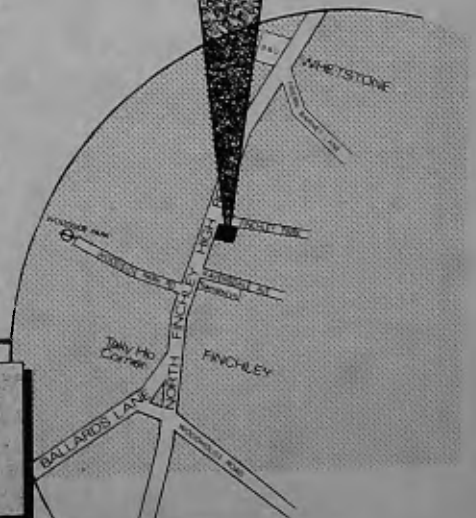

## Council Christmas Closures

BARNET Council's main office buildings will be closed over the Christmas/New Year holiday from 5pm on Friday, December 23 until 9am on Tuesday, January 3.

During this period an emergency service will be maintained and can be contacted on 202 8282. Residents are asked not to use this service unless their call is a genuine emergency.

### Libraries

Libraries and Church Farm House Museum will be closed from Saturday, December 24 until normal opening times on Thursday, December 29. They will close for New Year at 1pm on Saturday, December 31 until normal opening times on Tuesday, January 3.

### Copthall Pools

The pool will close at 4.30pm on Friday, December 23 and re-open at 9am on Wednesday, December 28. From Wednesday through to Saturday, December 31 the pool will be open 9am to 4.30pm with an Early Bird session for ticket holders only at 7am to 8.30am.

On Sunday, January 1, the pool will be open 8am to 11am, and on Monday, January 2 (Bank Holiday) the pool will open 9am to 4.30pm. From Tuesday, January 3 the pool will be open normal hours, 9am to 9.30pm with Early Birds at 7am.

Squires Lane pool will close at 4pm on Friday, December 23 and reopen on Monday, January 2. On New Year Bank Holiday it will close at 4pm and resume normal opening hours, 8am to 8pm from Tuesday, January 3.

