

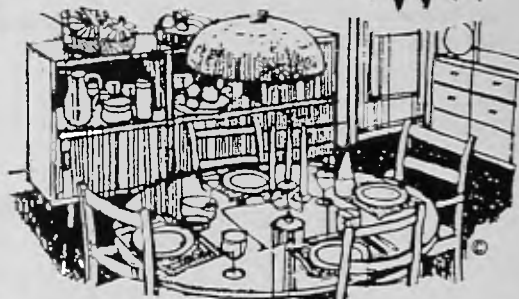

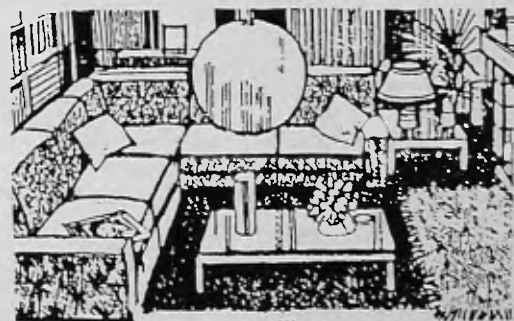

## Battle of Barnet is now a war on litter

Our front page cover is a very special poster which will be helping the borough in its Keep Barnet Tidy campaign. McDonalds Hamburgers Limited sponsored a poster competition for schools in the borough and there were more than 800 entries.

When the day arrived for the prizes to be awarded, on Friday, July 7, at Friern Barnet Town Hall, the Prime Minister herself, Mrs Margaret Thatcher, MP for Finchley, presented the certificates to winners and the highly commended entries.

Mr Trevor Bull, regional operations manager of McDonalds presented the prize cheques - £10 to winners, £5 for highly commended entries - and £100 to the six schools represented by the main winners.

The Mayor, Cllr Dot Benson, who was founding chairman of the Keep Barnet Tidy Committee, reminded parents, teachers and councillors, that

the aim of the committee was to persuade people to care about their environment and to keep it litter free. The Council was working with schools and also seeking engineering solutions to the problem.

The Prime Minister congratulated the children on the standard of the posters which were bright and carried a very clear message. She also stressed the importance of individual responsibility for maintaining the quality of the urban environment. She was delighted to see industry, local authority and schools working together to publicise the anti litter campaign.

Trevor Bull said his company were very conscious of their responsibility and were the first to establish street litter patrols.

The winners were: Class A (3 to 7 years), Holly Brown, St John's Infant School, Hendon; Class B (8 to 11 years), Clare Sanger, Whittings Hill

Junior School, Barnet; Class C (12 to 14 years), Angela Kyprianou, Friern Barnet County School; Class D (15 to 16 years) Penny Askew, Oak Lodge School. Class E (17 to 19 years) There was no overall winner and each of the following received an award - Waheed Shah, Jennifer Osmany and Gerald O'Sullivan, Mapledown School, Cricklewood.

Highly Commended certificates and awards went to Golman Li, Deansbrook Infants School; Dada Morrish, Underhill Junior School and Anthony Ioannou, Friern Barnet County School.

McDonalds, whose sponsorship covered the cost of all prizes and awards, also arranged for one of the winning posters to be printed. That poster, designed by Angela Kyprianou, will soon be on display at schools and offices around the borough.

Thousands of Barnet people responded when Cllr Barbara Langstone chose a project for St John and the Red Cross for her mayoral appeal in 1985. On Tuesday, July 18, the foundation stone of the new St. John Ambulance Training Centre near Underhill, Barnet, was laid by the Duke of Westminster, President of London District. The centre will include garaging for two ambulances, a training centre and a small store for the Red Cross, who have also received money.

The total cost is £235,000. So far £150,000 has been raised (including £40,000 from the Mayor's Appeal) and donations are still needed

A SOVIET scientist in whose name Edgware Exodus has been donating mathematics prizes to local schools in recent years was able to present the 1989 award himself.

Dr Evgeny Lein applied to leave the Soviet Union in 1978 and permission was given last December. He flew in from Israel to make the presentation to Manisha Shah, 14, at Friern Barnet Town Hall.

