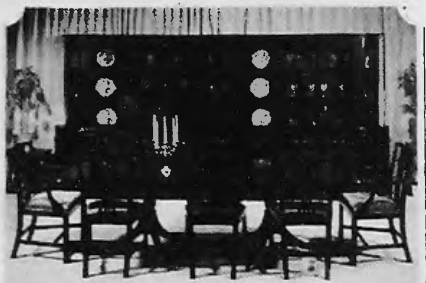

Community Charge in Barnet

The borough-wide canvass for the Community Charge Register begins early in June. Each household will receive a Registration Form which they must complete.

The Community Charge will come into effect in April 1990, replacing the domestic rates.

The Registration Office is at Hatchcroft, next to Hendon Fire Station, The Burroughs, NW4.

From Thursday, June 1, there will be a telephone 'Helpline' to deal with enquiries from the public. The 'Helpline' will be manned during office hours, Monday to Friday, and staff will be available to assist visitors at the office, Monday to Thursday, from 9am to 5.15pm and Fridays from 9am to 5pm.

For members of the public who are unable to visit or telephone within normal office hours, a telephone answering service will be available. The telephone 'Helpline' numbers are: 202 8282 extns 2800 and 2801 (Monday to Thursday 9am to 5.15pm, Friday 9am to 5pm); or 01-202 3990 outside office hours.

To help residents with any questions about the form, how it should be filled in, or about any aspects of the Community Charge itself, Barnet has arranged a series of public meetings throughout the borough. A team of professional officers, headed by Paul Ede, deputy director of Finance, will attend the meetings to talk about the charge and answer questions.

These are not political meetings and are intended solely to give advice and guidance to residents.

An information bus will tour the borough. Staff will be aboard to answer questions from the public on the community charge and on registration.

Information leaflets will be available on aspects of the Community Charge.

The bus will be out on Saturday mornings between 9.30am and 12.30pm. Look out for it at the following locations:

FIRE AT AVENUE HOUSE

FIRE broke out at Avenue House, Finchley, in the early hours of Monday, completely destroying the East Wing which included the drawing room and the laboratory where Finchley Society held the Stephens collection.

The building was bequeathed to the people of Finchley for community use. During the First World War it was used as a hospital and it was not until 1928 that it was opened for public use. When Finchley Council Offices were bombed in 1940 it became the meeting place for the Council.

This fine Victorian building is used extensively by the community with organisations such as the Finchley Old Peoples Welfare Committee and CRAB (Community and Recreational Arts in Barnet) having their headquarters there.

As well as the valuable collection held by the Finchley Society which included Stephens family memorabilia there were also records of the Hendon and District Archaeological Society which were destroyed.

Reporting to General Purposes Committee Max Caller, Barnet's chief executive, said it was a tragedy for local groups and for local history.

A structural check is being carried out on the whole building.



Apthorp Trust gift for Meadowside

A WING of Meadowside home for the elderly in Holden Road, North Finchley, has been converted into a specialised unit giving a family atmosphere for 12 people, thanks to a generous gift from the Milly Apthorp Trust.

Barnet Social Services Department presented Mrs Apthorp's son, John, with an illuminated scroll as a token of appreciation for grants, totalling about £100,000, from the Trust for schemes including the Meadowside project. A companion scroll commemorating the £35,000 grant for the new unit will hang on a wall at the home.

The Trust was founded by the Apthorp family who were, until recently, owners of Bejam stores. John Apthorp is a former Barnet councillor who represented Edgware Ward from 1968 to 1974. 'We have strong local connections and like to help the community,' he said.

Cllr Mrs Mamie Perry, chairman of the Social Services committee said other residential and day care centres had benefited from 'this generous and public-spirited family's concern to help the community.'

Meadowside's manager, Alan Clare, said: 'We want them to have a more family-like lifestyle with key staff who have chosen to work in this unit and provide continuity.'

The contract for the work was won

by Barnet's Direct Labour Organisation. 'They were very sensitive to the needs of a residential home and the people who were living here while work was going on,' he added. The extension has provided 12 single bedrooms, each individually furnished with a sitting room/dining area, domestic kitchen, bathroom, three toilets, laundry/utility room.

