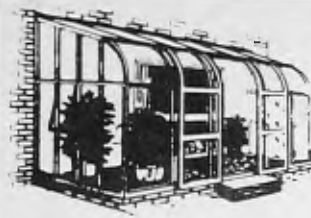

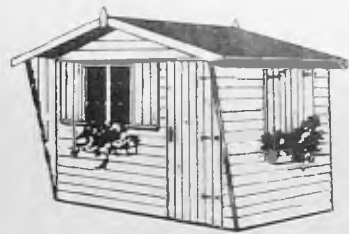

Mayor's Appeal on the move

PUBLICITY for the Mayor of Barnet's Appeal to help sick children with cystic fibrosis is going round the borough. The committee entered a float in Finchley Carnival, manned a stall at Brent Cross shopping Centre's 10th Anniversary Celebrations, and will have a stall at Friern Barnet Summer Show on Saturday, August 9.

Mrs Jean Higgs, appeal secretary, said, 'We really do want people to know about what we are doing and why.'

'Cystic fibrosis causes great suffering to children — and to their families. There is no known cure

but research has found ways of treating the sufferers and recently there has been a breakthrough.'

That breakthrough is the first early prenatal diagnosis by the CF Genetics Research Group at St Mary's Medical School, London.

Funds are urgently needed to allow research to continue. CF is the most common severe inherited disease in the United Kingdom and the team at St Mary's are searching for better forms of prevention and treatment. Their research is funded by the Cystic Fibrosis Research Trust and it is this charity for which the Mayor's Appeal Fund is working.

Plans are also in hand for a series of fund raising events including a

sponsored swim at Cophall Pools on April 4; a civic dinner and ball; a car rally and barbecue; entertainments and an equestrian event. The Mayor of Barnet's Appeal will also share in proceeds from the Charity Horse Ride at Elstree on September 7.

The fund now stands at almost £1,000 and the first event for the appeal — a charity sponsored walk organised by Mr Popat Shah, will probably raise more than £1,500.

'It has been a jolly good start and the committee are pushing ahead. I hope that we can all join in and make a really useful contribution to this important research work,' the Mayor, Cllr Denis Dippel, said.

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN

BARNET Council has produced a borough-wide traffic management plan which lays down policies for the road and traffic network.

It has been produced by the Engineering Services Division and approved by Public Works Committee.

In 10 chapters the report looks at the pattern of roads in the borough; traffic management; parking; accident investigation and road safety; provision for pedestrians and disabled people; cyclists; public transport, and freight transport.

Each section sets out the existing situation, the problem and the policies which the Council will follow.

Four zones in the borough are listed under the highest priority for traffic management:

- Aerodrome — the area bounded by the A41 from Northway Circus

to Colindeep Lane and the Edgware Road;

- Brent Cross area;
- Clitterhouse area;
- High Barnet.

The policies range from a possible link between the A1 and M1 at Scratchwood; adequate off street parking for lorries; possible use of commercial property car parks for public Saturday parking; priority rating for accident blackspots; targetting children, motorcyclists and elderly people for road safety work; reserved parking for disabled people in Council car parks; and the build-up of a cycle route network throughout the borough.

In November 1984 a member of Public Works expressed concern that the borough was tackling traffic management problems on a piecemeal basis and that, with the

demise of the GLC, it was important for the borough to have a clearly defined traffic management plan.

Work began on the plan early in 1985 and each section has been submitted to Public Works for discussion. It has been prepared in the light of the Topic Study on Transportation which forms the basis of the Barnet Borough Development Plan.

Copies of the Borough Traffic Management Plan can be purchased, £5 each, from the Engineering Services Division, London Borough of Barnet, Barnet House, 1255 High Road, Whetstone N20 0EJ. Cheques should be made out to Barnet Corporation. Copies of the plan are also available in public libraries for inspection.

Watch those bonfires

DO you enjoy your garden? If so don't stop your neighbours enjoying theirs by lighting a bonfire carelessly.

Remember, bonfire smoke can be very irritating and even harmful, particularly to people with chest or heart problems.

Even though bonfires are not specifically prohibited by the Clean Air Act, even in smoke control areas, the Council has power to take action where smoke is likely to damage people's health or be a nuisance.

Anyone lighting a fire and allowing smoke to drift across a road faces a fine of up to £2,000 under the Highways (Amendment) Act 1986. And under the Clean Air Act 1956 it is an offence to cause a nuisance by creating smoke — again, maximum penalty £2,000.

So observe the following simple rules before lighting bonfires in the open.

- Choose the site for your bonfire carefully and consider those living nearby.

- Never light a bonfire unless you are sure that weather conditions are such that smoke or ash will be carried away from your neighbours' windows and gardens.

- Make sure there is no laundry drying in adjoining gardens.

- Only use material that can be burned quickly and with a minimum of smoke. Soft vegetable waste and grass cuttings, which are difficult to dry, should be composted or buried.

- Do not burn oily rags, rubber, plastic or other materials likely to produce heavy or pungent smoke. Household goods and furniture should not be burned. A special collection, for which there is a fee, can be arranged by telephoning 361 0013. Or you can take them to the Council tip at Tilling Road or Summers Lane. They are open seven days a week, 8am to 4pm.

Please follow these simple rules. Then your neighbours will not be annoyed and will not have to complain to the Council.

What to do with garden refuse

Barnet Council's policy on the collection of garden refuse is that the refuse collectors will pick up one-third of a bin or bag, and no more, from each property per week.

Householders who want additional garden refuse collected should telephone 361 0013 to book a special collection for which a charge of 38p a bag or bin will be made.