Manisha, of Minchenden Crescent, Southgate, who won £50, is a pupil at Ashmole School. The second prize of a £10 book token was won by Nick

Jacob, 14, of Cyprus Avenue, N3, who attends Hendon School and the third prize of £5 book token was won by Marcus Alcock, 14, from Elizabeth Close, Barnet, who attends Queen Elizabeth's Boys School.

Dr Lein told them: 'It is a really special moment for me to present these prizes.

'I wish you all success and happiness in the future. I and my family are here because of the solidarity of scientists and I thank you all.'

Barnet's Maths Adviser, Wiola Hola, who speaks Russian, welcomed

Dr Lein on behalf of the Mayor of Barnet, Cllr Dot Benson; MP's John Marshall and Sydney Chapman; Barnet's Deputy Director of Education, John Bailey and Exodus representative, Alan Myers. Edgware Exodus is an organisation which campaigns for the release of Jews who have been refused exit visas.

Dr Lein was escorted to the ceremony by his hosts in England, Norman and Marie Gleek of Stanmore. The winners were accompanied by members of their families and staff from their schools.

## The Freehold gets its own Community Centre

RESIDENTS of 'the Freehold' in Muswell Hill, on the South Eastern tip of the Borough, are to have their own Community Centre. It has been provided by Barnet's Housing Committee and will be run by the Freehold Residents Association.

The new community centre, built on the site of the old Alexandra Road Depot, will provide a large hall, a committee room, store, kitchen and lavatories, including a toilet suitable for disabled people. It is brick built with a tiled roof, blending in with local domestic architecture. Outside is a patio area and a barbecue.

Housing Committee, at their meeting on July 17, agreed that the Freehold Residents Association would manage the centre, under licence from the Council. The agreement will provide for other local groups to be able to hire the premises at times which will not conflict with the residents association bookings. The centre will open for use later this month.

The Freehold Residents Association represents local council tenants and home owners. The name dates back to 1860 when the then Duke of Westminster sold the land to the Westminster Freehold Development Company to build workingmen's housing. This historic link is reflected in the name of the new centre 'The Freehold'.

## Their 'Double-Your-Money' Barbecue

A Greek barbecue attracted 1,200 people and doubled the money raised at a similar event last year for Oak Lodge School, Heath View, East Finchley.

Two of the organisers, Bambos Stylianou from New Southgate, whose nine-year-old daughter, Helen, is a pupil at Oak Lodge and George Costa, from Barnet, recently handed over a cheque for £6,000 to head teacher, Peter Carney.

Mr Carney said: 'On behalf of my pupils and staff, I thank all those who were involved in this event for a wonderful fund-raising effort.'

This is the third such barbecue held at The Cavalier, Russell Lane, Whetstone, and

# Can you help a student find a home?

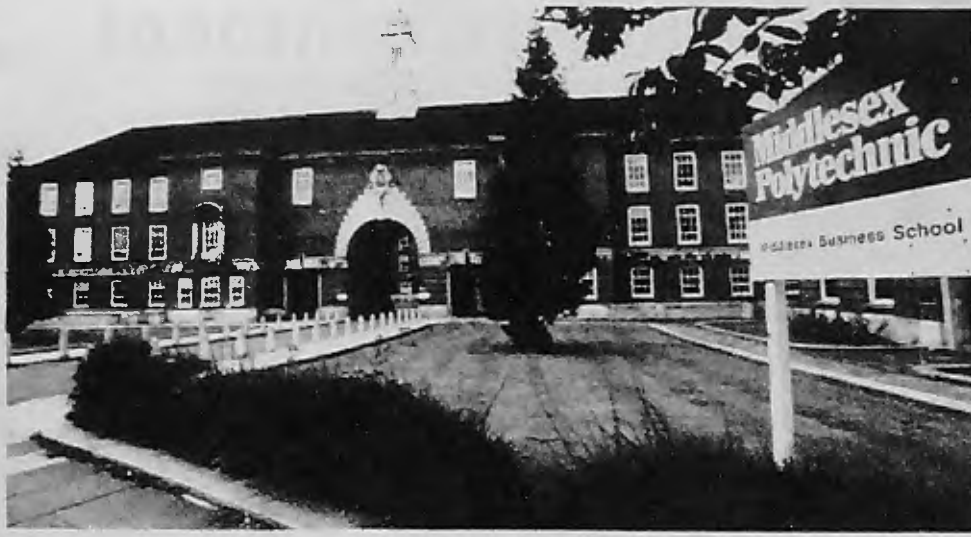
Last year over 3,000 local residents registered their vacant rooms and houses with Middlesex's Polytechnic Accommodation Services.

