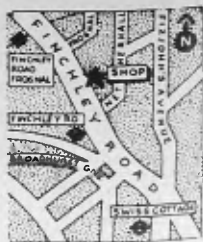

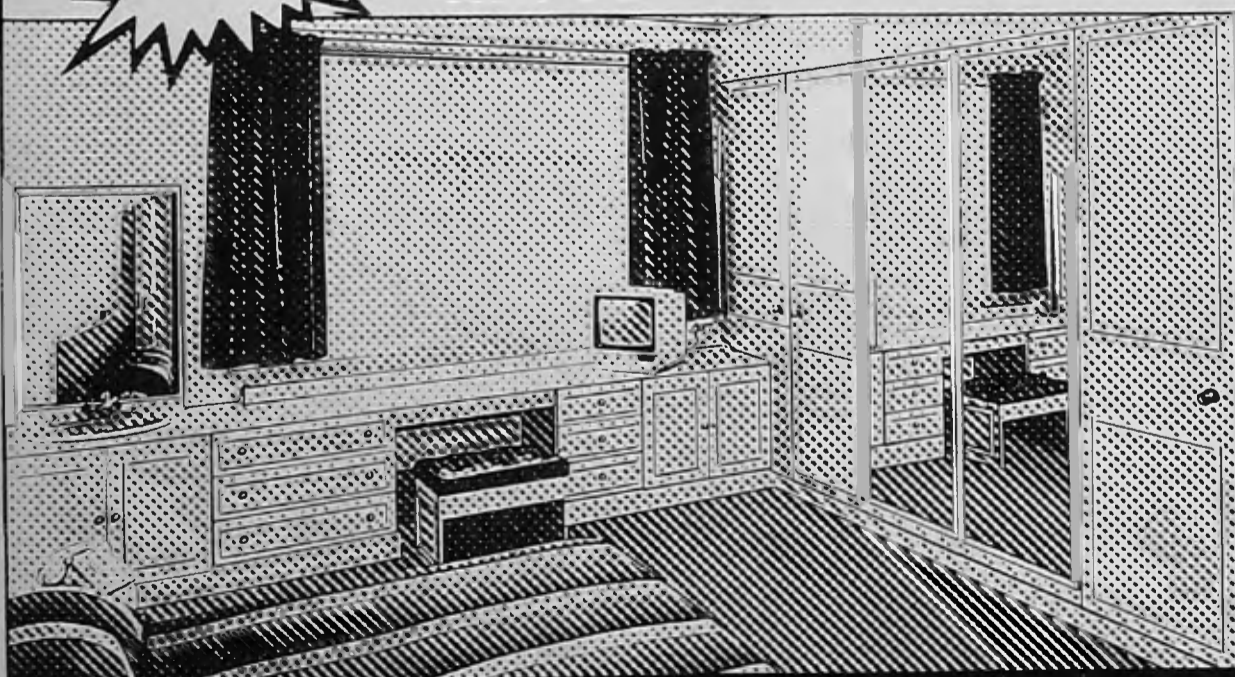

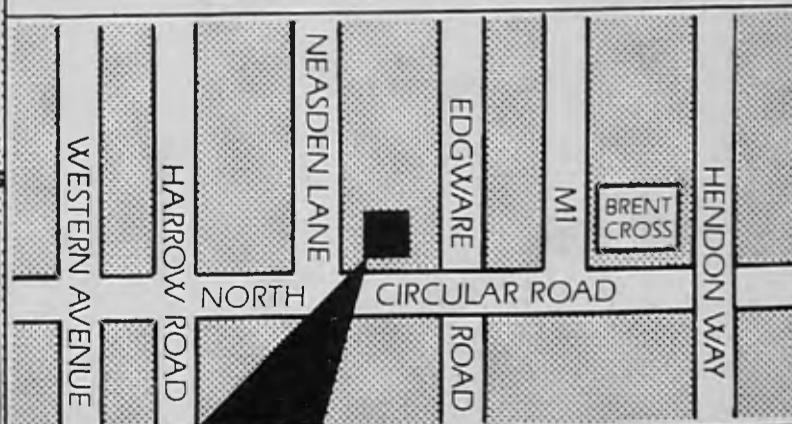

# Schools' links with business and industry

BARNET'S Business Education Centre, now part of the new Teacher's Centre at 451 High Road, North Finchley, is holding an Open Week from June 29 to July 3.