Alternatively, householders can take any amount of garden refuse to the refuse sites at Tilling Road, off the North Circular Road, Cricklewood, or Summers Lane, North Finchley. The sites are open from 8am to 4pm seven days a week including public holidays except Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

Nature Notes

AUGUST

WITH THE breeding season drawing to a close, birds become noticeably quiet and shy this month. Many are moulting into the new livery of feathers vital to survive a British winter or a long migration. Early departures are the Swifts and adult Cuckoos whose young follow them to Africa slightly later and never meet their parents.

The lack of avian activity is compensated for by spectacular displays of wild flowers and, in good summers, the 22 species of butterflies found in Barnet.

Although most woodland plants flowered before the tree canopy became too dense in June, there are still plenty of botanising opportunities in our meadows and grasslands. Look out for the Giant Hogweed — an alien plant rapidly colonising our area. Resembling an outsized Cow Parsley with red spotted stem, it stands over 10 feet tall and has white flower umbels larger than a dinner plate.

There will be a unique opportunity to see bats in the hand at Brent Reservoir on August 6. Members of the Herts Bat Group will be mist netting to show us that bats are hardly creatures of Draculean proportions! Meet at 7.30pm in the car park in Cool Oak Lane, NW9.

YOU CAN send anything through the post these days — including $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton telephone kiosks. This one is a gift from the people of the Borough of Barnet to their twin town of Tempelhof, West Berlin.

But how do you get such a large package across the North Sea relatively unscathed?

'Call in the Army' was the answer the Mayor of Barnet, Cllr Denis Dippel, came up with, and they duly obliged.

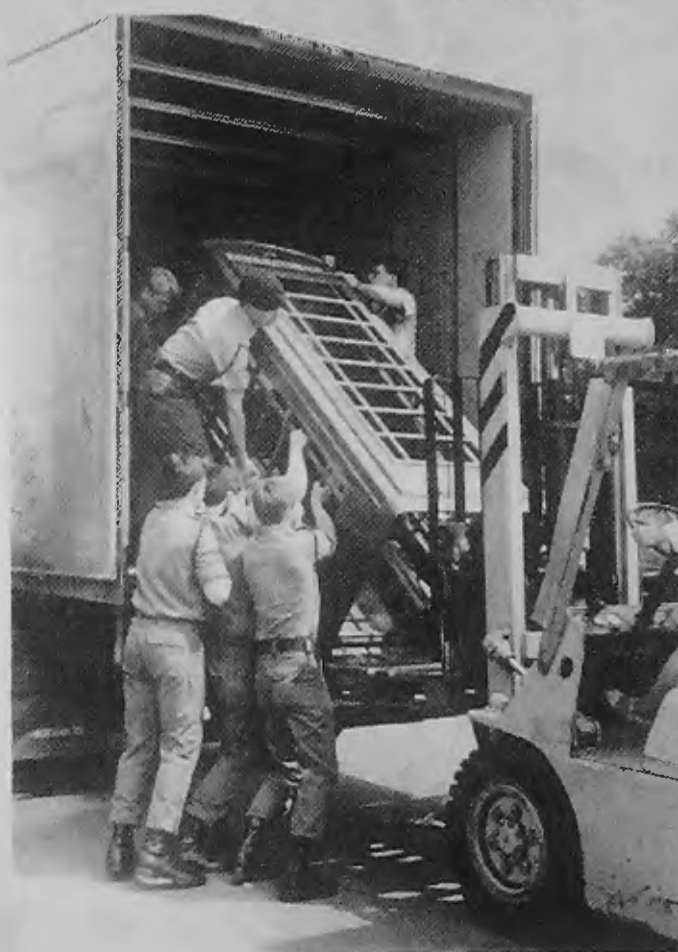
The Postal and Courier Depot, Royal Engineers, who have the Freedom of the Borough and are based at Inglis Barracks, Mill Hill, took on the task of delivering the telephone kiosk to the Mayor of Tempelhof on their normal mail run to West Germany.

Helping the borough to say 'It's for youhoo!' were British Telecom who presented the redundant 1936 red phone box to the Mayor at the Romac Works, The Hyde, Colindale.

Their general manager for London payphones, Mr Trevor Greenwood, made the presentation in the company of the Mayoress, Mrs Lorna Dippel, Brig Dennis Streatfield, Commandant, and Maj Ivor Siddall, Admin Officer, both of PCDRE.

Romac provided the special trailer to carry the kiosk over to the barracks ready for delivery to Berlin, where it will sit in state on Tempelhof's Barnet Strasse.

Polytechnic's joint venture with French university

A joint venture of Middlesex Polytechnic with the University of Lille, France, offers humanities students the opportunity to study for both a French and British degree in the time it takes for an ordinary degree programme.

After four years' study at both Middlesex and Lille, successful students will be awarded the BA Honours Humanities (Council for National Academic Awards) and the Licence ès Lettres, the French degree equivalent, from the University of Lille.

Students will spend the first two years at Middlesex Polytechnic All Saints and Trent Park sites, on a modified version of the BA Humanities, combining modules in English, history or philosophy with French.

The third and fourth years are spent at Lille taking a French approach to humanities studies. While at Middlesex, students take preparatory work for the period abroad.

Many requests

The course takes off in September this year after seven years in the planning. During that time, humanities staff at Middlesex have received many requests from prospective students for a course of this kind. Lecturers forecast the course will open up employment prospects in Europe for successful students.

The course is a result of Middlesex Polytechnic's long-standing relationship with the University of Lille through teaching exchanges, guest lecturers and a series of international conferences.

Photographic survey in Garden Suburb

THE Hampstead Garden Suburb photographic survey, which began last October, is now more than two-thirds complete. This one year project is being sponsored through the Manpower Services Commission by The New Hampstead Garden Suburb Trust, the Archives Trust and Barnet Council's Planning Group.

