### JAMES

James is a 9 year old boy of white parents. He has been in foster care for the last 9 months as his mother was not able to adequately care for him. James needs a two parent foster family who are willing to offer him a home until he is 18.

James is a healthy, energetic boy who is demanding of attention and at times can be defiant. While his behaviour is tiring he can also be affectionate and helpful and generally rewarding to care for. He enjoys football, swimming, horse riding, indoor games and cooking and belongs to cubs and youth clubs.

James is of average intelligence but has missed a lot of schooling in the past. As a result he is behind in basics such as reading and writing and needs extra help in these areas.

Foster parents who care for him can expect to be paid an appropriate allowance which will reflect his needs.

# Barnet Council charts the way to Community Charge Benefits

UNDER the new Community  
Charge regulations many local  
residents will qualify for a rebate  
- **Community Charge Benefit.**

Barnet Council has drawn up a  
personal and family profile chart  
to help local chargepayers iden-  
tify their circumstances and find  
out if they qualify for benefit.  
This chart is only a guideline as  
people's circumstances differ  
greatly.

### Act now!

People who think they qualify  
should act quickly. To get benefit  
dating back to 1 April 1990 appli-  
cation forms must be returned by  
26 May 1990. **After that date  
rebates will apply from the Mon-  
day following receipt of the  
application.**

### Help for elderly and disabled people







ELDERLY and disabled people  
who were not ratepayers, or the  
partner of a ratepayer under the  
former rates system, may qualify  
for special help called Transitional  
Relief. This rebate does not de-  
pend on income or outgoings.

tion are available from Barnet  
Council Community Charge Cust-  
omer Services, or chargepayers  
may telephone the enquiry num-  
ber shown on their Community  
Charge Account.

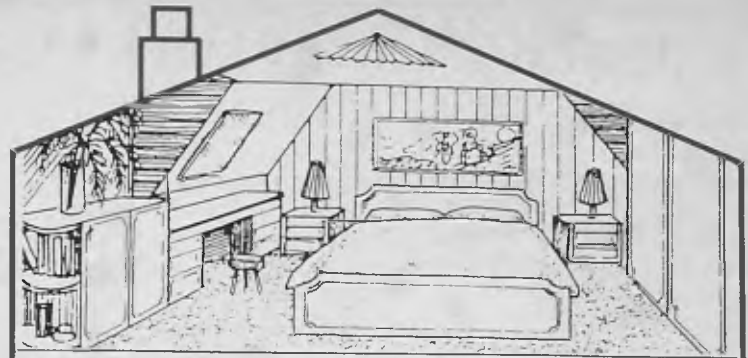

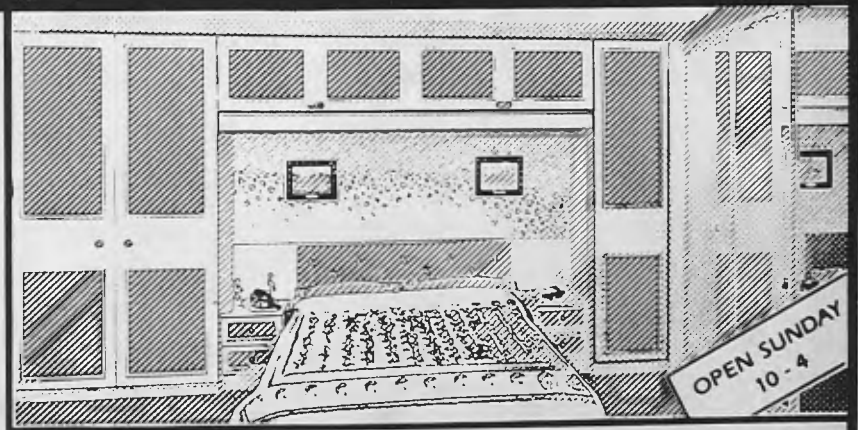

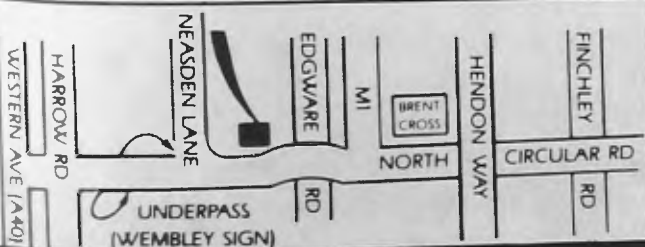

# Council's Clean Parks Campaign gets underway

BARNET Council's 'Clean Parks' campaign took off in bright sunshine when 350 residents and their dogs turned out to collect a free 'poop scoop' and car sticker, at Oak Hill Park, Church Hill Road, East Barnet, on 7 April.

Youngsters were given yellow balloons carrying the 'Clean Parks' logo. The Mayor's Escort, Ron Benson, almost took off in the strong wind when he held a bundle of balloons while the Mayor, Cllr Dot Benson, unveiled a sign at the entrance to the park.

