## Two-times-two is £750 — OK?

WHO SAYS kids today need calculators? The children at Brookland Primary School, Hill Top, Hampstead Garden Suburb, decided to learn their multiplication tables for charity. They searched out sponsors, and the older children tackled their 17- and 36-times tables just to make life difficult. They all had to take a test. And the result was that 220 children raised £750 for the Mayor of Barnet's Charity Treasure Chest Appeal.

On Friday, December 10, the head teacher, Miss Jean Miller, accompanied by four pupils, made a surprise visit — organised by Mrs. Mildred Newton, the Mayor's Secretary — to present the cheques to the Mayor. Education has always been one of my particular interests and I can assure all the parents that we can be proud of our schools in this borough.


## Thank you

# HIGH PRAISE FOR VOLUNTARY WORKERS

IN THE PAST nine years the number of people calling on Barnet's Social Services Area Teams for help has more than doubled. In 1973, 7,326 turned to the department for assistance — and that included 677 housing and homelessness cases which today would be dealt with by the Housing Department. In 1981/82 the figure had risen to 14,770.

More than half of the people needing help were over 60, a figure which reflects the fact that Barnet has a very high proportion of elderly in the population. One in five residents is over pensionable age. More than 20,000 are over 75.

At a press conference to present their annual report the chairman of Social Services Committee, Councillor Victor Lyon, spoke of the outstanding co-operation achieved in Barnet between the voluntary organisations and the local authority. At a recent conference of Social Services directors Barnet had gained high acclaim for its report on how the Council was assisting the voluntary organisations through co-ordination and co-operation.

Recently the Area Teams had been reorganised with three teams instead of six. These teams deal with the needs of children, families and the elderly and the domiciliary services, that is the home helps, home makers and home care assistants are now fully integrated into the area team.

By this streamlining there has been a saving of 27 staff posts, mainly administrative positions.

Sixty per cent of this saving is being diverted to the voluntary sector, not just in grant form but in order to fund specialist staff to help the organisation carry out its role more effectively.

'I am not trying to sweep everything under the carpet and pretend we have no problems.' These are times of financial restriction and there are things which the Council would like to do but for which there are not the resources available. But if

you look back over three years you will see that we have increased our spending by 40 per cent and I think that shows the Council's commitment to the service,' he said.

'I am very proud of the work carried out by the 1,700 Social Services staff and the many volunteers who bring their own special contribution to this field of community service,' he said.

Mr. Alan Gorst, Director of Social Services, described how Barnet Council was helping young, unemployed people to gain work experience in caring roles in old people's homes. Some would go on to full-time employment, others would finish their term and then be seeking employment in other areas.

In other areas the council has been able to maintain the price of meals on wheels at 50p with no increase in the coming year, and had directed financial resources towards the voluntary sector to enable the WRVS to continue their service in an area which needed a paid organiser.

'Volunteers are local people who know their area and are often closer to the needs of their community than the professionals who have to deal with a much wider field, and perhaps do not even live in the borough. By careful assessment of the situation and by putting money into such things as a paid part-time organiser for a specific service, we can get a very high

return in caring service,' he said.

The Annual Report shows that grant aid to large and small community organisations has been increased by about a third and has resulted in more neighbourhood schemes, better taxi and transport services for disabled, more advice on welfare benefits and legal services, provision of lunch and recreational clubs, mother and toddler, and mental health groups.

This cash injection encourages independent organisations to appoint organising professional staff or to initiate new schemes.

There is an increased percentage of people over 75 and that those people in their own homes, in day centres or residential settings require more staff attention because of their greater dependency. With the introduction of day care, and additional careworkers into residential homes, the quality of care and amount of choice of activities of meals or equipment is improved. Meetings of residents in council homes and members of day centres are encouraged, giving them direct influence on the development of services and activities offered.

There is strong emphasis throughout the work of the Social Services Department on encouraging people to live as independent a life as possible within the community rather than in

residential homes. The boarding-out scheme for adults has given an additional choice of care to elderly and handicapped people.

The reduction in the birth rate in recent years has resulted in a smaller number of children coming into care, but an even more significant factor in this field of child care has been the contribution of social workers, nursery staff, childminders, foster parents and homemakers.

The largest growth area in the borough's Social Service activities has been with physically handicapped people who now represent nearly four out of ten cases.