The week aims to highlight some of the good practices within schools' business studies, feature some of the well-established links with business and industry, and demonstrate resources available to build 'industrial awareness.'

It will also focus on the good links that are being built up between schools and further education, particularly with regard to new initiatives such as CPVE (Certificate of Prevocational Education) and TVEI (Technical and Educational Vocational Initiative) sponsored by the Manpower Services Commission.

There will be an opportunity for primary and secondary teachers from all subject areas to examine the ways in which they can bring business and industry into their own teaching. Displays of pupil's work will be an integral part of the week together with careers seminars, training simulations and some of the latest teaching aids and technology.

The Government has repeatedly called for schools to ensure that pupils leave school with some knowledge of the country's economic structure and with the basic skills needed to take advantage of

the range of careers arising from new technology.

Business education departments have a major co-ordinating role to play in ensuring that all pupils acquire an understanding of the world of work and the basic business skills involved.

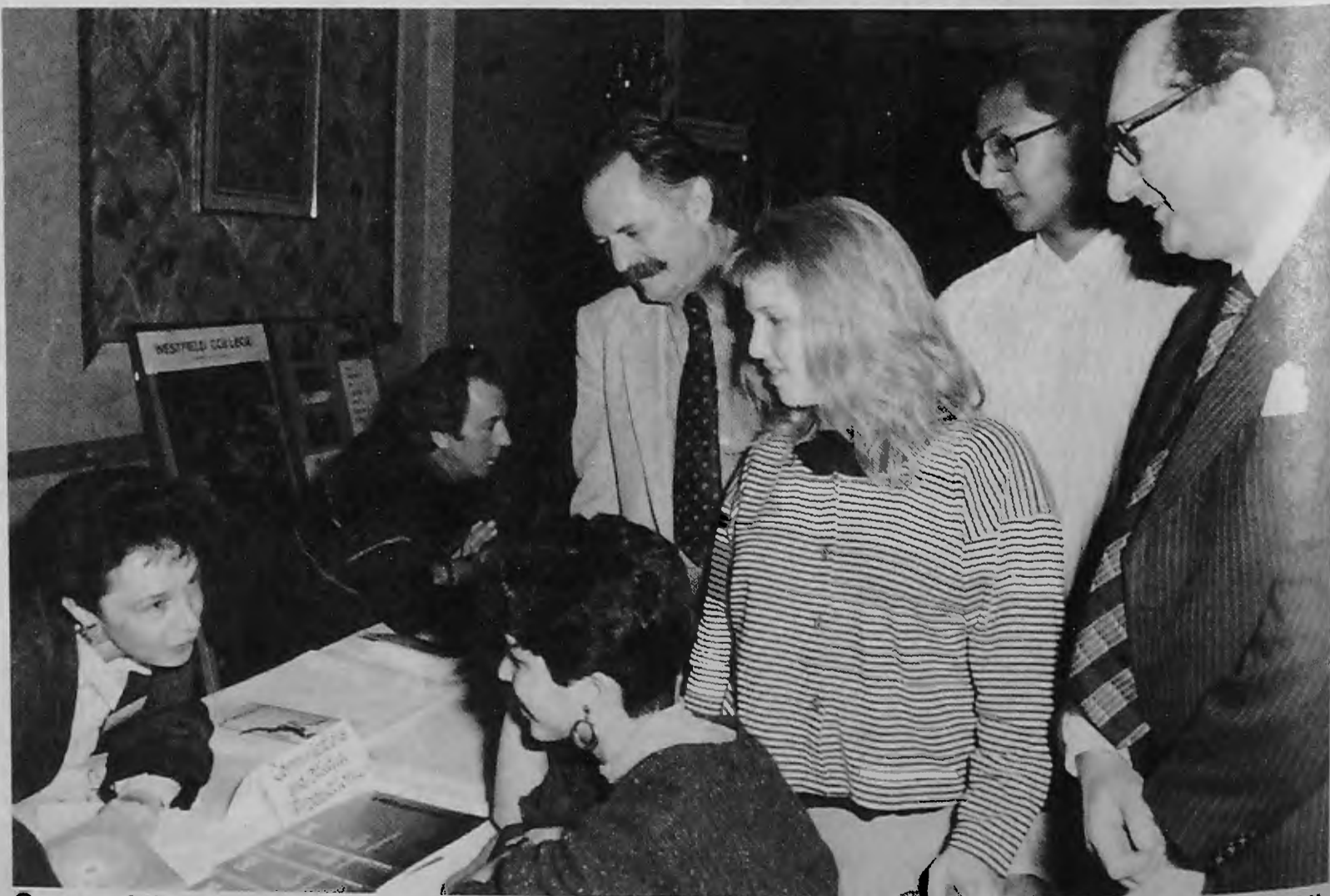
## Students look ahead in Barnet

BARNET sixth-formers had an opportunity to look ahead to their higher education years when the Barnet Careers Service held a conference at the Hendon Hall Hotel on Thursday, May 7.

Over 1,000 students visited the conference in relays, and were able to discover more about college and university degree courses in subjects ranging from agriculture to zoology.

The delegates were welcomed by Cllr John Hart, chairman of Barnet's Further Education sub-committee, and Mr Neil Gill, director of education. The conference was organised by Mr Mike Leonard, senior careers and development officer, with the staff from the two careers offices, in Burnt Oak and North Finchley.

Among those attending were representatives from Barnet and Hendon Colleges and Middlesex Polytechnic. But Universities and polytechnics from all over the country, including Scotland and the

The subjects included earth and environmental sciences; architecture, engineering and technology; languages and humanities;

medicine and dentistry; occupational therapy; veterinary sciences; social sciences, business studies; theology, law, arts and design.

There was advice for disabled

students, and an inquiry desk on grants, careers for graduates, and student life and accommodation meant that students could discuss problems at an early stage.

## Health

Healthy eating can be fun and the food is delicious. This is the message from Barnet Health Authority who have launched a healthy eating campaign which, like the old advert for stout — looks good, tastes good and by golly it does you good.

