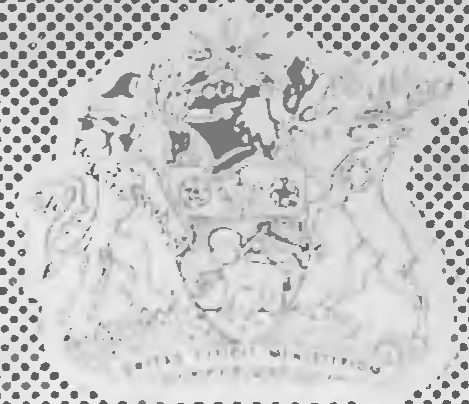

YOUR NEW RATE

Barnet Council, at its special rate meeting on March 13, set the new rate for 1980/81. Ratepayers in the borough will be paying 15p in the pound more than last year. The new rates are:

79p in the pound — increase 23.4 per cent

YOUR RATES

Facts and figures behind 15p in £ rise

ALL RATEPAYERS in the Borough of Barnet will be paying 15p in the pound more on their rates bill in 1980/81 as a result of the new rate set by Barnet Council at their special rates meeting on March 13.

Domestic ratepayers will pay 79p in the pound, an increase of 23.4 per cent; those in properties which have a mixed residential and commercial use will pay 88.5p in the pound, an increase of 20.4 per cent; and for commercial and industrial properties the rate is 97.5p in the pound, an increase of 18.2 per cent.

This means the average domestic ratepayer whose house has a rateable value of £380 will pay £300.20 a year which is £57 a year more than in 1979/80 and is equivalent to a weekly expenditure of £5.77.

Rising inflation, increased costs of wages and salaries and high interest rates were listed as the main causes of the rates rise, during the special council meeting.

Councillor Norman Hirshfield, chairman of the Finance Committee, said the Council were no more immune than any other member of the community from the effects of inflation.

They faced a choice between maintaining the same standard of services at a greatly increased cost or drastically pruning those services. Either measure would be equally unpopular with the ratepayers.

'On this occasion we have opted for the middle course of increasing the rate to what is considered to be an acceptable limit in present circumstances and of reducing some of the less essential services, particularly where revenue return is an indication in itself that there is no longer any great demand for the service

to be continued at its present level.

'We shall continue to review all the functions we at present carry out because what might have been considered essential or desirable in the past may no longer be the case today.'

He also referred to certain assets in the Council's ownership, such as pieces of land no longer needed for the purpose for which they were purchased, which could be sold for the benefit of ratepayers.

In his report to the Finance Committee, the Borough Treasurer, Mr. George Hopkins, surveyed the financial and political background to the setting of the new rate.

He recalled that the Government had called on local authorities to reduce expenditure by three per cent last year and had set this year's level of grants at four per cent below the original 1979/80 budgets. But with the expected increases in costs and pay this would mean a very considerable increase in the rates if services were to be kept at the same level, which was totally unacceptable to the Policy Advisory Committee.

In the circumstances the Policy Advisory Committee of the Council had called for further pruning of the estimates totalling approximately £2½ million.

Because there was no Government guidance on public expenditure levels beyond 1980/81 the forward plan, normally produced for a three year period, had been restricted to one year.

To maintain a balance between essential services development and a reasonable increase in the rates expenditure

DO YOU KNOW

In the financial year 1980-81 it is estimated that —

- It will cost £570 to educate one child at a primary school and £932 at a secondary school. At the beginning of this year there were 22,883 children at primary schools and 21,508 at secondary schools.
- 3,800 further education awards will be made for students at an average cost of £1,627.
- 6,000,000 school meals will be served during the year. The actual cost of a meal is 75p and the charge to pupils is 40p.
- 4,450,000 library books are expected to be issued. The net cost of the service for each of the borough's 297,200 residents will be £7.52.
- There are 27,000 lighting columns in the borough. The cost of looking after each column will be £26.19.
- There are 338½ miles of district roads in Barnet. The cost of maintenance and repair for each mile will be £6,700.
- 90,000 tons of refuse will be collected at an average cost of £28.48 a ton.
- The cost of maintaining parks, nurseries and open spaces will be £7.73 per head of population.

plans for the year had been restricted to three headings:

- Continuing projects.
- Essential or unavoidable developments.
- Developments designed to produce long term savings.