The new Specialist Team now established at Whetstone will provide a co-ordinated service to those with various physical handicaps and will work more closely with the Disablement Association (DABB).

The service to people suffering from mental illness is primarily operated from Napsbury and Barnet Hospitals. The emphasis on 'de-hospitalising' the care of mentally handicapped people has resulted in the growth of hostels, group homes, special care units and short and long term foster care.

Counselling for problem drinkers and nutritional advice projects have commenced and it is hoped to design projects for the growing misuse of drugs and solvents.

# Belt up for safety — and the LAW

From Monday, January 31, you will be breaking the law if you do not wear a seat belt in the front seats of your car. Very few exceptions will be made. So, in the Name of the Law, Belt up please.

## FACTS

### For the driver

When an unbelted driver slams on his brakes, the car is brought to rest in a very short time, usually one-tenth of a second. But during this instant of time, the driver's body will continue to move forward at the speed the car was travelling until it crashes into the steering wheel or windscreen. Even at speeds as low as 10mph, drivers and their passengers can still receive serious injuries as a result of sharp braking.



### For the passenger

The front seat passenger is even more likely to suffer serious injury than the driver as he has nothing against which he can brace himself, and is probably unaware of danger until too late. Rear seat passengers, dogs or parcels may be flung heavily forward and even greater injury done.



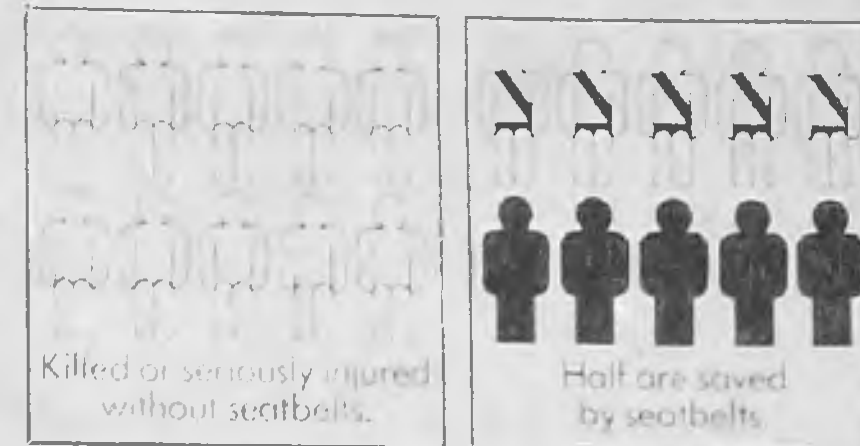
## QUESTIONS

- Q** Couldn't the belt trap me in a burning or submerged car?  
**A** The likelihood is very remote. Less than one per cent of all accidents involve fire or immersion in water. Moreover, all belt buckles are quick-release. If unbelted, you are at far greater risk of being killed, or knocked out by the accident and therefore unable to release yourself.
- Q** Wouldn't I be safer thrown clear of the car?  
**A** If you are thrown out, you are more than twice as likely to suffer death or serious injury. Grand Prix drivers wear seat belts for just this reason.
- Q** Aren't belts uncomfortable, restrictive?  
**A** Initially, this may appear to be the case, but this feeling soon disappears. You will soon appreciate the greater comfort seatbelts give, by helping you to resist the car's swaying movement.
- Q** Belts may be a good thing at motorway speeds - but surely not at low speeds around town?  
**A** It's a common misconception that speed kills. In fact, the risk of accidents is much greater in built-up areas than elsewhere. Unbelted drivers can be killed at speeds as low as 12 mph.
- Q** A badly-adjusted seat belt cannot be of any use?  
**A** This is partially true of static belts - but it's very simple to adjust them speedily to the right tension.
- Q** Don't I have the right to risk killing or hurting myself?  
**A** Do you really regard going through a windscreen as a right to be defended against all odds and evidence? It would be a terrible loss to your family. Your actions now could spare them the personal tragedy, grief and suffering of your death or serious injury in the future.