Every September the Polytechnic is faced with a pressing demand for accommodation. Their own halls of residence house only 600 of the 7,300 students. About 2,000 new students leave home for the first time each year and enrol at Middlesex Polytechnic. Consequently the Accommodation staff are very keen to hear from local residents who have spare rooms in their homes and from property owners wishing to let whole properties in the area on short term leases.

Professional accommodation staff will be pleased to advise all prospective landlords.

Students are put in touch with landlords by the Polytechnic's accommodation offices, each of which is staffed by an experienced accommodation officer who helps and advises landlords registered with the service. Although the Polytechnic cannot become involved in contractual letting arrangements, providing that these are all made clear at the beginning there is no need for misunderstandings to arise.

Middlesex Polytechnic students come from different backgrounds and have diverse personal circumstances, therefore their accommodation needs vary. However, the most popular types

of rented accommodation are self-contained houses, flats and lodgings.

Accommodation is usually let for one academic year at a time, that is from late September until late June. Although many students will be away during Christmas and Easter holidays, some, especially those on courses involving industrial placements, may wish to stay during the vacations.

Whether letting a house, flat or single room, landlords should provide a bedroom with adequate heating, lighting and ventilation. It needs to be large enough to allow room to study, and should include a desk or table and an upright chair. There should be

enough room to hold the student's books, clothes and general belongings. Most students prefer to have their own rooms rather than share a bedroom.

Students renting accommodation with a resident landlord usually prefer to cook their own meals as their timetables often don't coincide with family meal times. They should, therefore, have access to the kitchen at times that can be agreed at the beginning of the letting. Students usually provide their own food and the landlord provides the utensils.

Ideally, separate cooking facilities can be provided if the student's room

is large enough.

Whilst the needs of individual students may vary, the Polytechnic emphasises that problems shouldn't occur if the landlord makes clear to the student the precise terms of the agreement at the beginning. The rent that the student is to pay, when it is due, the method of payment and what is provided in return should be confirmed in writing. The same applies to the arrangements for bills. Whether smoking is allowed, whether students may have guests, and other specific details should be arranged between the student and the landlord before the start of the letting.

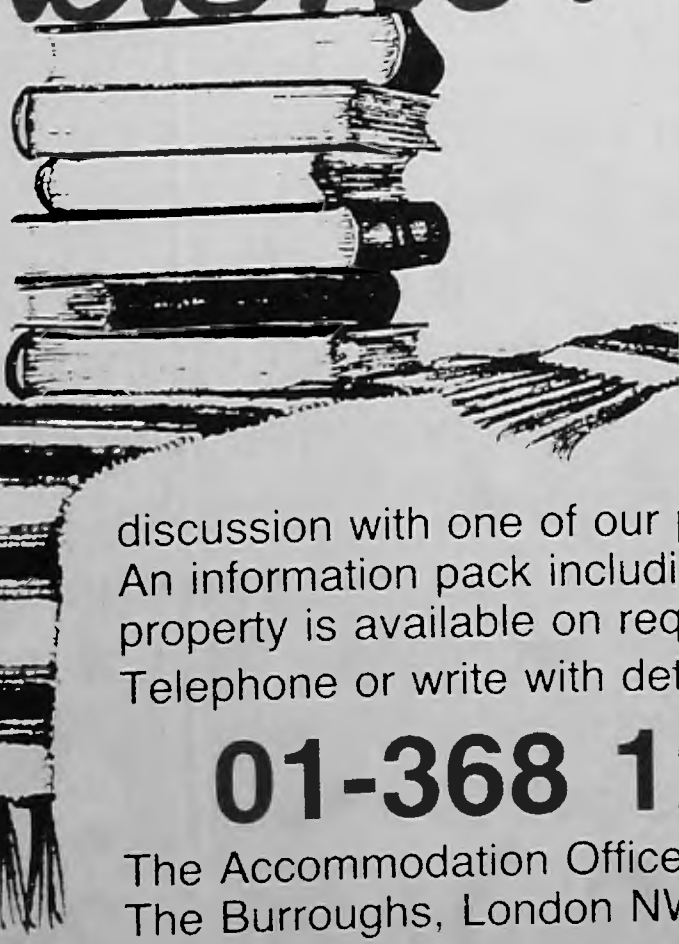
The Polytechnic's main teaching sites are at Burroughs, Hendon; Cat Hill and Trent Park in Cockfosters; Queensway, Enfield and Bounds Green Road, Bounds Green. Students prefer to live close to their place of study or within easy reach of local public transport to their teaching site.