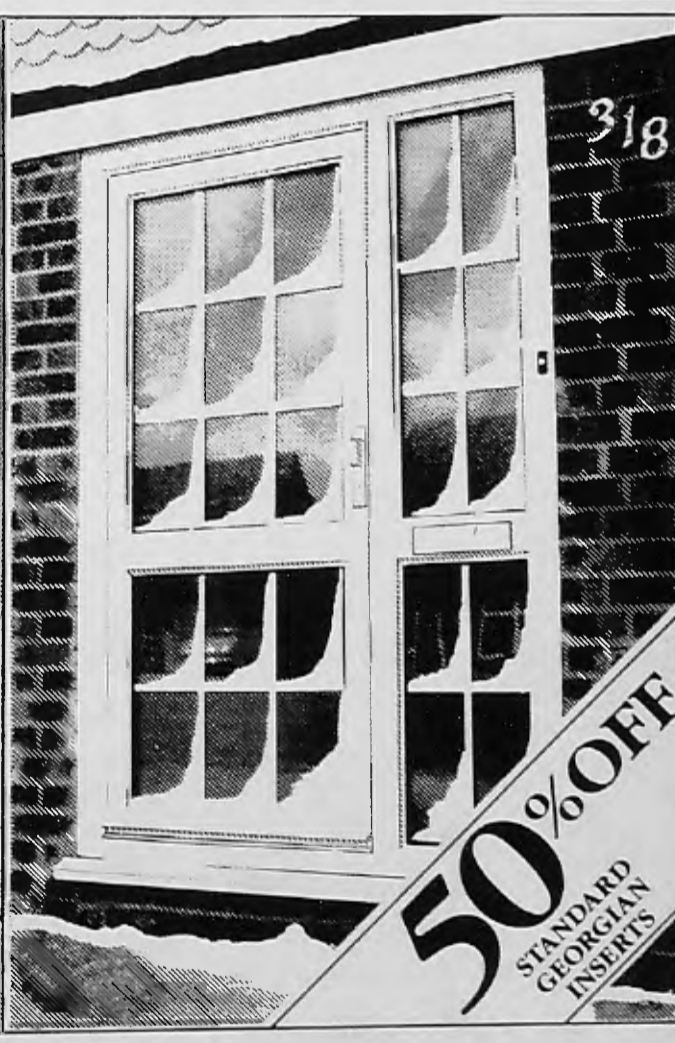
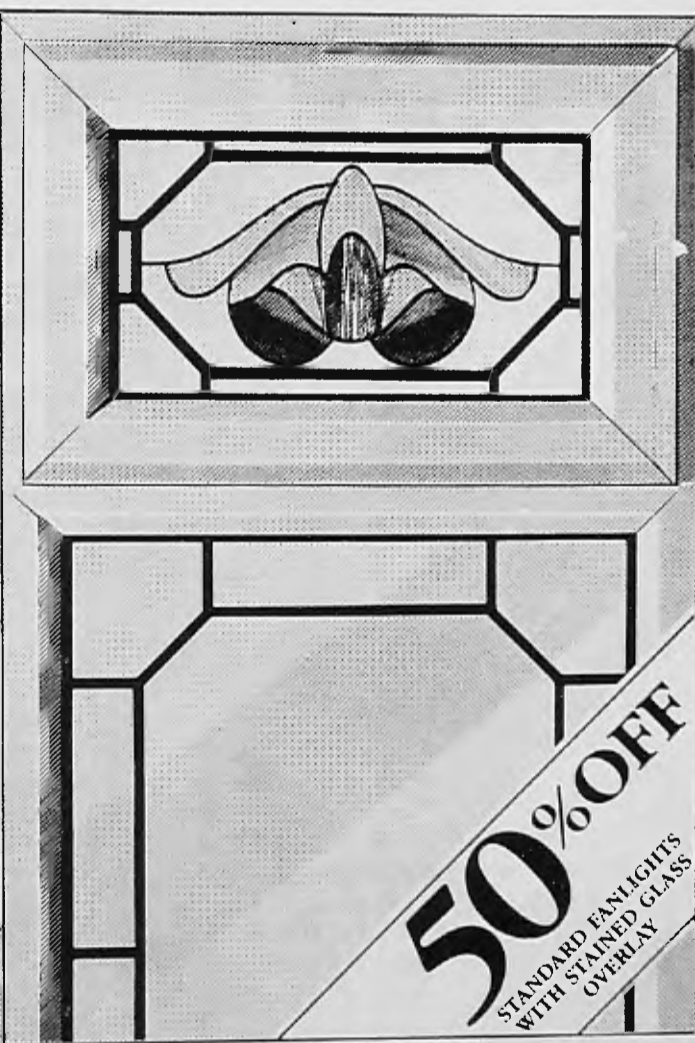
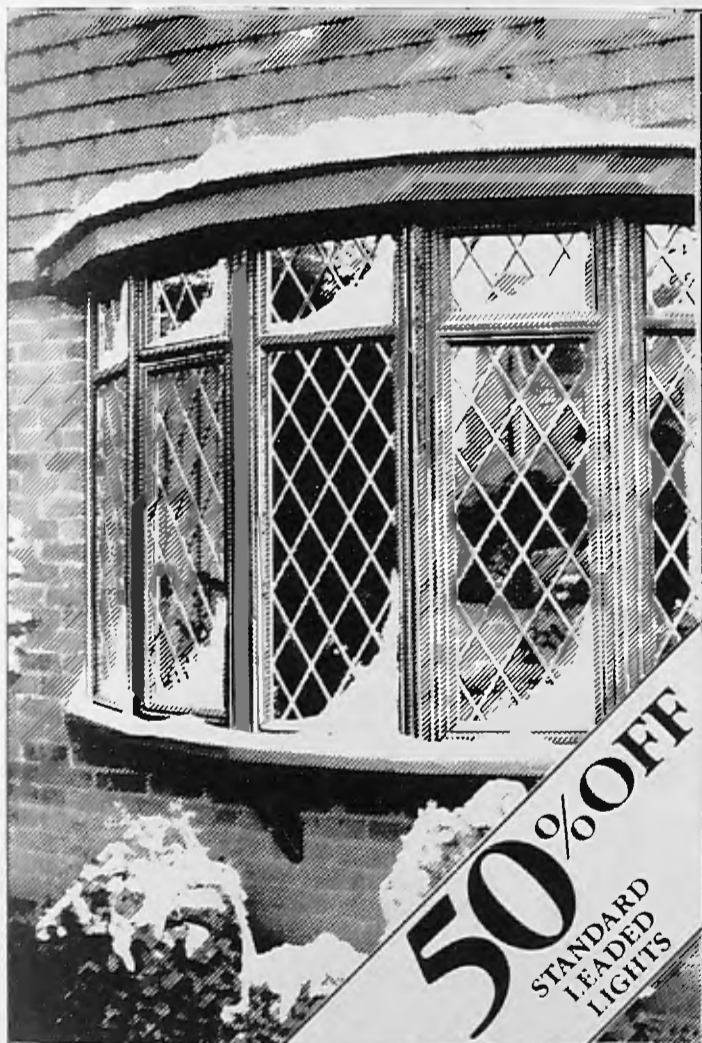