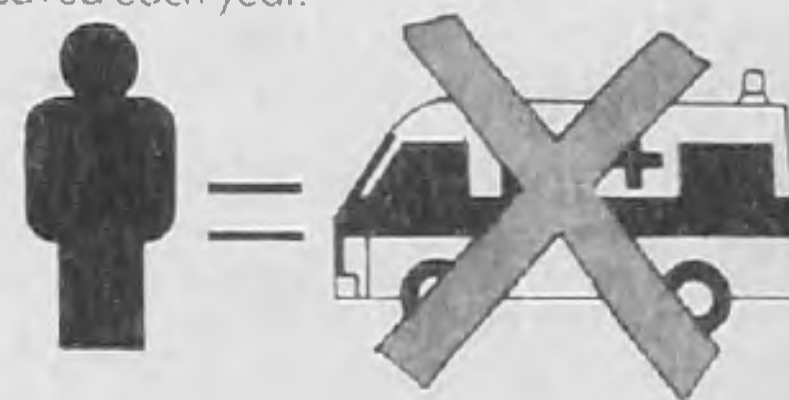

# Modernisation plan for Watling houses

STARTING EARLY this year a major programme of fire precaution and modernisation work will be carried out on 570 timber-clad and steel-clad houses on the Watling Estate, Burnt Oak. It is hoped that the work will be carried out over a two-year period.

The Watling Estate was built in the late 1920s and early 1930s to provide good quality housing for people living in the old slums of central London. In those days Burnt Oak was looked upon as the London countryside. Most of the area was farmland and yet, with the coming of the Northern Line, it had fast links to London.

## Cottage estate

The design was that of a cottage estate with small terraces of houses set in generous gardens and roads well planted with trees and greens. Half the houses were built in traditional brick but a radical design for those days was introduced in the timber houses. These houses, on a traditional foundation, were timber framed and timber clad, the cladding being treated with black staining wood preservative.

During the war the estate was bomb damaged and in several vacant areas in post-war years steel-clad houses were erected.

Recent inspections have shown that these houses no longer meet modern standards of fire resistance and surface spread of flame in the materials used to line the walls inside the houses. As these houses were all scheduled for modernisation works to be carried out Barnet Council decided to modernise and carry out the fire precaution work in a single exercise.

The Watling Estate was originally built by the former London County Council and then was taken over by the GLC. Over recent years the GLC has handed over the estate to Barnet Council, the last phase of the handover taking place in 1981. Because of this link the GLC have been carrying out a standard four-day modernisation package on the houses which formed the last phase of the handover. They will now undertake the modernisation and fire precaution work of approximately 240 of the 570 houses.

Barnet Council will carry out the work on the rest of the houses and have appointed Hunter and Partners as consul-

tant surveyors for the first phase of 88 dwellings.

The specifications for both the GLC work and Barnet Council contracts are very similar.

## Fire precautions

Under fire precautions the work entails a complete over-lining with plasterboard of all the walls and ceilings lined with hardboard or fibre board. Where necessary new skirtings and architraves will be installed and electrical fittings adjusted.

The modernisation work includes refitting kitchens and bathrooms, installing full gas-fired central heating, roof insulation and installing a gas fire

in living rooms when requested. All the houses will be fully redecorated inside and tenants will be offered a choice of wall-papers etc.

In each house the work is expected to take two weeks. Tenants will continue to live in the houses while the work is carried out but Barnet Council will make alternative arrangements in cases of serious ill health.

Liaison officers will be designated to help tenants with problems and every effort will be made to keep tenants informed of individual schedules. The full programme should be completed by 1985, subject to finances being available.

There is by the way, no keener critic of Terry's plays than his oldest son. When Dominic says, 'Rubbish!' it's back to the drawing board!

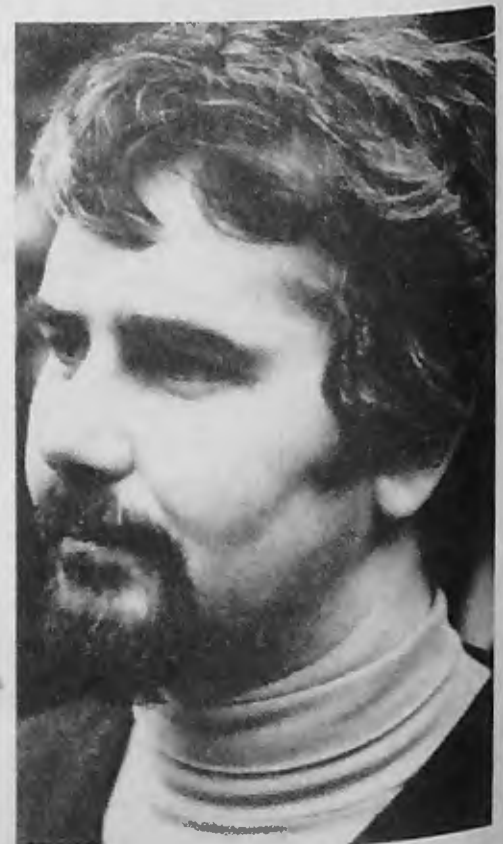
After lying comparatively fallow for a while, contenting himself with a rock opera, 'Rasputin', something well worth hearing, Terry has now written a new and original musical play,

