#### INFORMATION

The County Series Maps represent a district at 1:2500 or 25 inches to the mile, or 40cm to the Kilometre. If you were in a balloon it would be like being 800 metres (half a mile), above ground. Each sheet shows an area 1.5 miles west to east and 1-mile north to south. 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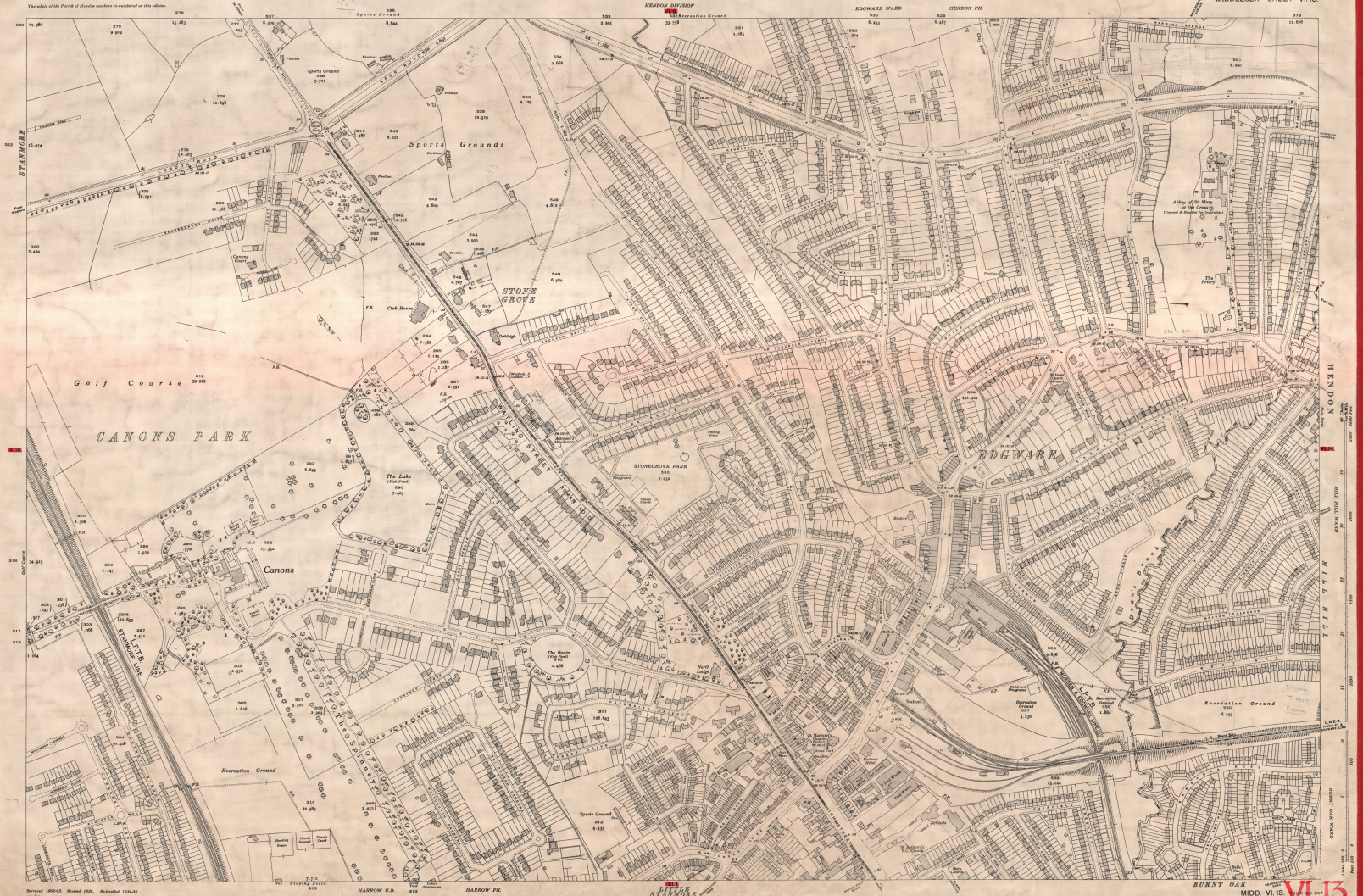

Every parcel is numbered thus	27
Its area is given underneath in Acres, thus	4 170
Arrows indicating that the space is connected are included in the same reference number and area	27

The Altitudes of Bench Marks and surface heights are given in Feet above the mean level of the Sea at NEWLYN, and are based on the new primary levelling of 1912-23. To refer these to the standard levelling datum, see the figures shown on B.L. 551. *Note that the figure applies to its place only and is only approximate to 0.1 ft. Further information on application.*

Altitudes indicated thus (288.45 ± 0.1) refer to bench marks on buildings, walls, etc. Those marked (+) presented or followed by the height refer to surface levels.

*Note*—To convert Decimals: per ft. of New line Roads and Panchals, multiply by 4, this will give Rods and Decimals of a Rod, multiply this Decimal by 40 this obtaining Panches and Centavals of a Panch.

Scale  $\frac{1}{60,000}$  being 25-344 inches in a Statute Mile or 200-23 Feet in One Inch.