## NOW WE HAZZ JAZZ!

BARNET'S first jazz project for young people has hit the right note and led to the formation of the Borough's own Big Band.

The project, financially aided by the Musicians' Union and Greater London Arts, swung into action in September when students, aged 11 to 17, began meeting weekly in the early evening, at Moss Hall Junior School, Nether Street, Finchley.

Under the musical guidance of Dave Milsted and Steve Watts from Barnet's Education Department, the strains of such standards as Splanky, Lady Blue and the popular Dizzie Gillespie/Charlie Parker number Anthropology, fill the

school hall with the Barnet sound.

A former pupil of Mill Hill County High School, now reading music at Oxford, has written a work entitled Saturnalia especially for Barnet's Big Band.

Students from a variety of schools including Queen Elizabeth's Boys and Queen Elizabeth's Girls, Barnet; Christ's College, Finchley and East Barnet School, New Barnet, are combining their talents in this exciting project.

Mr Milsted said: 'I have tried to set up a working ensemble that can cater for a wide age-range, use a varied selection of instruments and play a number of styles of jazz from

standard to contemporary.'

'Within this group we can explore the areas of rhythm, harmony, balance, style and improvisation that make jazz such an exciting field of music.'

'This is a one-term project with a view to considerable expansion to cater for a larger and more varied selection of players and participants.'

## Etchings from East Anglia

PEACE and tranquility are the themes of etchings by Jan Dingle, whose exhibition runs at the Dollisfield Gallery, Totteridge Library, N20 until December 17.

Summers spent cruising on the family's wind boat along the Norfolk Broads gave Jan the inspiration to capture the detailed images of river banks and fens, meadows and cornfields.

Visitors to the exhibition can buy Jan's work and may find it the ideal time to select Christmas gifts. Prices range for framed etchings from £18 to £75 and unframed from £10.50 to £48.

To create the coloured images on show, Jan uses two copper plates and several processes or 'states'. Eventually, once etched, the finished plates are inked in different colours in various areas and printed on a press to create the finished work. During the exhibition Jan will be demonstrating her work by etching plates.

'I feel that as an artist I record the landscape which I have come to love,' she said.

The exhibition is open Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10am to 1pm and 2pm to 8pm, Fridays from 10am to 1pm, 2pm to 5.30pm and Saturdays 10am to 1pm, 2pm to 4pm.

## Beware bargain sales

STAY away from one-off bargain sales is the warning from Barnet's Trading Standards staff after an evening sale in Mill Hill last month.

Prompt action by a local resident and Barnet's Trading Standards officers led to Londonwide publicity on television about a sale held at Hartley Hall, Mill Hill. The programme underlined the difficulty of getting a fair deal from the organisers of such sales.