Because salaries and prices had risen more sharply than foreseen in the previous year there would have been an over-spending on the 1979/80 budget of over £2 million but for economies made during the year to meet Government demands.

This year it will cost £124 million to run the Borough of Barnet — that is £24 million more than last year, despite a pruning of estimates to the tune of £2 million.

A £5.8 million provision has been made to meet pay and price increases but the extent of pay awards is very uncertain.

The borough has a total loan debt of £150 million and the high rate of interest charges will mean finding an additional £2¼m from revenue.

As an overall figure for the whole country the Government grant paid to help local authorities maintain services is 61 per cent of budget. But Barnet, as an outer London Borough, only receives 52 per cent of its net expenditure.

Government grant

So this year Government will provide £42 million by way of rate support grant. Housing and other subsidies amount to £16 million and rents and charges for services bring in £28 million. And that leaves £38 million to be found from the rates.

Not all of this is required by the Borough of Barnet.

The Greater London Council and the Metropolitan Police raise their money through a precept from each local authority in their area.

This year Barnet will contribute nearly £12 million to the GLC — that is 20.6p in the pound — and £7.3 million to the Metropolitan Police — 12.7p in the pound.

The difference between the rate charged to industrial and commercial property owners and that charged to domestic ratepayers is made up from a grant from the Government. This year the grant has not increased so this is why, although all ratepayers will pay an extra 15p in the pound, the percentage increase for domestic ratepayers is higher.

A penny rate in the borough raises just over half a million pounds — £577,000 to be precise. This year we are going to

draw from the borough's general rate fund balance the sum of £960,000 which will leave a balance of just over £2 million in these reserves.

In his report Mr. Hopkins concludes: 'The rate increase is the highest since the inception of the borough in 1965 and comes despite economies of £2½ million to be made in 1980/81, and a further £1 million of savings made in 1979/80.'

The reason for the 15p in the pound increases can be summarised as:

GLC precept Up 2p in the £

Metropolitan Police Up 2.4p in the £
Loss of Government rate support grant in real terms . . . 1p in the £
Lower appropriation from bal-

ances 2.2p in the £

Increased pay and prices 7.4p in the £
So the increase that Barnet is asking ratepayers to find is an extra 10.6p in the pound for the running and administration of the borough.

VOLUNTEERS IN ACTION

THE NAME VOLUNTEER dates back to 1600 and was a strictly military term for those who served their country willingly and usually without pay. Today it applies to another army whose recruits are young and old, men and women from all walks of life and with skills that range from legal and accountancy qualifications to the gift of friendship and an ability to listen to those who need someone to care.

In Barnet it really is a vital force — a regiment of local people who give their time and skills in the service of others. And like all armies it has a recruiting centre.

Barnet Volunteer Bureau was formed five years ago and today has 2,500 volunteers on its books, working with 280 organisations within the borough. These organisations include the statutory authorities such as Barnet Social Services, the Area Health Authority, and local societies and branches of national charities.

The Bureau has two main purposes: to work with local organisations in an advisory capacity, and to act as a clearing house, placing volunteers with the

organisation and in the type of work which will make the best use of their time and abilities and give them the most job or service satisfaction.

Headquarters for the bureau is the ground floor of a converted house at 275 Regents Park Road, Finchley, which is manned from 10 am to 5 pm on week-days with evening sessions by arrangement. In charge is the organiser, Sue Barnet with two part-time assistants, Anne Webster and Olga Deaner, and 10 volunteers who take it in turns to help with the Emergency Register, driving jobs and sometimes interviewing, after taking a training course.

Volunteers come forward in all shapes

and sizes. For instance, last year five recruits were only 13 years old while three were over 75. But they have one thing in common — they want to serve the community.

Programmes on television have brought to the attention of many residents the opportunities there are for helping in a thousand different ways, and there is a greater awareness among the public.

Even so the shortage of volunteers in many areas means that the voluntary associations are undermanned. Often it is the simple services which are most needed — shopping, visiting, and 'granny-sitting'. Car drivers who can take people to centres and hospitals are always in short supply. One of the big problems today is the fact that more and more women are returning to full-time work and can no longer undertake the voluntary duties they carried out when they were housewives.

But for those who can spare a little time in the service of the community the Barnet Volunteer Bureau is an obvious place to call.