Britain has one of the worst records of heart disease in the world. The United States and Finland were worse but they have led the way to a healthier diet and now the numbers of deaths through heart disease are well down.

The Government's 'I love my Heart' campaign has come to Barnet. The Health Authority and Barnet's Social Services will be working together to introduce the healthy eating life style to the community they serve.

More fibre, fruit and fresh vegetables: less sugar and animal fats, is the message. You don't have to go vegetarian, although it is a good idea to cut down on red meat and replace whole milk with skimmed milk.

Tasty, healthy food, is a question of balance said BBC Breakfast Time cook and food writer, Glyn Christian, who opened the project with a mouthwatering demonstration and lots of good advice.

Knowing what to use, why you are using it, how often you do so and the ways you can use it was the

theme of his quick-to-prepare, lovely cooking and delicious menu.

Colour, texture, flavour and variety are important in healthy eating. Above all dishes can be easily and cheaply selected by taking a good look at what was available on local supermarket shelves, he said.

Subtle herbs, and floral flavourings lessen the need for sugar and salt the TV expert said as he added drops of old-fashioned orange water to a cheesecake.

Choosing food for colour and texture as well as health value, was very important. Barnet's healthy eating campaign aims to dispel the confusion resulting from conflicting views and bad advice now available to the public.

By supplying consistent, unbiased and practical information about food and health, it plans to help people choose tasty meals and make well-informed choices.

An exhibition and leaflets are first being displayed in local hospitals. Then said District Dietician Debbie Thompson, 'We shall be taking the message into the community — working with schools, Barnet Council, industry and community groups.'

Meanwhile — try these recipes:

### 'CREAMY' DHAL

*This dish from India is full of fibre and protein and has a soft, creamy texture. Serve it with brown rice and a salad.*

*Wash and soak lentils for at least three hours (or over night) or use the small green lentils which need no soaking. Use a heaped tablespoon of dried lentils per person.*

*For two people: In a heavy saucepan fry a rough-chopped onion in a little olive oil until it is soft but not brown. Add a half teaspoon of cumin seeds, two cloves, and a finely chopped green chilli, a clove of garlic (crushed), a little salt and a dessert spoonful of tumeric.*

*Stir for a few seconds to allow the flavours to blend then add the soaked (or green) lentils and half a pint of water for each tablespoon of lentils. Bring to the boil and simmer gently for two hours. Ten minutes before serving add a walnut-sized piece of coconut butter. If you can't find this boil a tablespoon of dessicated coconut in a little milk for about five minutes, strain and press out all the liquid and use the liquid in the dhal.*