Any resident who receives a leaflet through their door or sees a poster advertising such a sale, usually held on one evening, should contact the Trading Standards Department on 202 8282.

Trading Standards officer, Andy Bishop, warns that these types of sales are likely to increase as Christmas approaches. 'People turn up to find the stuff set up on stage and there will be an 'auctioneer' and several helpers. All the stuff is worthless junk.'

### Misleading

Mr Bishop said: 'They entertain people, whip up enthusiasm, mislead people and get them into a frenzy so they will part with their

money. People are encouraged to buy the goods, which are often wrapped up and when they get home, they find they are rubbish.

'If you try to complain at the time, you are quickly shown the door or given a false name and address. On one occasion a false company name and a false registered company address was given in East Barnet Road. It turned out to be a public toilet.'

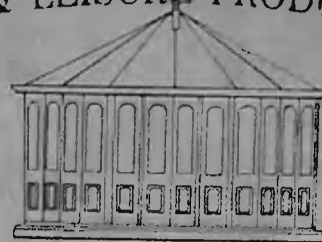
He also warns owners of venues such as community halls to be on the look-out for this type of event. 'If anyone who owns such a hall would like advice before accepting a booking, telephone Trading Standards. We are there to help,' he said.

<答> 日本の図書館は、本の貸出し、閲覧設備の提供につきますが、それというのも地方自治体の役所が、福祉、学校、情報、相談などの総合的市民サービスに直接携わっているからです。一方英国では、行政体系の機能分化が明確で、生活に密着した情報提供はすべて図書館が一手に引き受けていますので、市民の利用度も高くなっています。

バーネットには、全部で17の公立図書館があります。一般書籍の貸出し、閲覧施設が無料で利用できるのをはじめ、有料ながら、レコードやテープの貸出しも受けられます。一般情報(社会福祉、各種行事、スポーツ文化活動など)に関するパンフレットや散らしも豊富に揃っています。また、バーネットの図書館では、文化活動の直接企画もあり、定期的なものとしては夜間の公演会や子供のお話しの時間が計画されています。本の貸出しを受けるには、メンバー登録が必要です。住所を明記してある身分証明書(外国人登録証や運転免許証)を提示して、申込書に必要事項を書き込めば、その場で会員証を発行してくれます。提供サービスや会館時間は場所により差がありますので詳細につきましては、お近くの図書館でお確かめください。

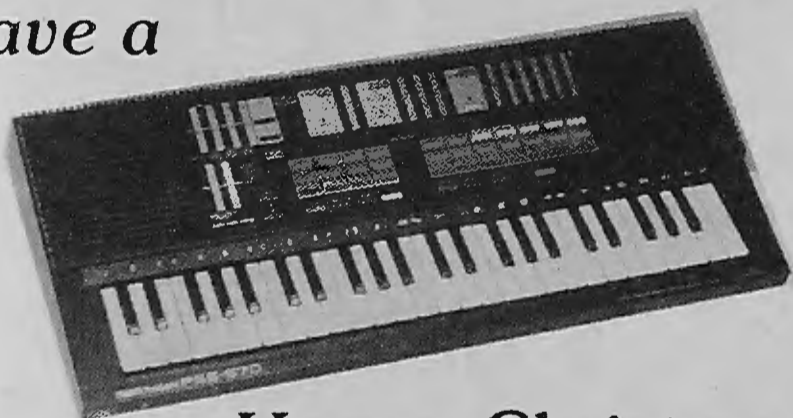

## Mrs Thatcher sets school on a new foundation

FOR more than a century St. Mary's Church of England School has sheltered close to the church in Regents Park Road, Finchley. Sadly, time has had its effect on the school buildings and for many years the need for a new school has been felt.

Barnet Council gave the project the highest priority — and now there is the first concrete evidence of the new school building in Dollis Park Finchley. The Prime Minister, who as MP for Finchley has taken a personal interest in the school, laid the foundation stone on Friday, October 28.