Every prospective volunteer calls into the office for an informal chat to find out not only the type of work they would

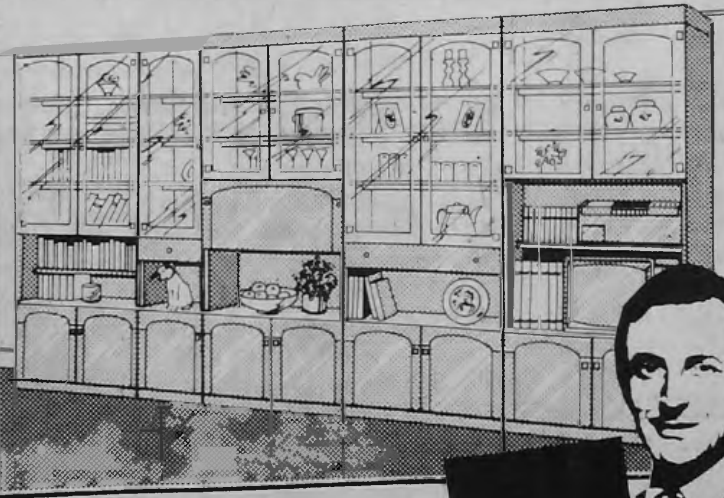

be best at, but also the type of organisation which will give them the most satisfaction.

Some prefer working with a young, socially aware group. Others may prefer a more established organisation. Some have specialist skills to contribute. Others don't even know if they can be of use or how they can help.

There is a place for everyone. There is a need for those with skills to teach them in clubs or centres. There is the need for just a friendly personality to go visiting the elderly or housebound. Accountants and zoologists, housewives and handymen, drivers and dishwashers, telephonists and typists — all are needed.

At the end of the discussion the organisation which should best suit the volunteer is contacted and the two are put in touch.

After that it is up to the organisation, be it statutory service or charity group, to help the volunteers fit into their new jobs.

But the Volunteer Bureau does follow up each placement just to make sure things are going well, and although most volunteers fit happily into their new organisation, some find the work unsatisfying and return to the Volunteer Bureau for a new placing.

Others feel a need for a change after a few years and ask the Volunteer Bureau to redirect them. It all adds up to a lot of work for the small team at Regents Park Road. But they feel it is well worthwhile.

As Sue Barnet explains: 'Volunteers are not expected to take over the work of full-time social workers and health officers. We need them to add a dimension of quality of life to the statutory services already offered.'

Small services

'Often the paid health visitors see a service which needs doing when they go round to their patients. But because they are overstretched already they cannot offer to get the shopping, or sit with a disabled relative to give other members of the household a break from their duties.'

'And social workers know of small services which, if carried out could make all the difference in the life of a young mother coping on her own or an elderly person, living alone and wanting to stay independent but finding things increasingly difficult.'

'We have been warned that with the cuts in local government spending there will be even less money available to spend on the things which make such a difference to the quality of life, and this is the very area where volunteers can be of great use.'

The third line of work undertaken by the Bureau is sometimes the most time consuming — keeping up-to-date with new ideas, new legislation and new

developments. They are helped in this by The Volunteer Centre who act as a national information centre.

Experience

Sue's own experience in working in the field of social and voluntary work stands her in good stead in this activity. At the age of 18 she became a voluntary leader in a youth club and then joined the London headquarters of the National Association of Youth Clubs, working with adolescents.

Later she joined the Family Planning Association and nearly three years ago she took charge of the Barnet Volunteer Bureau.

The Bureau is a registered charity, funded by grant from Barnet Council. No charge is made to the volunteers or the user organisation.

A gala feast of sport

ONE OF THE BIGGEST sporting events in the London calendar will be taking place at Barnet Copthall Stadium from Friday to Sunday, June 13, 14 and 15. It is the Barnet Sports Gala which attracts more than 2,500 competitors and this year offers an even more varied programme than ever.

The list of sporting events is almost endless! The Southern Counties AAA will be holding the veterans' event which attracts many well known athletes of former years and this year there is also to be a young athletes competition for up and coming contenders.

Children's sports

Then there are children's sports, archery, cricket, seven-a-side rugby, six-a-side football, Gaelic games, a fun run and all those previously mentioned.