## Three zone plan

Barnet Council has agreed a three zone plan for the control of dogs in parks:

1. Areas from which dogs will be banned - including children's playgrounds, ornamental gardens and sports areas
2. Park areas where owners will be expected to use a 'poop scoop' to clear up after their dogs
3. Open spaces where dogs can be exercised freely

Earlier this year, after almost 90 per cent of residents who took part in a public consultation on the Council's proposals gave the thumbs up to the plan. The coun-



cil then agreed to introduce a voluntary 'Clean Parks' campaign pending Home Office approval for changes in the by-laws.

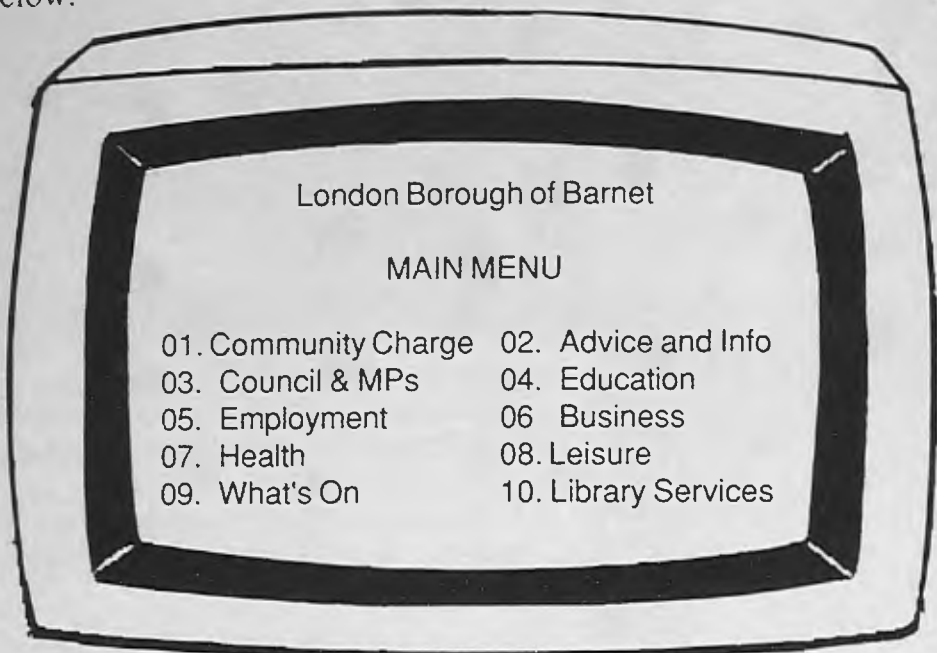

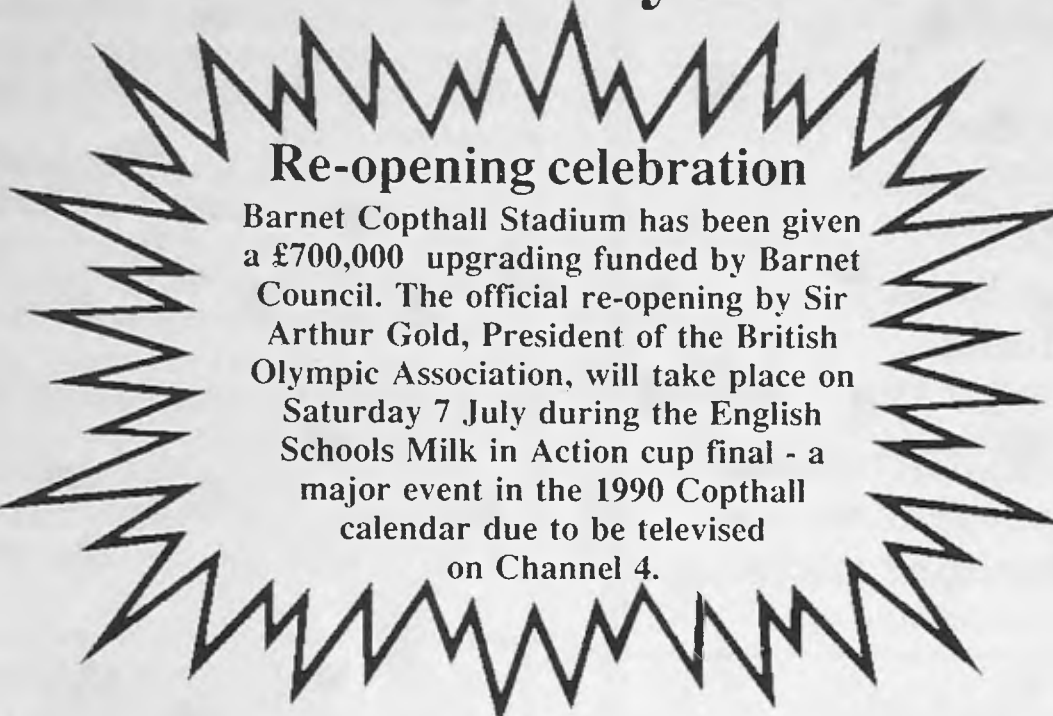
There's a packed programme of sport. National and international events are lined up for the three-day show on Friday 8, Saturday 9, and Sunday 10 June. And the funfair will run on all three days.