The photographs will be available for inspection by the public and will be of interest to residents and students of architecture and town planning.

The project is being financed substantially by the Manpower Services Commission under the Community Programme and is one of 127 currently under way in Council departments and voluntary agencies throughout the borough.

The photographer, Jane Whitton, has been recording the Suburb, road by road and in the early part of the year became a familiar figure with her camera in the old Suburb. She is now beginning the later Suburb and will be working in the area north of the Falloden Way in the next few weeks.

So far she has taken about 35,000 photographs, each of which has been labelled and indexed. Jane hopes to end the survey in October with a local exhibition of her work.

TV scientist opens new school labs

'TOMORROW'S World' presenter Judith Hann, one of this country's best-known woman scientists, opened Mill Hill County High School's new science laboratories.

She told pupils, staff and visitors that the school was lucky in having such a strong scientific tradition that also managed to make the subject exciting and interesting.

That tradition comes through Orange Hill, one of the schools, with Moat Mount, which make up the County High after their merger.

Orange Hill pupils regularly used to get into national competitions to find the young scientist of the year, the young engineer and young designer and won a number of awards.

When the schools merged to form Mill Hill County High on the Moat Mount site at Worcester Crescent, they were promised more labs and this has been honoured by Barnet Council.

As she cut the tape to the new laboratories, Miss Hann was accompanied by the Mayor and Mayoress, Cllr Denis and Mrs Lorna Dippel, BBC TV News reporter Mike McKay, also a school governor, Cllr Dot Benson, vice-chairman of the Education Committee, ex-Alderman Clara Thub-

run, former chairman of education and of the governors, the headmaster, Mr Derek Culley, and the faculty co-ordinator for science maths and computing, Mr Alan Holmes.

On their tour of the four new labs, which brings the school's total to 10, the party also took in the new

photography darkroom, one of the facilities that will help pupils to do their photography O-level.

The Mayor declared a particular interest in the day's proceedings because his daughter, Anne, went to Moat Mount and then the County High. Her studies there had enabled her to go to the London

College of Printing to study art and photography.

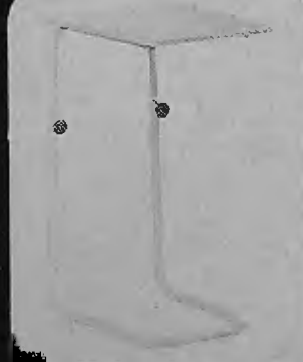
Mr Culley said science would continue to be a compulsory core subject up to O-level and pupils would also have the chance to study photography, electronics, environmental studies and computer sciences.

Trees are our heritage

Barnet is top of the tree league in London. There are 80,000 trees in our residential streets and 100,000 in council parks and open spaces. Last year we planted more than 2,500 young trees between October and April and now we are drawing up plans to take part in a London-wide scheme next year to plant trees on derelict open land.

If you were to join the tree officers in their offices on the eighth floor of Barnet House, Whetstone, you would look across the borough at a sea of green from East Barnet to Mill Hill. The contrasting shades and pinacles of the leaf canopy bear witness to continuous care and selection over many years. The filing cabinets echo the story.

Medical history

Did you know that our trees have their own medical history just like a doctor's files? Every time a new tree is planted or a mature tree is inspected for the first time a file is opened. There are already more than 17,000 trees on individual file and about 30 new files are opened every week.

Not only do the tree officers care about trees — so do the residents of Barnet. And if a tree has been damaged, or looks dangerous someone will very quickly phone the council. And that means an inspection, and, if necessary, action.

Perhaps because trees live to a

great age we forget that, just like humans, they do get old, suffer from disease, and need care. Today's tree officers have to be expert surgeons as well as plantsmen.

Both Mick Swabey, the arboricultural manager or trees officer, and his assistant, Paul Donaghue, trained at Merristwood Agricultural College, the leading centre for the study of urban forestry. Mick joined the Council in 1979 and is a member of the Council of the Arboricultural Association. His

other assistants, Ken Duffin and Stan Cook, have long experience in all aspects of tree management. And the gang of 16 men on tree planting and maintenance are trained and continue to take part in in-house training programmes and attend lectures to keep Barnet ahead in tree care.

Approved list

Because Barnet has so many trees it is also necessary to employ contractors to undertake about 40 per cent of the work. But all are carefully checked before being accepted on to the list of approved contractors.

So let's take a look at how Barnet cares for its trees.

In residential roads where pavements are wide enough, the planting of trees is encouraged. The varieties are carefully selected so

that large trees with spreading roots are planted on greens and wide verges, while streets are planted with smaller varieties.

Where possible a variety of trees is preferred because this prevents disease attacking all the trees in a road. It also allows an on-going replanting programme without making the road look 'gap toothed'.

Some residential roads are planted with large trees such as limes and London planes. Probably, if we were planning a planting scheme today these would not be chosen. Because they are beautiful trees the Council maintains them, but for safety reasons, the trees are pruned or pollarded to restrain growth.

Where a tree has become a real danger, because of rot or age it may have to be felled. Trees don't live forever and heartbreaking though it may be to see a favourite landmark cut down, it is necessary. These great trees were planted by our grandfathers as a heritage for our generation. It is our job to maintain and increase the heritage for generations to come. That means replanting

Wildlife haven

The tree group also undertakes woodland management. It may seem that the action is drastic but tree management is a long-term business. In Cherry Tree Woods we have cleared some of the weedier trees to encourage the native trees to develop more strongly. Other trees have been coppiced to encourage them to bush out providing a future haven for wildlife. In Big Wood and Little Wood, in the Garden Suburb, similar management projects are in hand, working

on small parcels of the area so that there is not a total devastation scene for a few years.