Residents are encouraged to bring small items of their own furniture to help them feel at home. The light, airy and comfortable lounge leads into a new enclosed garden area.

Four of the residents have been sponsored by Napsbury Hospital.

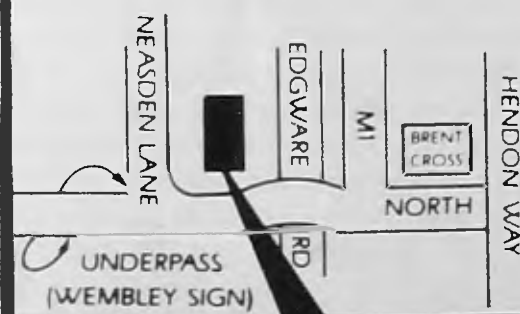
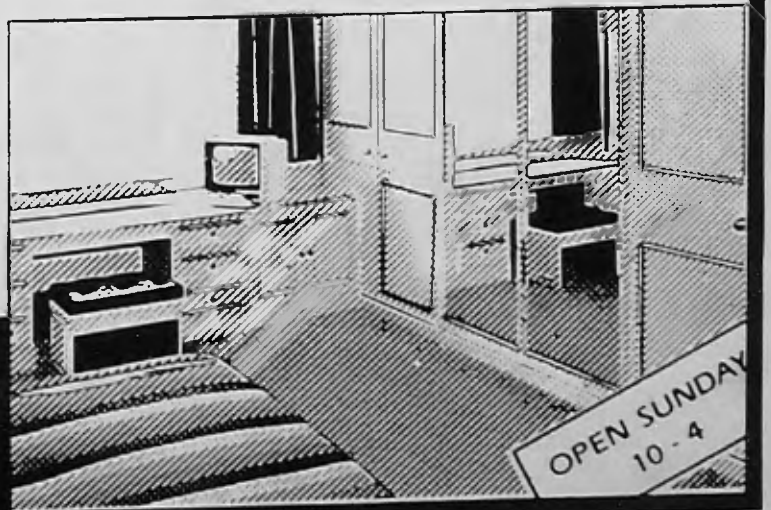

Fighting pollution at the Welsh Harp

The first oil and rubbish boom to be installed on one of Britain's natural water courses will be a vital weapon in the battle against pollution of the Welsh Harp and its wildlife.

A ceremony to unveil the new project at Silk Bridge, West Hendon, was hosted by the Welsh Harp Joint Consultative Committee and Barnet Council. The boom swung into action as buttons were simultaneously pressed by the Mayor of Barnet, Cllr Don Goodman and the Mayor of Brent, Cllr Harcharan Singh Wadhwa.

Cllr Tim Sims, chairman of the Joint Consultative Committee said: 'What better way to mark Environment Week than the inauguration of this screen. We have to be vigilant against pollution and this is a major step forward to conserve and protect this unique environmental area.' The benefits would be the enjoyment and protection of the area for present and future generations, he added.

Council funding

Alan Smith of the Thames Water Authority announced that the boom was a double first - the first in Britain on a natural water course and the first for land-drainage. The Authority designed and arranged the construction and installation of the boom free of charge, in addition to making a contribution towards the capital cost of the project.

Barnet and Brent Councils gave substantial funding to the scheme which also received grant aid of £10,000 from the Nature Conservancy Council and £5,000, presented by Carolyn Martin, from the Worldwide Fund for Nature. Guy English, on behalf of the Welsh Harp Sailing Association, one of the constituent organisations of the Welsh Harp Joint Consultative Committee, donated £500.