### Proud tradition

'You are pupils of a wonderful school,' she told the children. 'Your school has a proud tradition and everyone wants to send their children to St. Mary's. You have had to wait a long time for your new school but you will feel happier and happier as you see this building rising from its new foundations.'

Among those at the ceremony was the head teacher. Mrs Gladys Vandy, the chairman of governors, Dr John Harvey, Councillors Barbara Langstone and Miles Golding, and Mr Neil Gill, Director of Education.

The new St. Mary's will have 420 pupils aged five to 11 with a separate nursery unit for 52 children. It will be open in summer 1990.

In an energy conscious design, the architects, Phippen, Randall and Parkes, have planned the school around a central glazed atrium. The buildings with brick walls and tiled roof will fit comfortably into the environment. A treelined strip will provide a nature study area.

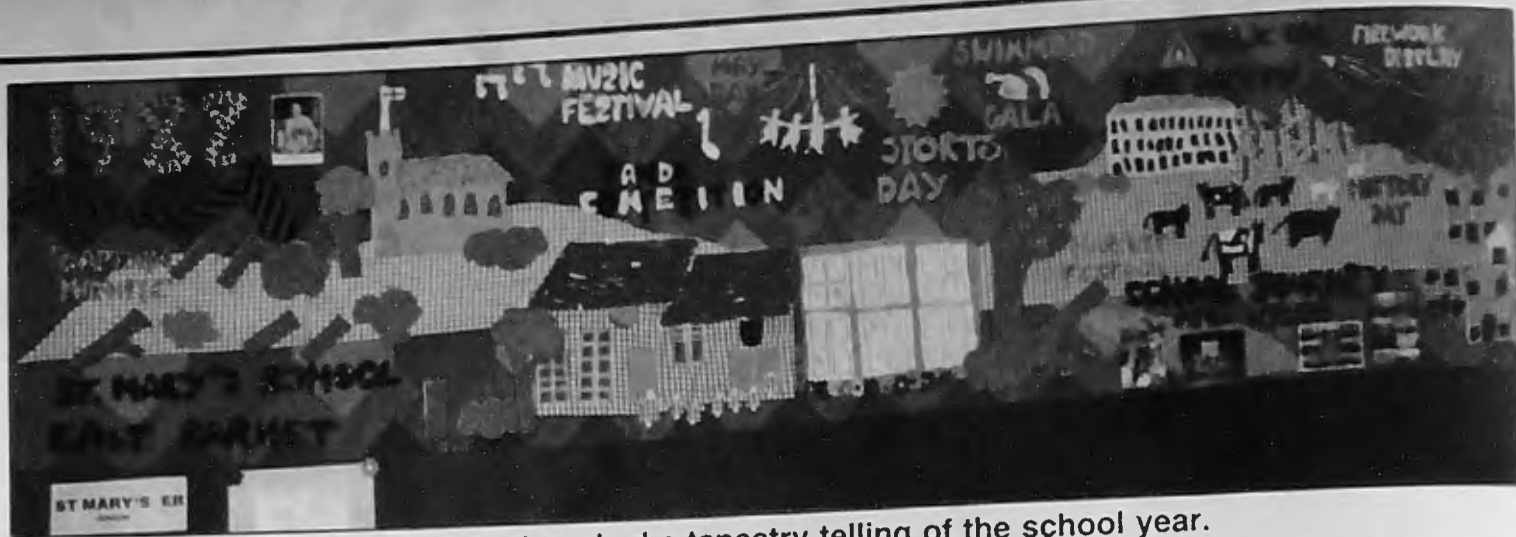

### TEN LE CLIC TIPS

Taking pictures can be a snap with today's aim-and-shoot cameras. The following tips can make the difference between taking good and great photos.

1. Keep your hands steady and elbows tucked in as you press the shutter button. Keeping your elbows close to your body will help steady your hands, and the camera, and give you sharp, clear pictures.

2. Stand at least five feet away from your subject. Being too close will cause the image to blur and will prevent you from 'framing' your subject.