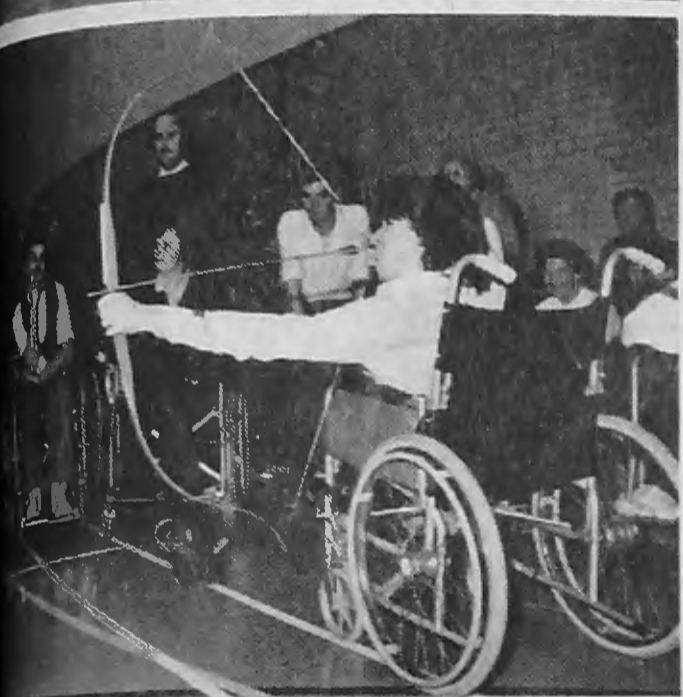

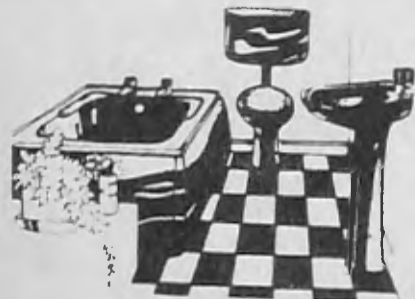

... a weak two spade opener by West and a competitive auction during which East West discovered their best suit. South became the declarer and five diamonds doubled. West decided to lead the two of spades and declarer led a diamond at trick two. West won with the ace, put his partner down. Unfortunate partner re-

marked South. Reverse the trump holding and the contract is unbeatable.

This is a classic case of a Declarer playing without thought. By his opening bid West announced a six card spade suit. It is obvious, therefore, that East has a singleton spade and will obtain a ruff if West is allowed to gain the lead. True if West has the ace of trumps and East a doubleton trump the ruff cannot be prevented, but South, aware of the danger, can protect against the other distribution of the aces. At trick two he plays ace hearts followed by the ten hearts. On the second heart he discards his losing club. It is now impossible for East to put his partner in for the setting trick and a doubled contract is safely made.

This hand is an example of the scissors coup where it is necessary for the Declarer to cut the defenders communications to ensure the contract, hence its name.

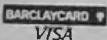

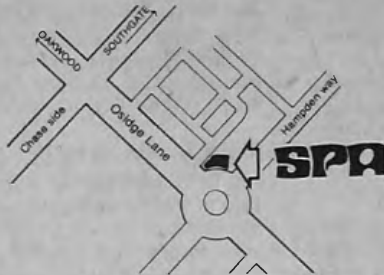

**LAND BOUGHT FOR TWO GUNS, THREE COATS AND 13 CANS OF RUM!**

Yes, in 1678 that is what the Indians agreed for the purchase price for the land on which Montclair, New Jersey, U.S.A. was built.

This information was given by Councillor Frank Gibson, convenor of the inaugural meeting of the Friends of Montclair in the Town Hall, Hendon.

Councillor Gibson visited Montclair, originally twinned 'on paper' with the Borough of Finchley 25 years ago, and he felt the link should be revived on an active basis.