One of the most exciting projects recently launched is the arboretum

at Arrandene Open Space where a collection of trees will be a centre of pleasure and education. Tree management schemes at Oakhill Park and Riverside Walk are being undertaken, rooting out diseased trees and invasive sycamores to allow existing and newly planted trees to develop.

To ensure a ready supply of a wide variety of trees Barnet buys in saplings to grow on in plant nurseries at Woodfield Park and Brunswick Park.

There is more good news. We have in Barnet one of the finest specimens of the Wild Service Tree — a native tree which has become increasingly rare. This year, probably as a result of the very wet winter and spring, it has seeded and it is possible that Barnet will be able to grow on the seedlings for future planting.

Rare collection

The borough maintains an impressive collection of rare and unusual trees in Avenue House Grounds and an illustrated booklet has been produced which is available from the recreation group at Barnet House.

In one of our parks in Whetstone young elms are growing strongly — a hopeful sign for the future of this tree which has been virtually wiped out in the southern half of England.

And along the North Circular



An ash on the Watling Estate, Burnt Oak, has been carefully pruned and lower branches lopped to retain its shape while allowing light to the cottages around the green.

Road the golden poplars which had to be heavily pollarded for safety — they were severely infected by rot — are already putting out strong new shoots. Additional planting in the gaps along this section will be undertaken during the coming planting season from November to March.

That's the good news. The bad news is that vandalism is getting worse. This is where the help of all local residents is needed. Don't let the vandals get away with it. If you

see jobs rooting up young trees or breaking off branches please report it. It is worth a 999 call to the police as a quick response can stop permanent damage.

Barnet trees officers are working with schools to develop the children's interest in our woodland heritage, but they need the support of all residents in the borough's campaign to make sure that when those children grow up Barnet will be a tree lined borough just as it is today.

No need to panic

STUDENTS left at a standstill after not getting the A-level results they wanted can take heart and turn to their local careers office for information and advice.

Every August and September in the borough the Advanced Further Education Information Service (AFEIS) give a helping hand to hundreds of young people who have just had the results of their A-levels or similar exams.

But the careers service help students who have done better than they expected as well as those who haven't done as well as they hoped.

Finding out exactly what can be done makes good sense, costs nothing and saves a lot of time and worry.

The AFEIS is a nationwide service, so there is a local advisory officer within reasonable reach of where you live.

In Barnet the officer has full information about higher education courses at polytechnics and other colleges around the country, including up-to-date details of vacancies on Prestel, entry requirements and enrolment times and procedures.

Advice is also available about late applications to university, the value of resitting exams at school or college and all other options.

And remember that the careers office have contacts with local em-

ployers and details of current vacancies.

It is important not to panic — the university and polytechnics clearing systems don't start for several working days after the publication of results, but try not to take a holiday abroad when the A-level results are due out.

There is a wealth of information, experience and advice waiting at the Barnet Careers Office — please use it wisely and telephone to make an appointment.

BARNET Social Services have presented 32 of their home helps with certificates of completion of basic training courses.

Another 12 have been awarded certificates for completing specialised courses designed to train them to help people with specific difficulties and disabilities.

The presentations were made by Mr Robin Jones, deputy director of Social Services.

APPEAL TOPS TARGET

THE MAYOR'S Appeal last year, in aid of the local St John Ambulance and Red Cross, topped its target by £2,500 and raised £42,500.

The news was given to the committee by last year's Mayor of Barnet, Cllr Barbara Langstone, at a party in the garden of the home of appeal secretary Sue Thurlow.

Among those present were Mr J. W. Bamford of St John Ambulance, and Col M. Ulton Ryan of the Red Cross.

The bulk of the money — £37,500 — will go into a trust fund to be used to build a new training headquarters in the Borough of Barnet for St John Ambulance, which will also be used as a medical loans depot for the Red Cross.

£5,000 was handed to Mrs Anne Painter of the Red Cross to purchase new medical loans equipment in advance of the new depot.

Handing over the cheques Cllr

Langstone said the new centre would be of real benefit to the residents of Barnet who had been so generous in their support for the Appeal.

The work of the two organisations was well known, both locally and throughout the world, and the new centre would be a further step forward in the friendship and co-operation which existed between them.

Mr Bamford, thanking the appeal committee and all the residents of Barnet who took part, said the two organisations already worked together locally and their volunteers gave great service for the welfare of the community.

A silver framed photograph of Barbara and her husband Roy at the civic charity ball, and signed by the Duke of Westminster and the Hon Mrs Villiers, was presented to Barbara from the committee by Cllr David Hammond.