*The dhal should be creamy in texture. If necessary add water during the cooking or raise the temperature and bubble away the sauce if the dhal is too runny.*

### NUTTY TOMATO AND MUSHROOM SALAD

(serves 4)

450g (1lb) firm, ripe, home-grown tomatoes

100g (4oz) button mushrooms, sliced

25g (1oz) walnuts, roughly chopped

5ml (1 tspn) dried basil

¼ tspn dried fennel

Salad dressing to taste

Freshly ground black pepper

*Cut tomatoes into rings. In a salad bowl mix them with the mushrooms and walnuts. Toss in dressing and sprinkle the herbs over. Chill. Just before serving, grind a little black pepper over the dish.*

450g (1lb) fresh blackberries, washed, drained

284ml (½pt) natural yogurt

75g (3oz) hazelnuts, shelled and skinned

Clear honey to taste

*Mix blackberries with yogurt, nuts and honey. Pile into serving glasses. Serve chilled.*

## CHURCH FARM HOUSE MUSEUM Behind a painted smile

THE CLOWNS are coming to Hendon. Not to the Big Top but to a museum.

Church Farm House Museum, Greyhound Hill, Hendon, will be staging an exhibition until June 27 'Behind a Painted Smile' — the story of clowns and clowning.

During the run of the exhibition clowns will visit the old Jacobean farm house to demonstrate their art and give illustrated talks.

The clown of cricrus and carnival began with the great Joseph Gri-

maldi (1778-1837) who lived in North Finchley, and includes the great names such as Grock, Coco and Oleg Popov.

Behind these great names is a tradition going back to ancient Egypt and Rome and the jesters and fools of the Middle Ages.

FEW people can have failed to become familiar with the word 'conservation'. While we rightly think of the conservation movement as a modern activity, there was nevertheless some notable progress last century.

By 1871, Hampstead Heath was saved for future generations and Epping Forest received protection in 1878. Birds also featured in early campaigns. The Royal Society for the Protection of Birds was founded in 1889 and by 1923 a bird sanctuary existed at nearby Walthamstow Reservoirs.

With the rapid expansion of the Country Naturalist Trusts in the 1960s, the conservation movement began to gain the momentum which has lasted to the present day. Such is the interest now, that all political parties campaign for the 'green vote' at elections.

Local authorities, too, are increasingly willing to devote more effort towards managing areas in a manner sympathetic to the needs of wild life. Barnet's woodlands have benefited from this change of attitude and many Borough officers are knowledgeable naturalists.

Sadly, while woodlands prosper in the borough, there is far less commitment to the conservation of vital grassland habitats. A walk in many of our suburban parks reveals acres of close mown grass with little room for the disappearing meadow flowers and butterflies we all enjoy. Perhaps progress in grassland conservation should be our next priority.

## Forum want a centre

THE Southern Forum is a group of people working in the community in the Childs Hill, Cricklewood and Golders Green areas who meet to discuss problems and ideas, and the need for new developments there.

It includes local clergymen, community workers, social workers, local health visitors, librarians, representatives from voluntary organisations, local under fives' groups, tenants' and residents' associations, pensioners' clubs, the local police and probation service.

The Forum want to set up a Neighbourhood Centre and have received a report from members who visited East Finchley Neighbourhood Centre at 42 Church Lane.

At the East Finchley centre there are weekly advice sessions, luncheon clubs, housing advice, free legal advice and councillors' surgeries. They answer questions about housing, social services, employment, social security, health matters and consumer problems.

Information is available on local and London-wide facilities for recreation, social activities and education. Various classes are run at the centre and it is a meeting place for local groups. There is also a creche.

There is no such service in the Cricklewood area. There is a Call Point at the Claremont Clinic but it is only open half a day a week and is a little remote.

The need for a centre in the area was recognised 10 years ago and the Forum feel that this need still exists. Ideally, the premises they are looking for should have a shop front, office, kitchen, three or four rooms and be easily accessible to residents, or example, in Cricklewood Lane. It could also be used for a community worker who at present is based about five miles away.

## Goodbye and Good News!

**THE** retiring Mayor, Cllr Denis Dippel, was able to hand over office on a high point.

As the new Mayor was installed, and he was being congratulated and thanked for his work as Mayor during the past year, he stepped forward and stopped proceedings.