Some events are open to anyone to enter, others are invitation competitions of high standing.

Bring back the local 'Bobby'

I was interested to read the letter on hooliganism in the February issue of Civic News.

While I agree in principle with what you say, we are not professional crime detectors and cannot be expected to mount the vigilante patrols which are really needed to deal with the ever-increasing acts of hooliganism. This is the job of the local police force which we, as ratepayers, pay for and whose protection we are entitled to expect.

Unfortunately, the policy of deploying local police on to national matters such as strikes, demonstrations and terrorism has left the local force very depleted in numbers.

My house has been subjected to stone-throwing by hooligans twice within one week recently. I have reported the incidents to the Mill Hill Police Station and have had discussions with the officers there. It is quite obvious that they have an almost impossible task in keeping law and order locally, so few are they in numbers. I have had to resort to keeping my own watch at home at nights, a task which the police agree should be theirs, not mine.

I feel that it is about time a national police force was formed to deal with national matters such as those I have mentioned above, leaving the local 'Bobby' to look after the area in which he is far more interested. After all, why should a policeman from Mill Hill have to risk his life keeping law and order in Yorkshire?

I would very much like to know from you what we can do about this present policy.

The Police, however, rely to a great extent on the goodwill and co-operation of the public to carry out their work more effectively. We will answer any calls with respect to vandalism and we are also assisted in this task by members of the public who volunteer to become Special Constables and their assistance is of great value to the force.

I do not feel, however, that I can usefully comment in a few words on the complex question of a national police force which is, of course, a matter for Government decision.

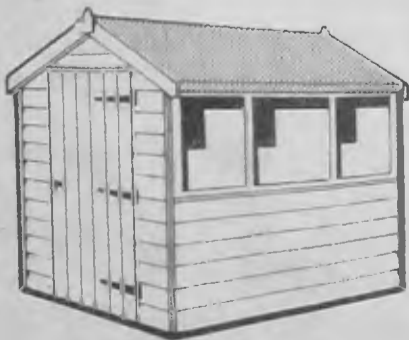

'Get this place looking a bit brighter' was the general response. And from that grew the idea of painting the walls with a jungle scene.

The first job was to paint the walls with a white base coat which was then marked out in one foot squares. Then the decor scheme was plotted by the members, with a little help from Mary, and the club leaders, and the members took up their brushes and got to work.

Two of the walls were ready by the time the club room was officially opened in October and now the whole project is virtually complete.

There's a 35-ft crocodile crawling round one wall, and a life-size tiger climbing out of a tree on another. Monkeys run up coconut palms, a kangaroo leaps towards a fluttering Union Jack, and a whole forest of cacti grows between them.

With the white background the colours stand out like a rainbow and give the whole basement a sense of life and drama.

A six-foot wide pizza is painted over the snack bar and the counter of the servery has a very special significance for the members.

Jack Davies, club leader, explains: 'We let all the members paint a brick and so they all feel they have contributed to the club. We even had kids from other clubs come in and want to paint bricks — but we had to tell them this was our club and our bricks. Go paint your own.'

'Since the club has been decorated there has been no writing on walls and

the project has involved us all. It has certainly cheered us all up,' he said.

The club already has 120 members from eight to 18. It is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and Saturday mornings, and meetings include visits to ice skating rinks, camping holidays and rambling.

Now the club have been given the use of a small piece of land to use as an outdoor five-a-side football pitch and are planning to carry out some of the work needed themselves under the direction of council officers.

Your Councillors

CHILDS HILL

Childs Hill is a ward of contrasts, taking in the bustling and industrial northern end of Cricklewood and the residential area bordering Golders Green and Hampstead Garden Suburb. It has a cosmopolitan population including two very active residents' associations in the Cricklewood area.



COUNCILLOR BRIAN JARMAN, vice-chairman of the Education committee, has lived in Hendon all his life. As a child he attended Algernon Road School and he takes a great interest in the history and environment of the borough.

In recent months he has been closely involved in the consultation exercise carried out to test public reaction to the idea of merging seven secondary schools. It has his resolution, accepted by the full Education Committee, that expressed the council's policy not to go ahead with the mergers.

He was elected to the Council in 1970, in a by-election. At that time he was chairman of the Hendon South Conservative Association.