They have an O-level package which counts towards the City and

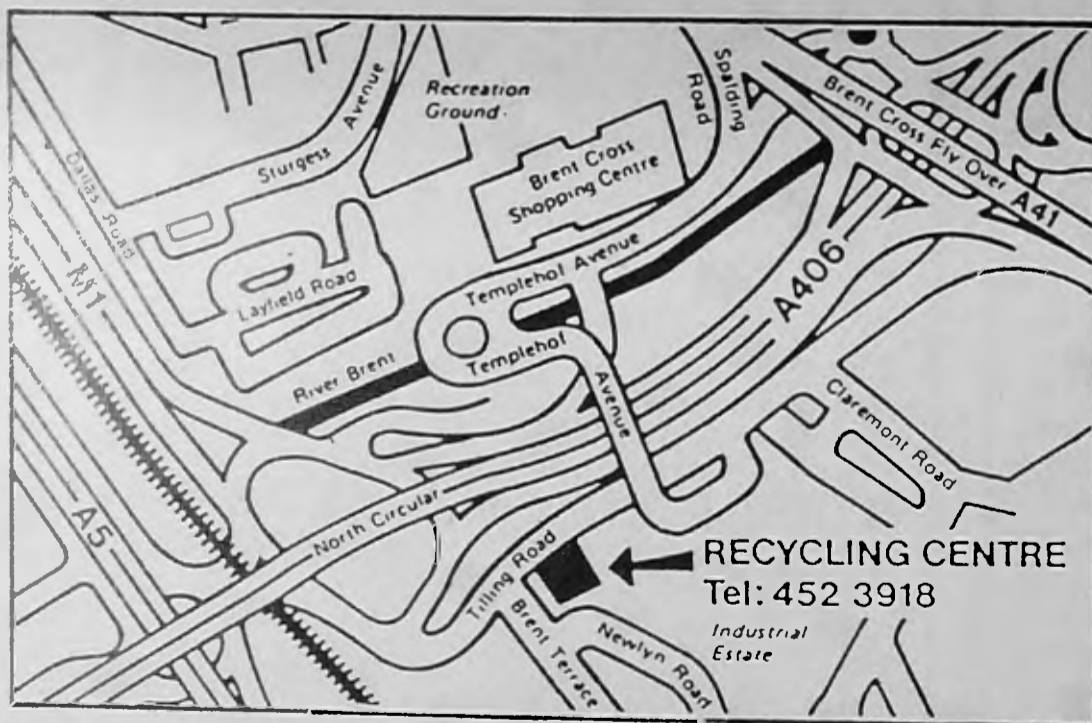
Guilds 481 Certificate in recreation and leisure studies, and a CPVE course involving assignments allied to the sports and leisure industry.

HOUSE A STUDENT AND STRETCH YOUR BUDGET

LOCAL RESIDENTS are finding a way to help meet the rising costs of owning property by letting vacant rooms in their homes to Middlesex Polytechnic students.

Many people find they enjoy having young people living in their homes and also find the income they receive from letting rooms to be a welcome supplement to the household budget.

Students tend to make convenient tenants as they usually only want accommodation from September until June each year. Many students are away during the Christmas and Easter breaks, allowing the landlord to perhaps use the room for a member of their own family.

Mr David Barnard, head of Accommodation Services at Middlesex Polytechnic would like to hear from local residents with rooms or whole properties to let. "More than 2,700 first-year students will be starting their studies at the Polytechnic this autumn, and most will be seeking somewhere to live," Mr Barnard says.

"Local residents who let rooms to students not only provide a valuable service to our students,

but also make their own budgets go further. Although the Polytechnic does have some halls of residence there are not nearly enough places for all our 7,000 full-time students."

The Polytechnic runs a Central Accommodation Office which landlords can contact to register their accommodation with the Polytechnic. The office also provides a landlords' information

package which gives useful details and a registration form.

The Central Office then forwards details of available accommodation to the Accommodation Offices on the major Polytechnic sites. The six main teaching sites are: All Saints, Tottenham; Bounds Green; Cat Hill, East Barnet; Enfield, Hendon; Trent Park, Cockfosters.

Most students prefer to live

close to their place of study but some are prepared to travel a reasonable distance to find suitable accommodation.

Student needs

Most students prefer to live in self-contained, self-catering accommodation in houses, flats or single-bedroom bedsits. Shared rooms are very difficult to let. Very few students are prepared to accept rooms with meals provided, as students' lifestyle do not usually fit in with family meal times. Many students, especially those from overseas, follow special diets.

Accommodation services

Mr David Barnard, head of Accommodation Services, is keen to emphasise that the services of the polytechnic's accommodation staff are free to both parties.

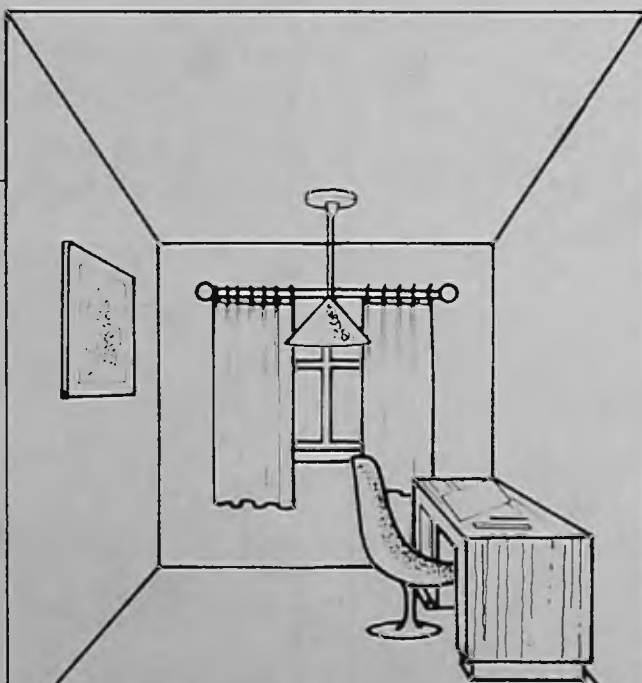


Accommodation in the Hendon area is in particular demand from students on business studies and management courses at the Middlesex Business School.