3. When outdoors, try to shoot the picture with the sun at your back. Also, avoid shaded areas that will cause shadows or cover up your subject. Indoors, place your subject close to a background; do not shoot into the middle of a large room — and don't forget the flash!

4. Whenever possible, include people in the picture. This will make a more exciting, personal photo and remind you for years to come about all those interesting scenes and people you saw or met.

5. Focus on a small group or part of a scene for each photo. If you try to get too much into each picture, most of it will be lost and the photo will be confusing.

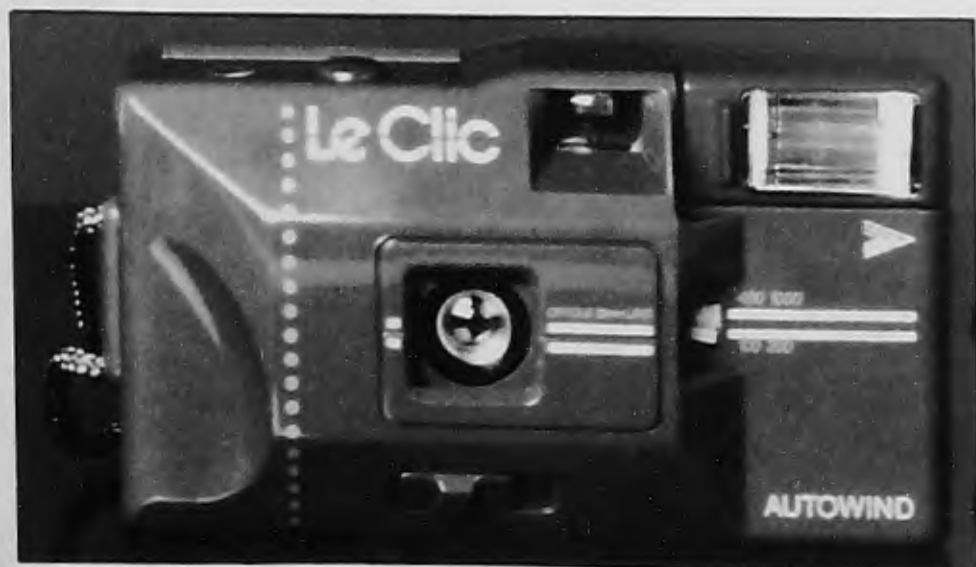
6. Do not hold your finger on the shutter button while advancing the film or the mechanism may jam and cause double-exposure.

7. After shooting your last photo, gently advance the film until it stops. If you try to force it, something — including the film — may break.

8. Never leave your camera or film in the boot, glove compartment or on the rear window of your car. Direct sunlight and high temperatures could have an adverse effect on the quality of the film.

9. Clean the lens or your camera with special lens cleaners. Never use chemicals or other cleaning agents because they may scratch the lens and leave marks on your photos.

10. Avoid getting your camera wet. If you're caught in the rain or you're on a boat or at the beach, keep your camera in a weather-proof case, or get the new Tuff 35 all-weather camera from Le Clic!

## Pilot advice scheme for elderly owner occupiers

**THIS** old house ain't got no windows, this old house ain't got no door, are the opening lines of a well known song. The sentiments expressed in those lyrics are a bit extreme, but Barnet's Housing and Environmental Health staff are very concerned at the number of elderly owner occupiers in the Borough whose properties need major repairs.

The first step towards tackling the situation has been taken. A pilot scheme has been launched in part of the borough. In addition to practical help for repairs, it offers the chance of dealing with the ever-increasing demand for advice and assistance from those approaching retirement, the elderly or the disabled.

The 'Agency Services Scheme' will, initially, be limited to residents of Friern Barnet and East, Central and North Finchley. Demand for the service will be assessed over a trial period.

### Strong Preference

'National research has shown that the majority of elderly people have a strong preference to remain in their own homes. This is particularly so in Barnet, where a high proportion of our private housing is occupied by elderly owners,' said Geoff Fish, Chief Environmental Health Officer.

The Greater London Housing Survey revealed that many elderly owners did not realise that maintenance work was required, and some of them simply could not afford to pay for extensive repairs.