Maintenance of the installation will



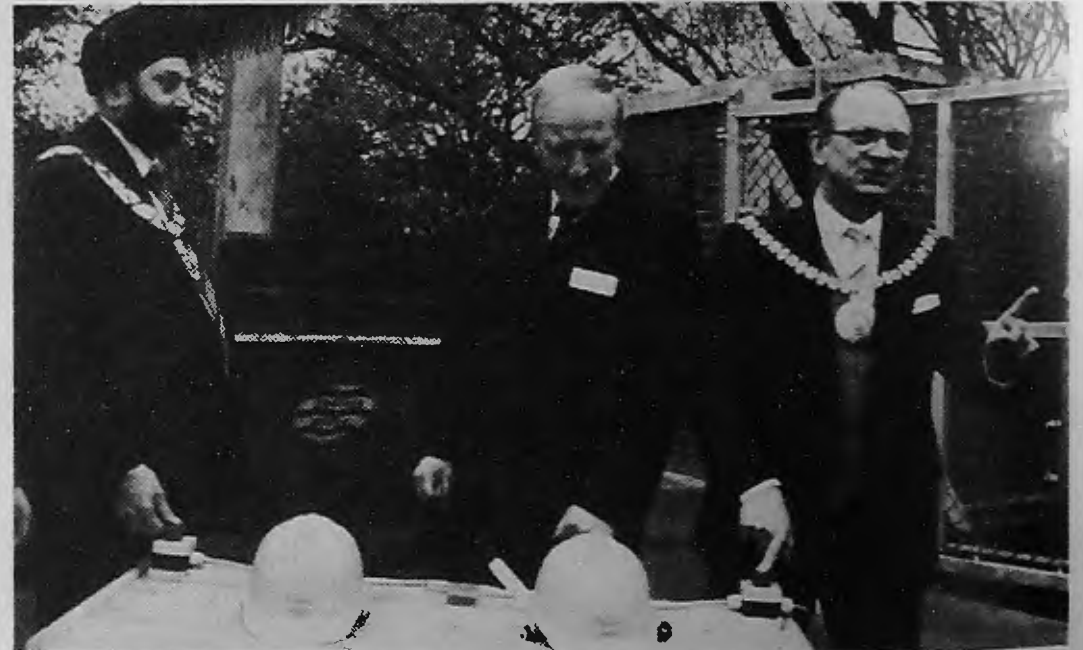

be carried out by Thames Water, who have agreed to pay 10 per cent of the annual costs, with the remainder being borne equally by Barnet and Brent Councils.

Agreement by Texas Homecare to allow access to the installation across their car park at The Hyde, West Hendon, was vital to the project as costs involved in providing access on the opposite bank would have been prohibitive. The boom was constructed by the Dutch firm, Interdrain. Building of bases, ramps and linking of the electricity supply was carried out by Pellen Construction Ltd of New Barnet.

Wide interest

The ceremony was attended by representatives of the construction firms involved in the project; members of sporting and conservation groups connected with the Welsh Harp; Cllr Victor Lyon, vice-chairman of the Joint Consultative Committee and chairman of Barnet's development



and estates committee; Neil Gill, Director of Education in Barnet; Andy O'Dell, manager of the Texas Homecare store at Silk Bridge; Barnet's Chief Executive and Town Clerk, Michael Bennett and officers from the recreation and leisure departments of both Brent and Barnet Councils.

Nature Notes for June

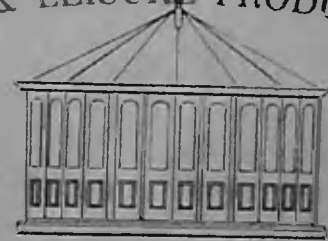
So often when observing wildlife and the countryside, we forget to consider its origins. Whilst some of our hedgerows may be remnants of former woodland, it is more likely that they have been planted in the past few hundred years. Similarly, our ponds may look 'natural', but originally they would have had a working use for livestock.

A large number of plants and animals which we regard as British, are not actually native to our shores. In fact there is a long history of alien species being introduced. The House Mouse was one of the earliest arrivals in the Iron Age, whilst the Romans may have been responsible for the presence of the Pheasant. Another batch of exotics were brought in by the Normans, including the now familiar rabbit. Other species are more recent newcomers, such as the Canada Goose (1660), Little Owl (1874) and Grey Squirrel (1876). Even goldfish can be found in some of our countryside ponds, although such releases are illegal under the Wildlife and Countryside Act.

Introductions of foreign wildlife have not been confined to animals. Many common plants - sycamore, horse chestnut, rhododendron for instance - originated from abroad. Even this winter, the London Borough of Barnet have planted exotic trees in prime wildlife sites at Hadley Green and along the Dollis Brook. So next time you're outdoors, take a closer look and consider the original homes of some of 'our' wildlife.