The first step for any interested homeowner with accommodation to let is to contact the Accommodation Officer who will advise landlords and put students in touch with them.

# Planners give top priority to the Borough's residential environment

BARNET'S residential environment gets first priority in new policies which the Council will use as the basis for future planning in the borough.

Because they will be included in the new Unitary Development Plan, which the Planning Group are now preparing, the Council will have more power to enforce them to protect and enhance the quality of life in the borough.

## Housing pressures

Under the existing system, although the Council is able to protect green belt and open spaces, the market pressures for more and more housing could lead to Barnet becoming just a dormitory town. If the present trend continued unconstrained, it is estimated that there would be 12,000 new dwellings by the year 2001, and that would lead to a 24 per cent increase in cars owned by residents while the population, now 302,000, would rise to 326,000.

With the new guidelines, a more balanced option has been drawn up.

This will allow Barnet to meet the regional target of 8,000 more dwellings between 1987 and 2001, but at the same time will keep the housebuilding increase to an average of 500 new homes a year. This would mean a

population rise of 8,000 to 310,000, and a car increase of 14 per cent.

The balanced development guiding principles set five priorities to achieve a borough where people will want to live, shop and work. These are:

## Five priorities

■ Maintaining and improving the environmental quality of the borough's residential areas must have first priority. Careful and close attention will be given to the effects of development and the impact of rising road traffic levels on the character of these areas.

■ Leisure, community facilities, services, and shops which influence the quality of life must be sustained and encouraged. Town centres, at the heart of residential areas, will need careful attention to support shopping, social amenities and employment, and to improve the environment and combat traffic congestion.

■ Linked to these priorities is the need for a favourable response to business, industrial and warehousing development in areas near major transport routes where it can be accommodated without harm to the environment or causing adverse traffic effects. There will be active promotion of low density, attractive business parks and

commercial developments.

■ The provision of new homes to meet regional targets and the changing needs of the borough's population must be achieved with due consideration for the existing character of residential areas and factors such as traffic increase.

■ The main transport priorities will be to make or encourage selective road and other transport improvements to ease travel between home and work, shopping places, leisure centres and community facilities. Road traffic will need to be controlled at busy junctions and roads and channelled away from residential areas wherever possible

## Residents' wishes

Barnet, in line with other London Boroughs and Metropolitan Authorities, is producing a unitary development plan which will set Barnet's planning aims and policies into a regional context.

This is seen as an opportunity to draw up guiding principles for planning which will meet both the requirements of the region and the wishes of local residents.

## Community Charge registration goes well

BARNET residents have made a good response to the new Community Charge registration. By July 10, deputy borough treasurer Paul Ede, was able to report to Barnet's Finance Committee, that 90,000 forms had been returned - a 72 per cent response within six weeks of the forms being sent out.

The first reminder letters went out on July 17. This should bring a further response to complete the information needed for the register which will be published on December 1, this year.

Barnet has taken a positive attitude to publicity and information. The Helpline set up at the Community Charge office, Hatchcroft, The Burroughs, Hendon, has been receiving 600 calls a day.

Speakers visited 25 local organisations, 15 public meetings were arranged and the Information Bus toured shopping centres on Saturdays.

The Helpline operates 9am to 5.15pm on 202 8282 Exts 2800 and 2801. There is an answer phone service on 202 3990 after those hours. The office is open 9am to 5.15pm.