Frequently large sums of money are locked up in the 'equity' of the house, that is the value of the property if sold. There are schemes available where elderly people can borrow money for repairs and repay only the interest, until the house is sold.

Elderly people must beware of 'sharp' finance companies who charge over the odds or have unfair clauses in their contracts.

Geoff Fish's advice is: 'Never sign or enter into an agreement without taking sound advice first. Good schemes are available and a Government leaflet setting out all the facts is available from the Environmental Health Department at Barnet House, Whetstone.'

Sometimes many hours have to be spent in explaining to those in need that by either selling their property, re-investing it or converting a large house into flats, they would be able to purchase a modern sheltered unit or have repairs and improvements carried out, and live in warmth and comfort during their retirement years.

Owner occupiers, and it is not just the

elderly, often find the full schedule of repairs required, before a grant can be paid, are too expensive. Mr Fish said: 'In such cases where financial hardship exists, my officers can arrange for a reduced grant to be paid for essential repairs only, to make the house sound and weatherproof.'

'Loft insulation grants are available to those in receipt of either Housing Benefit or DSS benefit, and we can also arrange for draught-proofing works to be carried out free in appropriate cases.'

Even when finance is not a problem, some elderly people may decide that improvements, or adaptations for the disabled are an expensive luxury for an 80-year-old. They may decide their money could be better spent on the installation of an alarm system, better heating and insulation to keep them warm and safe for their remaining years.

There are some cases where advice and assistance concerning minor repairs, such as new washers on taps, fixing curtain rails or arranging redecoration, is all that is required.

### Objective

Mr Fish continued: 'I personally feel, for two main reasons, that it is of the utmost importance for every assistance to be given to both those planning for retirement and elderly residents. The objective of every Environmental Health Department is to promote a state of complete physical health and well-being in the community and, of course, improving the living conditions of an increasing elderly population is of benefit to the entire community.'

'The second reason extends beyond the individual. It is the statutory responsibility imposed upon the Environmental Health Department to halt the decay of the housing stock and achieve improvements wherever possible.'

The increasing elderly population in Barnet has brought an upsurge in demand for advice and assistance. Mr Fish feels it is simply not good enough to send detailed literature or refer residents on to other organisations or departments.

### Advice

Welcoming the launch of the Agency Services Scheme he said: 'Officers in the Environmental Health Department will advise the elderly and the disabled on repairs, loft insulation, draught-proofing, improvements and adaptations for the disabled. Assistance will be given in organising the works, both minor and major'.

'Details of local builders can be provided and assistance given throughout every stage until the work is complete. The advice service includes guidance on available grants and arrangements will be made for a grant, if the works qualify.'

'Our officers will assist in filling out the application forms and attend to all of the other administrative matters, if required, as many elderly people often find this a most daunting task,' added Mr Fish.

Not all elderly residents require repairs and improvements nor choose to stay in their own homes. Officers in the Housing Department will give exactly the same sort of advice and support regarding the purchase of sheltered accommodation, and eligibility for Council sheltered housing for those who are renting privately owned property.

### Alarm scheme

Through Agency Services there is the opportunity to be included in the Housing Department's Telephone Alarm Pipeline Scheme, which can now be linked to houses occupied by elderly people who spend a lot of time alone. The system enables them to call for help by using an emergency button on the phone or on an emergency call pendant. This Lifeline Scheme is currently the subject of the Mayor's charity appeal.