'This is not on the agenda,' he said, 'But I feel I have to let you know the good news. As you all know, my appeal was in aid of research into cystic fibrosis, a terrible disease which affects children. Well, we have just heard from St. Mary's Hospital, where the Cystic Fibrosis Research Trust is based, that they have made a breakthrough. They have identified the gene which transmits the disease and now the way is clear to work towards finding a cure.'

The news was greeted with applause from the Council chamber and gallery.

An article in the top scientific journal, Nature, broke the news of the discovery which readers of Barnet Borough News will remember was hinted at by Professor Bob Williams when the Mayor

visited the research unit at St. Mary's.

They have been able to pinpoint the rogue gene on human chromosome 7 and their research has shown that almost every person with CF in Britain is descended from one common ancestor some ten thousand years ago.

Professor Williams said 'We are nearing the end of a 20-year journey to find the gene and to be able to do carrier tests. There are over two million carriers of this genetic time bomb in Britain alone and it is only when we have the gene that a community test for carriers can be devised and a prevention campaign started. Even more important is that now we know which gene is affected, and how, we will be able to introduce new forms of treatment for the young people with CF.'

The 1986/87 Mayor's Appeal for the Cystic Fibrosis Research Trust is now closed except for money coming in from sponsorship events held during the year. It is expected to top £45,000. A final figure will be announced later.

# Finchley site for 20-bed hospice

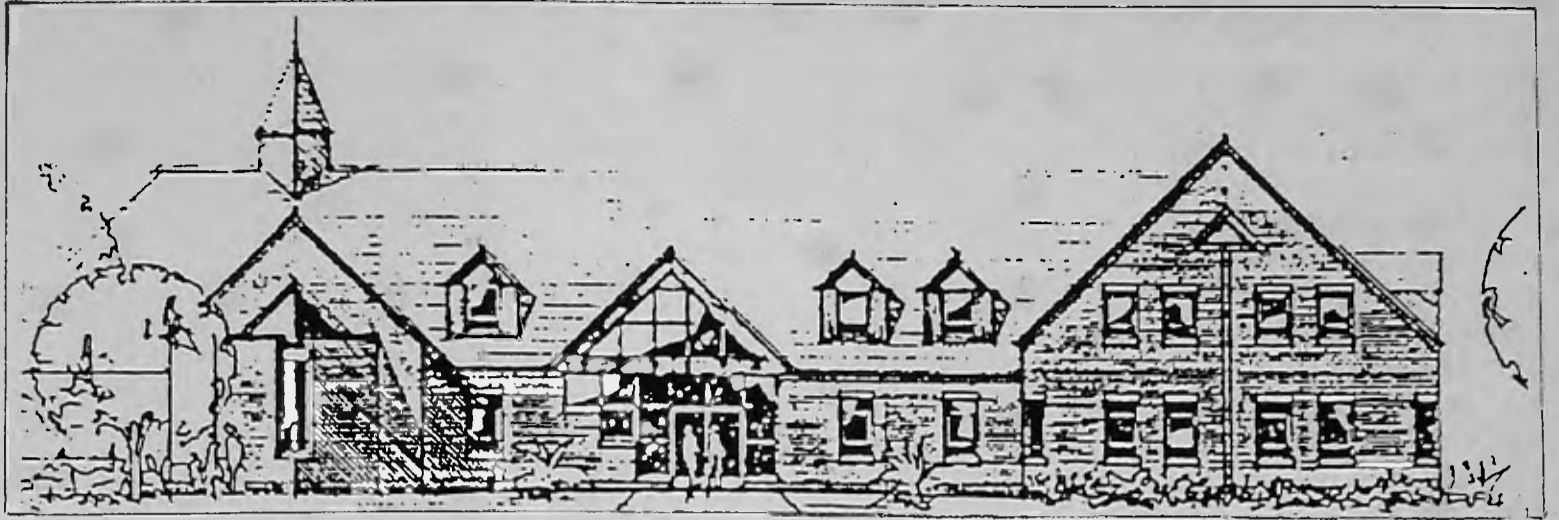
**AFTER** years of searching, the Interfaith North London Hospice Group have found a suitable site for a 20-bed hospice in Finchley.

The proposed site is about four fifths of an acre and fronts on to Woodside Avenue, North Finchley. The land is owned by the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Westminster and, until recently, was used by Finchley Catholic High School.