He lost the seat in 1974 and regained it in 1978. But all the time he remained on the Education Committee, serving either as an elected or a co-opted member. He is vice-chairman of the governors of Whitefields School and chairman of the managers of the Childs Hill and Golders Green Primary Schools group. He also serves on the Town Planning and Research Committee.

Like many local residents he faces the tiring day of the commuter — he is a legal executive with a City firm of solicitors, but he still finds time for a wide range of interests. He is chairman of Hendon and District Archaeological Society, having a particular interest in history and he is chairman of Abbeyfield, Finchley, which provides sheltered housing for the elderly.

He is also chairman of the Overseas Students Friendship Association which offers help and the opportunity for social gatherings to students from abroad.



COUNCILLOR VICTOR LYON, B.A., has served on three different local authorities in succession. He first joined Hampstead Council in 1959. Then, under local government reorganisation, it became part of the London Borough of Camden, of which he was a Member until 1971. He moved his home from Hampstead to Childs Hill in 1967 and was elected to Barnet Council in 1978.

His service stems from a keen sense of local interest and local involvement. One of his major interests is English history, particularly local history. When studying on an Open University Course he took 'the attitude of the Hendon Local Authority towards poverty and social policy 1929-1932', as one of his projects.

He serves on three major Council committees, Establishment, Libraries and Arts, and Finance. His professional experience as a personnel manager with the Thomson Organisation, in their scientific and technical publications division, is valuable on Council work.

He and his wife, with their teenage son and daughter, are closely involved in local life. The son attended Hendon School and the daughter is at Copthall. Councillor Lyon is a manager of four local primary schools, a Governor of Grahame Park School and of Hampstead School.

He also serves on the house committee of Derwent House, a day centre and short-stay residential home for the elderly in Hendon.

He welcomes the formation of a 'Cricklewood Society' to help forge a sense of identity for people living and working in the area and is active in the work of the Tenants' Association of Westcroft Estate.

All this leaves 'little time for outside interests, but he does cherish his MCC membership.



COUNCILLOR ALFRED YOUNG began his service in local government 20 years ago, when, at 27, he was the youngest member of the former Hendon Borough Council.

He was elected to Barnet Council on its formation, but in 1968 he decided not to stand for re-election because of the growing pressures of family and business. However, he returned to the Council in 1974.

A solicitor by profession, he takes a great interest in town planning and land development, and has been chairman of the Town Planning and Research Committee since 1976.

'I have always taken a lively interest in town planning and I believe that we as a council should allow reasonable development to take place as long as it comes within the guidelines laid down by the planning committee. We need to recognise that things do not stand still. There is going to be development and it is up to us as a Council to make sure that what is planned and built is right for the borough and its residents,' Councillor Young said.

He also serves on the Development and Estates Committee and on the General Purposes Committee. But during his years of service on these two Councils he has been a member of almost every main committee.

He is also a governor of the Hasmonean Boys' School.

A keen golfer he has played for the London Boroughs' Association and finds the sport provides exercise and relaxation.

He and his wife have three children. Their eldest daughter, who is 17, is at present studying for her 'A' levels at Henrietta Barnett School.

HOSPITAL APPEAL REJECTED

THE SECRETARY OF STATE for the Environment has refused permission for a private hospital and health clinic to be built on green belt land at Bury Farm, Edgwarebury Lane, Edgware.

This decision follows an appeal by Park Private Hospital, a Hornsey-based company, against Barnet Council's decision to refuse planning permission for the 99-bed hospital and 100-room clinic with a swimming pool, roads and parking area, planned for the 16-acre site.

The appeal was heard at a local enquiry, held at the Town Hall, Hendon, last autumn.

Although the Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State considered there was some merit in the proposed development he considered that its virtues did not outweigh the defects which he considered were rather too serious to allow the appeal. His conclusions were upheld by the Secretary of State.

MUMS AND DADS

John comes to stay

BEWILDERED and distressed, his belongings in a brown carrier bag, John came to stay with us for three weeks to give his mother time to get herself together and cope with him again. That was four years ago — John is still with us.

It was about five years ago that we started to foster children on a short-term basis. John was one of them. I met him and his family when, as a volunteer, I helped at a social club for people who suffered from mental illness. His mother went there with her three children.

At one time his mother was in a particularly bad way. She took an overdose, and the children called an ambulance. She was taken to hospital and the children to a children's home. A few days later, much recovered, she took two of her children home but left John behind.