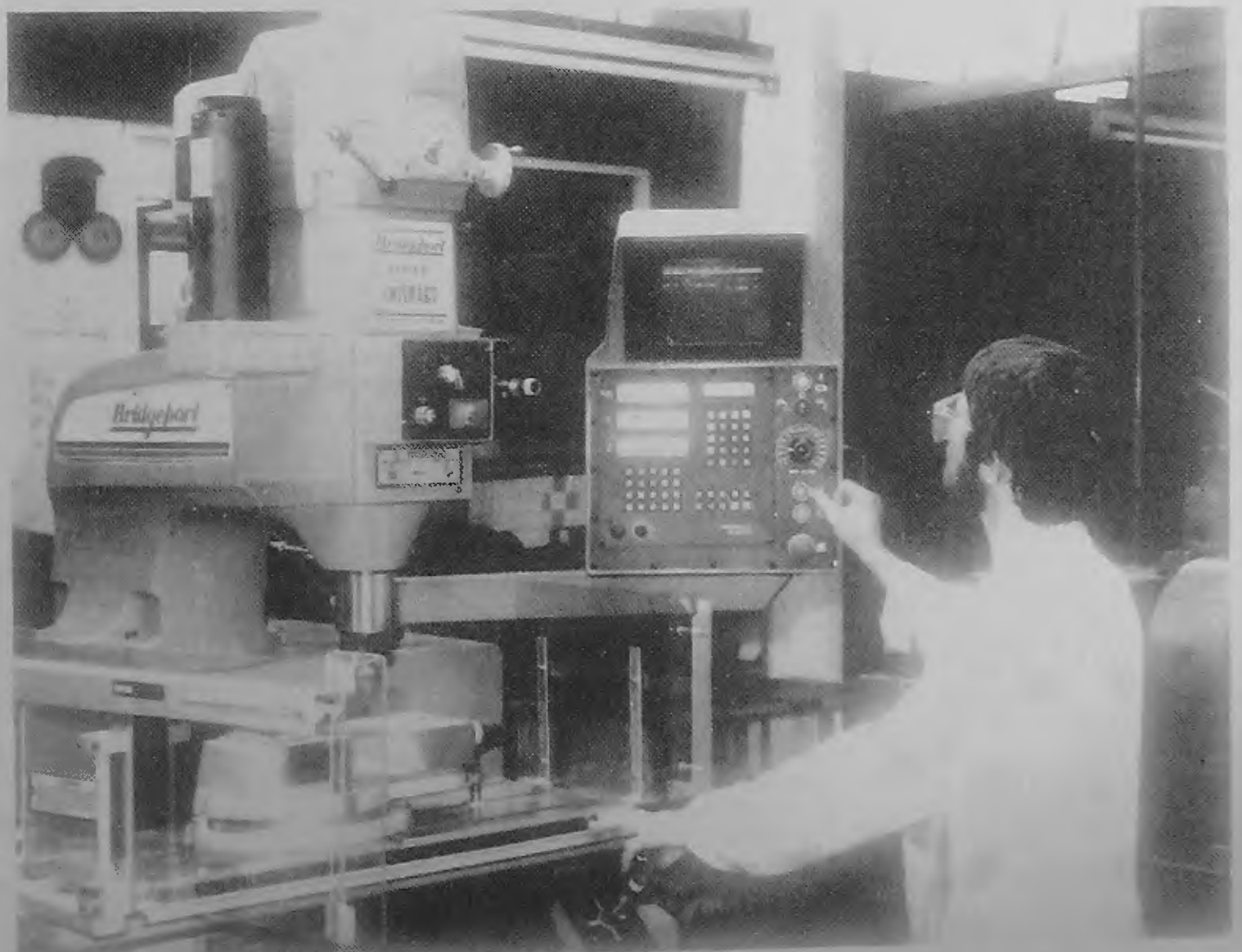

Caring kinds of courses

WOULD YOU like to work with people who need care?

Do you think you would but aren't sure?

Did you choose the wrong options at school?

If the answer to any of these questions is yes. We can help.

The Pre-Caring Courses at Barnet College are designed to give you work experience, a programme of study towards 'O' or 'A' levels, first aid or home nursing tuition, improve your mathematical and communication skills, and advise on applications for further studies or jobs.

Option I is a one year course including 3 'O' levels in English Language, Sociology and Human Biology.

Option II is a one year course on which 3 'O' levels can be studied, that is any of the above with Psychology, Cookery and Nutrition.

A third option is the two year 'A' level course on which two 'A' levels in Psychology and Sociology are studied, along with 'O' level Mathematics. The entry requirements are four academic 'O' levels, preferably including English Language.

FLEXI STUDY

FLEXI-STUDY combines the flexibility of correspondence course style of learning with the advantages of a college course. It enables those who cannot commit themselves to a weekly class but who don't want to study entirely alone, to continue their education.

Community Theatre — Act Now!

THIS YEAR a new 20-hour, part-time course is to be pioneered at Barnet College, which aims to use theatre as a means of working in the community.

Its targets include introducing students to the reality of working as a small theatre group; researching the needs of the local community; and responding to these needs through drama and performance.

Projects may include working with the elderly, the handicapped and those in hospital, but the course aims to be flexible and respond directly to the interests of the group.

ARE EXAMINATION nerves holding you back from a career in Science?

Many students with an aptitude for science who perform well on their course work find they cannot cope so well under the stress of 'O' and 'A' level examinations. These students have found that a continually assessed course such as BTEC National Diploma in Science is an answer to their problem.

The Science Diploma Course offers other advantages to the science student since the subjects studied are carefully integrated to provide a broad scientific background.

There is also considerable emphasis on practical work and the new suite of laboratories at the Russell Lane site is being developed with this course in mind. Practical skills are developed in a six week period of work experience where students

gain first-hand knowledge of work in science laboratories.

The majority of students who have completed this course already have gone on to higher education to universities and polytechnics. Some students, however, have entered scientific employment directly on completion of the course. These students have found their work experience particularly useful.