The Peabody Trust, who this year celebrate 125 years as providers of housing for the poor in London, have agreed to buy the land at a cost of £500,000 and make it available to the group. Once planning permission is obtained from Barnet Council, the purchase can be finalised.

Mr Kit Platten, architect to the Peabody Trust, has designed a building with a warm and 'welcoming' character that will also enable the staff to work in an efficient environment. To take advantage of the fall in the land, the accommodation will be on three levels with the principal rooms being on the ground floor.

The design allows for two small wards, each with six single rooms, two four-bedded rooms, ancillary nursing facilities, a day care centre and offices for the Home Care Service. A chapel will provide an

intimate space for private prayer as well as opening up into a larger area for more formal religious services of all denominations.

At present the hospice group provide home care service for the desperately ill; but the aim is to extend that service to give free hospice care to all those that most need it — whatever their faith or creed.

For the past two years the home care service has continued to look after desperately sick patients in and around the Boroughs of Barnet and Haringey.

The service offers multi-disciplinary home care for people from every faith as well as a bereavement service for families. Under Sister Harriet Copperman,

nursing director, the home care service looks after the sick and supports the families and relatives as well as the patients through the most difficult and emotional periods.

Co-director David Oliviere has organised a volunteer sitting-in service to support families of the dying. The home care service work in conjunction with general practitioners and all the other health and social services, as well as voluntary organisations.

Their work fills a much needed gap in the health services currently offered in Barnet and Haringey.

The 20-bed in-patient hospice costing about £2 million will be central to the work of the home care service. It will be designed and

built to offer treatment and facilities specially for those who so desperately need in-patient care.

It is anticipated that building works will be finished within the next three years. No public funds will be available to build the hospice and substantial donations will be needed to ensure that the building can be completed.

The North London Hospice Group office is at 10 Flask Walk, Hampstead NW3 1HE.

## Education

### SATURDAY SPECIAL

ONE HUNDRED and fifty teachers from Barnet schools gave up a full Saturday to attend a one-day conference at Barnet Teachers Centre. The theme was Supporting Children with Special Educational Needs and the response made this the biggest in-service course ever held by Barnet's education service.

The course organiser, Mr John Rowland, Barnet's general adviser for special needs, said: 'In fact more teachers applied for places than we could accommodate. This response from staff, giving up their time on a Saturday to increase and broaden their skills in helping children with special educational needs in a testimonial to the general concern that Barnet teachers have for their pupils. It is particularly impressive at a time when the national media are saying that the morale of the teaching profession is at a low ebb.'

All the speakers were teachers or professional staff within the borough's education service, sharing their expertise with their colleagues. The speakers were:

Mr Geoffrey Treasure, head teacher, Christ Church CE Secondary School, and Mrs Elaine Crawford, of the school staff, spoke on the approach to these children in a comprehensive school.

Mrs Shelagh Dunford, head teacher, Hyde Junior School, described the HELP project in which parents help teaching staff with support work.

Mr Peter Stretton, head teacher, Colindale School, outlined the work in supporting young physical-

ly handicapped pupils in a mainstream primary school.

Mrs Sarah Rosen-Webb, head of the specialist remedial teaching service, described the methods in helping children with specific learning difficulties, such as dyslexia. Mrs Tessa Cone, teacher in charge of a specialist centre at Ravenscroft Secondary School, described her work with secondary pupils with a greater degree of specific learning difficulty.

Two educational psychologists,

Dr Julia Gibbs and Mr Ian Gardner, spoke on recent trends in educational psychology.

Miss Janet Gayler, co-ordinator of the special tuition service, talked on aspects of school phobia.

And Mrs Sue Flockton of the support teaching service described the range of their work in primary schools.

Assisting with conference organisation were Mr Keith Hewett and Miss Pat Marvell of Barnet Teachers' Centre.