Barnet greets new Mayor

BARNET Councillors listened to a tale of struggle and romance at the Annual Meeting and Mayor Making on May 9.

The central character was born and grew up on a Council estate, her father was unemployed. She won a scholarship to grammar school, became head girl and was on the brink of going to university when the Second World War broke out.

Instead she took a job as a switchboard operator and began a friendship with the man who was to be her future husband, then an office boy.

Together they joined up. He went into the RAF with Bomber Command. She joined the WRENS. Fortunately they were posted near to each other and continued dating. In 1944, at the height of the V1 and V2 raids, they were married.

After the war he went into business for himself and she went to work to help pay the bills. But they prospered and today own a large suede and leather company.

This story was told by Cllr Jack Clarfelt about the new Mayor, Cllr Dot Benson and her husband and official Escort, Ron Benson. Cllr Clarfelt and Cllr Victor Usher proposed the New Mayor and paid tribute to her hard work, dedication and ability.

This year's Mayoral Appeal: A day centre for MIND in Barnet

The Mayor of Barnet has chosen a MIND in Barnet as the charity for her appeal, and in particular a project to build a day centre for people who suffer from or are recovering from a mental illness.

This is one of Barnet's most active voluntary organisations with more than 100 volunteers working to help people who have suffered from a mental illness and to help their families.

Mind in Barnet has been working locally for more than 25 years. They run a Thursday Club at 154 Station Road, Hendon, and a Sunday club at Etchingham Park Day Centre for between 40 and 50 members. They run

advice centres at Trinity Church, Golders Green, and they own a house in Schoolway, North Finchley, where lunch clubs are held and social groups meet. There is also an advice centre and counselling services.

But the exciting news is that Mind in Barnet want to open a purpose built Day Centre of their own and the Mayor's Appeal will give this project a boost which could turn dream into reality.

'I wanted to choose a project which would make an important contribution to our local community and I have always felt very close to the work which the members of Mind are doing,' the Mayor said when she announced her new appeal. 'These are local people, raising money locally for local families. And I know that not one penny of the money they raise goes in administration. They are doing essential work, giving support to families and helping people who have suffered from a mental illness to recover their confidence and independence.'

The officers of Mind in Barnet are well known local citizens. Mrs Mary Steinberger, a co-opted member of Social Services Committee, is the chairman of the Executive Committee and Jean Price, who has served on many Mayor's Appeal Committees is chairman of the fund raising committee on which Mr. Dennis Signy was founder chairman.

'I hope many local groups and individuals will help boost the fund - and have fun at the same time,' the Mayor said. 'This should be a community event and I look forward to the day we in Barnet will open our own centre for MIND, knowing that the generosity of local people has made it possible.'

Derek Buckman says Goodbye

DEREK Buckman, who as borough architect changed the whole concept of council housing in the London Borough of Barnet, retired in April.

Housing schemes which rivalled the private market were the result, schemes such as Booth Road, Colindale; Prospect Place sheltered housing in East Finchley; the shared ownership schemes in Mill Hill and Friem Barnet; and the new Rosa Freedman complex in Cricklewood.

He also led the team in designing the refurbishment of some of the older estates, where pitched roofs have replaced flat roofs and new landscaping has improved the environment.

When the Directorate of Technical Services was established in 1986, he

was appointed deputy director and controller of development services, with responsibility for architecture, building services, planning and property services.

To mark his retirement colleagues presented him with an illuminated vellum tracing his career with Barnet and Thames Water and his interest in the Scout movement. He also received golf clubs and bag.

Derek Buckman joined Barnet in 1965. 'I feel my whole career has been that of a social architect. I have always been involved with buildings which serve the community - schools, housing, community centres and elderly people's residences. I wanted a human scale in their design - places where people could feel comfortable and at home, where they could have privacy and dignity and I and my colleagues have always worked to achieve those goals. I hope we have succeeded,' he said.

'We have already installed many phones throughout the borough and to ensure that the phones are provided as quickly and helpfully as possible I am setting up a small group of trustees to deal with the final distribution of money.'

'I do want to thank all the people of Barnet who have donated so generously and a special "Thank you" to the appeal committee, particularly the chairman and secretary, Dennis and Pat Signy.'