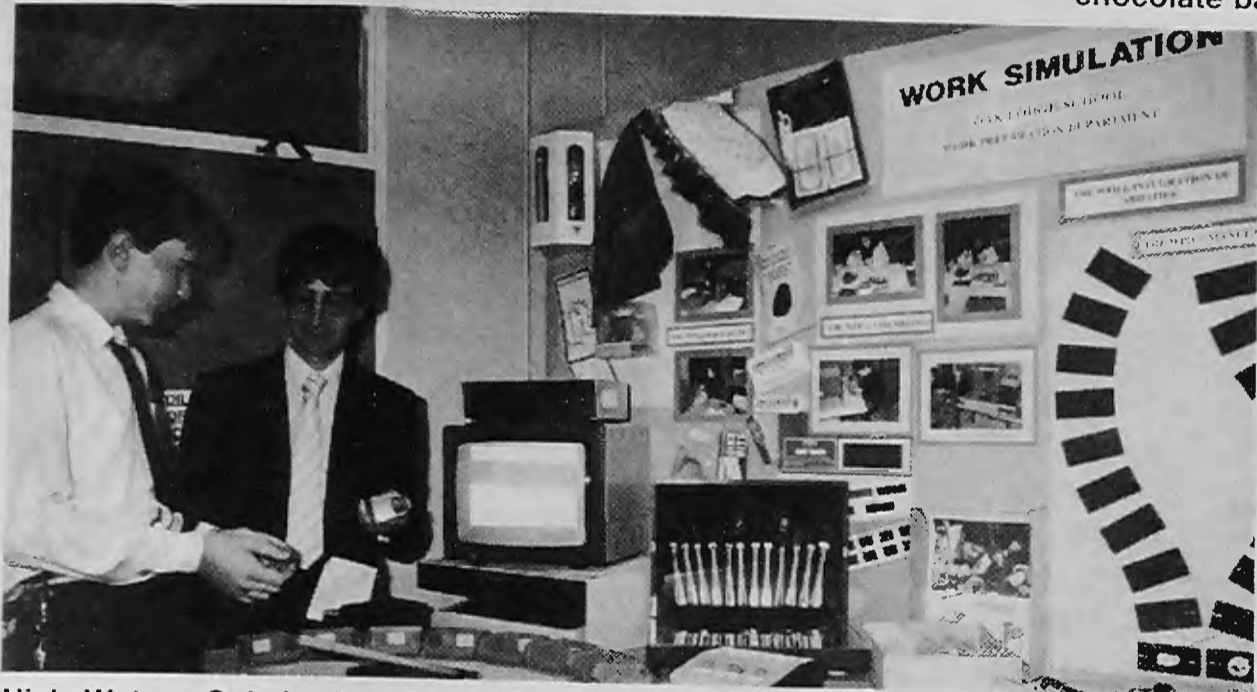

## Education today looks to tomorrow's world

MINISTER of Education Angela Rumbold found herself testing her fitness, racing a radio-controlled car, listening to electronic music and playing with an icing dolls' house when she opened Barnet's exhibition of TVEI — the education initiative which brings the world of business into the classroom.

Five schools and two colleges took part in the Technical and Vocational Education Initiative Expo, held at Hendon College on November 10.

The Minister said TVEI had enriched the teaching curriculum

by drawing together industry and the work carried out in schools. She congratulated Barnet on introducing TVEI in GCSE examination classes, a special school, and the two colleges, and on extending the initiative to sixth-form studies.

The Minister was welcomed by Cllr Roy Shutz, chairman of education.

There were 25 stands, most offering a challenge to visitors to try their own skills. In the main foyer Oak Lodge Special School featured their work simulation department. Here young people with a learning difficulty, discover about the world of work in a disciplined and chal-

lenging but supportive atmosphere.

Barnet College were showing their TVEI involvement, particularly the nursery nursing course. Video work and electronic music were combined in the media studies studio with Hendon College joined by students from Copthall and St. James' schools. St. James were also involved in desk top publishing while Edgware School demonstrated computer graphics.

Whitefield School were out to market a new chocolate bar called Secret. They also ran a photographic studio, and demonstrated the range of technology through radio controlled vehicles.

St. James' School surveyed kitchen utensils alongside Hendon College bakery department.

Copthall and St. James were involved in graphic design; Hendon College had a hairdressing demonstration and a building structures section; Edgware School ran a health and fitness studio; and the whole exhibition was linked by Education Department stands explaining the variety of studies and career opportunities.

For the final act of the day the Minister was joined by the Deputy Mayor, Cllr Wilf Lipman, to cut an iced cake, made by bakery department students.