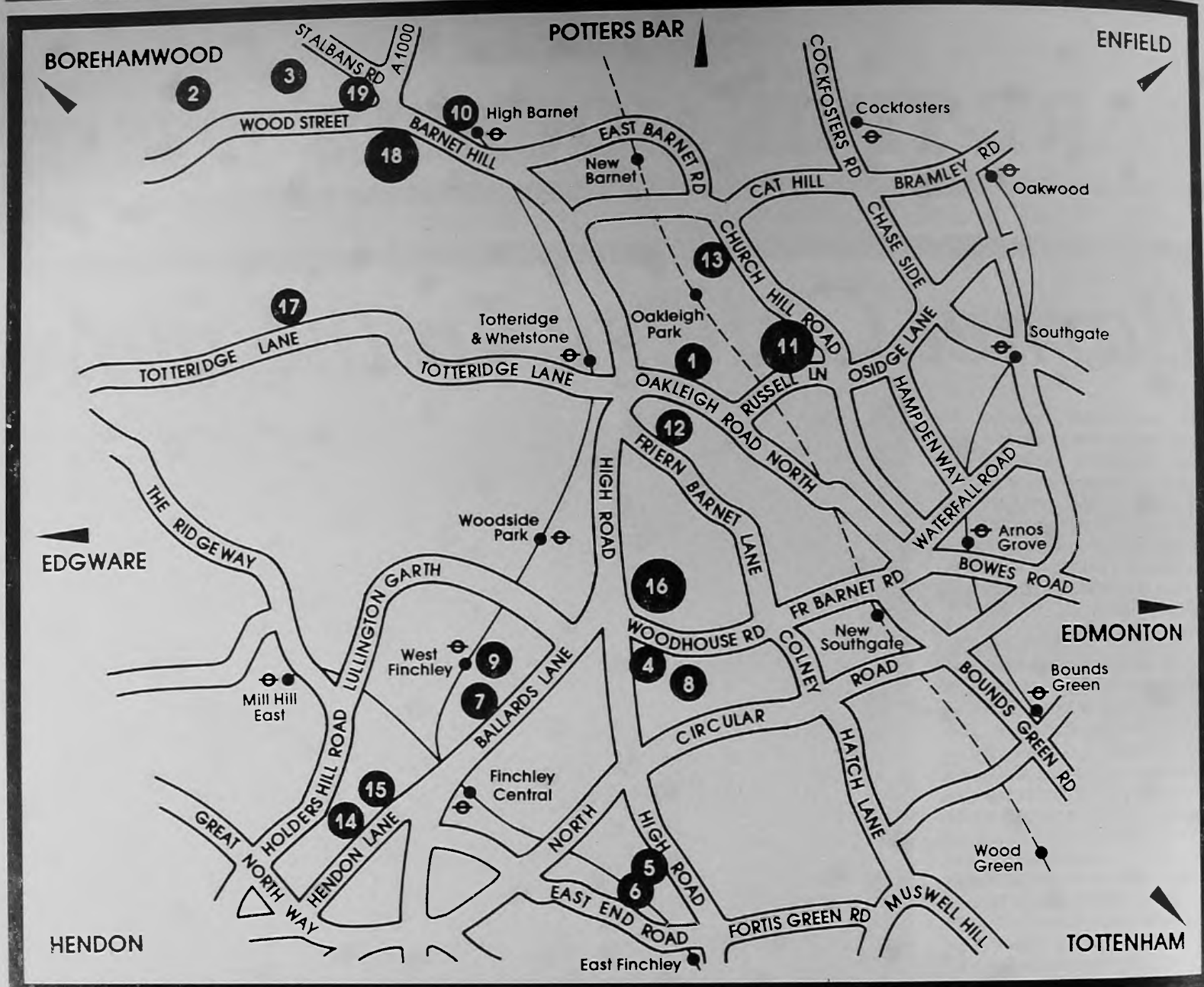

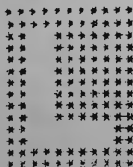

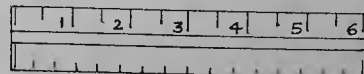

An expensive parking space

BARNET'S pavements and footpaths can be an expensive parking place. Motorists who obstruct the pavements by parking there can find themselves forking out £50 in the local magistrates courts.

Barnet Council is continuing to wage war on pavement parkers in the courts. Between May 12 and June 5, 43 drivers were prosecuted for footway parking. Most were fined £25 with £25 costs.

'Pavements are for pedestrians and cars who park there are a real danger to elderly people, mothers with prams who have to go out in the road to get past, and particularly to blind people who often use the kerb of the pavement as a guide. They don't expect to find an illegally parked car in their way,' Max Caller, Controller of Engineering Services, said. 'We shall continue to take a tough line with motorists who obstruct our pavements and the courts are backing us up by imposing higher fines of up to £35 plus costs.'

An exhibition of cycle routes was organised in the foyer of Barnet House which is the offices of Barnet's Technical Services Department.

Child abuse — Barnet take action

BARNET Social Services are taking action to make sure that, as far as humanly possible, the type of tragedy that occurred in the Jasmine Beckford case will not happen in this borough.

They have begun to set up a formal inquiry procedure for use in the event of the death of a child from abuse to determine whether established procedures were correctly stated or understood or if they were even followed.

Director of Social Services, Mr Alan Gorst, is committed to updating and improving the formal machinery for such an eventuality.

'We hope it will never happen in Barnet, but we have to make sure we are ready if it does. After the tragedies in other local authorities it would be foolhardy for any council not to have a well worked out procedure for holding an inquiry as quickly as possible,' he said.

A report on a possible format for a future course of action was discussed at the July meeting of the Social Services Committee.

There members put the finishing touches to a consultation document which will now go out to unions and other authorities involved in the prevention of child abuse, like Barnet Health Authority, the police, the Council's own Education Department and to legal representatives.

The proposed inquiry procedure was drawn up by the Barnet Area Review Committee which is chaired by the Council's Chief Solicitor and includes representatives from all relevant authorities and departments.

All aspects

This committee has been responsible for some years for reviewing all aspects of the management of cases involving child abuse.