## Sunday is Fun Day

Sunday is Family Fun Day with children's entertainment and a chance to join in the sports events. The programme opens on Friday 8 June with Barnet Council Primary Schools cricket competition at 1pm and the UK Men's Modern Pentathlon Championship, horse riding event, at 2pm.

## Nine boroughs competing

On Friday and Saturday nine boroughs compete in the Middlesex Schools Athletic Championships - Barnet, Brent, Ealing, Enfield, Haringey, Harrow, Hillingdon, Hounslow and Richmond



## Re-opening celebration

Barnet Copthall Stadium has been given a £700,000 upgrading funded by Barnet Council. The official re-opening by Sir Arthur Gold, President of the British Olympic Association, will take place on Saturday 7 July during the English Schools Milk in Action cup final - a major event in the 1990 Copthall calendar due to be televised on Channel 4.

upon Thames. Hundreds of school children will take part in this event from which the team to represent Middlesex will be chosen for the All England Games in July.

International challenge comes in the Motoball event - football on motorcycles! Two teams from Germany and one from Holland will be playing in a tournament organised by the local team - South Harrow. The finals take place at 2pm on Sunday.

Also on Sunday there's American football with the London Ravens v Birmingham. There's

even Gaelic Football for Irish supporters!

Soccer is well represented. Princes Park Youth Football Club are organising the Junior Football Competition on the Sunday and there is senior six-a-side football on Saturday.

The five-ring Horse Show will be a major attraction with Western Riding on Saturday.

On Sunday the main show jumping events will be held, including a preliminary round for the British Novice Championship and a Foxhunter preliminary competi-

tion. There are fun classes, a children's gymkhana and a fancy dress competition. Local riding stables have given sponsorship to many of the events.

Sgt Bob Barbour of West Hendon Mounted Police will be offering free saddle and tack marking as part of the Metropolitan Police's crime prevention drive.

## Entrance is free

Entrance to the show is free on all three days, and there is ample car parking.

Copthall Show is one of three major annual events funded by Barnet Council and organised by a panel of local people assisted by the council's recreation staff. The others are Finchley Carnival, at Victoria Park, Finchley, on Friday 13, Saturday 14, and Sunday 15 July; and Friern Barnet Summer Show, at Friary Park on Friday 10 and Saturday 11 August.

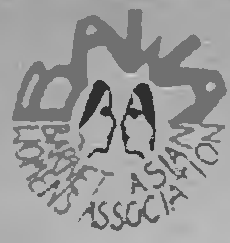

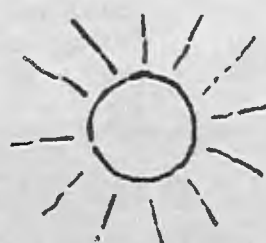

## Good response to Barnet Council's blueprint

### for 2000 AD

MORE THAN 200 local and national organisations and private residents responded when Barnet Council went out to consultation on the Unitary Development Plan (UDP) - an up-to-date planning framework for development throughout the whole borough over the next decade and into the 21st Century.

The consultation period ran from December to mid February. Replies came from amenity groups, residents associations, business organisations, national specialist bodies and 59 individuals.

#### Now on view

Many of their suggestions and observations have been taken into account and the revised plan will go on deposit for the public to see at the end of this month (April).

Tom Jeffrey, Barnet Council's Controller of Development Services, said: "I would like to thank the people of Barnet for the constructive comments that they sent to us. It shows that we serve a very involved and caring population.

"There were 214 responses - most of them from groups and organisations, so that the views of many hundreds of people have

been registered. Many commented extensively on all aspects of the plan, but in general most residents and amenity groups supported its broad intentions - to maintain and improve the quality of life for Barnet's residents.

#### Plan amended

"As a result of the consultation we have made amendments and indeed have been able to strengthen some aspects of the plan.

The plan is now being reprinted to take in the new amendments. From the beginning of May members of the public will be able to see the new UDP at the following Barnet Council locations:

- The Town Hall, The Burroughs, Hendon NW4
- Barnet House, 1255 High Road, Whetstone N20
- Western Area Planning Office, Barnard House, 158 Burnt Oak Broadway, Edgware, Middx
- Central Area Planning Office, 23 to 35 Hendon Lane, Finchley N3.
- And all 17 public libraries.

Barnet's UDP gives the council more specific powers in the control of development within the borough. When it is finalised it will replace the old Initial Development Plan and the Greater London Development Plan.

This version of the plan contains the policies which Barnet Council believes are necessary to protect the quality of the local environment, valuable residential amenities, and the character of individual areas.

A careful balance has been struck between the different forces competing to shape the borough. Many well established policies remain in this plan but there are also new policies to deal with new problems and changing circumstances.

#### Final chance for change

A copy of the amended plan is being sent to the Department of the Environment and a further six week period in which formal objections can be registered, will start at the beginning of May.

If there are substantial objections which the council are unable to resolve by negotiation there will be a public inquiry.

The finished project will provide an exhibition area, a children's library and will be fully accessible for disabled people. The building will be complete by the end of this year.