# Keeping The Big Wheels Turning

What would you do if you had a bright business idea but no money, no job and were behind with the bills? Most people would shelve the bright idea and go looking for a routine job to pay the bills. But Mike Evans is made of stronger stuff.

In 1984 Mike started thinking when his brother-in-law, who ran a plant hire business, kept complaining that he couldn't get the tyres on his firm's plant and machinery repaired or replaced quickly or cheaply. Mike was out of work so he had time on his hands to do a little market research. He soon found that poor tyre services were a common complaint amongst operators and hirers of JCB's, Dumpers, Diggers, Forklifts and lots of other rubber tyred plant and machinery commonly used on building sites. Companies that he called on were more than willing to let someone else have a go at mending their punctures and fitting their tyres in the hope that they would receive a better service.

Mike reckoned he could set up a mobile tyre service to work exclusively for operators and hirers and so give them a faster and more economical service.

There was only one problem - Mike was flat broke, so armed with the bright idea Mike first went to see his brother-in-law's boss. The boss agreed with Mike's idea and offered to let him have the use of an unused desk in the corner of the main office in exchange for Mike mending the punctures on his own plant and machinery.

Next Mike did the endless round of calls on bank managers, enterprise agencies and finance offices, all without success. He quickly found that a good idea isn't enough when you want to borrow money - you have to have security and a seemingly endless array of cash flow forecasts, budgets and business plans.

Almost at the point of giving up Mike went to see a local car dealer who had an old Transit van for sale. Explaining his idea and his lack of cash to the car dealer Mike offered to hire the old van on a weekly basis and return it straight away if he couldn't meet a payment. Much to Mike's surprise the car dealer agreed and that afternoon Mike was on the road.

With enough money scraped to-

gether for petrol and some tools salvaged from the garden shed Mike wasted no time in calling back on the customers who said they would use a new tyre service.

## Invest

In the first week Mike earned enough from toiling over puncture repairs to pay for the van hire and running costs and had a bit left over to invest in some business cards and some additional tools.

By the end of the first month Mike was working sixteen hours a day and turning away work because he couldn't keep pace with the demand. A phone was installed at the desk in the corner of the office and the van was signwritten.

## Nature Notes for August

By Clive Herbert

Now the breeding season is largely over, it is a good opportunity to review the birds of our borough. Although the centre of Barnet is only 15 miles away from the heart of London, there is an abundant bird life. These may be breeding species, winter visitors from the north or just birds passing through on migration.

Since 1945, no less than 210 different kinds have been recorded in our borough - including extreme rarities like the Aquatic Warbler and some birds in rather odd places, like the Common Scoter (a water bird) at College Farm in 1983. Top birdwatching sites in the borough include Brent Reservoir and Darlands Lake Nature Reserve which boast an impressive tally over the years. Most woodland areas in the borough could produce over 50 species during the course of a few years watching.

More information can be found in the new leaflet A Checklist of the Birds of Barnet by John Colmans and myself. The Lancelot Hasluck story goes back over 125 years and is today helping elderly people in the Barnet areas.

Lancelot Hasluck, born in 1863, became a member of East Barnet Urban District Council at the age of 35, the start of 40 years of public service. In the 1930s the Lancelot Hasluck Trust was formed with the aim of providing housing for local people in need.

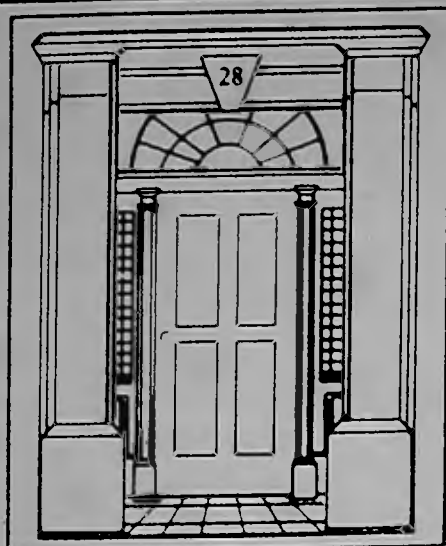

## Church Farm House Museum

IN THE cluster of eighteenth and nineteenth century buildings at Church End, Hendon, the Jacobean farmhouse which is now Church Farm House Museum, is outstanding.