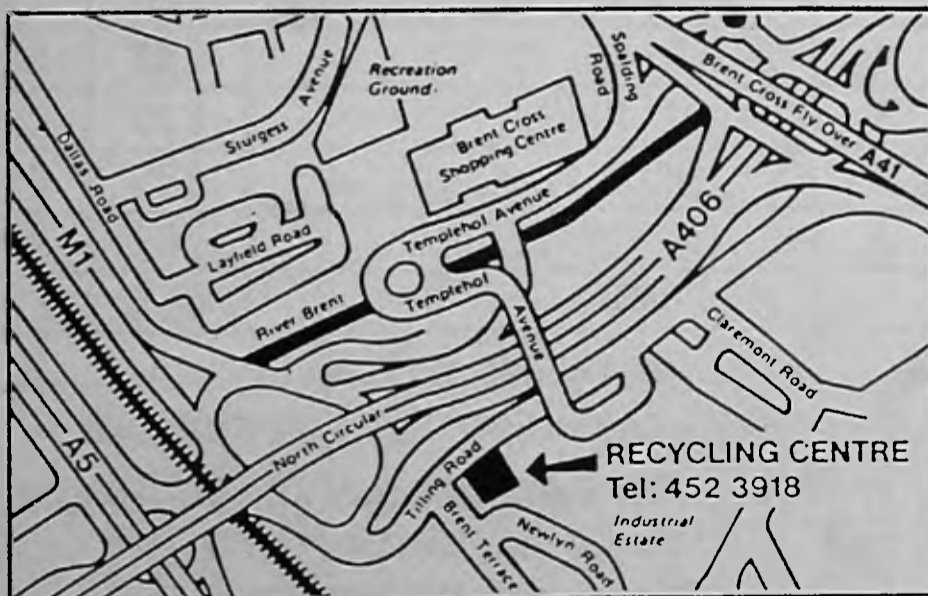

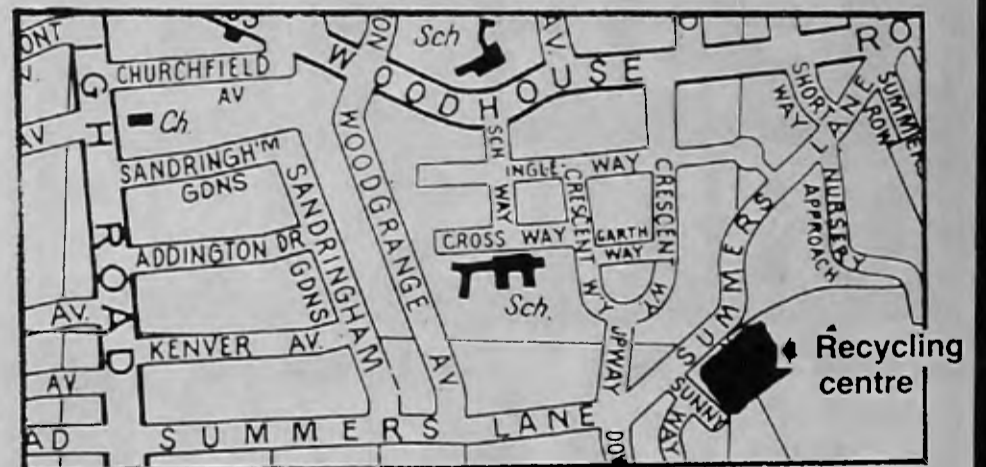

**Listing plan for Officers mess**

BARNET Council are to ask the Secretary of State for the Environment to make the Officers Mess at RAF Hendon, a listed building because of its historic association with the former aerodrome.

The building with its gabled roof and black and white, Tudor-style facade, was once the London Aerodrome Hotel, catering for distinguished visitors and people who flocked to the great air displays.

It was built in 1917 with later extensions, and features in the publication, 'The Birth Place of Aerial Power' produced by the Grahame White Company in the early 1920s.

Although most of the buildings associated with the former aerodrome have disappeared there are survivors.

The Grahame White Hangar, built in 1911, was listed in February 1979.

The former aerodrome control tower and factory, dating from 1915, were listed this year.

The former entrance gates to the Grahame White Aviation Company's factory in Aerodrome Road, now in front of the RAF Museum, were listed in February 1979.

An adjoining pair of former aircraft hangers, dated circa 1914, now part of the RAF Museum, were listed this year.

The former Borough of Hendon conferred the Freedom of the Borough on the Middlesex Regiment in October 1955. But Hendon was later merged with Finchley and the three urban districts of Barnet, East Barnet and Friern Barnet, to form the Borough of Barnet, while the Middlesex Regiment, with its traditions going back to 1756, became the 4th Battalion The Queen's Regiment.

Members of the public will be welcome to come and watch the march past for which the band will be the 3rd Regimental Battalion Quebec Band.