Its members have thought for some time that there ought to be formal machinery for use when a child dies in those circumstances and, to some extent, proposals have been speeded up by the events of the Beckford case and trial and inquiry details.

One of the most important suggestions that came out of the July Social Services Committee meeting was that membership of any panel of inquiry should be totally independent of Barnet Council.

The chairman and members would be appointed by the Social Services Committee and would report back to them and to the Area Review Committee.

It is proposed that the chairman would be a solicitor or barrister with experience in the field of health and social services law and practice and the other four mem-

bers would include one qualified doctor, health visitor and social worker and the chairman of another authority's social services committee.

A panel would meet only after the completion of any criminal proceedings or action to protect other children in the same household and evidence given to them could be used later in formal disciplinary measures if resubmitted at that stage.

Written report

After the inquiry a written report of its conclusions would be produced, ideally within eight weeks, and the panel may recommend that an extract or the whole of their report be published, although that will be at the discretion of Barnet Council.

It would then be considered at the next meeting of the Area Review Committee or, possibly, at an emergency meeting.

Cllr David Hammond, Chairman of Social Services, said of the proposals: 'I hope, now that we are setting up a formal procedure and given the wisdom behind that, to see other local authorities doing likewise. I consider it a most necessary development on our part.'

ARTSCENE

Join the club at Church Farm House Museum

CHURCH Farm House Museum, Hendon, takes on the atmosphere of a 19th century Englishman's club for its 'Brush, Pen and Pencil' exhibition which starts on August 9.

It consists of a collection of paintings and drawings by distinguished members of the London Sketch Club between the years 1890 and 1930. The club was founded in 1898 to provide a place for a group of artist friends to relax and practise their skills in good company.

With little change in aims, it has survived two world wars and is well known among artists for its Bohemian social atmosphere in its various homes throughout the years.

Now housed in a large studio in Chelsea, it is unique in clubland in that it commemorates in silhouette on its walls the profiles of past and present members.

Original

The exhibition at the museum, in Greyhound Hill, runs until September 28 and contains examples of work by some of the original members of the London Sketch Club, like Tom Browne, artist and black and white illustrator, 1872 to 1910, and Harold Earnshaw, watercolourist and illustrator, 1886 to 1937.

Others include Dudley Hardy, artist and illustrator, 1865 to 1922; John Hassall, watercolourist, poster designer and illustrator, 1868 to 1948; Frank Reynolds, black and white artist and illustrator, 1876 to 1953; Bert Thomas, black and white artist and illustrator, 1883 to 1966; and Lawson Wood, artist and illustrator, 1878 to 1957.

The London Sketch Club evolved from the original Artists' Society which was officially opened in 1830 at a meeting in a stable yard in Grays Inn Lane.

Langham

They moved to a studio in Fitzroy Square in 1835, taking additional premises in 1841, and in 1854 built their own studio at 1 Langham Place, changing the name to the Langham Sketching Club.

This building and club records were destroyed in 1940 during the Second World War and the Langham now meets at the London Sketch Club.

In 1898 a breakaway group was formed following a dispute over hot or cold dinners and this is the present Sketch Club.

They first met at the Modern Gallery, 175 Bond Street, from 1898 to 1902, and then at the Continental Gallery, 157 Bond

Street, from 1902 to 1903.

From there they moved to 79 Wells Street until 1913 and then to 216a Marylebone Road until 1957.

Dilke Street is the club's present headquarters, a large studio in Chelsea which was bought in 1957.

Tuesday evenings throughout the year are reserved for drawings from the live model, while Friday evenings from October to May begin with two hours of sketching a subject chosen for the day.

Informal comparison and comment is followed by an adjournment to the bar and after supper, songs, stories and other entertainment while away the rest of the evening.

The 125 subjects on show at the Church Farm House Museum exhibition date between 1890 and 1930 and are loaned by David Cohen, an enthusiastic collector of drawings of the period.

Several subjects originate from the years of the First World War, the history of which is another of David Cohen's major interests.

Man who took Hollywood to the East End

THE studio photographer who 'brought Hollywood to the East End' is the subject of an exhibition at the Museum of the Jewish East End next month.

It is a commemoration of the life and work of the distinguished East End photographer, Boris Bennett (1900-1985).

The exhibition runs from September 1 to 28 at the museum which is based in The Sternberg Centre, Manor House, East End Road, Finchley.

Boris was born in Poland and came to London in 1922. He set up his first studio at 150 Whitechapel Road with 6s 6d and although he had no formal training, he was an immediate success.

In 1933 he was able to buy and completely refurbish a former pub at 14 Whitechapel Road which became the well-known Boris Studio.

It is estimated that Boris took nearly 150,000 wedding photos

IT'S a busy time at Church Farm House Museum (see the London Sketch Club article) which has a second, more permanent exhibition on until the end of December.

Entitled 'English Cottage Glass', it focuses on the John Franks Collection, the most representative assembly of material of its kind to be shown in this country in recent years.

What is now most often referred to as cottage glass (other names are friggers or end-of-day glass) was produced throughout the Victorian era in styles which reflect, at a popular level, changing fashions in taste from the elaborateness of the Gothic through to the sinuous lines of Art Nouveau.

Unique

Created sometimes as apprentice pieces, or made by small glass works using up all the coloured glass left over from their main products (hence end-of-day), each one of the bowls, candlesticks, vases and jugs in this exhibition is unique, either in colour or shape.

Aimed originally at a working class market, cottage glass now gives us a fascinating insight into popular 19th century taste, although little is known about the exact places and dates of manufacture of cottage glass.

The exhibition is on now and ends on December 31. Admission is free, as always, and there is also a free catalogue available. For further details, tel: 203 0130.
