meeting on March 27th."



At a SPECIAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL held on the above date there were present Cr. J. W. Pearson, J.P. (Chairman), Cr. J. L. H. Thomas (Vice-Chairman), Crs. G. Ball, J. T. Chapman, H. Eames, H. E. Fern, C.C., H. M. Graddon, F. W. Hackforth-Jones, J.P., J. K. Mackay, J.P., A. G. Malins, C.C., H. R. Tinsley, Major W. H. Wellsman, E. T. Williams and A. J. Wills, with Dr. C. F. Hardie (Medical Officer of Health), H. W. Poole (Clerk and Solicitor), W. B. Chancellor (Engineer and Surveyor), W. Plumpton (Acting Inspector), and A. E. Dolton (Assistant and Finance Clerk).

1 General District Rate. On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Ball, it was resolved—" That the seal of the Council be affixed to a Rate of 1/- in the £ for the ensuing year in respect of the Parish of Totteridge, to be collected in two instalments of 6d. each, payable on the 1st April, 1919, and the 1st October, 1919, respectively."

On the like motion, it was also resolved—"That the seal of the Council be affixed to a Rate of 3/2 in the £ for the ensuing year in respect of the Parishes of Chipping Barnet, South Mimms Urban, Hadley and Arkley, to be collected in two instalments of 1/7 each, payable on the 1st April, 1919, and the 1st October, 1919, respectively."

2 Housing of the Working Classes. Crs. Hackforth-Jones and Williams reported upon the attendance before the Local Government Board on March 20th, of the deputation appointed to place before the Board the question of the purchase of certain further lands for Housing developments.

The Clerk also reported upon the subsequent steps taken to procure the valuation of the property under the Finance Act, 1910, and the Engineer and Surveyor submitted his report upon the suitability of the land for the purpose indicated and the attendance of the Housing Inspector of the Local Government Board for inspection of the site, together with the subsequent interview of the latter with the Clerk and himself.

Letters were read from the Agents for the Estate, intimating that the Trustees would accept the sum of £12,000 for the land and buildings.

Cr. Hackforth-Jones moved—"That this Council are prepared to entertain the purchase of the premises as suitable for the requirements of the District, on terms." Upon the motion being seconded by Cr. Williams, Cr. Malins moved as an amendment—"That the consideration of the subject be adjourned until the receipt of the Local Government Board's Report on the proposal and the opinion of the East Barnet Valley Urban District Council's representatives as to the Council's entry into the Scheme."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Wills and carried, there voting For: Crs. Ball, Graddon, Mackay, Malins, Wellsman and Wills; Against: Crs. Hackforth-Jones, Pearson, Tinsley and Williams.

Upon the amendment being put as a substantive motion, Cr. Williams moved as an amendment—" That the consideration of the subject be adjourned pending receipt of the Report of the Local Government Board on the proposal, and until the Land Valuer for the District has inspected the land and reported his opinion of its present value."

The amendment was seconded by Cr. Thomas and carried, there voting For: Crs. Chapman, Fern, Graddon, Hackforth-Jones, Thomas, Tinsley, Wellsman and Williams; Against: Crs. Ball, Mackay, Malins and Wills.

3 Audit. Offices Loan. The Clerk reported that Major Sutherland Wilkinson, District Auditor, had adjourned the audit of the Council's accounts for the year ended 31st March, 1918, until Saturday, March 29th, at 10.30 a.m., in order to give the Council an opportunity of making provision for the repayment of the proportion of this loan which had already fallen due, the Local Government Board requiring one thirtieth part repaid for every complete year since the loan was borrowed on April 6th, 1915: the whole question of putting the loan on a proper basis for repayment must also be gone into and dealt with.

On the motion of Cr. Fern, seconded by Cr. Williams, it was resolved— "That the Treasurer be forthwith authorised to transfer from District Fund Account to repayment of the Loan, the sum of £533 6s. 8d. representing 4 years' proportions of repayment of principal."

4 Steam Fire Engine. A letter, dated March 18th, was read from Lt.-Col. Boulton asking whether the Council were prepared to make an offer for the purchase of the Steam Fire Engine at Copped Hall.

The Report of the Chief Officer of the Brigade as to the condition and estimated present value of the machine was read and considered and on the motion of Cr. Ball, seconded by Cr. Graddon, it was resolved—"That Lt.-Col. Boulton be asked the price required for the engine, and that the Chief Officer be instructed to report as to what arrangements it is proposed to make for the storage of the machine, in the event of it being purchased."

5 Works. A letter was read from Mr. M. K. North, Local Government Board Inspector, as to his attendance on the question of the inception and execution of works during the period of demobilisation and reconstruction. A telegram was also read from Mr. North cancelling the appointment made for the purpose.