John is deaf. As far as one can tell he has never heard anything — speech, music or laughter. It was difficult to comfort a ten-year-old who had been openly neglected by his family. He couldn't hear us and covered this fact with his hands so that he could not see us trying to communicate with him. All we could do was cuddle him.

Apart from his deafness, John was deprived materially and emotionally but, surprisingly, he soon seemed to settle in. He was delighted with his clean clothes, warm bed, a chance to play, good food and, above all, our interest in him.

I can hardly remember how we communicated with John in those early days but somehow we did. At first he needed the visual stimulation of television but his dependence on it has decreased over the years as he began to enjoy games of ludo and cards, and now chess and backgammon.

John still has no speech. He makes a lot of noise and weird sounds while 'talking'. Homework was difficult and resulted in tantrums of frustration. He had no idea about written English, unable to connect it with speech, his own actions or life around him. Worried, we began to look at how deaf children are educated and for a way of communicating with John.

Volunteer

Social Services found a volunteer to come to our home once a week to teach us the deaf sign language. It was a struggle for John and within weeks we had covered his limited vocabulary. But we continued classes at college and now our sign vocabulary is very large. We can 'talk' with John on any subject in a simplified way and his frustrations have lessened considerably.

Our own children, born since John came to us, love him and, at a young age, are learning signs. John is learning from them too — about child development and, even more, about

normal family life. His skill at mime makes him a superb playmate. He builds houses for them, helps them with puzzles and even 'reads' to them.

Relationships with John's mother and her other children are fairly good but there have been tensions. It must be hard for her to see him doing so well in another family but gradually she is accepting that John is 'better off' now and I feel she resents us less. John used to visit them with reluctance, now he is happier knowing that once back with us he can talk and be understood.

Deafness is a severe handicap causing many problems and deprivations. But deafness is only one part of John. In all other respects he is now a normal child, happy, well balanced, with a sense of humour and interested in the world about him. Above all, he is a loving and loved member of our family.

ACTION AGAINST PAVEMENT PARKERS

BARNET COUNCIL is to take action against drivers who park their vehicles on the pavements, causing obstruction and even danger to pedestrians.

The first step will be to put up notices in certain roads where such parking is particularly blatant. If drivers persist in ignoring the notices then prosecutions will follow.

This action is the result of a decision by the council's Public Works Committee in January to make an effort to end pavement parking in areas where it is a real problem.

Mr. Alan Stringer, Borough Engineer and Surveyor, explains: 'Our pavements were not built to stand up to cars being parked on them. Cars which are parked with two wheels — and sometimes even all four wheels — on the pavements obstruct pedestrians who have the right to be able to walk in safety. Sometimes mothers with prams are forced to detour into the road because cars are blocking the footpath. Also cars parked in this way are a particular danger to blind people and disabled people and of course the danger is aggravated in fog.'

'Cars parking on paving stones crack them and this leads to dangerously uneven footpaths which cost the borough hundreds of pounds in additional maintenance.'

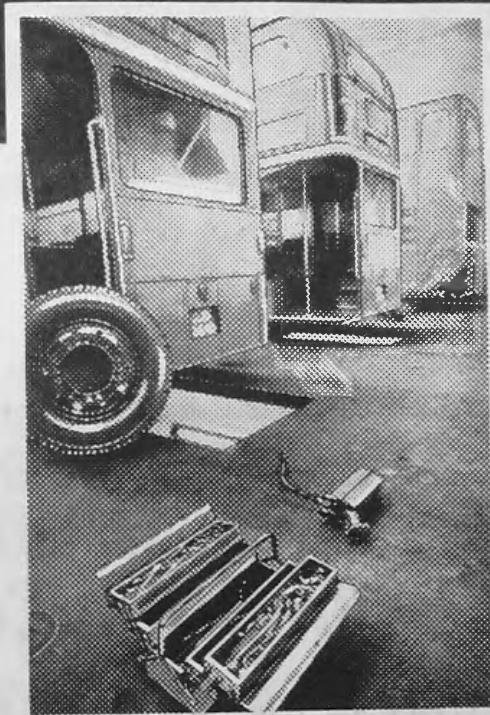

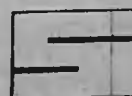