Standing in its own gardens, lightly screened by pleached limes, the museum houses a series of changing exhibitions.

On permanent show is the seventeenth century farm kitchen with its splendid hearth and great table. At present visitors can look behind the scenes of museum care. The Cabinet of Curiosities exhibition features some of the odd possessions and rarely displayed objects from the museum's col-

lection. The name of the exhibition derives from the collectors' cabinets of the 17th and 18th centuries when the world was opening up and avid collectors displayed their new discoveries to admiring friends.

There is also a photographic exhibition, the Changing face of London with architectural photographs by Harold Rose.

The museum is free. Opening hours are: Weekdays and Saturdays (except Tuesdays) 10am to 1pm; 2pm to 5.30pm. Tuesdays, 10am to 1pm; Sundays 2pm to 5.30pm.

# Out and About in Barnet and Beyond

BARNET'S parks and countryside are wonderful places for family outings. The whole borough is bursting with places to visit, things to do, and scenery to enjoy.

On two legs or two wheels or in the family car Barnet is an exciting and beautiful place to explore.

## Countryside walks

Take a stroll through the local park or set out for a good day's hike with a picnic through Barnet's countryside. Barnet Recreation Group have leaflets to guide your walks through the main nature trails.

## Countryside Park

In Mill Hill, just off the A1, is Scratchwood and Moat Mount Countryside Park

Pack a barbecue. There's good parking for the car and the barbecue grills are set in the first open area of Scratchwood so you don't have to carry things very far.

You can fly model planes in the plane field and there is a guided nature trail through Scratchwood, giving a choice of three routes, and pointing out such rarities as the wild service tree and the boundary oak.

The paths are well provided with tree-trunk seats and there is a wild flower guide. But you have to be up very early to see the tiny deer, the muntjacs,

which live in the wood. Moat Mount Park has parking for 30 cars, a circular walk and an orienteering course.

## Glebelands

The Glebelands and Coppetts Wood nature reserve in Finchley offers naturalists an interesting walk, and a guide booklet is available.

## Welsh Harp

The Welsh Harp Nature reserve and reservoir are described in a colourful brochure, prepared by Barnet and Brent Councils. Breeding ground of the Great Crested Grebe and the Canada Goose, the reservoir is always of interest, even in rain.

For young people the Youth Sailing Base is an attraction with sailing, canoeing and wind surfing. Families will enjoy the nature reserve.

## Other ideas for walks:

Walk the whole length of **Dollis Brook** starting in Barnet and making your way through to the Welsh Harp. Try the **Waterfall Walk** in Barnet which runs from Osidge Lane, East Barnet to Waterfall Road, New Southgate along the banks of Pymmes Brook.

From **Page Street to Saunders Lane** near Cophall Stadium the disused railway line makes an interesting woodland walk where wildlife

abounds. There is a bridle path alongside.

**Arrandene Arboretum.** The perimeter walk begins at the entrance opposite Mill Hill Park. This park features a magnificent tree collection, young but now beginning to mature.

## Hadley Green

Hadley Green is one of the most ecologically interesting sites in Greater London. There are rare plants and trees, rich pond life, while the walk across the common to King George's Field, off Hadley Green Road, is a pleasant stroll across bridges and open countryside.

## Parks panorama

Barnet's parks are at their best in high summer. While all the parks are attractive, there are several with special attractions.

Visit the aviaries.

The aviary in Highlands gardens is open 10am to noon and 1pm until 1 hour before dusk. Besides exotic birds there are small mammals such as guinea pigs, rabbits and bantams

The aviary at Old Court House is open for similar hours and features a collection of tropical birds.

Highlands Gardens feature waterfalls, ponds and a wilderness atmosphere.

Oakhill Park is large and has many amenities.

Hendon Park offers spectacular bedding plants and a quiet garden.

Edgwarebury Park is a gardener's delight, and a new 17th Century garden has been set out near the scented garden.

Friary Park has an alpine house and herb beds as well as a pond.

Rushgrove Park has a brookside walk where wildlife is encouraged.

If you have a special interest in trees visit Avenue House grounds, East End Road, Finchley, and follow the guide booklet.
